McKinley shares energy ideas

Also talks infrastructure, other bills he backs

With Congress in recess, Rep. David McKinley, R-W.Va., visited Morgantown Thursday and took time to talk to The Dominion Post. He shared his thoughts on fossil fuels and clean energy, infrastructure and a few bills he's backing.

On clean energy, McKinley said he supports a transition to wind, solar and hydro — but not a precipitous change that outpaces current technology and could do more harm than good.

He cited discussions the Energy and Commerce Committee has had about the CLEAN Future Act, introduced in March.

The act aims to achieve net zero greenhouse gas pollution no later than 2050, with an interim target of reducing pollution by 50% from 2005 levels no later than 2030. It would require all retail electricity suppliers to obtain 100% clean electricity by 2035.

McKinley has argued the goal is hasty. He cites the example of a the John E. Amos power plant in Putnam County, one of eight coal-fired plants in the state.

Working with the National Renewable Energy Laboratory, he determined it would take about 4,250 windmills to replace that single plant; and the spacing requirements for windmills mean that a single wind farm would take up 850 square miles. For comparison, Monongalia County covers 360 square miles; Preston covers 649.

Lyme disease on the rise

W.Va. among 15 states with high number of cases

Dr. Mark E. Rogers has recently seen as many as four cases of Lyme disease daily at WVU Urgent Care at Suncrest Towne Centre, one indication that the tick-borne illness is on the rise in Monongalia County.

"This year, it's really taken off," Rogers said. "We're seeing multiple cases every day."

In fact, the entire county is

diagnosing an average of one COVID-19 case a day, and he personally hasn't seen one since about mid-June. So when a patient comes in complaining of a low-grade fever, malaise, fatigue and joint pain, his first thought is often Lyme disease — an illness caused by the bite of a blacklegged "deer" tick — rather than COVID-19.

"Some of the people we still test for COVID, but I'm telling my patients that the big thing to watch out for is Lyme disease right now," Rogers said.

Cindy Graham, a Monongalia County Health Department registered nurse who helps with Lyme disease investigation, said she started seeing blood-work-confirmed reports of the illness in mid-June. "It really went crazy," she said.

Diagnosing the illness

Lyme is a reportable disease, so medical practitioners who diagnose it via blood work or with a bull's-eye rash at the site of the tick bite must send the

report to the health department.

The bull's-eye rash is left by the tick feasting on the host's blood, during which disease transmission can occur. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates the tick must feed on the host's blood for 36-48 hours before it transmits the disease.

Graham follows up with the reporting practitioner on all cases as well as patients who have positive blood work and/or the rash.

If a practitioner diagnoses

Inaugural festival gives guests 'a sweet taste of the mountains'

In the middle of Mylan Park's Hazel & J.W. Ruby Community Center was a DJ booth and a designated dance floor.

Booths displaying artisanal chocolates, jewelry, wine, spirits and wood carvings created a perimeter for the space.

Illuminated wooden signs and balloon arrangements welcomed guests into the room.

This was the setup for the inaugural Chocolate, Wine & Shine festival that took place Saturday.

Attendees were invited to indulge in "a sweet taste of the mountains" as they circled the room and tasted a variety of wines, distilled spirits and confections while the live music set the tone in the venue. They were also able to partake in games and giveaways, relax with chair massages and commemorate their attendance at the festival by sitting for a few snaps in a complimentary photo booth.

Although the event came together in the end, the process of putting it together was challenging, said Guidon Creative CEO and event director

Jamie Summerlin.

Summerlin and his wife enjoy attending events in the Mid-Atlantic area, and after visiting a similar event that showcased wine and chocolate, Summerlin was inspired to host one of his own that was closer to home.

"I thought, 'What a great opportunity to showcase things in West Virginia that we have here, in a unique environment that we don't typically see,'" he said.

After Summerlin fully committed to the idea of bringing a chocolate and wine festival to Morgantown, he began to reach out to vineyards, distilleries, crafters, artisans and food vendors. He invited them to come together and celebrate West Virginia at the inaugural Chocolate, Wine & Shine festival.

"And here we are. It's turned into a great event, and we're excited to see how the day progresses," he said.

Summerlin faced difficulties when trying to organize the festival in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. He and his fellow organizers spent months working with vendors to navigate the situation, watching as area establishments and events began opening up to see where opportunities existed.

