# Officials float ideas for recreational possibilities at new Flegal Reservoir

As the future emergency water supply for the greater Morgantown area, the Morgantown Utility Board's \$50 million Flegal Reservoir is all about hydration.

But will it also be about recreation?

That's the question MUB, the city of Morgantown and the

Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners have once again begun to consider.

MUB General Manager Mike McNulty said he is working with Assistant City Manager Emily Muzzarelli and representatives from BOPARC to look at the potential for "some picnic shelter options, trails and maybe some entry points for some kayaks."

The 370-million gallon reser-

voir is under construction on a 125-acre site along Cobun Creek Road, between Grafton Road and Kingwood Pike.

Questions about whether the site could also be a focus for recreation are nearly as old as the project itself.

In January of 2019, former MUB General Manager Tim Ball said recreation options have been on the table for years,

describing the "open invitation we've had with BOPARC since the fall of 2015."

Ball also noted it was MUB's stance that any recreational amenities would fall under the city/BOPARC's management responsibility.

Further, as the reservoir is a potential water source, no motorized watercrafts will

## Mylan sues Teva over MS drug

Alleges company stifled competition for its med Copaxone

The tangled world of generic pharmaceuticals took another twist last week, as Mylan Pharmaceuticals filed suit in federal court against Israel-based Teva, alleging Teva illegally schemed to stifle competition for its multiple sclerosis drug Copaxone.

Morgantown-based Mylan Pharmaceuticals — not its parent company Viatris — filed the suit in U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey against Teva and several of its subsidiaries.

Back in 2015, Teva, the world's largest generics manufacturer, made a failed bid to take over Mylan while Mylan was failing in a bid to take over another rival, Perrigo.

And Teva and Mylan are co-defendants in one of several lawsuits playing out in Pennsylvania federal court alleging they and other generics firms regularly collude to divvy up market share and control prices. (Last week Teva reached a \$925,000 settlement with the state of Mississippi in this case.)

Also, as we reported last week, Mylan and Viatris won a significant victory in a federal class-action antitrust suit in Kansas alleging Mylan used its monopoly power to stifle competition and drive up the price of its EpiPen epinephrine auto-injector. Part of that suit — alleging that Pfizer and Teva entered into a "reverse payment" settlement that unlawfully delayed generic competition

from entering the market and competing against the EpiPen — is set to go to trial.

In the new suit, Mylan alleges Teva “was in an unusual position with respect to its branded drug Copaxone. Specifically, Copaxone put Teva in the position of delaying and foreclosing, rather than championing, generic competition.” It cites a federal district court judge’s comment that “Teva has pursued every available avenue to prevent other glatiramer acetate [the generic for Copaxone] products from coming to market.”

Mylan says Teva’s scheme has lasted more than a decade and is largely aimed at Mylan, “the primary threat to Teva’s Copaxone franchise.”

Mylan says Teva used a variety of stalling tactics, such as abusing the regulatory and court pro-

cesses, including suits against the FDA in 2014 and 2020, and preventing market uptake of Mylan’s bioequivalent product after it finally launched.

“Teva’s playbook worked perfectly,” Mylan says. “It delayed Mylan from launching its competitive product, substantially impeded Mylan from making sales of its product to patients despite offering a significantly lower-cost alternative to Copaxone, and enabled Teva to enjoy substantial ill-gotten gains at the expense of patients, insurers and the government.”

Mylan reports a recent study showed the 2019 annual out-of-pocket for Copaxone for a Medicare patient was \$6,672. A Teva employee’s price was

\$1,673.33, compared to \$12 for Mylan’s generic.

In 2104, Mylan says, Teva undertook another strategy to maintain its monopoly: As its 20 mg/ml formulation began facing generic competition, it introduced a 40 mg/ml version, which still had market exclusivity, and pushed patients onto that by raising the price on the 20 mg dosage. “Experts estimate that the strategy cost the U.S. health care system between \$4.3 and \$6.5 billion in excess spending.”

Mylan also lists three other tactics Teva employed: It contracted with specialty pharmacies and pharmacy benefit managers to limit generic substitution; it lobbied doctors to write brand-name-only prescriptions;

and it used patient programs to incentivize patients to remain on the brand-name version.

Copaxone was a critical part of Teva’s lineup, Mylan says, making up about 19% of its 2017 revenue, peaking at \$3.3 billion in the U.S. in 2016.

Mylan is seeking various forms of relief. It wants an injunction against Teva representing that generic glatiramer acetate is less effective than Copaxone and for Teva to take corrective action and issue retractions. It also wants an injunction against any other activity designed to hamper competition. And it wants various monetary damages.

With the suit just filed, Teva has not yet had time to file a response. The Dominion Post contacted Teva Friday afternoon for comment and was awaiting reply.

balloon fight, inflatable slides, arts and crafts, a bounce house and more.

“We’re really excited about giving the community something outside that’s safe and organized and all in one area,” she said.

2021 is the first year for Freedom Day, but Harding said she hopes to make it an annual event and work with park and community partners to grow.

Tara Dalton, who brought her two girls, ages 10 and 4, said she’s glad Mylan Park decided to host Freedom Day.

“We haven’t been able to do much (because of COVID), and Morgantown’s not big on having kids’ activities, so there’s not a ton of stuff,” she said. “So this is really nice. I’m glad they threw this.”

Ginger Dalton brought her 11-year-old son Jay and was also glad for the chance to get out for a bit.

“We welcomed the

opportunity to come out of the house,” she said. “It’s been so hard with the pandemic, you know, the kids being quarantined for so long. So, any opportunity to get the kids out of the house, interacting with each other, we were so excited.”

Harding said while Mylan Park started as a sports facility, it has activities for kids of all ages, including a summer camp.

Sebastian Braud, 11, said he really enjoyed shooting at the basketball hoop that returned the ball and playing pickleball.

“A lot of it, all of it pretty much was fun,” he said.

be permitted.

Those sentiments were echoed during the most recent meeting of the MUB Board of Directors.

“We’ve certainly conveyed all of that to the city, and I think they are respecting that thought and that’s part of what we’re getting started in the conversation, so everyone can get a good look at what’s really there and what’s available,” McNulty said.

As for the city, Communications Director Andrew Stacy reiterated the recreation topic has gone hand-in-hand with the reservoir project. He said the city has been a part of that discussion

all along.

“The city remains committed to working through these discussions with MUB in a collaborative fashion so that we can maximize the benefit of this important community resource,” he said.

As for the project itself, the dam structure needs to be built to full height this construction season in order to allow settlement to occur through the winter.

MUB Spokesman Chris Dale said substantial completion of the project is currently expected sometime next fall.

Once the project is complete, MUB will plant some 14,000 trees at the site.

religion and faith among other things.

Individuals who choose to become a PFLAG member can choose one of several annual membership levels, including student (\$15 per year), household (\$40 per year), gold (\$75 per year plus one-time donation of \$35) or platinum (\$100 per year plus a one-time donation of \$60).

Individuals who want to contribute to PFLAG Morgantown but do not wish to become a member can make a one-time donation to the organization via the organization’s website and PayPal. They can also choose to volunteer at a PFLAG event or choose PFLAG Morgantown to receive 0.5% of what they spend on Amazon purchases by shopping at Amazon Smile.

A representative of PFLAG Morgantown did not respond to attempts to reach them for comment.

Morgantown Pride is a local organization that provides social and educational resources for the LGBTQ+ community, friends and allies in Monongalia County. Its main focus is to sponsor and participate in events and programs that enrich the Morgantown community and affirm the value of LGBTQ+ individuals within the Morgantown community.

The organization frequently hosts fundraisers, rallies, vigils and social events for members and allies of the LGBTQ+ community to attend.

To support the organization, interested individuals can join the Morgantown Pride Patreon and become a member, volunteer with the organization or share their positive experiences with the organization to help it grow its list of inclusive businesses

in the community.

Ash Orr is the founder, former president and current outreach coordinator for Morgantown Pride — as well as chair of the Morgantown Human Rights Commission and LGBTQ liaison to Morgantown City Hall. They were brought onto the HRC last summer as a liaison for Morgantown Pride and worked their way up to being elected as chair.

They are the first non-binary transgender chair member of the Morgantown HRC.

Orr founded Morgantown Pride in 2019. The organization was meant to facilitate queer advocacy and create a community space for queer people in the area to come together, feel safe and have access to resources.

Orr believes that Morgantown is an inclusive city, evidenced by its nondiscrimination ordinance and its council’s reception of ideas of other ordinances that would further extend those protections.

“In terms of Morgantown, I do feel that it is relatively safe to be a queer person here — especially in comparison to other parts of our state,” Orr said.

They said that they believe the biggest challenge faced by the LGBTQ+ community today in the state as a whole is struggling with validation and acknowledgement that the community exists.

Orr said it’s difficult to see politicians across the state actively pushing laws and bills that are against the queer community. Acceptance, validation and safety of LGBTQ+ individuals are threatened persistently.

The City of Morgantown should continue to listen to its minority communities and work with them to address their needs and concerns, Orr said. Municipalities like Morgantown that do listen to the LGBTQ+ community and

do work to make the environment safer for them can serve as a beacon of hope and possibly put pressure on other municipalities, which would in turn put pressure on politicians in Charleston, to pass more progressive and protective laws.

“In terms of the entire state of West Virginia, we need better representation,” Orr said.

Monongalia County is fortunate to have strong delegates that support the LGBTQ+ community and actively lift them up and try to work with them. Orr said we need more representation like that in the state as a whole, because when you get to Charleston, there is a lot of opposition.

“We just need more allies and more queer individuals either running for office or getting involved to overturn these corrupt politicians. I feel like that’s the only way things are going to get better,” they said.

West Virginia University’s LGBTQ Center provides programming and academic resources for university students, faculty, staff and community members. The center supports the university’s educational social justice efforts through training, classes and advocacy on WVU campuses and across the state. The center focuses on addressing all aspects of inequality when contending with LGBTQ-related inequities, including homophobia, transphobia, racism, misogyny, xenophobia, ableism and more.

The center also provides a comfortable atmosphere for organizing, socializing, teaching and learning.

The LGBTQ Center offers inclusive programming and outreach initiatives. It collaborates with and supports the university’s larger social justice efforts by providing inclusive, academic and curricular development training on all campuses by advocating for members of the community and by building coalitions. It also works throughout the state to improve understanding of LGBTQIA+ issues.

Students are encouraged

to use the LGBTQ+ Center lounge for studying, meeting friends, working on class projects, watching documentaries and more. The center offers additional meeting spaces and snacks as well.

Brad Grimes, program specialist with the WVU LGBTQ+ Center and Women’s Resource Center, said that the center is happy to do anything that it can to help students get the resolutions, supportive measures and the outcomes necessary to make them feel safe and welcome on campus.

To Grimes, the center’s most significant contribution to supporting the LGBTQ+ community is fostering a positive, affirming and inclusive campus for its LGBTQ+ community as well as educating others who do not identify as LGBTQ+ on how to be more informed, more accepting and better allies and colleagues.

“The education and the advocacy — those are our biggest achievements,” Grimes said.

He said the LGBTQ+ community can also work to better support other members of the community by building community within the huge LGBTQ+ umbrella; fighting racism and being more inclusive of LGBTQ+ people of color; keeping an eye on each other and reporting instances of discrimination, harassment or abuse; as well as mentoring other members of the community and listening or seeking to understand other members of the community as often as possible.

Grimes said, as a member of the LGBTQ+ community himself, it took him 40 years to fully comprehend some very important lessons regarding being a member of the LGBTQ+ community and what Pride Month is all about.

“Love yourself. Celebrate your uniqueness and who you are. Refuse to be shamed or diminished because of who you are or who you love, because who you are is amazing. It does get better. You are not alone.”

# Records show pressure by Trump on Ariz.

PHOENIX — Newly released records show the top Republicans in Arizona's largest county dodged calls from Donald Trump and his allies in the aftermath of the 2020 election, as the then-president sought to prevent the certification of Joe Biden's victory in key battleground states.

The records — including voicemails and text messages — shed light on another state where Trump, his attorneys and others mounted a behind-the-scenes pressure campaign on Republican offi-

cial overseeing elections. Days before Congress certified Biden's win on Jan. 6, Trump pressed Georgia Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger to find enough votes to overturn Biden's win there.

Trump tried to reach Clint Hickman, then the chairman of the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors, on Jan. 3, shortly before midnight in Washington and hours after news broke of Trump's call with Raffensperger.

"Hello, sir. This is the White House operator. I was calling to let you know that the president's available to take your call

if you're free," the White House operator said in a voicemail. "If you could please give us a call back, sir, that'd be great. You have a good evening."

Hickman told The Arizona Republic, which first received the records from Maricopa County, he did not return the phone call. He said he presumed Trump would try to pressure him to change election results or discuss election conspiracies as he had done with Raffensperger.

"I'm not going to tape a president, so I'm not going to talk to a president," Hickman told the Republic.

### Demolition of collapsed condo to start today

SURFSIDE, Fla. — Demolition workers planned to bring down the remainder of a collapsed condo building on Sunday ahead of an approaching storm that added to worries the damaged structure could come down on its own, officials said Saturday.

Miami-Dade Mayor Daniella Levine Cava, meanwhile, said two more bodies were found in the rubble, bringing the number of confirmed dead to 24. The number of people who remained unaccounted for in the collapse was 124.

Worries have intensified over the past week that the damaged structure could come tumbling down on its own, endangering the crews below and complicating the search for victims.

Fire Rescue Assistant Fire Chief Raide Jadallah told family members during a morning briefing the building would be brought down "as soon as possible. First thing tomorrow."

But he cautioned there "may be some hiccups." A follow-up meeting will be held in the afternoon to finalize details of the demolition, which could be a precarious operation as experts enter the building to bore into the structure to install explosives.

### Ransomware attack leaves biz scrambling

Businesses scrambled Saturday to contain a ransomware attack that has paralyzed their computer networks, a situation complicated in the U.S. by offices lightly staffed at the start of the Fourth of July holiday weekend.

In Sweden, most of the grocery chain Coop's 800 stores were unable to open because their cash registers weren't working, according to SVT, the country's public broadcaster. The Swedish State Railways and a major local pharmacy chain were also affected.

Cybersecurity experts say the REvil gang, a major Russian-speaking ransomware syndicate, appears to be behind the attack that targeted a software supplier called Kaseya, using its network-management package as a conduit to spread the ransomware through cloud-service providers.

Kaseya CEO Fred Voccola said in a statement late Friday night the company believes it has identified the source of the vulnerability and will "release that patch as quickly as possible to get our customers back up and running."

### 11 people in custody after standoff on I-95

WAKEFIELD, Mass. — An hourslong standoff with a group of heavily armed men that partially shut down Interstate 95

ended Saturday with nine suspects in custody, Massachusetts state police said.

Police said the suspects include two people who were arrested earlier on Saturday.

The standoff shut down a portion of I-95 for much of the morning, causing major traffic problems during the Fourth of July holiday weekend.

Authorities said the southbound interstate reopened, but northbound lanes remain closed.

The standoff began around 2 a.m. when police noticed two cars pulled over on I-95 with hazard lights on after they had apparently run out of fuel, authorities said at a Saturday press briefing.

### Rioters accused of erasing content

PHOENIX — They flaunted their participation in the Jan. 6 riot at the U.S. Capitol on social media and then, apparently realizing they were in legal trouble, rushed to delete evidence of it, authorities say. Now their attempts to cover up their role in the deadly siege are likely to come back to haunt them in court.

An Associated Press review of court records has found at least 49 defendants are accused of trying to erase incriminating photos, videos and texts from phones or social media accounts documenting their conduct as a pro-Donald Trump mob stormed Congress and briefly interrupted the certification of Democrat Joe Biden's election victory.

