BUCKWHEAT FESTIVAL

'80 Years of Memories'

Preston County's Buckwheat Festival is preparing to celebrate "80 Years of Memories."

Everyone is invited to join Preston County for four days of parades, carnival rides and games, livestock shows and sales, arts and crafts, and Preston County's famous buckwheat cakes.

During the Great Depression, buckwheat was grown as an "insurance crop" because of its hardy nature and short growing season. In 1938, Preston County farmers came together to celebrate the year's harvest. Thus, the annual Buckwheat Festival began, named after one of the area's most important crops.

Observed nearly every year, only cancelled during World War II and in 2020, the festival is a hallmark of memories for residents of Preston County. This significance inspired this year's theme, said General Chairman Nick Taylor.

Last year, as Taylor drove home with his family on the final day of the festival, his children sat in the backseat reminiscing about the celebrations. At that moment, the theme for 2022 became clear.

"I wanted to center this year's theme around memories because really, at the end of the day, that's what we do at the festival," said Taylor. "We create memories."

The event acts as a gathering for the community, and youth are a big part of the festivities.

"It really highlights a bright spot of our county and in our youth, particularly our youth that are involved in agriculture. These kids are hard workers," said Taylor. "The kids showing are from here and

they're representing their town, their county, their communities and their families."

The festival's royalty courts are another example of this, comprised of county residents from elementary to high school. Holding the titles of King Buckwheat and Queen Ceres LXXX are James "Jimmy" Peaslee of Albright and Taylor Holt of Fellowsville.

"To me, the festival highlights our youth," said Taylor. "Whether it's our marching bands or our livestock association or our royalty court, you really see some of the best we have to offer from our vouth at the festival. I think that's really special."

To mark the anniversary, WVU's Pride of West Virginia will be performing on Saturday and a new craft beer festival has been added to the lineup on Friday. Another vital aspect of the festival, the arts and crafts fair is a full house of new and old vendors, said Taylor.

Completely volunteer-run, the Buckwheat Festival is by the community, for the community.

"We're an army of volunteers," said Taylor. "There's so many people that spend countless hours getting this festival off the ground, and it's pretty amazing to see what can be done by a lot of people with a passion to do this.'

With all aspects of the festival returning to normal since 2020-21, festival organizers are looking forward to a strong turnout. There's something for everyone to enjoy.

"Hopefully everyone will be able to come back and join us and start making memories again."





Holt makes dream come true with crowning

As a little girl, Taylor Holt dreamed of being Queen Ceres of the Preston County Buckwheat Festival, an agriculture fair and carnival held annually in Kingwood. After months of working for the title, Holt has earned the title of Queen Ceres LXXX.

Preston High School senior and Fellowsville native, Holt decided to compete for Queen Ceres to share the opportunity with younger generations and act as a role model.

"It seems like every year the [number of] people who go out for [Queen Ceres] just keep getting smaller, and smaller and smaller," said Holt. "So I wanted to show children that it is still such a great opportunity."

Holt, who has a speech impediment, wanted children to see that nothing should hold them back from pursuing what they love.

"A bunch of people told me I wouldn't get Queen Ceres because of my speech impediment," said Holt. "I wanted to show people not to let a disability hold you back; to still go out and do whatever

vou want."

After applying, participating in multiple pageants, interviewing with judges and giving speeches, Holt was chosen as this year's Queen Ceres.

"This was my first pageant ever," said Holt. "So honestly, I didn't know what I was doing and I didn't know what to expect. But I enjoyed it so much."

Since winning the title in April, Holt and King Buckwheat, James "Jimmy" Peaslee, have participated in 10 parades, attended the State Fair of West Virginia, visited various Preston County schools to speak to students, volunteered for the Food for Preston event and more.

Their next step? The Buckwheat Festival Thursday through Oct. 2.

The theme for this year's festival is "80 Years of Memories." After spending so many years attending the Buckwheat Festival, Holt looks forward to the special memories this year will bring.

"I get to create a ton of memories every year that I cherish forever," said Holt. "I'm very excited to see what memories I get to create this year."



After years of competing in the Preston County Buckwheat Festival's livestock shows, James "Jimmy" Peaslee has achieved a longtime goal — earning the title of King Buckwheat.

"I have had a really fun time with the court doing all the parades and events," said Peaslee.

Thursday through Oct. 2, Peaslee will represent Preston County at the Buck-wheat Festival and continue to participate in the fair's livestock shows.

"With the Buckwheat Festival coming up, I am really looking forward to exhibiting my livestock and spending time with the court and others involved in the festival," he said.

In 1938, Preston County farmers came together to celebrate the year's buckwheat harvest and the Buckwheat Festival began. According to healthline.com, Buckwheat belongs to a group of foods commonly called pseudocereals. These are seeds that are consumed as cereal grains but don't grow on grasses. Quinoa and amaranth are two other common pseudocereals. Buckwheat, despite it's name, is not related to wheat and is gluten-free. In addition to buckwheat flour, it is ground for tea and noodles. Buckwheat has become popular as a health food due to its high mineral and antioxidant content. Its benefits may include improved blood sugar control.