When they saw that July seemed to be the peak

Public may soon see sharps containers

Health Right to discuss placement with police

In October 2019, former Milan Puskar Health Right Peer Recovery Coach Dani Ludwig approached Morgantown City Council about the placement of sharps containers in and around the city's downtown.

A month later, Health Right Executive Director Laura Jones, backed by former Morgantown Police Chief Ed Preston, followed up with an official presentation showing the need for such publicly available needle disposal units.

In January 2020, former City Manager Paul Brake said the containers would likely be up "in the next few weeks."

Health Right ordered the containers days later.

Then the discussion just kind of went silent.

Until now.

"The issue never went away. What happened was they were on back order, which speaks to just how much people are trying to get them out into the community," Jones said, noting production lags due to COVID-19 lengthened the delay.

"We have them now and the next step is to meet with the police chief and others in the community who have ideas about where they should be placed. Then, we'll get them up."

Jones said Health Right is has two sharps disposal containers, and, as previously discussed, will be responsible for placing, emptying and maintaining them.

Representatives of Health Right and the Morgantown Police Department have said the boxes can only improve a bad situation. City police and public works crews, Health Right personnel and neighborhood volunteers expose themselves to

blood-borne pathogens and potentially lethal substances cleaning up used needles concentrated around specific locations.

In his 2019 remarks to council, Preston said the number of syringes col-

lected by the MPD prompted the placement of containers in all the department's cruisers years ago.

The issue, in part, is a byproduct of Health Right's clean needle exchange, which has operated since August 2015. Jones credits the program with preventing the kind

of HIV outbreaks present in cities like Charleston and Huntington.

"We serve three counties [Monongalia, Preston, Upshur] and we actually have people who come from 17 different counties to receive services, because there are no longer any other needle

exchanges in our area — Clarksburg closed and Marion County, I think, either has closed or is planning to close," Jones said. "Probably, last year we did 400,000 syringes."

A large percentage of those needles are returned to Health Right. Jones said the agency disposes of

more than 50 pounds of syringes each month. Clients are also taught how to properly dispose of the syringes per West Virginia DHHR guidelines.

But a lot of needles still end up on the ground. That, hopefully, is where the containers will come in.

"We're trying really

hard to make sure people have access to the appropriate containers they need, even if they are not housed currently," Jones said. "We're just glad that we finally have some movement, and we hope to get them up soon."

Lyme based solely on symptoms minus the bull's-eye rash, that case would not be reported to the health department, which means confirmed cases are probably low.

Growing issue

The Mountain State is one of 15 states, plus the District of Columbia, listed by the CDC as having a high incidence of Lyme disease. Nearby Pennsylvania topped the 2019 data, with 6,763 confirmed cases and 2,235 probable cases. West Virginia's numbers were lower, at 703 confirmed and 182 probable.

The West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources' Zoonotic Disease Group provided updated numbers this week. Last year's statewide number of 1,062 Lyme cases compared to 205 so far in 2021 is misleading, said Michael L. Abshire, a Zoonotic Disease Group research specialist.

"The 2021 numbers look small, but they also do not show all the cases that have been reported so far, only the ones that have been investigated and are confirmed," Abshire said.

By comparison, at this same time in 2020, the state had 243 Lyme cases,

Abshire said.

Dr. Diane K. Gross, MCHD's regional epidemiologist, said the number of Lyme cases tends to increase exponentially in late summer, and the COVID pandemic has probably led to late reporting of cases.

Gross also said while the DHHR's official Lyme number for Monongalia County is 17, she has 26 potential cases that still need to be evaluated.

Rogers and Graham said they have seen Lyme disease in patients of all ages.

Individuals can get it while hiking or camping, but Graham said she has heard a lot of accounts in which individuals reported getting it just working or playing in their yards.

What to look for

Ticks can be found anywhere on the body, but common places include skin folds such as behind the knees, under armpits, around the beltline, in the groin and behind the ears, as well as on the scalp, Rogers said.

And even though a mature deer tick has a distinguished look, with black legs and a red and black body, they might not always be so obvious.

"They can be very tiny nymphs, smaller than a poppy seed," Rogers said. "People come in and don't recall having a tick bite.

But they have the symptoms or the rash."

Those who want to remove it, rather than wait for a health care practitioner's help, should do so with tweezers, making sure to get a firm grip on it in order to get the head out.