Experts say the efforts to scrub the social media accounts reveal a desperate willingness to manipulate evidence once these people realized they were in hot water. And, they say, it can serve as powerful proof of people's consciousness of guilt and can make it harder to negotiate plea deals and seek leniency at sentencing.

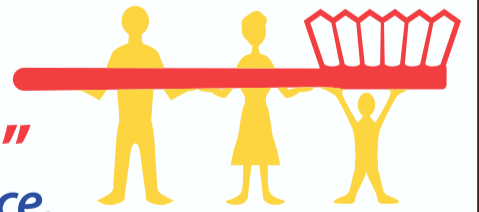

**Nevada gambling icon dies at age 96**

SPARKS, Nev. — John Ascuaga, the son of Basque sheepherders who became a northern Nevada gambling icon after he bought a small coffee shop with a few slot machines in Sparks in 1960 and turned it into a major hotel-casino he operated for more than a half century, has died. He was 96.

Ascuaga was known for roaming the casino floor and greeting patrons personally at the Nugget that bore his name along U.S. Interstate 80 just east of Reno until it first was sold in 2013.

Anthony Marnell III, CEO of Marnell Gaming which acquired the property now called the Nugget Casino Resort in 2016, said Ascuaga's family notified them of his death Monday. The cause of death was not disclosed.

Ascuaga's father moved to Idaho from Spain in the early 1900s. He was born in Caldwell,

Idaho, in January 1925, served in the U.S. Army in his youth and earned degrees in accounting at the University of Idaho and restaurant management at Washington State University.

He got his start in the industry as a bellman at a lodge in Idaho where he met casino pioneer Dick Graves. Graves owned small Nugget casinos in Reno, Carson City and Yerington before opening one in Sparks in 1955 and hiring Ascuaga as a manager.

Ascuaga bought it in 1960 and soon began a variety of expansion projects that turned it into today's 1,600-room property in two towers with a convention center and multiple restaurants.

One of the first additions was a 600-seat show room, dubbed "The Circus Room," where Red Skelton, Liberace, Wayne Newton, Ella Fitzgerald, George Burns and Ray Charles preformed.

**Garden club keeps Charleston blooming for 100 years**

CHARLESTON — If you've taken a stroll through Davis Park, noticed the plant boxes full of flowers in downtown Charleston, enjoyed the thousand daffodils that covered an entire side of Spring Hill Cemetery or relaxed on a bench in Ruffner Park, then you have benefited from the quiet efforts of the Kanawha Garden Club — which entered its second century last week.

"Four women were sitting on the porch of the house that's now owned by Brooks and Bobby McCabe on Staunton Road in 1921. And they decided to form a garden club," said Jennie Ferretti, club historian and a former club president.

She rattled off the names: Julie Staunton Clay, Louise Schoonmaker Chilton, Margaret Ward McCabe — who eventually became the grandmother of public service commissioner and former state legislator Brooks McCabe — and Caroline Staunton Hill.

It was June 23, 1921. They were friends, the wives of some of the more prominent citizens of the Kanawha Valley at the time. And one of them was relatively new to town.

"I think it was inspired by Louise Chilton's mother, who had been part of a garden club in Kingston, New York," said club president Ditsy Keightley.

"And that garden club was part of the Garden Club of America. So I believe they formed the

club with the intention of qualifying it to be a member of the Garden Club of America," she said.

Joining the national organization would bring landscape architects to Charleston to speak to the community. We still do that kind of thing now. And civic beautification. That's where Ruffner Park came up."

Around the time the club was formed, what was the city-owned Ruffner Cemetery on Kanawha Boulevard was in the

midst of conversion to Spring Hill Cemetery — meaning graves and headstones were being relocated, so the land, between Ruffner Street and the Capitol, could be transformed into a park.

Founding club member Louise Chilton was actively involved in the conversion of Ruffner Cemetery to Ruffner Park.

"People had the option to move their family up to Spring Hill when the cemetery was founded. Some of them either didn't choose or couldn't afford to move their relatives. Or we couldn't find them," said Keightley.

So, "There are still a lot of graves underneath Ruffner Park. There are a number of graves and headstones, some buried headstones."

It is Charleston's first public park — by design, a restful, reverent place with scattering of benches and a canopy of trees hiding nearby homes so that it offered "a little sanctuary of green space," said Keightley.

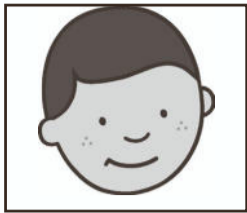

## Tiny, Shiny Hummingbirds

### Mini Fact:

When migrating, some hummingbirds travel as far as 23 miles in one day.

Hummingbirds were called "glittering fragments of the rainbow" by the famous bird artist John Audubon. They are some of the only birds in the world with so many super-bright, shiny colors.

The broad-billed hummingbird is found only in Mexico and the southwestern United States.

As hummingbirds flit around this summer, The Mini Page learns more about these amazing birds.

### Colorful creatures

Hummingbirds get some of their colors from pigments, or chemical colors, just like most birds do. These pigments always show the same color.

For example, a blue jay is always blue, no matter how the light hits its feathers.

But the hummingbird's brightest colors come from the way its feathers are made. Tiny layers of feather cells break the light into brilliant colors, just as water breaks light into a rainbow. Unless the light hits the bird just right, you can't see the bright colors at all. The bird just looks dark.

### A colorful strategy

The ability to display colors when they want is a great help to hummingbirds. A male flashes his bright colors to attract a female or scare off an enemy. Even a hawk can be scared off if it sees a sudden burst of color.

Many females have white tips on their tail feathers. Although most females are not as brightly colored as males, they often flash their white-tipped tail feathers to scare off enemies.

### Small ...

Hummingbirds need these defensive tools partly because of their size.

Hummingbirds are so tiny that one of their enemies is an insect, the praying mantis. The smallest bird on Earth is the Cuban bee hummingbird. It is less than 2 inches long from the tip of its beak to the tip of its tail. It weighs about 6/100 of an ounce.

### ... but mighty!

Hummingbirds get their name from the hum created by the superfast beat of their wings. The smallest ones beat their wings the fastest, up to 80 times per second. Their wings beat so fast that people see only a blur.

A hummingbird's flight muscles make up about one-third of its weight, a bigger amount than in any other bird. They are the only birds that can fly backward, upside

down or sideways for more than a few seconds. They are so good at flying that most don't ever walk. They use their feet only to perch. Even when they are just changing position on a branch, they fly.

### Fueling up

Hummingbirds are so active that they need to eat at least every 30 minutes when they're not sleeping. They eat some insects, but their main food is nectar from flowers or trees. Water makes up about three-fourths of nectar. Sucrose, or ordinary table sugar, makes up the rest.

Their long, thin beaks help them drink from flower blossoms. The bills of many hummingbirds are the longest of any birds in relation to their body size.

You can help hummingbirds and give yourselves a treat by putting out feeders or planting the flowers they like.

Hummingbirds' favorite flowers are red, red-orange or pink. Feeders often have red decorations because hummingbirds know red means food. But do not put red food coloring in the feeder nectar because this could harm the birds.

### Nectar recipe

To make nectar, all you need are four parts of water and one part of white table sugar. For example, dissolve 1 cup of sugar in 4 cups of water.

**'Elsa' falls to tropical storm as it batters Haiti**

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti — Hurricane Elsa fell back to tropical storm force as it brushed past Haiti and the Dominican Republic Saturday and threatened to unleash flooding and landslides before taking aim at Cuba and Florida.

The storm was centered about 255 miles east of Kingston, Jamaica, and was moving west-northwest at 29 mph. It had maximum sustained winds of 70 mph as the tropical storm, which had been a Category 1 hurricane earlier Saturday, weakened during its approach to Hispaniola and Cuba, according to the National Hurricane Center in Miami.

The long-term forecast track showed it heading toward Florida as a tropical storm by Tuesday morning, but some models would carry it into the Gulf or up the Atlantic Coast.

In Haiti, authorities used social media to alert people about the storm and urged them to evacuate if they lived near water or mountain flanks.

Haiti is especially vulnerable to floods and landslides because of widespread erosion and deforestation. In addition, a recent spike in gang violence has forced thousands of people to flee from their homes, so the civil protection agency is running low on basic items including food and water, director Jerry Chandler told The Associated Press.

**Vatican indicts 10 in London deal**

ROME — A Vatican judge on Saturday indicted 10 people, including a once-powerful cardinal, on charges including embezzlement, abuse of office, extortion and fraud in connection with the Secretariat of State's 350 million-euro investment in a London real estate venture.

The president of the Vatican's criminal tribunal, Giuseppe Pignatone, set July 27 as the trial date, though lawyers for some defendants questioned how they could prepare for trial so soon given they hadn't yet formally received the indictment.

The 487-page indictment request was issued following a sprawling, two-year investigation into how the Secretariat of State managed its vast asset portfolio, much of which is funded by donations from the faithful. The scandal over its multimillion-dollar losses has resulted in a sharp reduction in donations and prompted Pope Francis to strip the office of its ability to manage the money.

Five former Vatican officials, including Cardinal Angelo Becciu and two officials from the Secretariat of State, were indicted, as well as the Italian businessmen who handled the investment.

Vatican prosecutors accuse the main suspects of bilking millions of euros from the Holy See in fees, bad investments and other losses related to financial dealings that were funded in large part by Peter's Pence donations to the pope for works of

charity. The suspects have denied wrongdoing.

**At least 43 migrants drown off Tunisia**

TUNIS, Tunisia — At least 43 migrants drowned off the coast of Tunisia Saturday and 84 others were rescued after their boat capsized overnight, the Tunisian Red Crescent said.

Mongi Slim, head of the organization, told The AP the boat, which was carrying 127 migrants, left Libya's coastal city of Zuwara Friday to cross the Mediterranean Sea toward Italy. He said 46 Sudanese, 16 Eritreans and 12 Bengalis were among the migrants.

The defense ministry's spokesperson, Mohamed Zekri, said the 84 migrants were rescued by fishermen. He declined to confirm the drowning of the other migrants.

Libya is a frequent departure point for migrants making the dangerous Mediterranean Sea crossing. Several shipwrecks from smugglers' boats carrying migrants have occurred in recent weeks, as attempts to reach Europe become more frequent amid warmer summer weather.

Last week, Tunisian coast guards found seven bodies on the beaches of Djerba, an island off the southern coast. They were buried at the cemetery for migrants in Zarzis, who perished in the Mediterranean Sea.

**Forest draws crowd for 'Rainbow Gathering'**

CARSON NATIONAL FOREST, N.M. — Across a mile-long stretch of forest in a remote part of north-

ern New Mexico, the party is in full swing.

This is the Rainbow Family.

The Carson National Forest, just beyond the tourist enclave of Taos, was chosen as the spot for this year's national gathering. But people also were congregating for the July 4 celebration in Pennsylvania and elsewhere.

The so-called Rainbow Gathering — which draws an array of characters who range from office workers looking to get away from the daily grind to nature lovers and those who have mastered van life — was set to culminate Sunday in a silent hand-holding circle punctuated by a loud "ohm."

**At least 19 missing in Tokyo mudslide**

TOKYO — A powerful mudslide carrying a deluge of black water and debris crashed into rows of houses in a town west of Tokyo following heavy rains Saturday, leaving at least 19 people missing, officials said.

As many as 80 homes in Atami were completely buried, according to an official with the Fire and Disaster Management Agency.

The official said more people, possibly 100, could still be missing under the mudslides but warned details were not immediately clear. The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, stressed that aggressive rescue operations were underway to find survivors.

Shizuoka prefecture spokesman Takamichi Sugiyama said the prefecture confirmed at least 19 dead, although it may grow.

**Europe in vaccination race against the Delta variant**

LISBON, Portugal — Countries across Europe are scrambling to accelerate coronavirus vaccinations and outpace the spread of the more infectious Delta variant, in a high-stakes race to prevent hospital wards from filling up again with patients fighting for their lives.

The urgency coincides with Europe's summer holidays, with fair weather bringing more social gatherings and governments reluctant to clamp down on them. Social distancing is being neglected, especially among the young, and some countries are scrapping the requirement to wear masks outdoors.

Incentives for people to get shots include free groceries, travel and entertainment vouchers and prize drawings. The president of Cyprus even appealed to a sense of patriotism.

The risk of infection from the Delta variant is "high to very high" for partially or unvaccinated communities, according to the European Centre for Disease Control, which monitors 30 countries on the continent. It estimates that by the end of August, the variant will account for 90% of cases in the European Union's 27 nations.

The World Health Organization is also concerned. The variant makes transmission growth "exponential," according to Maria Van Kerkhove, its technical lead on COVID-19.

Daily new case numbers

are already climbing sharply in countries like the United Kingdom, Portugal and Russia.

In the U.K., cases of the Delta variant have increased fourfold in less than a month, with confirmed cases Friday up 46% on the previous week.

Portuguese health authorities this week reported a "vertiginous" rise in the Delta variant, which accounted for only 4% of cases in May but almost 56% in June. The country is reporting its highest number of daily cases since February, and the number of COVID-19 patients in hospitals has surpassed 500 for the first time since early April.

In some countries, the virus is spreading much faster among younger people. In Spain, the national 14-day case notification rate per 100,000 people rose to 152 Friday. But for the 20-29 age group, it shot up to 449.

Those numbers have triggered alarm across the continent.

Dr. Hans Kluge, the head of the WHO's Europe office, cautioned this week the Delta variant is poised to become dominant by August in the 53-country region his office covers. And he notes that 63% of people in that region haven't had a first jab.

"The three conditions for a new wave of excess hospitalizations and deaths before the (fall) are therefore in place: New variants, deficit in vaccine uptake, increased social mixing," Kluge said.

## Social worker pens book as gift to clients

In the annals of human experience and human interaction, consider ... the cheeseburger.

Not the kind you grab at the drive-thru, and certainly not the ones wrapped in cellophane you pop in the microwave.

"... The best burger is the one that starts with an 80/20 ratio of

meat and fat. Any leaner, it will be dry and not juicy. When forming into a patty, make the burger thicker on the outside and thinner in the middle. This allows for more even cooking ..."

Joyce Walker Bennett, who retired last month as a social worker in the Early Head Start program for Monongalia County Schools, wrote the book on cheese-

burgers and everything else.

Her cheeseburger recipe is entry No. 16 in her book, "Life Lessons to my Early Head Start Moms," which she penned as a reverse-retirement gift to the young women with children she's been calling on in the past couple years in her job.

Bennett, who spent 25 years with the school district and a few

years before that working in foster care, wanted to let those moms and their families know she wasn't ready to stop helping them, even if she is moving on the next chapter.

"Maybe this is something they'll go back to over the years," Bennett said of her book that contains 60, one-page observations, thoughts and practical asides,

such as the cheeseburger recipe.

"I can't stop caring, even though I'm quitting work."

## Grill safely this 4th of July

AT SOME POINT during this Fourth of July weekend, Ryan Walther will probably be behind a grill, cooking up some steaks or burgers and maybe some veggies — safely.

As a former restaurant grill cook and the sanitarian at Monongalia County Health Department who teaches food safety courses, Walther is well-versed on how to make sure to prepare foods and grill them properly.

"Obviously, now, being a sanitarian and knowing the food code led me to understand ways to prevent cross-contamination and to cook the food properly," he said.

He advises to keep surfaces clean and avoiding cross-contamination there, including when he goes back inside the house to grab more food.

"You want to be conscious of not touching surfaces that could become contaminated with bacteria from raw meat," he added.

Keeping your hands clean is a habit that has been elevated in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic, and it's no different when you are grilling.

"Hand-washing is very important, especially after handling raw meat," Walther said.

As with just about every public health topic, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (cdc.gov) is a great resource for checking out just about any food safety information you might want to know. Also, for some basic facts, you can check out MCHD Environmental Health's food website (monchd.org/food.html).

