City, county set to offer 3 places to swim

It was one year ago that a highly contagious virus forced the cancellation of a beloved annual event.

That virus ... doggy bronchitis, also known as kennel cough.

That event ... Dog Day at BOPARC's Marilla Pool.

We have overcome!

"It's back," BOPARC Assistant Director Marissa Travinski said of poochie pool day, "It's going to be on Aug. 21 this year, here at Marilla."

BOPARC's Marilla and Krepps pools open this weekend.

Information about daily rates and passes is available summer boparc.org.

Along with open swim, BOPARC offers a number of aquatic offerings, including times designated for new mothers and children with accessibility and sensory issues.

Swim lessons are also on offer.

"Lessons start with the parent-andchild programs, so that's 0-12 months, and they go up through age 12," Travinski said. There are six sessions this summer between Krepps and Marilla pools. Unless the class is full, those classes are always open for registration, and if they are full, there's a wait-list option.

Other programs include eight-week water fitness sessions and a new aqua boxing class that uses submersible punching bags.

"It's pretty cool," Travinski said.

Next summer will be the last for BOPARC's 60-plus-year-old Marilla Pool as construction of a new \$7 million-\$9 million pool complex is slated to begin in the upper section of the park next spring.

Speaking of pool projects, Monongalia house facility. County plans to reopen its Camp Muffly pool next month after a half-million dollar overhaul.

As part of that project, the county's

This spring and summer there will be a farmers market held within an easy drive of Morgantown every day of the week.

"By visiting farmers' markets, you are supporting local farmers and the local economy directly. It is a great place to spark creativity for gardening, community, cooking and crafting," said Ayron Walker, manager of the Morgantown Farmers' Market.





Post-COVID lockdowns, more people plan summer trips

Coping mechanisms abounded during the long months of stringent pandemic lockdowns. Many people avoided the doldrums by window shopping for vacation packages that promised fun, relaxation or adventure. This year, a growing number of Morgantown residents feel comfortable enough to finally make those dreams a reality

Folks in the region seem to be favoring beachy getaways this year, according to local travel agents. Domestic travel is booked slightly more often than international, with Florida and the East Coast being perennially popular. Kenneth Main, owner and travel agent at Wild & Wonderful Travels, recommends Punta Cana in the Dominican Republic with its wide selection of resorts for every taste and budget. For those who are willing to go a little farther afield, Hawaii and Aruba make excellent destinations. For

individuals who want an escape but aren't sure where to go, Main suggested a cruise.

"Cruises offer great value for the money and allow you to see multiple destinations on one vacation with ease," he said.

If you are considering taking a trip this year or next, time is of the essence.

"Don't assume that by waiting to book, prices may get better," Main cautioned. "People often, for various reasons, will put off booking their trip only to find that when they finally go to book the price has skyrocketed. I've seen this happen in as little as 24 hours, especially with flights.

"Pricing is very volatile right now, given fuel pricing and labor issues," he added. "Oftentimes a travel agent can get a temporary courtesy hold on a vacation package, which locks in the price with no deposit or obligation on the part of the traveler."

Lisa Weese, of Wanderlust Travel at the Morgantown airport, was of the same mindset.

"It is not a bad idea to book a year out," she said. "If the price comes down and I can adjust it for my client, I will."

Both Weese and Main stressed the importance of travel insurance. Main said all flights to Jamaica were recently canceled due to a strike of air traffic control workers.

"Unpredictability like that is what worries folks and is an excellent reason why it's so important to take out travel insurance," said Main.

Weese said it is critical to get insurance that will cover any medical needs that might arise.

"Your regular health insurance won't work when you're abroad, and you never know what is going to happen," she said.

Another tip for potential travelers: Be aware of your passport expiration date.

"Don't wait until a month before your trip to check your passport only to find out that it's expired or about to expire," said

Biking big at Big Bear Lake

50 miles of trails open to public for hiking, skiing, running, more

Big Bear Lake Trail Center is just 30 minutes from Morgantown and offers almost 50 miles of trails for mountain biking, hiking, trail running and cross-country skiing.

There were already some trails in the early 90s when a friend of general manager Mark Schooley approached him about hosting a mountain bike race there. In fact, there was one in the 1980s.

"I was always a guy that rode a bicycle around when I was young. It was fascinating. And it pretty much just started with that," Schooley said. "I just started building trails just for fun. So I'd have someplace to ride and, it's turned into about 50 miles of trails. We're becoming nationally known for people to come by and ride our trails."

It's easy to find your way around, he said. The trails are clearly marked and on several apps such as Trailforks.

"They're all hand cut. East Coast style. Very, very rocky. They're pretty technical. We do have some trails that are more beginner, intermediate friendly," Schooley said.