"I use the same procedure that the CDC recommends," Rogers said. "Get as close down to the skin where the mouth meets the skin and firmly grasp them and pull them up with traction. The skin is going to tent and it will pop off."

If the head remains embedded, Rogers uses a tiny needle to flick it out like a splinter.

Prevention

The CDC (cdc.gov/ticks) provides information on tick prevention. This includes checking yourself and your pets daily when you return from outdoors.

Prevention starts before you step out the door. Clothes and gear can be treated with products that contain 0.5% permethrin, and individuals also can use Environmental Protection Agency-registered insect repellents that contain diethyltoluamide, or DEET. Anyone planning on spending time outdoors should also consider wearing long sleeves and/or long pants.

In some situations, such

as when multiple members of a family have been diagnosed with Lyme disease contracted while spending time in their yard, Rogers also suggests treating the yard with pesticides.

Treatment

Lyme disease is treated with the antibiotic doxycycline. Rogers prescribes a one-time dose if the patient is not experiencing symptoms. Someone who does have symptoms would get a longer course of the medication, he said, maybe 10 to 21 days.

The bacteria that cause Lyme disease will clear up if treated properly, Rogers added.

Problems can occur if Lyme disease gets into a joint or nerve, where permanent damage can result. "One misconception is that there is this chronic Lyme disease, where people might be on antibiotics for months or years," he said. "That's not something we have evidence for."

Why the rise?

Lyme disease is found primarily in the mid-Atlantic and Northeast regions of the United States. CDC surveillance maps (cdc.gov/lyme/data-surveillance/maps-recent.html) show that more of the state's instances of the illness have

been found in northern West Virginia.

Neither Rogers nor Ed Abbott, a registered nurse who investigates Lyme disease for MCHD, knows why Lyme disease is on the rise, although both believe weather could be a factor.

"That's what I would like to know," Rogers said. "I know it seems like we've had milder winters, but that's hypothetical. But my guess is that we have more surviving through milder winters."

MCHD's Threat Preparedness program conducts tick surveillance, and Abbott said that recently, more ticks have been found in shady areas.

Tick surveillance was suspended last summer because of the COVID-19 pandemic, said Jamie Moore, MCHD's Threat Preparedness program director.

"However, we've resumed dragging for ticks this summer, although efforts have sometimes been hampered by rain," he said.

Tick surveillance is conducted to learn what ticks are in the area and to send off specimens to the state lab to be tested for disease.

So far, surveillance has been done in Monongalia, Preston and Marion counties, with plans to also move into Harrison, Doddridge and Taylor counties. These are the members of the six county Preparedness Action Coalition Team, one of the DHHR's West Virginia Surveillance Regions.

of opportunity, Summerlin and his team decided to go ahead and schedule the festival — fingers crossed that everything would turn out well, he said.

“Everybody’s still being safe and smart, and doing the things they need to do,” he said. “We’re excited to just get everybody back together again and celebrate the best of West Virginia.”

Summerlin said that inaugural events are usually accompanied by concerns as to how everything is going to turn out. An hour and a half after the event’s opening, Summerlin felt everything at his inaugural festival was

running smoothly.

He said based on how the festival appeared to be turning out, he would love to follow up with another one in the future. Even early on in the event, Summerlin and his team already knew of some things they could do to improve it on their end.

“We’d love to see this thing come back,” he said.

Summerlin said he has actually already set a date for next year’s Chocolate, Wine & Shine event: Feb. 12, 2022.

“Valentine’s Day — it’s a great Valentine’s type of event,” he said.

He said tickets for next year’s festival will be available soon.

All that land would have to be acquired — probably by eminent domain — and all those windmills and all the new transmission lines and all the permitting would have to be complete by 2035.

“When you put an artificial, politically driven date of 2035 — do you understand the consequences of that?” he asks.

He has an alternate idea. Continue using fossil fuels, and continue the research to enable existing plants to be retrofitted for net-zero emissions. Shoot to be 100% clean energy by 2050, which he thinks is a more realistic goal given today’s technology.

Section 902 of the act calls for a three-year moratorium on building plastics plants or expanding existing plants. McKinley believes that section may be stricken, as he sees it as self-defeating. We are just passing through a pandemic that saw us dependent on other countries for PPE.

McKinley is also concerned about an interim final recommendations report issued in May by the White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council in response to an executive order by President Biden.

