

Find fresh foods, more at area farmers markets

Farmers markets do a world of good for their communities.

The most obvious benefit is improved nutrition among residents. Many studies have indicated that the presence of a farmers market is correlated with increased consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables and lower average BMIs. In recent years, steps have been taken to ensure that the fresh foods found at farmers markets are available to all, no matter their financial status.

Many farmers markets in the region, including those in Morgantown, Kingwood and Bridgeport, accept Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits by EBT card. SNAP Stretch, a program of the West Virginia Food & Farm Coalition, allows shoppers using SNAP to effectively double their money at participating farmers markets. There is no registration process. Shoppers only

have to swipe their EBT cards when buving qualifying items and they will receive a one-to-one match in SNAP Stretch dollars, which can be used to purchase fruits, vegetables and other fresh foods. More information on the program can be found at snapstretch.com.

Farmers markets are also a social outlet, not just for the farmers but for community members who attend as well.


"I see people every week at our market that I wouldn't see otherwise, and we catch up on each other's lives and families," said Katie Fallon, manager of the Cheat Lake Farmers Market. Positive social interactions can have a tremendous effect on the well-being of individuals and their communities.

Local economies benefit from the presence of farmers markets. According to the Farmers' Market Coalition, farmers markets and other locally owned retailers return more than three times as much of



It's off to camp we go

Youths from across West Virginia head to West Virginia University Jackson's Mill each summer to participate in camps.

This year is no different, as WVU Extension offers five statewide camps, including something new this summer.

There are countless opportunities for youths throughout the state to attend summer camp, from statewide to specialty county camps, everyone is welcome. Membership in 4-H is not required to attend camp.

"West Virginia state 4-H camps provide access to incredible camp experiences and quality summer learning for all West Virginia youth," Jason Burnside, WVU Extension 4-H camping specialist, said. "You don't have to be in 4-H to participate, but it's a great way to learn more about our youth programs, in addition to learning new skills and making lifelong friendships."

The five statewide camps offered this summer are Older Members Conference (OMC), Junior Firefighter Camp, Camp Jump Start, Alpha I and Alpha II.

Older Members Conference is an annual weeklong camp where attendees learn leadership and civic engagement skills by leading camp activities and discussing current issues. Youths participate in workshops to master new skills that will help them in their futures. This camp will be June 18-23 and is open to anyone ages 14-21.

Junior Firefighter Camp provides classroom education and practical training to further students' knowledge and skill in firefighting and emergency operations. Campers will learn CPR, conduct live fire training, learn about aircraft and vehicle firefighting, as well as participate in team building and leadership exercises. This camp will be June 17-22 and is open to youths ages 14-17.

Camp Jump Start, the newest camp offered by 4-H, is a weekend camp that introduces younger campers to a statewide camping experience. It focuses on team building, personal skill building and friendship. Camp Jump Start will be July 7-9 and is open to ages 10 and 11.

Alpha I and Alpha II also are weeklong camps where campers are divided into age-specific groups to participate in workshops and learn about teamwork and leadership. Campers also will attend assemblies with guest speakers and have many opportunities to develop new skills. Alpha I is not a prerequisite to Alpha II. Both camps are open to anyone ages 12-21. Alpha I will be July 9-14, while Alpha II will be July 16-21.

"I am looking forward to another amazing summer of camps at Jackson's Mill," Brent Clark, director of 4-H Youth Development, said. "The addition of Camp Jump Start to our offerings, as well as the continued evolution of our weeklong state camps, will provide wonderful opportunities for youths throughout West Virginia."

Each county in West Virginia offers some type of camping program for 4-H'ers and other youths, including day camps and overnight camps.

Area pools offer several locations for cooling off

After 65 years as a Morgantown summer staple, BOPARC's Marilla Pool is ready for retirement.

But not before at least one last hurrah.

This is opening weekend for both city park pools — Marilla and Krepps — and likely the final summer season before major changes come to Marilla Park.

According to BOPARC's tentative schedule, it anticipates receiving bids this summer for construction of a \$9 million to \$11 million pool complex in upper Marilla Park.

BOPARC Executive Director Melissa Wiles said the concept includes a zero-grade entry, a "lazy-river" component, water slides, a splash pad and a deep well to accommodate a wide range of aquatic programming.

The relocation of the pool complex up the hill to the former site of a baseball/softball field is part of a complete reimagining of lower Marilla Park.

As for this summer, both BOPARC pools will be open daily from noon-6 p.m., with evening swim hours until 8 p.m. on select Fridays.

Daily admission to the pools is \$6 for adults; \$5 for children 4-17 and seniors 55+. Children under 3 are free with a paying adult and slide passes are available at Marilla for \$3.


Sunday is discount day at the pools. Admission for a group of four is \$15, with up to two additional admitted for \$2 each.

An individual can purchase a season pool pass for \$110 or \$130 (with slides). A family pass for up to four people can be purchased for \$200 or \$230 (with slides) and \$25 for each additional person.

As in summers past, BOPARC also offers a number of pool programs, including swimming lessons and aquatic fitness classes like power splash, shallow fit, deep interval and aqua boxing.



From trails to playgrounds, lake offers more than water

Nearly hidden, less than 2 miles down Morgan Run Road from Monongalia County 857 is one of the gems of Cheat Lake.

Cheat Lake Park and Trail and Hiking/Biking Trail, at the end of Morgan Run Road, is a good place for a walk or a family outing.

The hiking trail runs along Cheat Lake's shore and shows off the natural beauty of the location.

Though there are no lifeguards and it is "swim at your own risk," there is a sandy beach and swimming area.

The walking/biking trail is 4.5 miles long and runs along the edge of Cheat Lake. Made of compact stone, the 12-foot wide trail is handicap-accessible.

A picnic area includes several picnic

benches. These are on a first come, first served basis and cannot be reserved.

Fishermen can enjoy the nearby fishing locations and docks along the shore from which to fish of just enjoy the quiet of the lake. During the summer season, all boats must be launched from Sunset Beach, which is about four miles away on Sunset Beach Road.

Back at Cheat Lake Beach Park is a playground for the children, not to far from the free parking area. In the summer months, a pavilion with public restrooms is available.

Boat docks are publicly available for day use. During the day, these boat docks can be used to access the public restrooms and the picnic area. Boats can be launched from the park between November and April.



their revenue to the local economy than do chain competitors. The West Virginia Farmers Market Association estimated sales in 2022 to be around \$25,000,000.