Here are some tips on handling raw meat, chicken and seafood from the CDC:

- When shopping, pick up meat, poultry and seafood last, right before checkout. Separate them from other food in your shopping cart and grocery bags. To guard against cross-contamination, put packages of raw meat and poultry into individual plastic bags.

Jim Justice's "Do it for Babydog: Save a life, Change your life" vaccination sweepstakes offers vaccinated individuals a weekly chance to win \$1 million, trucks, guns, vacations and other prizes. Several residents of Monongalia and Preston counties have won in the first two drawings, including Sharon Turner, who won the \$1 million in the second drawing.

On Friday, The Dominion Post asked people shopping in Morgantown what they thought of the lottery and what they would do if they won.

Some thought it was a waste of money. Others thought it was a good idea. But either way, the lottery didn't influence anyone The Dominion Post spoke with to get the vaccine.

"I was vaccinated long before the lottery," Dan Sowers said.

The 56-year-old said he drove to Morgantown from Shinnston for his vaccine shots. He thinks the lottery is a good idea — anything that motivates someone to save themselves or someone else is worth doing.

"If I win anything at all, I'll be happy with it. I won already, I got the vaccine and if I get sick I'm not gonna die," he said. "That's the biggest thing for me."

BJ Kelley, 72, of Morgantown, is vaccinated but did not enroll in Do it for Babydog. She said she thinks the lottery is a waste of money, and she would rather see it go to "roads and jobs."

In total, a bit over \$8 million in cash will be given away during the seven drawings, which includes \$1,588,000 instead of \$1 million for the final drawing and a \$588,000 runner-up prize in the last drawing. That doesn't include the price tag for the custom trucks and guns, free stays at state parks and other prizes.

Fairmont resident 65-year-old Joe Kisner is not vaccinated and does not like the lottery.

"He's got money to throw away on stupid stuff because of his dog," he said. Instead, the money should go to other things, such as "the highways to begin with."

Toni DeWitt, 51, of Morgan-

■ Cup hooks (optional)  
Enjoy the process of finding wood for the branches and the base. Take a walk in the woods alone, with friends or get kids involved to help scavenge a variety of wood. Bring home a few options for the base and the branches — you never know when something will break or which combination of wood will look perfect.

If you want a circular log slice base, find a fallen but not rotten tree to saw. Use a chain saw, and cut a slice or two. If the wood is strong and not cracked, you can make a thinner base — about an inch thick. However, a thicker base (two or even three inches thick) can look nice, as long as it isn't too large and cumbersome.

Use a belt sander or sand the base by hand to even out a rough cut and make the surface smooth.

A log, plain and simple or with an interesting shape or texture, also works well as a base. Find a log that is no less than a foot long for best balance. If it is

too short, your finished product may tip over once loaded up with jewelry.

Arrange different branches to see which will work best for your aesthetics and needs. You can use any type of branch — one with many offshoots or even just a single stick with no branches at all.

If opting for a single branch, consider whether it is thin enough to hook earrings over, or thick enough to support cup hooks twisted into it. If you use hooks, twist them into the branch at intervals you think will best display the items you want to hang.

You may even want to use multiple branches per base.

For any type of branch, consider the placement on the base and the angle at which it should be secured. Use a drill the same width as the branch to make a hole in the base at the angle you choose. If you have to choose between a drill bit that is too large or too thin, opt for a size down and carefully scrape off as much of the outer layer of the branch as you need to make a snug fit.

Drill a hole in the wood base. A snug fit is best.

If the fit is snug and secure, you can choose to not use wood glue. If you want to give it a little extra strength, apply some wood glue as the instructions on the bottle direct.

You can apply varnish or another type of wood finish or paint to seal your jewelry tree. However, if

you like the raw look, you can leave it as is.

Hang jewelry off the branches (or hooks, if you used a single thicker branch), and display or gift to someone who will enjoy the natural, zero waste, eco-friendly home décor.

### Regulators to probe Suddenlink complaints

CHARLESTON — West Virginia's Public Service Commission said Thursday it has opened an investigation into customer service complaints about Suddenlink Communications.

The PSC ordered Suddenlink to file information within 30 days. It also scheduled two public comment hearings and an evidentiary hearing in

August at its Charleston headquarters, the agency said in a statement.

Among the information the PSC wants are details on customer complaint call logs, worker training, completed and projected improvement projects to cable service, specific outage information and the processes used to issue and track trouble tickets.

### Lead water lines in Clarksburg under review

CLARKSBURG — West Virginia officials will review lead service lines in Clarksburg for elevated levels of the toxin in drinking water.

The Department of Health and Human Resources on Friday said the review comes after sampling in several homes showed lead levels above a limit set by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Dr. Ayne Amjad, the state health officer, urged parents of young children who live in older homes to discuss the risk of lead exposure with a pediatrician.

town, said she thinks the lottery is a good idea, but it wasn't the reason she got vaccinated. She also thinks more outreach is needed, especially to vulnerable populations.

"I think the population it's not helping, it's gonna take a lot more outreach,"

she said. "Like that are on the edges of society, drug addicts, homeless people, elderly people that aren't really paying attention."

There was only one answer on people's minds about what they would do with the million bucks if they won and DeWitt put it best: "Just pay bills like everybody else."

■ Keep meat, poultry and seafood refrigerated until ready to grill. When transporting, keep at 40 degrees or below in an insulated cooler.

■ Wash your hands with soap before and after handling raw meat, poultry and seafood. Wash work surfaces, utensils and the grill before and after cooking.

■ Use a moist cloth or paper towel to clean the grill surface before cooking. If you use a wire bristle brush, thoroughly inspect the grill's surface before cooking. Wire bristles from grill cleaning brushes may dislodge and stick into food on the grill.

■ Throw out marinades and sauces that have touched raw meat juices, which can spread germs to cooked foods. Use clean utensils and a clean plate to remove cooked meat from the grill.

■ Use a food thermometer to ensure meat is cooked hot enough to kill harmful germs. When smoking, keep temperatures inside the smoker at 225-300 degrees to keep meat a safe temperature while it cooks.

According to the CDC, correct food temperatures are:

■ 145 degrees — Whole cuts of beef, pork, lamb and veal (stand-time of three

minutes at this temperature)

■ 145 degrees — Fish  
■ 160 degrees — Hamburgers and other ground beef

■ 165 degrees — All poultry and pre-cooked meats, like hot dogs

■ And then keep food at 140 degrees or warmer until it's served

Grills that have an extra rack on top are a great way to grill vegetables safely without coming into contact with meat, Walther noted.

"It's like low heat and not directly on the flame," he said. "If you're doing something like squash and zucchini, wrapping it in aluminum foil with olive oil, salt and pepper on a low heat rack. It keeps it away from the meat."

And when you're done cooking, it's also important to put the leftovers in shallow containers and place in the refrigerator or freezer within two hours, or one hour if it's above 90 degrees outside, which it has been often lately.

Grilling out is a great summer pastime and also can be a healthy way to cook your food, as long as you follow safety tips. So have fun with your family and friends and fire up the grill!

## McBride to stay in NBA Draft

Deuce McBride has played his last game in a West Virginia uniform and has decided to keep his name in the 2021 NBA Draft.

"Yeah, he's staying in," WVU head coach Bob Huggins said. "He called me late (Friday) night and told me he's staying in the draft."

McBride led the Mountaineers in scoring last season at 15.9 points per game and he shot 41.4% from 3-point range while dishing out 140 assists over 29 games.

The Mountaineers fell to Syracuse in the second round of the NCAA tournament to end last season.

Since then, both McBride and forward Derek Culver have announced their intentions on turning pro and forgoing their remaining college eligibility.

"We support Deuce and Derek in their decisions and, obviously, we want both of them to have success," Huggins said. "Any player who has played for me and gone through this process, I've wanted them all to have the most success they could have."

McBride was invited to last month's NBA Combine in Chicago and performed well in front of NBA scouts and general managers.

McBride also compared favorably in most of his physical measurements at the combine.

McBride's standing vertical leap was measured at 31 inches, fourth highest among point guards.

He completed the lane agility drill in 11.08 seconds, fifth highest among point guards.

His wingspan was just under 6-foot-9 and his hand width was measured at 9.5 inches, tops among all point guards at the combine.

Heading into the combine, McBride was projected as an early second-round pick, but had moved up into the late first round by many projections following the combine.

Huggins said he wasn't sure if any team had officially told McBride they would take him in the first round.

"I don't know if anyone really knows for sure or where Deuce may go," Huggins said. "I don't know of any teams that will come out and say something like that."

If picked in the first round, McBride would be guaranteed a contract for two years.

According to the NBA salary scale, McBride could earn at least \$3.3 million over those two years as a late first-round selection.

If McBride were to fall out of the first round, he would not have a guaranteed contract and would have to make the team at training camp.

Culver, meanwhile, is not projected to be picked, but announced in April he was turning pro regardless if he's selected in the draft or not.

Since the end of last season, Huggins believed losing both players early was a possibility and recruited accordingly.

He signed two shot-blocking forwards in Pauly Paulicap and Dimon Carrigan and an additional point guard in Malik Curry.

"If you look at it, we've lost two all-Big 12 first-team players and potentially two All-Americans," Huggins said. "We tried to prepare for virtually everything. I think we're as well equipped as we possibly could be, but it's hard to replace the experience that we've lost. I think we did as good a job as we could."

If McBride is picked in the first round, he would be the Mountaineers' sixth all-time first-rounder and the first since Joe Alexander in 2008.

The 2021 NBA Draft is scheduled for July 29 at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

## Huggins talks reality of transfer portal, 2021-22 roster

Bob Huggins is not about to play naive with the current state of college basketball or even with the current WVU men's basketball roster.

With the transfer portal alive and well, college coaches have quickly realized that roster stability is anything but stable.

"It's never been this fluid," Huggins said during a Zoom call. "Ever."

The traditional two- or three-year building plans are no longer the blueprint for success.

Heck, Huggins even went lower than that.

"One year plans are done," he said. The reason? There is no clear-cut way in determining what the Mountaineers' roster will look like past the 2021-22 season.

In truth, the roster could change dramatically before next season even begins, depending on Deuce McBride's decision to stay in the NBA Draft or not.

That decision has to be official by July 7.

There will be other WVU players who will eventually have to make their own difficult choices.

Examples: Sean McNeil could be eligible to play as a fifth-year senior in 2022 or forwards Jalen Bridges and Isaiah Cottrell could decide to leave school early and turn pro.

More to the point will be future decisions made by the Mountaineers' core of younger players and whether they remain with the program.

"We're going to bring freshmen in where if everything doesn't go the way they want it to go or maybe it's over their head or they don't like this or don't like that, they can leave," through the portal, Huggins explained. "It's an entirely different situation."

WVU's 2021 recruiting class may be its most unique ever in that it includes three freshmen and three graduate seniors who have already earned their college degrees at another school.

The freshmen are guards Kobe Johnson and Seth Wilson out of Ohio and forward Jamel King, who originally signed with New Mexico State before getting a release.

The seniors are forwards Dimon Carrigan and Pauly Paulicap and guard Malik Curry.

Along with those three seniors, Gabe

**Narváez, García, Peterson lead Brewers to 11th straight win**

**Milwaukee's longest streak since 1987**

PITTSBURGH — Omar Narváez had five hits, Avisail García drove in five runs and Jace Peterson added four RBIs as the Milwaukee Brewers rolled to their 11th straight victory, 11-2 over the Pittsburgh Pirates on Saturday.

It is the Brewers' longest winning streak since they began the 1987 season with a franchise-record 13 victories in a row. The NL Central leaders have outscored their opponents 84-28 during the streak.

"It's fun," García said. "I think everybody is playing together, everybody is playing hard, everybody is trying to do their part. It's not one, two, three guys. It's everyone contributing and that's how we have to win ballgames."

The five hits — all singles — were a career high for Narváez, who previously had two four-hit games. He lined out in the ninth inning to finish 5 for 6.

Narváez lifted his batting average to .303, quite an improvement from last year. He hit .176 during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season after being acquired from Seattle in an offseason trade.

"I mean, once last season ended, I tried to forget what happened in 2020," Narváez said. "It was in the past and 2021 was a new season and I'm just trying to get better and better."

Peterson and García each had three of the Brewers' 16 hits. Peterson is 16 for 33 with 11 RBIs in

his last 13 games while primarily filling in at second base for injured Kolten Wong.

"He's locked in, and he has a great feel what he's doing," Brewers manager Craig Counsell said. "He's making a huge impact. It's no coincidence that this streak has lined up with Jace doing some great things."

Christian Yelich scored three times and drew three walks.

Eric Lauer (3-3) allowed one run and four hits in 6 1/3 innings. He struck out four and walked four while beating Pittsburgh for the first time in five career starts.

The Pirates' losing streak reached six games. They have scored just seven runs during the skid.

Pittsburgh rookie Cody Ponce (0-2) lasted only 1 2/3 innings in his second start of the season. He was tagged for five runs and six hits while walking three and striking out three.

Ponce left after being examined on the mound by an athletic trainer, and the Pirates said he had right arm soreness. Ponce was a Brewers second-round draft pick in 2015 and was facing them for the first time.

"We were too much in the middle of the plate with pitches," Pittsburgh manager Derek Shelton said, referring to his entire staff.

Milwaukee broke to a 3-0 lead in the first inning. García hit a two-run double to left-center with two outs and scored on Peter-

son's double.

The Brewers added two more in the second to make it 5-0 on consecutive two-out RBI singles by Narváez and García.

Peterson had a run-scoring single in the sixth, and another run scored on a wild pitch to make it 7-1. The Brewers added two runs in the eighth and two more in the ninth.

Pirates rookie Jared Oliva had his first career RBI with a single in the second inning and Ben Gamel homered in the eighth. Gamel had two hits and is 8 for 19 (.421) this season against the Brewers, his former team.

"Right now we're just not giving ourselves any scoring opportunities," Shelton said. "We have to figure out a way to get out of it."

**Walker to join Booth**

Neil Walker, the veteran infielder who retired earlier this year, threw out the ceremonial first pitch.

The Pirates announced Walker will do some color commentary on their television and radio broadcasts beginning in August. He is also expected to serve the baseball operations department as an adviser.

The native of Pittsburgh's northern suburbs was the Pirates' first-round draft pick in 2004 and made his major league debut with them in 2009. Walker spent 12 seasons in the majors, playing for six teams.

Catching the pitch was Pirates bench coach Don Kelly, who is Walker's brother-in-law.

# Threats from Chronic Wasting Disease continue

Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) was first found in West Virginia in 2005. For those hunters who thought that it would be possible to isolate the problem and things would go back to normal, you were mistaken.

CWD is not going away, and slowly but surely it is spreading everywhere. Can we stop the spread? Based on the science we know have, we can't stop CWD. There are things states can do to slow the spread, and those are being done. Some states are doing more than others, but the spread continues.

Some states have a tougher time slowing CWD than others because they have lots of deer farms. For example, Pennsylvania has over 760 deer farms and

fenced deer shooting preserves. These facilities exacerbate the spread of CWD. In December 2020 a deer was shot at a Pennsylvania hunting facility five miles from the New York border in an area that previously had no CWD. It was tested for CWD and the positive results became known in May 2021. That facility was immediately quarantined, and all deer there were euthanized. None tested positive.

Of course New York is very concerned about the presence of CWD so close to their border. They are taking added precautions in that area to make sure hunters do not bring dead deer that have not been processed into the state.

