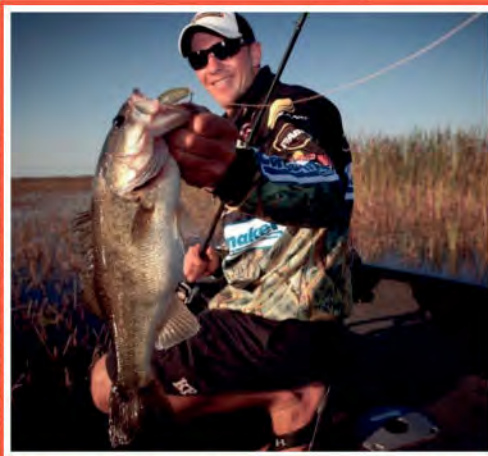

# 20th annual show promises more vendors, more products

## DETAILS

The 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show will be March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown. Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$10 daily, \$2 for ages 7-12 and free for children under 6. First 50 people in each day get a prize.

This weekend's 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown has a new owner.

But, that doesn't mean it will be anything but bigger and better than the 19 previous shows.

That's because Labeth Hall, owner of PR Plus Events, is still organizing the show for the new owner.

"It's going to be the biggest show yet," Hall said. "It will have the power of 60 stations advertising with WVRC Media behind it. People will be hearing about it across West Virginia and into Ohio, Pennsylvania and Maryland."

After 19 years, Hall said she was ready to sell the show to the right entity. She found that in WVRC Media, owner of radio stations such as WAJR, WVAQ and WKKW.

"I'm excited to say WVRC Media has purchased the show from PR Plus Events, but I will continue to organize and run it for the next couple of years to ensure a smooth transition," Hall said.

Hours for the show are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday.

The first show was held at the old Lowes building in Westover in 2002.

"It was a super hit," Hall said. "We sold all vendor booths and had a line of people

waiting to get in all the way across the parking lot and into the old Sears' parking lot."

From there, the show moved to Morgantown Commons, in what is now Gabe's. When it outgrew that building, PR Plus took it to the Pro Performance building in Mylan Park.

In 2006, Hall said she pitched the idea of a community building in Mylan Park, going so far as to do the research on the size and layout and what kinds of events could be held in such a facility.

The outdoors show was the first to be held in the building that came from those conversations and has been there since.

Though the Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center is undergoing expansion, Hall said it won't be completed in time for this show. But next year, she'll be ready for a larger venue.

"We are really excited for next year's event," she said. "It will allow for another 150-200 vendors. We have 160 vendor booths now and we should be close to 300 next year."

Return attendees will see some of the same vendors from previous years, but also some new ones.

"We always try to have new vendors every year," Hall said. "Probably the most exciting is Bass Pro Shop. They will have camping, ATVs, gun safes, boats and more. It will be a very nice display."

There will be two grand prize giveaways: A fishing trip sponsored by WKKW and a hunting trip sponsored by The Dominion Post.

Registration for the hunting trip is on the back of this special section. For the fishing trip, see the prize table at the show.

The first 50 people through the door each day will receive a free gift.