Page 59 of the recommendations lists examples of projects that would not benefit a community and should not receive federal investment.

Among them:
 ■ Fossil fuel procurement, development, infrastructure repair that would in any way extend lifespan or production capacity, transmission system investments to facilitate fossil-fired generation or any related subsidy;

■ Carbon capture and storage or carbon capture, utilization and storage;

■ The procurement of nuclear power;

■ Research and development;

■ Highway expansion;

■ Road improvements or automobile infrastructure, other than electric vehicle charging stations;

■ Pipeline creation, expansion or maintenance.

McKinley said the United States has already achieved Paris Accord goals without signing it; the country has reduced green-

house gas emissions more than the next 12 countries combined.

And, he said, the U.S. is not at the technology level for 100% EV transportation. He estimates the country needs to allow 15-20 years to develop a battery that doesn’t require lithium, cobalt or cadmium, rare earth elements. Extracting one ton of lithium requires excavation of 250 tons of dirt; and one ton of lithium supplies only 20 car batteries.

Cobalt extraction is socially problematic, he said. He showed a picture of children in Africa digging through dirt to find cobalt. There are 40,000 African children 14 and younger mining cobalt.

“If people have a problem with mountaintop mining, this is on steroids,” he said. “I’m with you, but just do it in the right time frame. Don’t put an artificial deadline up, because it’s just going to cause chaos for us.”

If we end carbon capture research, he said — echoing frequent statements by his Democratic colleague Sen. Joe Manchin — no one else will do it, and the glaciers will keep melting and the seas will keep rising. If we perfect it, we can share it and mutually benefit.

“We have this opportunity to become the leader in the globe on this and market it and use it as a diplomatic tool. But if we walk away from it, no one’s going to do it.”

He often cites his four pillars of the costs of going 100% green before we’re technologically ready: Utility bills will rise; thousands of people will lose jobs, which will hollow out communities; air quality won’t get any better because China, India and other countries will still be building plants and fouling the air; and extreme weather events won’t go away.

Infrastructure legislation

Asked about the current debate over infrastructure legislation, McKinley said, “We’re still wrestling with what to do with it.”

Like Manchin and Sen. Shelley Moore Capito, R-W.Va., he favors passing a bill focused on traditional infrastructure — roads, bridges, water, sewer, broadband, ports and airports — and handling social infrastructure separately. A targeted infrastructure bill would pass overwhelmingly and needs the most immediate attention.

Other legislation

At the end of June, McKinley announced he

was selected to serve as a member on the Republican Task Force on Energy, Climate and Conservation. The task force “will focus on developing a policy agenda that promotes innovation, expands and modernizes energy infrastructure and promotes natural solutions and conservation.”

Along those lines, McKinley said his current top priority is a bill he introduced with Rep. Kurt Schrader, D-Ore., called the Clean Energy Future through Innovation Act. It would fund a decade’s worth of clean energy research, development and commercialization — across all sectors — to be followed by establishing a technology-neutral clean energy standard that would reduce CO2 emissions 80% by 2050.

That decade, he said, allows time to get the country ready for a net-zero energy world.

On the health care front, McKinley and Rep. Abigail Spanberger, D-Va., announced Friday they’ve introduced the PROTECT 340B Act, which would prohibit pharmaceutical companies and pharmacy benefit managers from hurting hospitals and other providers that participate in the 340B drug pricing program.

The federal 340B Drug Pricing program requires pharmaceutical companies to provide drugs at discounted prices to specified clinics and hospitals — Federally Qualified Health Centers, Ryan White HIV/AIDS clinics, Medicare Disproportionate Share hospitals, rural hospitals, children’s hospitals and others.

McKinley said that pharmacy benefit managers and insurers reimburse safety net providers for drugs that pharmacies dispense to patients. But through their contract terms, “PBMs and insurers have found creative ways to take the 340B benefit away from safety net providers. As a result, the savings accrue to these for-profit, third-party middlemen at the expense of vulnerable patients for whom they were intended.”

And McKinley has teamed with Rep. David Trone, D-Md., to introduce the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act 3.0. CARA 3.0 is aimed at mitigating the effects of COVID-19 on the addiction epidemic and will build on the original CARA of 2016 and opioid bill of 2018 by increasing funding for prevention, education, research, treatment and recovery.