In June, Minnesota had 13 deer test positive for CWD at a captive deer facility hundreds of miles from a CWD endemic area. It was determined by state officials that those deer were transported from a facility in the CWD endemic area located in the southeastern part of the

state. During the investigation it was found that the owner of the facility had been dumping infected deer carcasses on nearby public land for years. The governor then recommended transferring control of captive deer farms from the Board of Animal Health to the DNR. That proposal opened up various political issues in the legislature where the Republicans shot down the Governor's proposal. When it comes to CWD, politics trumps biology in Minnesota, as it does in many states.

There are over 1,200 deer breeders in Texas. Yes, it is a huge industry there, but also a source for CWD. In May the Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife began an investigation after a CWD flare-up at deer breeding facilities in five counties. The investigation is attempting to trace the location of several hundred deer sold from the breeding facilities. This gives you some idea of the difficulty states have when attempt-

ing to trace CWD deer. Unless the facility does testing and keeps accurate records, tracing CWD deer or deer found on breeding farms where CWD has been found, is impossible.

Led by the Theodore Roosevelt Conservation Partners, several national-level organizations are urging U.S. Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack to provide leadership and coordination on the CWD crisis. They have urged him to implement a moratorium on the interstate movement of all live deer. They also want him to convene an emergency meeting of the CWD inter-agency task force that was authorized by Congress in 2020 to develop an immediate federal response to contain CWD. These things need to happen soon.

# Walker shuts down Yankees, Mets fans cheer 8-3 win in Bronx

NEW YORK — Taijuan Walker took a no-hitter into the sixth inning, Brandon Nimmo provided a spark in his return from the injured list and the New York Mets beat the crosstown Yankees 8-3 Saturday to open a three-game Subway Series.

The Mets led 8-0 when Aaron Judge homered with one out in the sixth to end Walker's bid for the record-tying eighth no-hitter in the majors this season.

Walker (7-3) was lifted after 5 2/3 innings and got a standing ovation from Mets fans among the season-high crowd of 40,047 at Yankee Stadium.

Jordan Montgomery (3-3) stranded five Mets baserunners over the first three innings to keep it scoreless, but the visitors broke through in the fifth. Nimmo led off with a single, one of his three hits, and scored the first run.

Tigers 11, White Sox 5

DETROIT — Eric Haase hit a three-run, inside-the-park homer and later cleared the fence for another three-run drive, and Detroit snapped Chicago's five-game winning streak.

The Tigers trailed 2-0 in the fourth inning when Jonathan Schoop and Miguel Cabrera drew walks from Dallas Keuchel (6-3).

Haase hit a sinking liner that bounced past diving center fielder Billy Hamilton and rolled to the wall as the runners circled the bases.

Haase's inside-the-park homer was the first by a Tigers player since JaCoby Jones hit one last Aug. 10 against the White Sox. The six RBIs were a career-high for Haase, who has four multi-homer games this season.

Tarik Skubal (5-7) lasted five innings, allowing five runs on eight hits while striking out six.

Phillies 4, Padres 2

PHILADELPHIA — Bryce Harper homered and drove in two runs, Rhys Hoskins also went deep and Philadelphia beat San Diego.

Zach Eflin (3-6) allowed two runs and three hits in six innings, and Philadelphia's bullpen held the lead. Bailey Falter, Archie Bradley and Ranger Suárez combined for three innings of one-hit, scoreless relief. Suárez earned his first professional save with a perfect ninth.

BUFFALO, N.Y. — George Springer homered for the second straight day, Santiago Espinal hit his first career home run and Toronto beat Tampa Bay.

The Blue Jays won for the 10th time in 13 games. Tampa Bay has lost five straight overall and 10 in a row on the road.

Springer led off the second inning with his fifth homer, going deep on a first-pitch fastball from Shane Bieber (3-3).

Adam Cimber (2-2) got the win in relief of Ryan Stripling, who allowed one run on two hits and three walks in 5 2/3 innings.

Royals 6, Twins 3

Osabuohien and Taz Sherman are both in their final year of eligibility.

McNeil and guard Kedrian Johnson are technically seniors next season, too, although both could return for the 2022-23 season due to the extra season of eligibility the NCAA granted athletes due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Having a bulk of seniors may not leave a lot of playing time for younger players.

That includes Wilson, Johnson and King, but could also mean sophomores Taj Thweatt and Seny N'diaye.

For now, Huggins said there is a possibility of redshirting some of the incoming freshmen.

"I thought the best thing we did for (Bridges) was redshirt him for a year and not play him," Huggins

# Kyle Busch makes it 4 for 4 in Xfinity Series with 101st win

ELKHART LAKE, Wis. — Kyle Busch expects that he won't continue racing NASCAR Xfinity Series events after this year, and he has a chance to finish up with a perfect season.

After spinning off course twice, Busch rallied in the final stage to win Saturday at Road America. That gives him four victories in four Xfinity Series races this season.

NASCAR only allows Cup Series drivers such as Busch to compete in five Xfinity and five Truck Series races a year. Busch is scheduled to enter his final Xfinity event of the season next week at Atlanta.

"Since we're this close, we might as well go 5 for 5," Busch said. "That would certainly be nice. That would be special."

Busch edged Joe Gibbs Racing teammate Daniel Hemric by 3.522 seconds, with Michael Annett third, AJ Allmendinger fourth and Harrison Burton fifth. Road America has had a different winner in each of its 12 Xfinity events.

This marked his 101st career Xfinity Series victory and 200th overall win with Toyota.

"I didn't really come up here coming up expecting to win, just wanted to learn the track," Busch said. "But when you're in position there toward the end of the race, your mindset definitely changes and you get in the groove of what you've got to do."

Busch will race Sunday in the first Cup Series event at Road America since 1956, though he will have to start in the back of the pack with a backup car after crashing his Toyota in practice Saturday.

He was much better at navigating Road America's

4.048-mile course and 14 turns in the Xfinity Series race later in the day.

Busch appeared to be in seventh place during a restart with about six laps remaining but had fresher tires than the cars ahead of him. The restart took place after a wreck that began when Myatt Snider spun off course and impacted several cars, including Austin Cindric, who won this race last year and finished eighth this time.

Busch went past Allmendinger on the right and led for the final five laps.

"We knew that we had a better car, better tires to drive away," Busch said.

Allmendinger said the difference in their tires at that point in the race made it virtually impossible to maintain the lead no matter what he did.

"At that point, you're a wounded duck," Allmendinger said. "You're just trying to hang on."

Busch will try to earn his fifth Xfinity victory of the season next week. Then he just might stop entering Xfinity events at all.

After his Xfinity Series triumph at Nashville two weeks ago, Busch noted the criticism he received for "beating up on the little guys" by winning on a circuit filled with drivers trying to work their way up to the Cup Series. He discussed that criticism again Saturday and noted how Kevin Harvick also had stopped entering as many Xfinity races a few years ago to focus on Cup Series events.

"Sometimes you drive guys away," Busch said. "That's part of it. We'll just run on Sundays, I guess. I still own a truck team, so I'll still run my Truck races that I can."

# Ko leads at Old American after bogey-free day

THE COLONY, Texas — Jin Young Ko chipped in for eagle on the par-4 15th and finished a bogey-free 32-hole Saturday in near darkness with a one-stroke lead in the Volunteers of America Classic.

Ko returned to overcast and breezy Old American early Saturday, playing the final 14 holes for a 1-under 70 in the suspended second round. After a rest break at her nearby home in Frisco, the 25-year-old South Korean star shot 66 in the third round. She got up-and-down for par on the par-4 18th, chipping close after hitting over the green.

Germany's Esther Henseleit and Finland's Matilda Castren were tied for second. Henseleit also eagled the 15th in her 64. Castren shot 68. They both finished their second rounds Friday.

Ko dropped from No. 1 to No. 2 in the world when Nelly Korda won the KPMG Women's PGA Championship last week for her second straight victory, ending a run of nearly two years. Even with a victory Sunday, Ko would remain No. 2.

The first-round leader

after a 63, Ko had a 14-under 199 total in the event that got back on schedule after the start of play Friday was delayed six hours because of rain and lightning.

The 22-year-old Henseleit followed the eagle on 15 with a birdie on the par-5 17th. She won the Ladies European Tour's 2019 Magical Kenya Ladies Open.

Castren birdied 15 and 17. She won the LPGA MEDIHEAL Championship three weeks ago in California at foggy Lake Merced to become the first Finnish winner in LPGA Tour history.

Jeongeun Lee6, the South Korean player who won the 2019 U.S. Women's Open and lives in nearby Irving, was 10 under after a 69. She birdied the last three holes.

Defending champion Angela Stanford birdied three of the last four holes in a 68 to get to 9 under. The 43-year-old former TCU star from Fort Worth won at 7 under last year when the event was played in early December.

She played 31 holes Saturday, finishing a second-round 70 in the morning.

# Bucks beat Hawks, head to NBA Finals for 1st time since 1974

ATLANTA — The Milwaukee Bucks are headed back to the NBA Finals for the first time since 1974.

Trae Young returned to the Hawks lineup after missing two games with a bone bruise in his right foot, but the young star never got anything going. After both teams struggled to find the

range in the first half, the Bucks suddenly couldn't miss in the third quarter.

Atlanta actually had a chance for its first lead of the game when Young's behind-the-back pass gave Kevin Huerter an open look from 3-point range.

The shot rimmed out, and Middleton quickly ripped off the next 13 points to suddenly push the Milwaukee lead to 60-45.

Jrue Holiday added 27 points for the Bucks.

Cam Reddish, who missed much of the season with an Achilles injury,

came off the bench to spark the Hawks. He scored 21 points — making six of seven 3-pointers — as the Hawks sliced a 22-point deficit down to six in the closing minutes.

Young finished with just 14 points on 4-of-17 shooting.

## Celebrate the good; recognize the bad

*“Our country is not the only thing to which we owe our allegiance. It is also owed to justice and to humanity. Patriotism consists not in waving the flag, but in striving that our country shall be righteous as well as strong.” — James Bryce, historian and British ambassador to the United States (1907-13).*

Today we celebrate our independence from England. (The irony of opening with a quote from a British diplomat is not lost on us.) Two hundred and forty-five years ago, the Founding Fathers declared that the American colonies would be free of British tyranny and become a cradle of modern democracy — a place where the people would rule themselves, where debate and cooperation would vanquish oppression, where every man had the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

In that 245 years, we have sometimes risen to the lofty ideals of our nation; sometimes we have fallen short. For many other countries, America has been the beacon of hope, of what good governance could and should be. But we have had our own genocides and concentration camps. We decry autocratic and unstable governments around the world, even as our own government in recent decades has been unilaterally wielded by one party or the other, with power switching hands every few years.

We set the standards for human rights abroad, positioning ourselves as the physical and economic global enforcer. But within our own borders, we have failed to grant basic human rights to our brethren, based on the color of their skin or their ancestry or their religion or their gender or their sexual orientation.

We are a nation of contradictions, founded on noble intentions and cobbled together from victories and mistakes.

When we celebrate the Fourth of July, we remember that specific moment of our founding and all the grand ideals that created the framework for the United States of America. We celebrate the fight for freedom, then and now, here and abroad. We celebrate the progress we have made toward becoming a better country and toward creating a better world. We celebrate the good of us.

But in celebrating the good, we cannot ignore the bad. We cannot erase the pain the country has inflicted on entire swaths of peoples. We cannot hide from the failures to meet our own standards of conduct.

As West Virginians, we are perhaps uniquely situated to understand how to love and take pride in the place you call home, even as you loathe its flaws and strive to make it better.

To paraphrase James Bryce, patriotism is not blind allegiance to a flag or to the country it represents.

So as we have our cookouts and wave our red, white and blue flags and watch fireworks light up the night sky, know that we are allowed to feel all those things — love, hate, pride, shame — contradictory as they are. We are allowed to celebrate the good of America, even as we recognize its flaws and work toward fulfilling the promise of forming a more perfect union.

### Elementary students need to wear masks

For the past 15 months, West Virginians have banded together to drive our COVID-19 infection and death rates down. We have been successful: The statistics show new infections are basically nonexistent, leading people to become more relaxed about mask wearing. However, the incredibly infectious Delta variant has already settled in the Mountain State. Earlier this week, the World Health Organization recommended that vaccinated people should wear masks indoors.

I am quite concerned that Dr. Eddie Campbell and the Monongalia Board of Education are becoming a little too relaxed with their approach to mask standards in our schools, per The Dominion Post's June 29 article, The DP reports Dr. Campbell "wants to lift the mask mandate for

the coming year, provided vaccines trend upward and positive diagnoses go the other way." In fact, they have already made masks optional for the Monongalia County Summer Avalanche program, much to my disappointment.

school, since those students are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine. But our elementary students still need our protection, not only from the Delta variant, but also the symptoms of what experts are calling long COVID.

My two elementary-aged children will be participating in the Summer Avalanche program. They need to be around other kids to minimize the social effects of the pandemic. However, masks should not be optional in this particular setting. When mask wearing is mandatory, students are great about following rules and protecting each other. We need to continue to act as a community until every one of us is eligible for the vaccine. Our elementary-aged kids deserve this courtesy until they have access to the vaccine.

### A NATION DIVIDED

## America's empathy problem — and what to do about it

**A DICTIONARY DEFINITION OF EMPATHY IS THE ABILITY TO UNDERSTAND AND SHARE THE FEELINGS OF ANOTHER.** It's not the same as sympathy. As memoirist Rebecca O'Donnell puts it, "Empathy is walking a mile in somebody else's moccasins. Sympathy is being sorry their feet hurt."

If Americans seem less empathetic than they used to be, the scientific community says that feeling has validity. A 2010 University of Michigan study found that college students then were 40% less empathetic than their counterparts of 1980s and 90s, as measured by standardized tests of this personality trait. And it seems to have only gotten worse since then.

In 2011, CNN's Wolf Blitzer asked presidential candidate Ron Paul what should happen to a 30-year old man who chose not to buy health insurance and then became seriously ill. "Are you saying society should just let him die?" Blitzer asked. The debate crowd "erupted in cheers and whoops of 'Yeah,'" Slate reported.

Roughly a decade later, in September 2020, after the shooting of two Los Angeles sheriff's deputies, a crowd gathered outside the treating hospital shouting "we hope they die" as they tried to block the hospital's emergency exits, according to the Los Angeles Times. That same month, "The U.S. has an Empathy Deficit" was the headline of an opinion piece in the September 2020 Scientific American.

In America today, immigrants are demonized. Asian Americans are assaulted. Capitol police are beaten with flagpoles. Unarmed

African Americans are shot and suffocated by police. Votes are suppressed. Mass shootings take lives regularly.

Even mask wearing amid COVID-19 illustrates our empathy problem. The message "I wear a mask to protect you, you wear a mask to protect me" did not resonate with millions of Americans; neither did the social value of vaccinations. Today's notion of individual freedom has little room for empathy.

"The death of human empathy is one of the earliest and most telling signs of a culture about to fall into barbarism," wrote philosopher Hannah Arendt.

So, what can we do to boost our collective empathy level? Empathy — or lack of it — is partially hardwired: A

2018 University of Cambridge study found that 10% of differences in humans' ability to empathize can be attributed to genetic variations. But that means 90% is explained by non-genetic factors such as socialization and education. That suggests empathy can be taught.

Stanford neuroscientist Jamil Zaki confirms this in his book "The War for Kindness: Building Empathy in a Fractured World." The book shares research, including experiments from his own lab, showing that empathy can be strengthened through effort.

Author Roman Krznaric, in "Empathy: Why it Matters and How to Get It," argues that empathy should be

taught at a young age. He notes that half of the children who participated in Roots of Empathy, a Canadian nonprofit that teaches school-age children to empathize with each other, were less likely to fight than they were prior to the program.

Here's one more idea: Administer an empathy test to every candidate for public office.