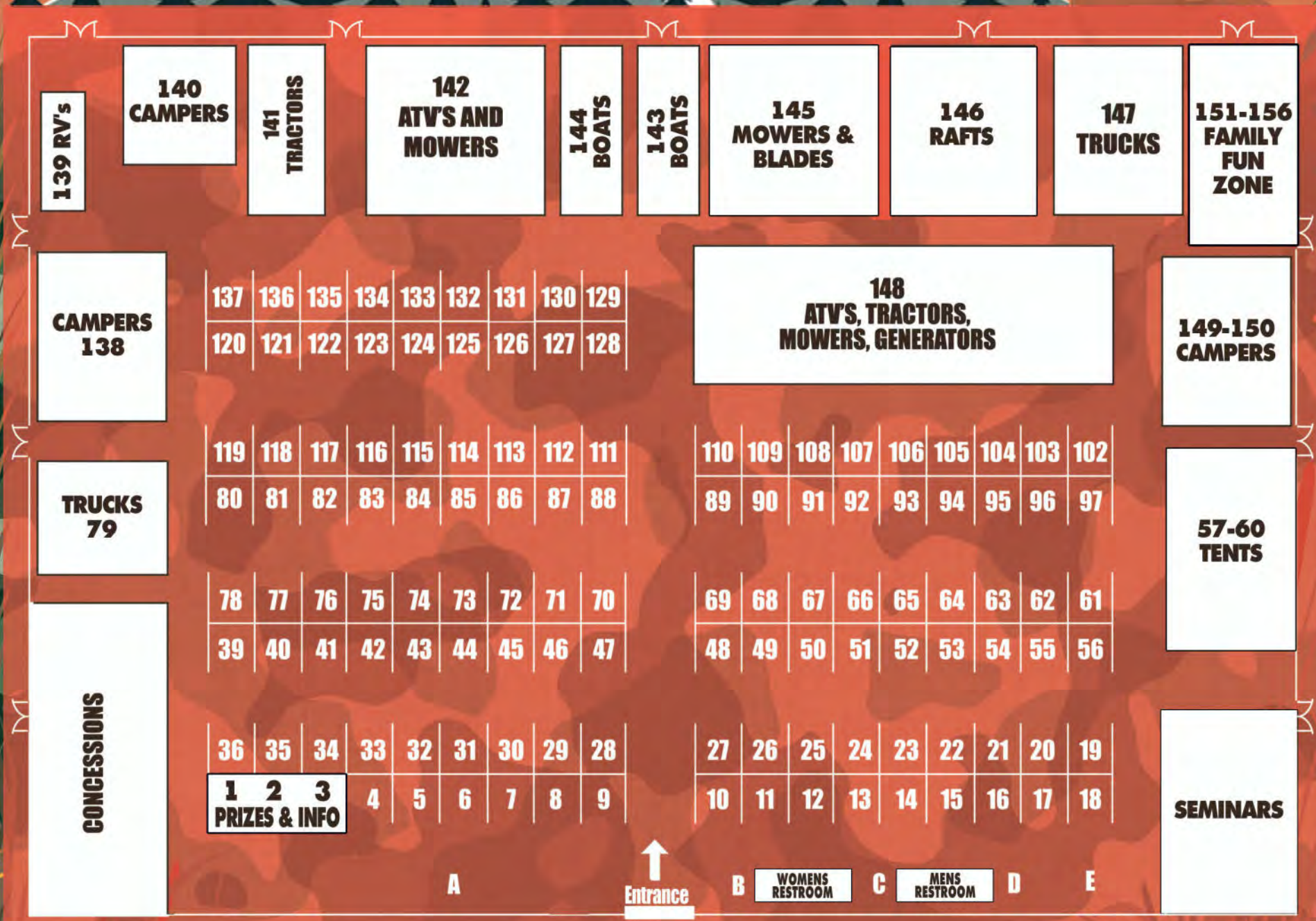

Shiloh and Hannah Turner will have their Holy Pursuit Outfitters at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown. There, the Turners will have a display of four of their larger deer, plus a running slide show that includes trail cam pictures. Hannah said they are eager to talk to people about Illinois and the hunting there. The couple also runs Holy Pursuit Dream Foundation, taking youngsters on hunting or fishing trips in Illinois and beyond.

Shiloh and Hannah Turner are from Morgantown, but they spend a good bit of time in west-central Illinois.

Something very common to West Virginia drew them to Rushville, Ill. — the whitetail deer.

Their love of hunting the deer led them to Illinois and to start a business and then a foundation.

Through Holy Pursuit Outfitters, the couple manages 8,000 acres and takes people on hunting expeditions there.

Holy Pursuit Dream Foundation takes youngsters on hunting or fishing trips in Illinois and beyond.

The husband-and-wife team will be at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown.

Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday.

Hannah said her now-husband went to Illinois at age 18 on a deer hunt. He loved it and started working as a guide out there. He did that for 10 years.

About eight years in, he met Hannah and she started guiding with him.

"When the opportunity came to start our own thing, we took it," Hannah said.

She and Shiloh are now in their eighth

season running Holy Pursuit Outfitters.