Auschwitz survivor dies at 96

BERLIN — Esther Bejarano, a survivor of the Auschwitz death camp who used the power of music to fight antisemitism and racism in post-war Germany, has died at 96.

Bejarano died peacefully early Saturday at the Jewish Hospital in Hamburg, the German news agency dpa quoted Helga Obens, a board member of the Auschwitz Committee in Germany, as saying. A cause of death was not given.

German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas paid tribute to Bejarano, calling her "an important voice in the fight against racism and antisemitism."


Born in 1924 as the daughter of Jewish cantor Rudolf Loewy in French-

occupied Saarlouis, the family later moved to Saarbruecken, where Bejarano enjoyed a musical and sheltered upbringing until the Nazis came to power and the city was returned to Germany in 1935.

Her parents and sister Ruth eventually were deported and killed, while Bejarano had to perform forced labor before being sent to Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1943. There, she volunteered to become a member of the girls' orchestra, playing the accordion every time trains full of Jews from across Europe arrived.

Bejarano would say later that music helped keep her alive in the notorious Nazi death camp in occupied Poland and during the years after the Holocaust.



STATE**Justice says lawmaker should resign for explicit TikTok video**

CHARLESTON — West Virginia Gov. Jim Justice called on Saturday for the resignation of a state lawmaker who posted a sexually explicit TikTok video to his public account.

State Del. Joe Jeffries was stripped of a committee assignment Friday after word spread of the social media posting, according to a statement from House Speaker Roger Hanshaw, who called his fellow Republican an "embarrassment."

On Saturday, the state's Republican governor issued a statement calling Jeffries' behavior "sad" and "childish."

"Not only did he yell graphic comments about me to a group of senators during the recent Legislative Session, but now we find that his not-so-secret TikTok is full of disgustingly vulgar videos, which are especially insulting to women," Jus-

tice's statement read. "This is the behavior of an immature child, not a 39-year-old father and elected official."

The governor said he had expected to hear an apology from Jeffries by Saturday morning, "but all he has done is hide from the media and the criticism."

Jeffries did not immediately respond on Saturday afternoon to a phone message left at his office or an email from The Associated Press.

Jeffries, whose district includes a group of counties near the state capital of Charleston, posted the video Thursday. His account was set to private Friday afternoon.

Belinda Biafore, chair of the West Virginia Democratic Party, said Jeffries "has a slew of inappropriate and vulgar videos with his own sexually explicit commentary on a social media app aimed at youth."

Olympics spectators barred from venues

TOKYO — Two more prefectures outside the immediate Tokyo area have decided to bar fans from attending Olympic events because of rising coronavirus infections, Tokyo Olympic organizers confirmed Saturday with the pandemic-delayed games opening in just under two weeks.

Tokyo organizers and the IOC earlier in the week barred all fans from venues in Tokyo and three neighboring prefectures. They make up the overwhelming majority of Olympic venues, although a smattering of outlying areas were allowed initially to have limited attendance.

All fans from abroad were banned months ago.

Now, two prefectures that were permitted to have fans have backed out of those plans.

Fukushima prefecture in northeastern Japan has decided to hold its baseball and softball events without spectators. It has been joined by the northern prefecture of Hokkaido, which will hold soccer games without fans at the Sapporo Dome.

Virus surge hits younger patients in Spain

BARCELONA, Spain — After a brief respite that brought medical activity back to pre-pandemic routines, managers at the Hospital del Mar in this northeastern city are fac-

ing a sharp surge in infections by, once again, rearranging staff shifts and moving patients around in their sprawling facilities.

The increase comes amid the advance of the Delta variant of the coronavirus that spreads more easily. And it's being driven mostly by younger, unvaccinated patients who require less ICU care but are turning in droves to health centers and emergency wards. If they reach the point of needing hospitalization, they typically spend longer in regular wards until they recover.

At this facility, the number of COVID-19 patients has gone from 8 to 35 in just two weeks. That is far from the hundreds that the hospital nursed at the height of previous surges. But it comes as a warning of what could await unless "drastic measures" are taken against the spread of the virus, according to Juan Pablo Horcajada, who coordinates all the COVID-19 activity there.

Survivors of Bosnian genocide speak out

SREBRENICA, Bosnia-Herzegovina — Through tears and in between fraught silences, Devla Ajsic refuses to remain quiet any longer.