Prior to filing, every candidate would be required to listen to the old song "I'll Be Seeing You" by Billie Holiday. They would be asked to imagine a G.I. in a foxhole dreaming about his wife or girlfriend back home, and a young woman stateside wondering if her love would make it back. If by the last line "I'll

be looking at the moon, but I'll be seeing you" there's not a tear in the candidate's eye, he or she wouldn't be allowed to run. We'd then know that our elected officials had hearts at least capable of empathy.

Henry David Thoreau may have said it best: "Could a greater miracle take place than for us to look through each other's eyes for an instant?"

Steve Martin had a less noble take: "Before you criticize a man, walk a mile in his shoes," he reportedly said. "That way, when you do criticize him, you'll be a mile away — and have his shoes."

But at least you will have done the walk. And the journey of a thousand miles — and to empathy — begins with a single step.

## Impact of our war on police

**SUPPOSE YOU'RE IN A BATTLEFIELD WITH BAD GUYS COMING AT YOU FULL FORCE AND YOU HAVE THE MEANS OF STOPPING THEM,** but, while calling your own troops names, you pull them off the field, letting the bad guys have their murderous way. That's not that far from what we've done in the United States of America with cops, and we thus have had an egregious homicide rise. Guess who pays the most: our Black American citizens

It is terrible, terrible, terrible that some of our police have themselves done horrible things, but while the George Floyd tragedy signaled a deep need for reform, the Democrats preferred denying Republicans any say to getting anything done. Police are still being universally demeaned as immoral racists and, in some major cities, police forces have been at least temporarily stripped of significant funds. Police have retired early and quit in record numbers.

Those numbers? It's 3,700 beat cops who are gone, it is reported, and think of a policewoman in Asheville, North Carolina, who was written about in The New York Times.

Because of her presumably mistaken career, friends quit talking to her. Relatives quit talking to her. A demonstrator set her clothes on fire. As quoted in the Times, she said, "I am drowning in this politically charged atmosphere of hate and destruction." She quit. One problem with that is that police are hard to replace at the moment.

We've had thousands of protests saying abolish cops and hundreds of riots saying the same thing, using violence as an exclamation mark. Defunding has proceeded. Portland, for instance, cut a police budget in 2020 by \$16 million after 12 homicides and then experienced 44 more homicides with 200 police officers taking off and the homicides in 2021 getting worse.

For more, consider how experts are telling us that homicides went up by a whopping, incredible 30% in 34 of the nation's largest cities, a historic rise, in 2020. The bloody, ugly, inhumane increase in homicides was a much higher 92% in Louisville and 95% in Milwaukee.

Hey, the pandemic did it, some say, but a precise study shows the big bump did not come until virulent anti-police protests went national. Nothing exacerbates crime like the lessened prevention that followed, and those who

# Housing crisis needs a federal solution

**HOUSING IS EXPENSIVE IN MORGANTOWN.** Whether you're renting or paying a mortgage or currently unhoused, unaffordability is a fact of life for most people who live here. Today, as we celebrate Independence Day, it is undeniable that the housing reality here in our community is a reflection of an ongoing national housing crisis, a crisis experienced keenly among renters.

Simply put, wages have not kept pace with rising rents, and a short supply of available rental units nationwide has only made the situation worse. The National Low Income Housing Coalition reports currently there is no state or county in the United States where a renter working full-time at minimum wage can afford a two-bedroom apartment.

According to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, 24 million people in 11 million low-income American households pay more than half their income for rent, often forgoing necessities, like food or medicine, to stay in their homes.

However, less than half, 10.4 million people in 5.2 million households, are actually using some form of federal rental assistance to afford modest housing. Sixty-eight percent of those renters are seniors, children, or people with disabilities. And because of the legacy of discriminatory housing policies, this is a burden that falls more often on people of color: The NHLIC estimates that although 6% of white households are extremely low-income renters, 20% of Black households, 18% of American Indian or Alaska Native households and 14% of Latino households are extremely low-income renters.

The primary federal program meant to address these inequalities, the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program, which makes up the difference between what people earn and the reasonable cost of a safe and decent home, is not funded adequately to meet the need.

Currently, more than 5 million people in 2.3 million low-income families use these vouchers to help pay for housing in the private market, according to CBPP. However, only 1 in 4 eligible renters is able to access this federal housing assistance. That means roughly 75% of households that qualify for HCVs aren't able to get them when they need them. They can languish on waiting lists for months or years, all the while remaining vulnerable to many of the other ills of extreme poverty, like food insecurity, declining physical and mental health and homelessness.

Though provisions for affordable housing were not included in the recent bipartisan Senate infrastructure deal reached this week, Congress should still consider several proposals over the summer for substantial long term affordable housing investment. Any effort to address affordability for renters must also include a boost to the HCV program, for what good is any investment in development if people still lack the resources to rent?

Sen. Joe Manchin sets an admirable standard working with colleagues in the Senate to move economic recovery legislation forward. As the work of Congress continues throughout the summer, affordable housing needs to be among his top priorities.

Expanding the supply of affordable housing while ensuring rental assistance to all eligible renters with guaranteed multi-year funding to the HCV program is a solid step in the right direction to address the housing crisis in the U.S. Beyond being a just, equitable and sensible solution to stably house millions of families and start to undo the legacy of racial discrimination in housing, this provides a bridge to economic stability and generational prosperity to millions of Americans struggling to keep a roof over their heads.

# Taxes: What they are and how they work

**GOVERNMENT RUNS ON MONEY!** Our governments provide us with all kinds of services, from national defense to elementary schools. Mostly, they fund these services with taxes.

For a discussion about taxes, you need to understand several concepts: Disposable income, regressive taxes and progressive taxes.

Disposable income is income left over after paying for essentials, such as food, housing, clothing, a means of transportation and health care. Some don't include health care in this definition, but when you have to choose between going to the doctor or paying the rent, health care becomes an essential cost of living. Low income people don't have much, if any, disposable income. High income people do.

Regressive taxes — essentially flat taxes — take a larger percentage of income from low income people than from high income people. A fixed rate is applied to something of value, which seems fair. We all pay 7%

sales tax when buying a car. But, the guy buying the \$100,000 car doesn't care; \$7,000 doesn't mean as much to him.

Progressive taxes, such as federal income taxes, take a larger percentage of income from high income people than from low income people. Taxes are complicated because there are so many different ways of earning income and of taxing different types of income. For most people, it's simple: You have salaries and wages.

Your income is taxed in layers or brackets, with each layer taxed at a progressively higher rate as the income increases. Most West Virginians will find themselves in the bottom three brackets: 10%, 12% and 22%. If you are in the 22% bracket, some of your income will be taxed at 10%, some at 12% and some at 22%. Being in the 22% bracket does not mean all your income will be taxed at 22%.

There is a standard deduction that, depending on your filing status, will allow you to deduct an amount from your salaries and wages to determine your taxable income. In effect, this is a 0%

layer of income below your 10% layer.

Let's do some examples. Let's have two married couples filing as "married filing jointly" and their standard deduction will be \$25,100.

Couple A earns \$45,000. After subtracting \$25,100, their taxable income will be \$19,900. The first bracket goes from \$0 to \$19,900. All their taxable income will be taxed at 10% for a total of \$1,990. Their effective rate is 4.4% (1,990 ÷ 45,000). My definition of "effective rate" is the "total tax" divided by "total income." The effective rate shows your actual rate is less than your top bracket rate because of deductions and the tiered rate structure. Couple A's after-tax income is \$43,010.

Couple B earns \$160,000. After subtracting \$25,100, their taxable income will be \$134,900. Their first \$19,900 will be taxed at 10% for a tax of \$1,990. The second bracket goes from \$19,900 to \$81,050, so their next \$61,150 will be taxed at 12%, or \$7,338. The third bracket goes from \$81,050 to \$172,750. Their next \$53,850 will be taxed at 22%, or \$11,847. Their

total tax is \$21,175. Their effective rate is 13.2% (21,175 ÷ 160,000), and their after-tax income is \$138,825.

If we had a couple whose taxable income was \$1,000,000, we could work our way through all seven brackets, including \$371,700 taxed at 37%, or \$306,523 — an effective rate of 30.7%. Their after-tax income is \$693,477.

It's important to note the higher rates in the higher brackets have no effect on the rates or taxes of people in the lower brackets. Progressive taxes are better, because additional brackets with higher taxes can be added on top without affecting the bottom.

Wealthy people do pay more, because they are taxed at higher rates on more income. However, they have more disposable income, so they can afford to pay more.

# Bill Cosby was freed from prison. I'm shocked. I'm angry. But also a little happy

I'M SO CONFLICTED.

I hate to admit it, but it's true. Part of me is secretly happy that Bill Cosby is out of prison. He's so old and blind now. I highly doubt he will bother any more women ever again. I hated the thought of him being locked up like that.

But then there's the other part of me that's shocked and angry.

I believe women. I believe his accusers. I believe Andrea Constand. I can't imagine what she must be going through right now. She's probably kicking herself for believing she ever had a real shot getting justice with our flawed legal system. Yes, she was able to testify in court and get a jury to believe her allegations. Other women also got to share what Cosby did to them. I met some of them. Talked to them. Seeing him sentenced back in 2018 had to have been therapeutic.

But in the end, Cosby still won out. Freed over a technicality.

The Pennsylvania Supreme Court's ruling Wednesday that District Attorney Kevin Steele had to abide by his predecessor's handshake agreement not to charge Cosby changed the game for him.

And just like that a guilty man has gone free.

Never forget that Cosby hasn't been exonerated. He's not some innocent the system picked on just because he expressed interest in buying NBC. A jury convicted him of three counts of aggravated

indecent assault for drugging and assaulting Constand at his home in 2004. Dozens more have made similar allegations.

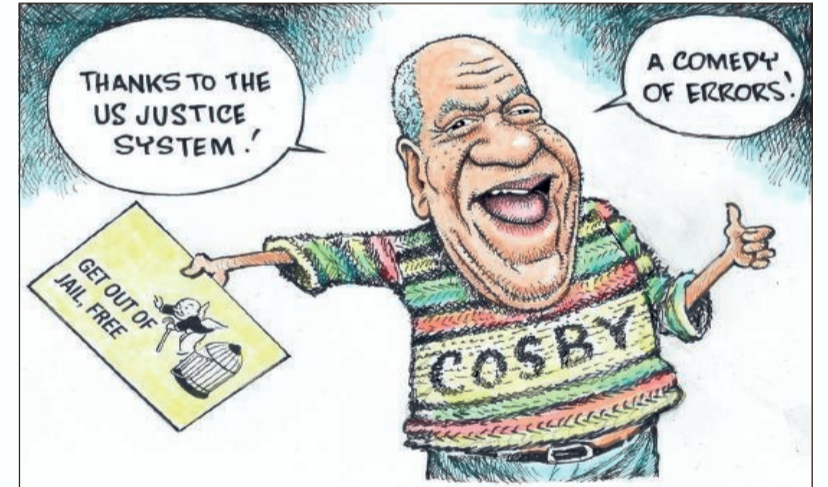
This ruling is a huge setback for the #MeToo movement.

It's also a setback for sexual abuse survivors everywhere who all too often put their trust and faith in a system that doesn't always come through for them. They are going to look at this as another glaring example of why so many sex abuse survivors don't bother coming forward, especially when their allegations involve a wealthy, famous predator.

"People aren't going to get in the weeds in that way," said Monique Howard, a sexual violence advocate and public health strategist. "All they're going to think is that it was overturned. It's the women that suffer."

This is going to have a chilling effect on sexual assault survivors. Women will hesitate even longer before reporting sexual abuse cases. All because Cosby had the means to have good lawyers bring his appeal before the Supreme Court.

It's an awful lot to digest.



Back in 2018, I wrote a column calling Cosby's sentencing both a triumph and a tragedy. I wrote about how much I admired all he had done for the culture with "The Cosby Show" and the millions he gave to historically Black colleges and universities.

On the other hand, I couldn't defend a man who had given drugs to Constand that left her defenseless to his sexual advances. That was a sleazy and low-down thing to do.

Still, I hated seeing Uncle Bill in his shirt sleeves with his hands cuffed being taken off to prison. It was difficult for me to witness a man whom I had grown up admiring fall so far from grace.

Whenever I found myself wondering what Cosby's life was like in prison and worrying about his health, I had to force myself to not think of him and

instead to focus on Constand and his other victims.

Common sense and reasoning are wrestling with my heartstrings. I felt kind of the same way when the O.J. Simpson verdict went down.

Cosby is home now. A part of me smiled at the sight of him in that white Central High School T-shirt at the news conference outside his home. A Black man had beaten a system that too often has left African Americans with a knee on their throats.

But just as I'm Black, I'm also a woman. Sisterhood is strong. I know his alleged victims are beside themselves with outrage. I feel for them, too.

As I said, my emotions are all over the place.

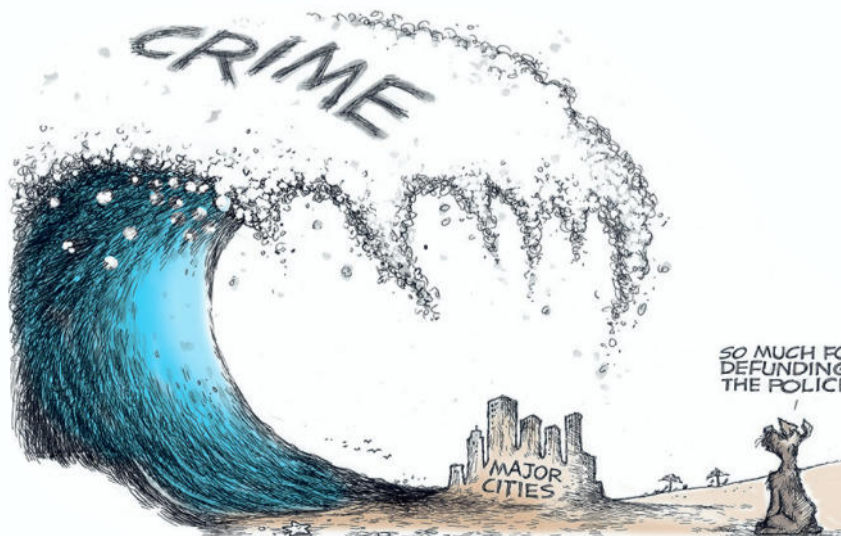

NEW YORK — On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress formally endorsed the Declaration of Independence. Celebrations began within days: parades and public readings, bonfires and candles and the firing of 13 musket rounds, one for each of the original states.

Nearly a century passed before the country officially named its founding a holiday.

With the recent passage of the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, commemorating the end of slavery in the United States, the country now has 12 federal holidays. Many are fixtures in the American calendar, but their presence isn’t only a story of continuity. They reflect how the U.S. has evolved — from an affiliation of states with a relatively small federal government to a more centralized nation.

Statewide and local gatherings for Independence Day and other holidays are as old as the country itself. But the first round of federal holidays, identified as such because federal employees (initially only federal employees in Washington, D.C.) were given the day off, was only signed into law in 1870, by President Ulysses S. Grant, five years after the Civil War ended.

“The Civil War consolidated national power in all sorts of ways, and national holidays are an illustration of that,” says the Pulitzer Prize-winning historian Eric Foner. “There were many, many firsts after the Civil War.”

Juneteenth and other federal holidays have passed with substantial majorities in Congress,

suggesting broad, bipartisan consensus. The first holidays, notes Grant biographer Ron Chernow, were the safest ones at the time — New Year’s Day, Independence Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and George Washington’s birthday (enacted in 1879).

“They followed the Civil War, but, by no accident, they had nothing to do with the Civil War. The war wounds were still deep and irrevocable, and any commemoration of the war itself would have been seen as divisive,” Chernow says. He notes that Memorial Day, the honoring of those who died in war, did not become a federal holiday until 1888.

“The first five federal holidays ... attempted to restore common ground between North and South,” Chernow says. “Both sides in the Civil War claimed to have fought in the spirit of the American Revolution. It was therefore easy for both sides to honor Washington’s birthday and Independence Day.”