They were both hunters in Morgantown and continue to love what they do. They spend a lot of time taking other people on hunting and fishing trips, but when they can, they return to Morgantown.

Hannah said they go to shows like next weekend's about two or three times a year.

"We've been to this one before," she said. "It's always very good to us. It's nice to get to come back home and see our family and some friends. It's a quality show."

There, the Turners will have a display of four of their larger deer, plus a running slide show that includes trail cam pictures.

Hannah said they are eager to talk to people about Illinois and the hunting there.

The outfitters portion of their business has the 8,000 acres and offers free-range trophy white tail deer, plus a 6,400-square-foot lodge with 15 bedrooms. They sometimes do a little turkey hunting, but people are mostly there for the deer.

"When people hunt with us, it's fully guided with meals and lodging," Hannah said.

## Father-to-son business still making coonskin caps

Walt Poniatowski retired three years ago.

Now his son, Luke, runs Rustic Fur Products in Erie, Pa., while Walt does a little PR for him and helps out where he can.

Rustic Fur Products will be at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show next Saturday and Sunday at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown.

Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday.

Walt said it's a two-part business. It manufactures fur hats and takes commercially tanned animal skin and makes clothing.

He said they will have 30-50 hats at the show next weekend and they will be made from raccoon, beaver, fox and more.

"The big thing down there are the raccoon hats because of the Mountaineers," Walt said.

They mostly get the fur from a dealer in Pennsylvania, but will also take it from hunters as long as they have it

commercially tanned and made garment grade.

Walt did some hunting and fishing, and trapping was always a hobby.

"We've been in business for about 30 years," he said. "I trapped when I was younger, and the boys [Luke and Aaron] trapped. They were Eagle Scouts and always were outdoors people."

Walt said his sons talked him into buying a license so he could trap and then make the items.

They went from handsewing to now having 10 machines to help with the work.

At the show, people will be able to see demonstrations of how they make coonskin caps.

The second part of the business came from Walt's previous art gallery. He sold that business, but they still have wildlife art and do framing for customers.

The family still enjoys hunting and fishing but keep pretty busy with the business.

# Self-taught taxidermist does it all — small or large

Jeff Hosaflook has been doing wildlife artistry — taxidermy — since he was about 15.

It became a side job when he was a coal miner for Consol Energy.

Then, about seven or eight years ago, Jeff was laid off and started doing taxidermy full time.

Now, he's the owner and only employee of Hoss's Wildlife Artistry, where he prides himself on being a full-service taxidermist committed to providing quality mounts in a timely fashion.

Jeff will be at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown.

Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday.

Hoss's is in Harrison County, not far from Clarksburg, in a little town called Wilsonburg.

That's where Jeff does his work.

When he first started, Jeff said, he read books and watched videos. And learned as he did.

Jeff Hosaflook taught himself about wildlife artistry — taxidermy — at age 15. Now, he's the owner and only employee of Hoss's Wildlife Artistry, where he prides himself on being a full-service taxidermist committed to providing quality mounts in a timely fashion. Jeff will be at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown.

"I've taken a couple of classes over the years," he said. "But it's pretty much been by reading."

Jeff has done taxidermy on the smallest of animals such as fish, birds and ducks to larger ones like bob cats and bears.

He does the full animal, European mounts and skull plates — pretty much whatever the customer is looking for. Most of the customers and animals come from West Virginia, he said.