Ajsic was 21 years old and three months pregnant in July 1995 when she was repeatedly sexually assaulted in Srebrenica while her fiancé and thousands of other mostly Muslim men and boys were taken away and executed

in Europe's only acknowledged genocide since World War II.

For decades, Ajsic did not talk openly about the horrors she endured after Bosnian Serb forces stormed the eastern Bosnian town in the waning months of the Balkan country's 1992-95 war.

"I locked it all inside for 26 years and suffered in silence. I had no one to confide in, no one to share my pain with. ... I cannot take it any longer," said the now 47-year-old Ajsic, steeling herself as she finally spoke publicly of her ordeal on the eve of the 26th anniversary of the massacre Sunday.

When Bosnian Serb forces captured Srebrenica, which had been declared a U.N. "safe haven" for civilians in 1993, about 30,000 of its terrified Muslim residents rushed to the U.N. compound at the entrance to town in the hope that the Dutch U.N. peacekeepers there would protect them.

However, the outnumbered peacekeepers watched helplessly as Serb troops took some 2,000 men and boys from the compound for execution, raped the women and girls, and then bused the women, children and elderly to Bosniak Muslim-held territory.

Ajsic said she was sexually assaulted and tortured for three days before departing Srebrenica in one of the last buses packed with refugees.

And yet, she believes her personal nightmare,

including the loss of the fetus she had to abort after fleeing Srebrenica, is dwarfed by the weeklong Bosnian Serb killing spree in which over 8,000 mostly Muslim men and boys from the town perished.

Wife of slain Haitian leader decries enemies

PORT-AU-PRINCE — The hospitalized wife of Haiti's assassinated President Jovenel Moïse has given her first public statement since being wounded in the attack that killed him, accusing enemies of wanting "to kill his dream, his vision, his ideology."

Martine Moïse issued the recorded statement in Creole from the Miami hospital where she was being treated for wounds suffered in the attack early Wednesday, and also posted a version on her Twitter account Saturday.

"I'm alive, thanks to God," she said in the recording, which also played on local radio stations. "But I love my husband Jovenel. We fought together for more than 25 years. During all these years, love radiated within the home. But suddenly, the mercenaries came and pelted my husband with bullets."

"You have to be a notorious criminal without guts to assassinate a president like Jovenel Moïse with impunity without giving him the chance to speak," she added. "You knew who the president was fighting against."

Lee statue removed in Charlottesville, Va.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. — A statue of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee was hoisted away from its place of prominence in Charlottesville Saturday and carted off to storage, years after its threatened removal became a rallying point for white supremacists and inspired their violent 2017 rally that left a woman dead and dozens injured.

Work to remove the Lee statue began early Saturday morning. Crews later removed a statue of Gen. Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson.

Scores of spectators lined the blocks surrounding the park where the Lee statue had stood since the 1920s, and a cheer went up as it was lifted off the pedestal. There was a visible police presence, with streets blocked off to vehicular traffic by fencing and heavy trucks.

Charlottesville Mayor Nikuyah Walker gave a speech in front of reporters and observers as the crane

neared the monument.

"Taking down this statue is one small step closer to the goal of helping Charlottesville, Virginia, and America, grapple with the sin of being willing to destroy Black people for economic gain," Walker said.

The removal of the statues follows years of contention, community anguish and litigation. A long, winding legal fight coupled with changes in a state law that protected war memorials had held up the removal for years.

Saturday's work also came nearly four years after violence erupted at the infamous "Unite the Right" rally. Heather Heyer, a peaceful counter-protester, died in the violence, which sparked a national debate over racial equity, further inflamed by former President Donald Trump's insistence that there was "blame on both sides."

The work seemed to proceed smoothly and fairly easily as couples, families with small children and activists looked on from surrounding blocks. The crowd inter-

mittently chanted and cheered as the workers made progress. Music wafted down the street as a pair of musicians played hymns from a church near the Lee statue.

There were at least a handful of opponents of the removal, including a man who heckled the mayor after her speech, but no visible, organized protester presence.

Calif. wildfire prompts Nevada evacuations

BECKWOURTH, Calif. — A Northern California wildfire exploding through bone-dry timber prompted Nevada authorities to evacuate a border-area community as flames leapt on ridgetops of nearby mountains.

The Beckwourth Complex — a merging of two lightning-caused fires — headed into Saturday showing no sign of slowing its rush northeast from the Sierra Nevada forest region after doubling in size only a few days earlier.