Whether statements of patriotism or social justice, federal holidays mirror a part of the country’s sense of itself and how it changes.

Public support to make the Rev. Martin Luther King’s birthday a holiday was so strong that it was signed into law in 1983 by President Ronald Reagan, who had opposed the Civil Rights Act and Voting Rights Act in the 1960s and privately believed the late civil rights leader’s standing was “based on an image, not reality.” Even then, Arizona, New Hampshire and South Carolina resisted making it a state holiday, with South Carolina waiting until 2000. Alabama and

Mississippi still pair King’s birthday with the birthday of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee.

Columbus Day became a national holiday in 1968, endorsed by Congress and President Lyndon Johnson as a tribute to immigrants and as a “declaration of willingness to face with confidence the imponderables of unknown tomorrows,” according to a Senate report at the time. But over the past 40 years, as Columbus’ image has shifted from the “discoverer of America” to that of a racist and imperialist, cities and states have either changed the holiday’s name (Hawaii calls it “Discovery Day”) or used the day to honor others; since 1989, South Dakota has called it “Native American Day.”

“You can think of federal holidays as being like monuments erected in parks,” says Matthew Dennis, author of “Red, White, and Blue Letter Days,” a 2002 book on American holidays. “With a monument, you try to set the meaning of the past in stone. But that can change, and people might say, ‘Wait, who is this guy?’”

Among national holidays, July 4 stands as the most complex and debated, a reflection of the questions and contradictions about the country’s origins and about the Declaration of Independence itself.

Independence Day has been caught up in the country’s divisions almost from the start. In the 1780s and 1790s, supporters of a stronger central government (Federalists) and those who worried about a return to British-style monarchy (sometimes

called Jeffersonian Republicans), argued over the authorship of the Declaration of Independence, with Republicans giving sole credit to their own Thomas Jefferson and Federalists countering (correctly) that many others had worked on it.

In the decades before the Civil War, Black Americans were often excluded from official July 4 events and instead would celebrate on July 5, both acknowledging July 4 and their distance from it. Frederick Douglass delivered his famed 1852 speech, “What to the Slave Is the Fourth of July,” on July 5.

The Civil War itself was a time for competing interpretations. Southerners embraced the Declaration of Independence’s message of defiance against tyranny. The North looked to it as a blueprint. In a letter to Congress sent on July 4, 1861, just months after the Civil War began, President Abraham Lincoln spoke of Independence Day as inspiration for a new and more humane society.

“Our adversaries have adopted some declarations of independence in which, unlike the good old one penned by Jefferson, they omit the words [all men are created equal,]” Lincoln wrote, adding that the Union was upholding “government whose leading object is to elevate the condition of men; to lift artificial weights from all shoulders; to clear the paths of laudable pursuit for all; to afford all an unfettered start and a fair chance in the race of life.”

The meaning of July 4 has continued to evolve, from president to president. Franklin D. Roosevelt and George W. Bush are

among those who dedicated Independence Day speeches to the military, whether during World War II or in the aftermath of the Sept. 11 attacks. John F. Kennedy’s 1962 address, in the midst of the Cold War, called independence the “single issue that divides the world today” and invoked “the longing for independence behind the Iron Curtain.” In 2014, President Barack Obama cited the promise of “life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness” as a reason “immigrants from around the world dream of coming to our shores.”

For Independence Day in 2020, less than two months after the murder of George Floyd, President Donald Trump denounced Black Lives Matters protesters and what he called “a merciless campaign to wipe out our history, defame our heroes, erase our values and indoctrinate our children.” His eventual successor, Joe Biden, issued a brief video saying the country had yet to live up to its promise of equality, noting that even Jefferson was a slaveholder.

“But once proposed, it (equality) was an idea that couldn’t be constrained,” he said. “It survived the rages of the Civil War, the dogs of Bull Connor, the assassination of Martin Luther King and more 200 years of systematic racism.”

“America is no fairy tale,” Biden added. “It’s been a constant push and pull between two parts of our character: the idea that all men and women — all people — are created equal and the racism that has torn us apart.”

ourselves worthwhile. Our self esteem focuses on the positive. Self acceptance is the ability to embrace all facets of ourselves, not just the positive. It is unconditional acceptance.

Perhaps we need to come to a certain age before we can accept ourselves completely, body, mind and soul. Living through a long life of working, learning, striving, we come to a point where we can look back and see our accomplishments, our failures, our mistakes and our good choices. Hopefully, we bring all these out of the shadows, into the light and see them with realistic clarity. As poet and author, May Sarton, states so well, we need to accept ourselves

"warts and all", and hope others will accept us the same way.

We should not be defined by our mistakes, nor necessarily be defined by our successes, the good judgments we've made. We are defined simply by who we are, by who we have become. In reality, every one of us throughout the world has, at times, failed and faltered, made mistakes and bad judgments. Each of us is unique, yet we are bound together by our humanity. ## Readers without wearing glasses? And what about that mask fog?

**Q: I have been needing “readers” for a few years now, and while putting them on and off has been a nuisance, the fogging I have now with the mask I still choose to wear to protect from COVID-19 mask makes them even worse! Any suggestions?**

**A:** Yours is a very common problem these days for people wearing readers, and for folks wearing regular glasses too. There are some very good anti-fog solutions you apply to your lenses to reduce fogging, but they vary widely in how well and how long they last. Ask your eye doc or optician

for recommendation.

We have had many, many patients since COVID choose to begin or resume soft contact lenses to truly solve this problem. For everyone over 40, our near vision begins decreasing so that reading becomes more and more frustrating. Good news,

however, in that just since 2019 we now have excellent “multifocal” contacts that are designed to give you good near vision, and they can be prescribed also with your distance vision correction if needed.

These multifocal contacts provide up to three different focusing ranges, meaning we can prescribe your lenses to give you clear vision up close for your phone, plus a focus for arm’s length for your screen, and even distance if needed for driving. And thank heavens our brain is pretty “smart” — it will learn to use the part of the lens

you need automatically. So unlike bifocal or progressive glasses, you don’t even need to move your eyes up or down to find the right power.

These new contacts are not perfect, and not everyone finds their vision perfect at all distances. But most people, about 80%, find their vision so comfortable and more normal compared to glasses (and without the annoying fogging) that they love wearing contacts to be free of glasses. Our practice, like most, will prescribe your contacts and have your wear them in your normal life for a several days

before you decide to continue and actually buy lenses. Some patients do need some “fine-tuning” in the lens prescriptions after a few days to improve some aspect of their vision. If so, you may have one follow up visit with your eye doctor to achieve your best all around vision.

If contacts would be new to you, rest assured that now days the lenses are extremely soft and moist and thin, so that most people do not even feel the lenses after just couple minutes. And learning how to place a lens on your eye, and to

remove it that evening, is not difficult but takes a little practice. We typically show patients a lens handling video, and then personally teach them how to easily handle their new contacts. So again, nothing is medicine is 100%, but these new lens designs have been very successful and well received by most people. Talk to your eye doctor about your multifocal contact lens options and take a pair for a “test drive.”

I am thinking about the Statue of Liberty this year. I am not thinking about the beauty and power of the statue, but of the modest and populist eloquence of Emma Lazarus’ poem “The New Colossus,” inscribed at her base, *Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame With conquering limbs astride from land to land; Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name Mother of Exiles. From her beacon-hand Glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes command The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.*

*“Keep, ancient lands, your storied pomp!” cries she With silent lips. “Give me your tired, your poor, Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, The wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door!”*

I am also thinking about Abraham Lincoln this July 4th. On Nov. 19, 1863 at the dedication of the Soldiers’ National Cemetery in Gettysburg, President Abraham Lincoln delivered the following address:

“Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that “all men are created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so

conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of it, as a final resting place for those who died here, that the nation might live. This we may, in all propriety do. But in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow, this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have hallowed it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here; while it can never forget what they did here. It is rather for us the living, we here be dedicated to the great task remaining before us — that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they here gave the last full measure of devotion—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have

died in vain, that this nation shall have a new birth of freedom, and that government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth.”

I am thinking not of the 40,000 casualties of that battle, but of the 600,000 casualties of our struggle with this plague. It is absolutely fitting and holy that it is on this July 4th that we can begin to celebrate, tentatively to be sure, but still celebrate, our return to normalcy. Their deaths are a deep wound but also a deep inspiration. After so many defeats in so many recent wars, we can finally celebrate a victory over a microscopic enemy that was unable to vanquish our enduring dream.

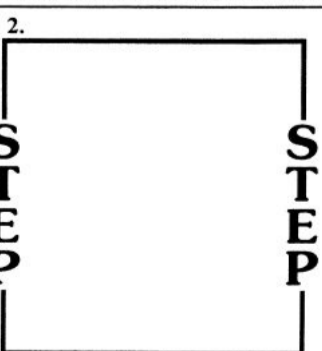
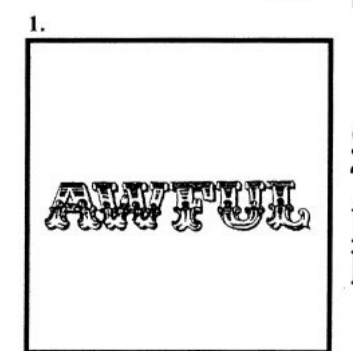

## The ins and outs of an HOA

**WHAT IS AN HOA?** Real estate developers establish homeowners' associations as corporations for the purpose of marketing, managing, and selling homes and lots in a residential subdivision. Usually, the developer transfers ownership of the association to the homeowners after selling a predetermined number of lots. When you purchase a condo, townhome or single-family home within a "planned development," you may also encounter the HOA structure. These structures are put in place to help maintain a clean and cohesive atmosphere in the neighborhood.

Before you buy a home that makes you part of an HOA, there are some questions you should ask of the association. What are the fees? What do they cover? Are there any special assessments? You should review the covenants and restrictions prior to making your offer. These documents detail what is allowed in the development and any expectations as a homeowner. You can obtain them directly from the HOA or ask your Realtor to provide them to you. You may need to obtain approval before putting in a pool or installing a fence, so you need to be well informed.

HOA's are usually run by volunteers that live in the community. Some are very active, and some are not. You should do as much research as possible and talk with current homeowners in the development. Living in a planned development — and being governed in part by the rules of an HOA — can be a mixed blessing. It offers the prospect of exchanging some control over your home for the reduced responsibilities of maintaining it, and for the benefit of enjoying shared amenities and security. It can, however, also trade the diverse look of a typical neighborhood for a more uniform appearance, albeit one with a lower chance of a neighbor's decorating taste or sloppy maintenance habits becoming a problem for you.

Homeowner associations can be beneficial for your community. They can help maintain the look of the neighborhood, which in turn can keep property values in line with the market. If you move to a neighborhood that has an active or even inactive HOA, get involved. # Cream of Wheat, a hot seller

**CREAM OF WHEAT**, a cereal first marketed in 1898, is still a popular winter breakfast cereal. A trolley sign in a recent auction showed the picture of a box of Cream of Wheat and two children eating it from a bowl. The sign read, "Summer Favorite Served Cold with Fruit." Was Cream of Wheat originally served cold?

Most advertising, even today, promotes the use of the hot, cooked cereal for a winter breakfast.

Other popular cooked cereals — oatmeal, cornmeal, Ralston, Maltex, Farina and Wheatena — are like Cream of Wheat in that they could be eaten cold but are always advertised as hot cereals. When cold, some get hard and lumpy, but all could be a breakfast cereal, especially if fresh fruit is added. We searched the Internet and cookbooks and not one suggested that cold Cream of Wheat might be served at breakfast. Did the company have an advertising campaign that promoted it?

This sign could have been part of the advertising. The box is one used in the 1930s, though the clothes seem more like the 1940s. The trolley sign is 12 1/2 x 22 1/2 inches, made of cardboard or heavy paper, and in good condition. Someone is bound to buy it just for the memories of the cold, lumpy breakfast. Or maybe with a lot of maple syrup or bacon, it was a favorite cold breakfast.

block print that's been in my family for over 80 years. It's 12 inches high, 8 inches wide and came with information that says it's called "Tatami-Shi" (Mat Maker). It's by Mitsuoki Tosa and part of a set of pictures called "A Collection of Pictures of Artisans." Can you tell me how old this is?

A: Mitsuoki Tosa was a Japanese painter who lived from 1617 to 1691. (Japanese names are often listed last name first, so Mitsuoki Tosa is often written as Tosa Mitsuoki.) He reintroduced the classical Japanese style of painting known as Yamatoe. Your print is a reproduction of one of his paintings, which was included in the series depicting artisans working in old, traditional ways. Although the painting of the Mat Maker was done in the 1600s, the woodblock print was probably made in the 1920s.

It has been reproduced many times and can be found on prints, posters and greeting cards. The 1920s prints sell for about \$60. Modern copies are available for \$35.

of a horse's head. The head unscrews to reveal space for a small flask sealed with a cork. The shaft of the cane unscrews into three sections. What is the potential value?

A: Canes weren't only used as an aid to walking but were also popular fashion accessories in the 1700s to the early 1900s. Canes with special features or those that conceal items are called gadget canes. They were made for both men and women. Canes have been made that conceal flasks, cameras, drugs, fans, guns, lighters, maps, perfume bottles, pool cues, sewing kits, snuff, surgical instruments, swords, telescopes, tools and other items. The material of the head, any special features and condition determine price. Some gadget canes sell for

several hundred dollars, some for less than \$50. Horse's head gadget canes with concealed flasks sold recently for \$40 to \$90.

**Q:** We're cleaning out our mom's house and trying to decide what to sell, what to donate, and what to pitch. How can we determine the value of things?

A: Values have changed in the past 20 years. Figurines are hard to sell, 1950s furniture is easy. Look online to get an idea of what is selling. Go to Kovels.com. It has a million past prices and information about prices, auction house names, collector groups, events and more, organized to make searches easy.

**Q:** We have a teapot marked "Arthur Wood &

Son, Staffordshire, England, Est. 1884, 6304." It's 5 3/4 inches high and 9 1/4 inches wide from handle to spout. There are roses in shades of red and pink on the front and smaller roses on the back, a rose on the spout and one on the lid. We're senior citizens, computer-free, with no smartphone. We'd like to find out what this teapot is worth before we put it out for a garage sale.

A: The company known as Arthur Wood & Son began operating under that name in 1928. It traces its beginnings to 1884, when Arthur Wood joined with Alfred and William Capper to found Capper and Company.

The partnership dissolved in 1893, and Alfred Capper and Arthur Wood continued to work

together until 1904, when Arthur Wood became sole owner. His son joined the business in 1924, and it became Arthur Wood & Son four years later. The company was sold in 1989 and sold again in 2003. It is no longer in business. Arthur Wood & Son is known for its teapots. Each teapot has a four-digit pattern number. Teapots with pattern number 6304, with colorful roses, were made in several sizes and shapes. They sell for \$45 to \$65.

# Surfside building collapse may have a 'jarring' effect on Miami's condo-buying frenzy

SURFSIDE, Fla. — As grim images of rescue workers sifting through the wreckage of the Champlain South Tower circulate around the world, Miami's kingpin condo real-estate industry is bracing for a slide.

"In the short-term, the effect of the collapse will be jarring," said real estate attorney Jesse-Dean Kluger, who said he spent the weekend fielding calls from clients under contract for units in older buildings.

"You're going to have some pushback from buyers on the closing dates, because why would you close before you have an inspection and a satisfactory report?" he said. "This could be a deal-breaker for some clients."

Built in 1981, the beachfront Champlain Towers South condo, located at 8777 Collins Ave., partially collapsed on the morning of June 24 shortly after 1:30 a.m. The building was going through its 40-year recertification process. Search and rescue efforts are ongoing.