The trails are built specifically for mountain biking and are beautiful to hike, Schooley said. But hikers should make sure they check the trail distance, most of them are fairly long loops on account of being built for biking — not

everyone wants to walk eight miles.

Access to the trails costs \$10 in the form of a day pass or \$30 for a season pass. They can be purchased at bikebig bearwy.com

Big Bear Lake Camplands, of which the trails are a part, opened Labor Day weekend 1972, making 2022 its 50th anniversary, said Julie Friend Schooley, part-owner and granddaughter of founder Paul Garbart.

Garbart was inspired to start the camplands after visiting Alaska in a camper.

"He always loved camping; drove us around when we were kids from camp to campground to campground. And they drove to Alaska, and he loved it. He just loved it so much," Julie said.

Hartley said the older camp will be from July 3-8. The last day to register will be June 23, and can be done online at ZSuite.


"Older camp is for 8th graders and will be held in Bruceton Mills," he said. "This year we will have an Olympic theme."

MUSKIE

'Fish of 10,000 casts' elusive, but can be caught

An adult muskellunge is an apex predator only bested by large birds of prey such as eagles in their natural habi-

The largest member of the pike family also needs to be wary of a subgroup of the planet's apex predator — humans. For many anglers, the muskie is the ultimate sport fish.

"A friend of mine took me muskie fishing. ... I think it was about 2012. And I've been hooked ever since we caught a monster that day," said Matt McLaughlin. "Now it's just you always want to try to catch that elusive muskie, which is a tough fish to catch."

The muskie is called the fish of 10,000 casts because of the time it takes to catch

"You gotta be in the right place, right time. You got to find them; make sure they're hungry and biting," McLaughlin said.

In order to cover more water and increase his chance of finding one. McLaughlin said he likes to troll for them.

Once one bites it's three to five minutes of chaos, McLaughlin said.

Over 10 years of dedicated muskie fishing, McLaughlin has caught 22 about two a year. The average catch is 30-40 inches. The first one he caught was 42 inches and remains his largest.

"I'm still waiting on the elusive 50-inch-plus muskie," McLaughlin said.

The largest muskie on record was caught in July 1949 in Wisconsin. It weighed 67 1/2 pounds and measured 60.25 inches, according to the Interna-



tional Game Fish Association.

Besides putting in the time, the hardest part of catching a muskie is getting it out of the water, he said. The only way to hook a muskie is by putting in the hours until you eventually land one.

In the midwest, pike and muskie are much more common; however, they live in many bodies of water in West Vir-

Mostly, McLaughlin targets muskie in Stonewall Jackson Lake. He's also fished for them at Burnsville Lake and the most recent state record was caught just below the Burnsville dam. Muskie live in the Tygart, Monongahela, Elk, Buckhannon and Middle Fork rivers.

While there is dedicated muskie gear — much of it similar to bass lures, just

much bigger — the aggressive muskie is just as happy to eat smaller lures, too.

Jon Martin and his daughter Alyssa found that out while fishing on Cheat Lake on May 17.

The pair were trolling for bass or walleye and one of the lines seemed like it was snagged again, Alyssa said.

"We had our poles in pole holders, so I pulled it out and I started reeling it in as

KINGWOOD — City officials are working to update not only the pool, but Brown's Park and the Civic Center as well.

"We're making some improvements," Mayor Jean Guillot said, referring to the splash pad and other work being done at the pool. "But we need to make our parks a priority."

Kingwood Parks and Recreation Director Kevin Stiles said due to permitting issues, the new splash pad might not be in place until next year.

"Once we receive the permit from the state, construction will start," he said. "The (pool) slide is already in place and waiting for plumbing."

Stiles said a redesigned concession stand at the pool will offer customers a variety of snacks and drinks. He said an ice cream and slushy machine has been added, along with a larger variety of other drinks. Stiles said a large pavilion will also be added in the pool area. Currently there are three tennis courts and a basketball court at the pool area, and smaller basketball courts at both Brown's Park and Westpoint Park.

Stiles said a tentative date to open the pool is June 6. He said it will be open from noon-6 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Pool rental for parties will be available from 6-8 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Night swimming will be 6-8 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays.

"We're hoping to offer Surprise Sunday once or twice a month," Stiles said. "We'd offer discount swimming at maybe \$2 per person."

The pool is not the only updating scheduled this summer. Stiles said Brown's Park is "very busy" with rentals. He said the city is hoping to do some upgrading at that park, including a new castle.

"The castle has been there for 26 years," Stiles said. "It was an Amish-

other drinks. Stiles said a large pavilion built castle. That's why it has lasted so will also be added in the pool area. long."


He said new a play area below the pool is also in the works.