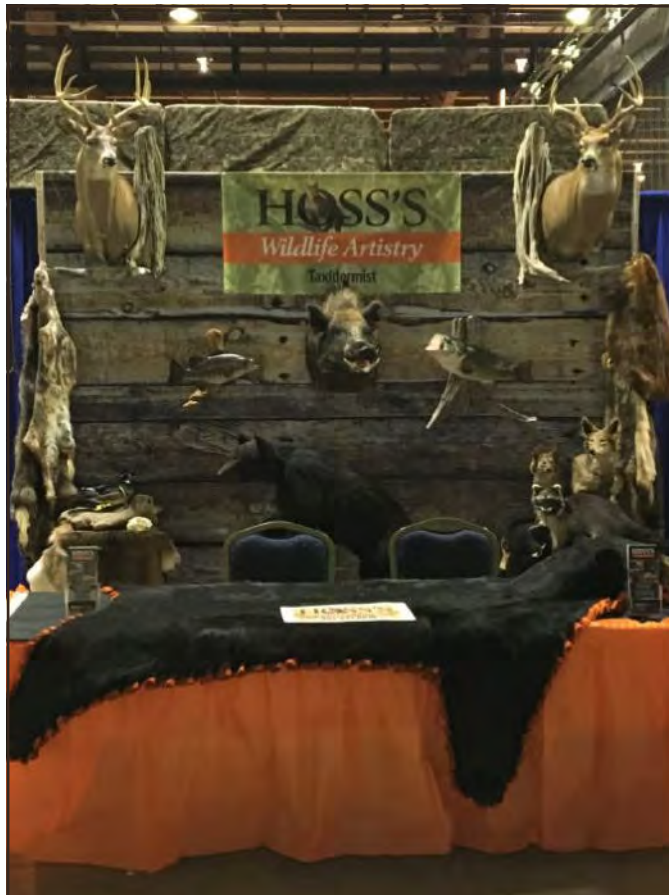
He works 10 hours a day, six days a week to complete 250-300 orders each year.

At next weekend's show, Jeff will have a variety of mounts.

"They'll see game heads, fish, birds, usually a bear," he said. "One of every type of mount I do."

Jeff doesn't limit himself to working with dead animals. He also enjoys hunting, fishing and trapping.

## From bows to knives, Vosler makes artwork

It was an accident.

Or so Tom Vosler says.

The Greenville, Pa., man used to make bows for bow hunting.

In 1983, he decided to make a knife to match his latest bow.

When people saw the knife, he quickly had 80 orders from those wanting one of their own.

So, Tom put the bow-making aside and started Custom Made Knives.

He's up to 15,860. He knows that because he signs and numbers each and every one.

"They are all made by hand," Tom said. "For some, I hammer the steel; some I grind. The heart is my trademark. I also do animal cutouts."

Custom Made Knives will be at the 20th annual Fishing, Hunting and Outdoor Sports Show March 5-6 at Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center at Mylan Park in Morgantown.

Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday.

The handles are made from just about anything.

"I even have a knife with my elbow in it," Tom said.

What? After an injury, Tom was able to get a piece of his elbow bone to include in that special knife.

For other people, he uses pretty much whatever the customer requests — warthog tusks, buffalo bones and deer horns.

"Mostly, I use deer horn handles," he said. "A lot will bring their own deer horn in. I'll put their name on it or the name of a grandson. That makes it more of a keepsake."

If a customer has an idea for a knife handle but doesn't have the material, Tom will find it.

He'll have about 100 custom made knives at next weekend's outdoors show. They can be purchased, or he'll take orders.

It takes about 13 hours to make one knife, so Tom's made this his full-time job since the late 80s. Before that, he worked at a ladder company and made a letter opener for the owner of that business when he retired.

Besides hunting knives, Tom will also make kitchen knives.

Joining Tom at next weekend's show will be his wife of 42 years, Sondra. She is part of the knife-making business.

"She does the engraving and keeps track of everything," he said. And no matter what he decides to get into, "she's always went along with me."

She said hunters come from all over the U.S. for the experience and they take people from all ages and those wanting to hunt with a muzzleloader, rifle or bow.

The foundation was started when a family approached them about taking their ill son on a hunt. Other organizations that grant wishes to sick children don't take on wishes involving guns, Han-

nah said.

So, Hannah, her husband and father-in-law decided they would do something for that child and started the Holy Pursuit Dream Foundation to make it happen.

Now, they have a board — made up of people from Morgantown — get the word out and take kids with life-threatening illnesses hunting or fishing.

Hannah said they get a lot of the young participants from WVU Children's, but they've come from 26 states. They take

30-35 of these trips a year and have gone to all U.S. states, as well as Africa, Hannah said.

The kids decide if they want to go hunting or fishing and then tell the Turners the top three places they'd like to go. "From the time they leave their house until they get back, everything is paid for," Hannah said.