While the exact cause of the collapse probably won't be known for at least a year, two suspected contributors — salt air and ocean water — are cause for concern for would-be buyers of waterfront condos in older buildings.

In the short-term, at least, some experts say they expect the brakes to slam on what has been a county-wide sales bonanza.

"At the very least, 'people are being more sensitive to association fees and checking the financial health of the association,'" said Ron Shuffield, president and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices EWM Realty. "These 40-year recertifications are now something that everyone is aware of, instead of just the industry. Buyers are also looking more closely to the construction of the building."

Increased attention to such detail is a positive development, said Shuffield. But it likely also will lead to higher prices and deter some buyers, say experts.

"Every condo, especially the older ones, are going to want to hire an expert and verify the integrity of their buildings," said Alex Barthet, managing member of the Barthet Construction Law Firm and publisher of the-lienzone.com website. "These are probably not fully budgeted items, so this will increase the assessments," Barthet said. "That's going to send buyers away, because they only have a certain number of dollars to spend, so why spend them on an older building?"

According to the Miami Association of Realtors, sales of existing condos jumped a whopping 286% in May year-over-year, from 563 to 2,176, driven primarily by U.S. buyers from tax-burdened states.

The median sales price of existing condos rose to \$325,000, a 25% year-over-year increase, and sales of existing condos priced between \$400,000-\$600,000 — a range that includes many older waterfront buildings — increased 475.4% to a total of 328 transactions.

The Champlain Towers South, where property records show a total of 14 units were sold over the last three years, was part of the sales boom. Condos in the town of Surfside, may be particularly hard hit for the next year, especially in older buildings, said Ana Bozovic, founder of brokerage and consulting firm Analytics Miami.

Buildings located near the collapse site may be most affected. Bozovic said resale prices might drop for the ultra luxury Eighty Seven Park, which is adjacent to the site of

the collapse and currently has seven units for sale priced between \$2 million-\$11 million.

"Who wants to buy something overlooking this collapse? People died there," she said. "People don't want to look at the site."

"When 9/11 happened, it affected the lower Manhattan area," she said. "It's going to be the same thing here."

Buyer hesitation also may affect newer buildings, say experts.

Such was the case for an attorney whose clients were scheduled to close on a Bal Harbour condo the day after the Surfside collapse. "They got cold feet, even though the building where they were buying is only three years old," said the lawyer, who declined to be named. "They just needed a minute to hear more about what happened at the Champlain Tower. A lot of people with active contracts can delay their closings, but they can't pull out because they would lose their deposits. They're stuck."

### Inspections underway

Miami-Dade County and the city of Miami Beach have started doing visual inspections and audits of buildings nearing or at their 40-year recertification process, which is required by county law. The city of Miami has gone further, requiring inspections of all buildings 40 years and older that are six stories or taller. The city has given condo associations a 45-day deadline to provide letters detailing the condition of their buildings signed by licensed structural engineers.

But the enforcement boost hasn't eased buyer concerns.

"The question is, does being able to walk out on the sand surpass the value of safety?" said real estate analyst Jack McCabe. "What I thought was going to be paradise could now be a danger."

"This collapse is the tip of the iceberg," McCabe said. There are a lot of other buildings affected by sea level rise and hurricanes that are 40-50 years old, that have not been well maintained, and that have put off special assessments — that can run into millions.

Favorable pricing has been the chief attraction of older buildings. "It comes back to affordability," said Dan Kodsi, CEO of the Miami-based development firm Royal Palms Companies, which developed the Paramount Worldcenter tower. "A lot of people live in those older buildings because they can afford it and still get to live by the water."

But repairs can diminish the differential.

"Getting hit with a huge assessment bill is going to become a bigger factor in the minds of buyers," McCabe said. "It could be a much more costly endeavor buying an existing unit than it was in the past."

### Age matters

The numbers tell the story.

According to the real estate firm CondoVulturesreality.com, some 1,660 units in buildings on the barrier islands built before 2000 — or before Florida's building code was strengthened to its current standard — currently are listed for sale, with an average price per unit of \$589,692. During the first three months of 2021, 779 sales were closed at an average price of \$487,384. Currently 491 units are under contract at an average price of \$484,821.

In comparison, the current 1,241 active listings of condos in buildings on the barrier islands built after 2000 have an average asking price of \$3,141,845 — a price tag beyond the reach of all but the wealthy.

The gap likely will widen.

"What you're going to see is anything built before 2000 is going to suffer and [drop] their prices," said Peter Zalewski, co-founder of Condo Vultures. "We have always told our clients not to look at anything built before then. Right now the system is stacked against any due diligence by the buyer. The associations are very private, and they're not going to share any information that might impact pricing. They give the condo docs, and in three days your offer is locked in by default according to state law."

According to Zalewski, there were 139 towers fronting the Atlantic Ocean in Miami-Dade County as of November 2019. Of those, only 60 were built between 2000-2019.

The other 79 towers were built between 1930-1999.

While waterfront has long been considered prime territory, inland locations have been gaining favor as waterfront prices soar and climate change becomes a greater concern. A recent study of "climate gentrification" in Miami-Dade showed home buyers and renters are increasingly choosing properties on higher-elevation land, most of which happens to be in primarily Black and Hispanic neighborhoods.

The collapse may speed the inland migration. Cordelia Anderson, founder of the Miami-based I Heart Real Estate LLC brokerage firm, said one of her prospective condo buyers from New York is now considering moving her search more inland, expressing concern about the structural

integrity of coastal buildings and sea level rise.

### Falling prices?

The seemingly inevitable price drop of older condos in beachfront locations isn't just a problem for their owners and brokers. According to the Miami-Dade County Property Appraiser, the county is poised to collect more than \$94 billion in 2020 taxes from condominium owners — money that goes to everything from schools and police and fire services to infrastructure repairs and maintenance.

If prices of older condos take a nosedive, all Miami-Dade residents will feel the pinch, since taxes are calculated by property values.

But if prices drop far enough in older buildings to make selling too much of a loss for the

owner, there's another possible scenario that could eliminate the problem altogether, said Alicia Cervera, chairman and principal of Cervera Real Estate: Condo termination, in which owners decide to sell the entire building to a developer interested in building something new at the location.

"When you sell an entire building in a triple-A location to a developer, you get a much better price for your condo," she said. "It may be that some associations are not doing the repairs because they simply can't afford it. Selling to a developer could be a solution for the owners and would result in the buildings being taken down before they become unlivable. It's a good exit strategy for a lot of condo owners."

## House in armed standoff over taxes on sale again, for \$1.59M

PLAINFIELD, N.H. — A house that was the setting for a monthslong armed standoff in 2007 between a couple and U.S. marshals over tax evasion is back on the market.

The 7,500-foot former home of Ed and Elaine Brown in Plainfield, New Hampshire, is listed for \$1.59 million, the Valley News reported.

The current owners bought the home in 2019 for \$315,000 and put in new windows, a redesigned kitchen, hardwood floors, four fireplaces and a steam room, among the upgrades.

“Some of the first steps that they took was essentially bringing it back up to livable conditions,” said Lochrane Gary, a real estate agent listing the home. “They did everything from the ground up.”

The Browns were convicted of failing to pay taxes on \$1.9 million of income. They declined to appear in court and retreated to the fortress-

like home. U.S. marshals arrived; a standoff went on for nearly eight months as anti-tax crusaders and militia groups rallied to the Browns’ cause. The marshals eventually arrested the Browns.

Elaine Brown apologized for her actions and was released last year after serving over 12 years in prison. Ed Brown is expected to serve another 16 years.

During the arrests, the marshals discovered weapons, pipe bombs and explosive devices. When the home was auctioned off years later, federal agencies couldn’t ensure there were no remaining explosives or booby traps on the 100-acre property.

The property changed hands several times. As the house was being worked on, crews did not come across any explosives the Browns were feared to have used, Gary said. He called rumors of their existence “simply conjecture.”

## Low-income seniors sue property manager over rising rent

TIGARD, Ore. — A group of low-income Oregon seniors is suing their out-of-state property management company, alleging the company deliberately misled them by renting apartments that would soon jump in price.

The class-action suit was filed in Multnomah County Circuit Court Tuesday against Denver-based Mission Rock Residential, Oregon Public Broadcasting reported. The company manages Woodspring Apartments, a federally subsidized building in Tigard.

This January, residents of Woodspring were told that the owner would soon bring the building’s 172 units to market-rate rent.

The suit argues that when San Francisco real estate firm Hamilton Zanze bought the property five years ago, the property managers knew of the plan to raise rent. The lawsuit

alleges the property management company intentionally withheld that information and continued to market the units to people as a retirement option.

Michael Fuller, the lead attorney for the plaintiffs, says a judge should consider this a form of false advertising and deem it an “unlawful trade practice.”

The suit names one plaintiff: Cheyenne, who began leasing an apartment in Woodspring in July 2020. According to the suit, Cheyenne, whose last name is not given in the legal documents, rented the apartment with the expectation that she would be able to stay for decades.

Fuller said he’s asking a judge to issue an injunction ordering the property manager to maintain apartment rents at a rate that is affordable for older people on a fixed income.

Mission Rock did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

# U.S. home prices jump at fastest pace in more than 15 years

WASHINGTON — U.S. home prices soared in April at the fastest pace since 2005 as potential buyers bid up prices on a limited supply of available properties.

The S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller 20-city home price index, released Tuesday, jumped nearly 15% in April from the previous year. That is up from a 13.4% annual gain in March.

Many Americans have sought more living space since the pandemic began, seeking larger homes in suburbs rather than apartments or smaller homes in cities. Historically low mortgage rates, restrained in part by the Federal Reserve's low-interest rate policies, have also spurred demand, just as the large millennial generation ages into a peak home-buying period. The price gains have been so dramatic that home

sales have started to slow as more would-be buyers are priced out of the market.

Still, economists said there is little sign that the housing market's blistering price increases are likely to cool off soon.

"The forces that have propelled home price growth to new highs over the past year remain in place and are offering little evidence of abating," said Matthew Speakman, an economist at real estate data provider Zillow.

All 20 cities that make up the index reported higher year-over-year price gains in April than the previous month. Five cities — Charlotte, Cleveland, Dallas, Denver, and Seattle — had the largest 12-month price increases on records dating back 30 years.

Even as demand rose during the pandemic, fewer Americans were willing to sell their properties, perhaps reluctant to have

waves of potential buyers troop through their homes. That sharply reduced the number of houses available, setting off bidding wars for most properties. Last month, nearly half of homes sold were selling for above their asking price, according to realty company Redfin.

In May, the number of available homes ticked up slightly, to 1.23 million. But that was still down 21% compared with a year earlier.

Sales of existing homes have fallen for four straight months, likely because soaring prices have discouraged some would-be buyers. Still, demand is strong enough that a typical home was on the market for just 17 days last month, the National Association of Realtors said. Nearly 9 of 10 homes were on the market for less than a month.

# Shareholders sue Rocket Companies citing misleading guidance

Detroit-based Rocket Companies was hit Tuesday with a shareholder lawsuit accusing the firm and its executives of giving misleading guidance that the suit says artificially boosted Rocket's stock price in the weeks before founder Dan Gilbert sold \$500 million in stock to finance a major philanthropic effort in the city's neighborhoods.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in Detroit, claims that Rocket executives were extremely optimistic to the point of deception and fraud earlier this year when forecasting the anticipated "gain on sale" margin for its mortgage loans. The gain on sale margin is commonly viewed by investors as a core measure of profitability.

But once the May 5 release of Rocket's first-quarter earnings results showed these margins were

shrinking fast, the company's stock price dropped to \$19.01 per share from \$22.80 per share in a day.

During that May earnings call, Rocket's Chief Financial Officer Julie Booth "admitted" that the trend toward shrinking gain on sale margins began "at the end of Q1," the lawsuit says. The shrinking margins are the result of increased competition among lenders and compression in the price spread between the primary and secondary mortgage market, among other factors, the suit says.

Rocket said during the May earnings call that it was on track for a 2.65% to 2.95% gain on sale margins for the second quarter. Previously, it had a 4.41% margin in the fourth quarter

2020 and 3.74% in the first quarter of this year.

That timing of Rocket's contracting margins is a key fact, according to the lawsuit, because on March 29 — two days before the end of the first quarter and well before news of the contraction was publicized — Gilbert and his wife sold 20.2 million Rocket shares at \$24.75 to net \$500 million in proceeds for their Detroit neighborhoods initiative. The 10-year initiative includes an initial \$15 million to cover low-income Detroiters' delinquent property taxes.

A Rocket Companies representative did not respond to a request for comment Tuesday night. Gilbert, who is Rocket's chairman, is also a defendant.

## Icon Reimagined

### Land Rover Defender Debuts Its First-Ever Total Redesign

Close your eyes and imagine the classic safari Land Rover.

What you're envisioning is the Defender, or at least one of its ancestors. The Defender's roots stretch all the way back to World War II, and its combination of go-anywhere 4x4 capability, utilitarian layout and excellent visibility made it the classic choice for adventures the world over.

How many times has it been completely redesigned since its debut? Just once, and you're looking at the new one.

While the old Defender had evolved thoroughly by the time it was discontinued in the United States in 1997 — and finally ended production altogether in 2016 — its bones dated all the way back to the war-era Land Rover Series I.

To off-road purists, making a new Defender is like making a new Mona Lisa. It simply can't be done.

Land Rover must have channeled da Vinci, though, because the new Defender is a masterpiece of an attempt.

From the moment you see it, there's no mistaking the fresh version is a contemporary machine. It looks sleek and modern on the outside, yet it still is instantly recognizable for what it is: the classic safari Land Rover.



After getting its first-ever redesign from the ground up, the Land Rover Defender is back in the United States after a break of more than two decades.

It's also remarkably refined on the highway. It's not Range Rover smooth, of course, but it's lightyears ahead of its closest American competitor, the Jeep Wrangler. The Defender is smoother, quieter and roomier than the Jeep, making it a better choice for everyday, on-road driving.

Still, on-road driving isn't the point.

The Defender offers 11.5 inches of ground clearance when you put it in off-road mode, which lifts the frame

up higher to clear obstacles. That's more than the Wrangler Rubicon and exactly the same as the Ford Bronco with the Sasquatch Package.

The base turbocharged four-cylinder engine makes 296 horsepower, enough to help it reach 60 mph in a reasonable 7.7 seconds. An optional 3.0-liter turbo six-cylinder makes a much more impressive 395 horses, enough for a 0-60 time of 5.8 seconds, Land Rover claims. My tester came with a

mild hybrid powertrain, which adds some electric boost to the V6 engine to help it achieve fuel-economy ratings of 17 mpg in city driving and 22 on the highway.

It can wade through nearly three feet of water — 35.4 inches, to be precise — and comes with a rear differential that automatically locks when needed to muster up traction in touch situations. It can handle inclines and slopes of up to 45 degrees, which feels more like 90

degrees from the driver's seat, if you've never experienced that.

The equipment to make it do all that adds up to a hefty 6,610-pound gross weight. Coupling that with the Defender's brick-like shape makes this a thirsty beast indeed, rated for 17 mpg in city driving and 20 on the highway.

It also creates some confusion about where it fits in the Land Rover lineup. The Defender is noticeably roomier than the Discovery

but is priced almost \$8,000 cheaper, which makes one wonder why the Disco still needs to exist.

Pricing starts at \$46,100 for the two-door Defender 90, with the traditional luxury-brand caveat that options can rocket the cost higher. Still, if buyers exercise some self control on the upgrades, the Defender seems like an amazing value for the money. It offers a whole lot of capability and luxury for \$46 grand, if you don't mind its fuel-burn numbers.

The four-door Defender 110 starts at \$50,500.

## The case of the mysterious check oil light; can auto-dimming mirror drain the battery?

**Q:** My 2011 Acura MDX with only 83,000 miles does not burn or leak oil. However, when I either make a sharp left turn or sudden stop, the check oil message comes up for a brief instant then goes away. This never happens with any right turn I make or if I stop normally. Any thoughts?

— D.W., Glenview, Illinois

**A:** Honda had some issues with oil pressure switches, especially on engines that had some miles on them. The company released a revised switch that does not trigger at the lower, but safe, pressure typical of worn-in engines. Or maybe you are making some serious high-G maneuvers. The oil in the oil pan may be sloshing to one side and the oil pump gets starved

momentarily. This is more likely to happen if the oil level is low. Check your dipstick.

**Q:** We had an occasional dead battery with my mother-in-law's 2004 Chevy Impala. After an extensive search, our mechanic traced it to the automatic dimmer rear view mirror. Apparently, there was a short that was draining just a few amps but was enough to drain the battery every few days. Once we disconnected the mirror, we never had that problem again.

**A:** Problems such as this have been around forever. If it is not the review mirror, it may be the glove compartment light, the trunk light, the underhood light or myriad other potential battery drains. A simple way for your auto tech to begin is to connect an

ammeter to the battery and start pulling fuses until the drain stops. But then the serious circuit sleuthing begins.

**Q:** I read your Q&A about what to do with the glaring sun and am not sure the "eyebrow" area windshield tint was discussed. It has really helped me. You can get the dark 6-to-8 inches of tint on the top of your windshield and it make all the difference! Better than holding your hand up to block that one place where the sun is searing your vision.

**A:** Tint is permitted only on the top 4-5 inches of the windshield above the A1 line. If your car did not come with a tinted windshield, you can install a strip, but sun strips that dip lower may be illegal in some states. You can find the A1 mark on the top

left portion of the glass.

**Q:** When HID headlights came out, I went for them in a big way because they are vastly superior to the halogens. They also have a distinct horizontal cutoff line. The new LEDs make me want to quit driving at night because of the dazzling effect. And why aren't there standards for headlight height as most of the new vehicles have the headlights at my eye level when I'm sitting in the car?

— J.B., Westmont, Illinois

**A:** High-intensity discharge (HID) lights were a quantum leap ahead for nighttime driving but were expensive and took a moment to reach full intensity. LEDs come on immediately and, as you have seen, are very bright. The U.S. Department of Transportation has regulations for lighting and carmakers must

meet those regs. Some state safety inspections require properly reaiming the lights, but seldom do inspectors go through the trouble to check. In Europe, cars must have headlight lens cleaners (squirters) and automatic leveling, but not in the USA. It is illegal to convert your headlights to LEDs. And those super-bright LED light strips that some idiots install are quite illegal.

## Honda changing course, will build its own electric vehicles

DETROIT — Although General Motors will build Honda's first two fully electric vehicles for North America, the Japanese automaker plans to change course and manufacture its own later this decade.

Company officials say they're developing their own EV architecture, and after two GM-made EVs go on sale in 2024, Honda will start building its own.

"It's absolutely our intention to produce in our factories," Honda of America Executive Vice President Dave Gardner said, adding that Honda has developed battery manufacturing expertise from building gas-electric hybrids. "We absolutely intend to utilize that resource."

Honda and GM have been partners on hydrogen fuel cell and electric vehicles. Earlier this year they announced that GM would build one Honda SUV and one Acura SUV using its Ultium-branded electric vehicle architecture and battery system. The company said the Honda SUV would be named the Prologue, and that both SUVs will have bodies, interiors and driving characteristics designed by Honda.

But after those two, Honda plans its own manufacturing for

most of a series of electric vehicles, although it hasn't determined if it will use GM components.

Gardner says sales projections for the Prologue are between 40,000 and 150,000 per year, but he didn't say when those numbers would be reached.

In April, the company said it plans to phase out all of its gasoline-powered vehicles in North America by 2040, making it the latest major automaker with a goal of becoming carbon-neutral. Honda wants 40% of North American vehicle sales to be battery- or fuel-cell powered by 2030, and 80% of all vehicles sold to run on batteries or hydrogen by 2035.

Honda initially had planned to meet stricter government fuel economy and pollution standards by adding hybrids to improve internal combustion engines. But regulatory actions across the world to combat climate change, including proposals from U.S. President Joe Biden, have moved the company more toward electric vehicles, Gardner said.

Battery-electric vehicles accounted for less than 2% of U.S. new-vehicle sales last year, but analysts are predicting huge growth as automakers roll out new models.

# Taking a bite out of summer: SharkFest runs for six weeks

As summer kicks into high gear and millions flock to beaches, what better time to learn about the ocean's most fascinating creatures? Celebrities, scientists and shark attack survivors take a look at the captivating world of sharks in a programming event that will last most of the summer.

Sharks swim across screens in more than 100 hours of programming during the highly anticipated ninth annual SharkFest from National Geographic, beginning Monday, July 5, and spanning National Geographic, Nat Geo WILD, Nat Geo Mundo, Disney+ and Disney XD.

Many programs will premiere on National Geographic, to be followed by encore airings on other platforms (and Disney+ later still). With at least 21 hours of premiere content and another 60 hours of enhanced archive footage to please shark aficionados from coast to coast, it will all unfold over the course of six weeks — the longest SharkFest ever.

Although many scientists and conservationists have dedicated their lives to raising awareness about sharks, there is so much to learn about the ocean's most often misunderstood creatures. Luckily, SharkFest (not to be confused with Discovery Channel's annual SharkWeek) provides a venue for those ready to dive in and learn more.

"Like every year, shark scientists and oceanic experts have pulled out all the stops for this year's SharkFest, revealing new discoveries, shocking revelations and bizarre shark behavior never seen before," National Geographic Partners executive Janet Vissering said in a statement. "It's going to be jaw-some!"

National Geographic and its partners are bringing a variety of documentaries and docuseries to the small screen this summer, beginning with the season premiere of fan-favorite series "When Sharks Attack," airing Monday, July 5.

The series, which has been around since 2013, features underwater photography, news stories and testimonials from witnesses and survivors who share stories of real-life shark attacks. It also explores what may have caused such events and how they may be prevented in the future.

While "When Sharks Attack" is one of the anchors of SharkFest's annual programming, this year's event also features a number of standalone premiere documentaries.

In what has been billed a "marquee special," one of Hollywood's biggest stars is bringing viewers along as he learns about shark behavior. "Shark Beach with Chris Hemsworth," also premiering Monday, July 5, on National Geographic, stars the actor best known for playing Thor in the Marvel Cinematic Universe.

In the wake of one of the worst shark attack seasons in his native Australia, he embarks on a mission to discover how humans can safely coexist with sharks. Meeting with famed shark conservationist Valerie Taylor, the two embark on a shark dive to get up close and personal with nurse sharks.

SharkFest continues on opening day with "Rogue Shark," as filmmakers take a look at a series of shark attacks that occurred in 2018 near the remote islands of Whitsunday in Australia. All of the attacks occurred in the same patch of ocean, causing some to wonder if a "rogue shark" was on the loose.

Day 2 (July 6) kicks off when National Geographic debuts "Orca vs. Great White," a documentary revealing that orcas began hunting great white sharks off the coast of South Africa in 2017. Cameras follow researchers in New Zealand as they infiltrate shark populations off the country's southern coast and investigate whether it could happen again.

The next day (Day 3), scientists look into surprising new shark behavior in "Shark Gangs," debuting Wednesday, July 7, on National Geographic. Many experts think of sharks as solitary predators, but experts have revealed that the predatory creatures have also been known to hang out in groups. Filmmakers seek to find out whether this is a mark of social behavior or a more effective hunting strategy.

SharkFest wraps up its first week of programming by premiering "Croc That Ate Jaws" (July 8) and "World's Most Dangerous Shark" (July 9).

Among the many high-profile SharkFest specials that follow Week 1 is "Shark Attack Investigation: The Paige Winter Story," premiering Monday, July 12, on National Geographic.

Winter lost a leg and a part of her hand to a shark when she was just 17. After relaying the details of the attack and exploring what might be done to avoid it, filmmakers shine the spotlight on Winter, who, despite her experience, has become somewhat of an unlikely advocate for the creatures.

Disney+ also brings viewers more of "Shark Beach" expert Taylor in the premiering series "Playing With Sharks" on July 23. Director Sally Aitken traces Taylor's journey from champion spear fisher to shark advocate, using archival footage and conversations with Taylor to look at how the intrepid ocean explorer became a pioneer with regard to underwater filmmaking and shark research.

Shark fans may also want to keep an eye on National Geographic and its partners for other premiere specials, including, but not limited to, "Shark Attack Files" (July 12), "World's Biggest Bull Shark?" (July 13) and "Killer Shark vs. Killer Whale" (July 15).

So, what are you waiting for? Dive in when SharkFest kicks off with "When Sharks Attack" and "Shark Beach with Chris Hemsworth" on Monday, July 5, on National Geographic.

## Women of Wimbledon: Championship finals wrap up in London

After last year's cancellation, tennis is returning to the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club in London, England, for the 2021 edition of The Championships, more commonly known as Wimbledon. Be sure to tune in to the women's final on Saturday, July 10, live on ABC and The Tennis Channel.

Wimbledon remains one of the most prestigious tournaments on the calendar for both the women's and men's seasons. One part of its prestige is that it is one of the four Grand Slam tennis events (along with the Australian Open, French Open and U.S. Open). The other is for its long-standing history.

The first championship occurred in 1877, though it was not opened up to women for another seven years, when the inaugural women's championship was held in 1884. While this was the first of many changes, there are a number of traditions that continue to this day, the most famous being the dress code: All of the players must be dressed

completely in white — a rule that also extends to their hats and shoes.

Wimbledon's most successful woman, Martina Navratilova, won nine championships between 1978 and 1990. In fact, between Navratilova and Steffi Graf (the second most successful woman), they won every championship between 1982 and 1993. This two-player dominance repeated itself again in the early 2000s when sisters Serena and Venus Williams won nine championships from 2000 to 2012.

Currently leading the WTA standings is Australia's Ashleigh Barty, who has already won three tournaments, including the Miami Open.

Another favorite to win, Simona Halep (third in the standings), has yet to win a tournament this season but has previously found success at Wimbledon. She has made it to the quarter-finals or later in four of the past six championships, going on to win in 2019.

It's anyone's game as the Wimbledon women's final airs live from London, England, on Saturday, July 10, on ABC and The Tennis Channel.

### When a CEO falls: Kyle Chandler joins cast of Showtime anthology series

**When a CEO falls:** “Friday Night Lights” alumnus Kyle Chandler (aka Coach Taylor) has had no trouble finding work after the NBC series wrapped in 2011, with roles on television and in films such as this year’s “Godzilla vs. Kong.” For his next role, Chandler will be involved with a different kind of Titan: the ride-hailing app Uber.

The Emmy winner is set to star in “Super Pumped,” a new Showtime anthology series from “Billions” creators Brian Koppelman and David Levien, and “Quantico” writer/producer Beth Schacter. The idea is that each season of “Super Pumped” brings you a true story that rocked the business world, one that eventually made headlines for all the wrong reasons — and it doesn’t get more shocking than the rise and fall of a big CEO.

The first installment is based on Mike Isaac’s bestselling book, “Super Pumped: The Battle for Uber,” which chronicles the rise and fall of Uber CEO Travis Kalanick. The television adaptation will explore Uber and Kalanick’s meteoric rise in Silicon Valley, as the ride-hailing app became one of the world’s most valuable startup companies and Kalanick reached billionaire status.

But from 2013 onwards, the company was rocked by allegations of sexual harassment and accusations of a toxic work environment. Kalanick was eventually ousted as CEO in 2017 over concerns he had fostered a flawed corporate culture, though he stayed on as a member of the board of directors until 2019.

Chandler will play the role of Texas venture capitalist Bill Gurley, who staked his reputation on Uber’s success early on.

And who will play Kalanick? Another award-winning actor, Joseph Gordon-Levitt, who won a Golden Globe for 2009’s “500 Days of Summer” and 2011’s “50/50” and recently starred in the Oscar-nominated film “The Trial of the Chicago 7” (2020).

No news yet on a possible release date, but “Super Pumped” has been in the works since 2019. It’s also worth noting that it was originally intended to be a limited series before being bumped up to a seasonal anthology.

**‘Perfect Strangers’ Again:** HBO Max is working on a potential revival of 1980s sitcom “Perfect Strangers.” And now, we are so happy, we do the Dance of Joy.

Longtime TV viewers will remember

the original version as a quirky ABC comedy that ran from 1986 to 1993, and in that time, it was a key part of the network’s TGIF programming block (it occupied the first time-slot when the block was introduced in 1988).

The series centered on the sometimes-contentious relationship between “Cousin” Larry (played by Mark Linn-Baker, “Blue Bloods”) and his distant relative-slash-roommate, Balki Bartokomous (Bronson Pinchot, “Risky Business,” 1983), a shepherd from the (fictional) island of Mypos.

It didn’t win any major awards (except a Young Artist Award for one of its guest stars), but it did make TV history by launching a popular spinoff, “Family Matters.”

Larry and Balki won’t be the stars of this updated version. This time, the story revolves around Deja (Robin Thede, “The Rundown with Robin Thede”) and Poppy (London Hughes, “Damned”), two “perfect strangers” who discover they’re half-sisters when they inherit a one-bedroom apartment above a yoga studio in Fort Greene, Brooklyn.

Like the original leads, Deja and Poppy are polar opposites, but they eventually learn to live and work together.

This new “Perfect Strangers” is still in development. Thede, whose HBO series “A Black Lady Sketch Show” was recently renewed for a third season, will pen the script and serve as executive producer alongside Robert L. Boyett, who was the supervising executive producer on the original show, “Full House,” “Family Matters” and many others.

**Freeform renewal:** Expect more “Cruel Summer” to come. The Jessica Biel-produced YA (young adult) drama recently wrapped its freshman year, but it’s already Freeform’s most-watched series, with an average of 6.8 million total viewers per day. It’s the top new cable drama in 2021 among women aged 18 to 34, and it’s performing well on Hulu, too.

So it shouldn’t come as a surprise to learn that Freeform has officially renewed it for a second season, though the Disney-owned basic cable network has yet to announce when it will be back or for how long (Season 1 consisted of 10 episodes).

“Renewing ‘Cruel Summer’ for a Season 2 was an easy decision,” Freeform president Tara Duncan, who stepped into the role last year, said. “It’s the biggest se-

ries debut in Freeform’s history, and the audience response has been overwhelmingly positive. Jessica [Biel], Michelle [Purple] and [showrunner] Tia [Napolitano] did a phenomenal job telling an addictive story that’s tapped into the cultural zeitgeist. I’m excited to see where they take the series next.” (Take note of that last sentence.)

As for producers Biel and Purple, they had this to say in a joint statement: “To be picked up for a second season is a dream, and we have so many ideas for where we can take this next.”

As it stands, “Cruel Summer” is a mystery that focuses on two young women, popular girl Kate Wallis (Olivia Holt, “Kickin’ It”) and nerdy Jeanette Turner (Chiara Aurelia, “Gerald’s Game,” 2017), who suddenly becomes an outcast after Kate goes missing and she’s accused of being involved in the disappearance.

The story itself was set over the course of three years in the mid-1990s and was told through shifting points of view, with episodes alternating between Kate’s and Jeanette’s perspectives.

But will Season 2 feature the same characters and a new mystery? Or will “Cruel Summer” switch to an anthology format, meaning a completely different mystery and a new cast of characters every season?

In an interview with Deadline last month, Duncan confirmed the same creative team will be back for the second season. She also mentioned that she hadn’t heard how Season 2 will unfold,

exactly, or what the story will center on, so expect more details to emerge in the coming months.