The fire was one of several threatening homes across Western states that are expected to see triple-digit heat through the

weekend as a high-pressure zone blankets the region.

On Friday, Death Valley National Park in California recorded a staggering high of 130 degrees. If verified, it would be the hottest high recorded there since July 1913, when the same Furnace Creek desert area hit 134 degrees, considered the highest reliably measured temperature on Earth.

California's northern mountain areas already have seen several large fires that have destroyed more than a dozen homes. Although there are no confirmed reports of building damage, the fire prompted evacuation orders or warnings for hundreds of homes and several campgrounds in California along with the closure of nearly 200 square miles of Plumas National Forest.

Death toll reaches 86 in Florida condo collapse

MIAMI — First responders continuing the search and recovery mission in the debris of the collapsed Surfside condo tower on Saturday morning worked through a thunderstorm that brought heavy down-

pours and strong wind gusts at times.

The recovery effort — which overnight uncovered seven more bodies from the rubble of the Champlain Towers South — briefly paused at 7 a.m. after a lightning strike, and inclement weather was expected the rest of the day.

The grueling, gut-wrenching task of finding victims went on as police-escorted trucks carrying debris from the site were seen on the Julia Tuttle Causeway and the Florida Turnpike earlier in the day. The death toll in the partial collapse of the Champlain Towers South now stands at 86, Miami-Dade County Mayor Daniella Levine Cava told reporters Saturday morning.

Of the 86 victims, 62 have been identified.

There are "potentially" 43 people still missing following what may be the worst building failure in U.S. history, Levine Cava said. "We can only truly account for a missing person who is deceased once an identification is made."

Officials are still working on making the missing list as accurate as possible,

by cross-referencing addresses from the U.S. Postal Service, driver's license records and the condo building roster.

Saturday's work continued in efforts to recover the bodies of victims in the rubble of the oceanside condo building, which partially collapsed at 1:30 a.m. the morning of June 24.

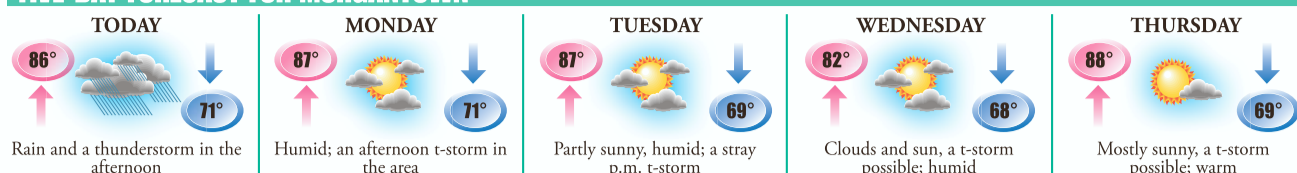
The pace of finding victims has increased substantially since the demolition of the remaining part of the building nearly a week ago, as rescue workers access a wider area. Significant removal of the debris pile has freed up the space for rescuers to search areas they couldn't get to before.

Surfside Mayor Charles Burkett told media Saturday that the pace of the operation makes it "very likely that the site will be clear sooner than expected."

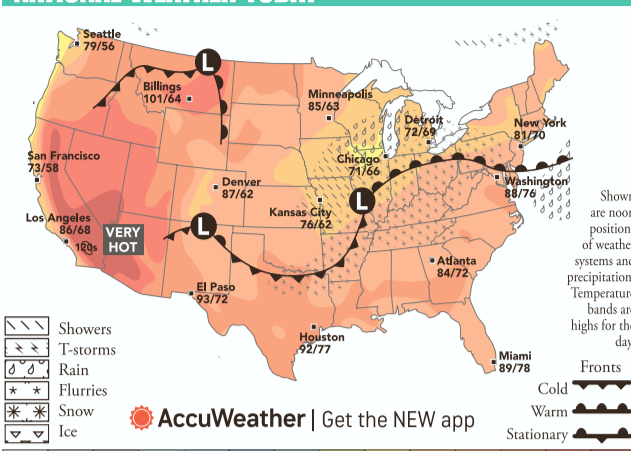
"The progress there remains intense," he said. "Much of the original pile is at ground level or below."

Miami-Dade Fire Chief Alan Cominsky said he didn't have a timeline for when the site will be cleared.

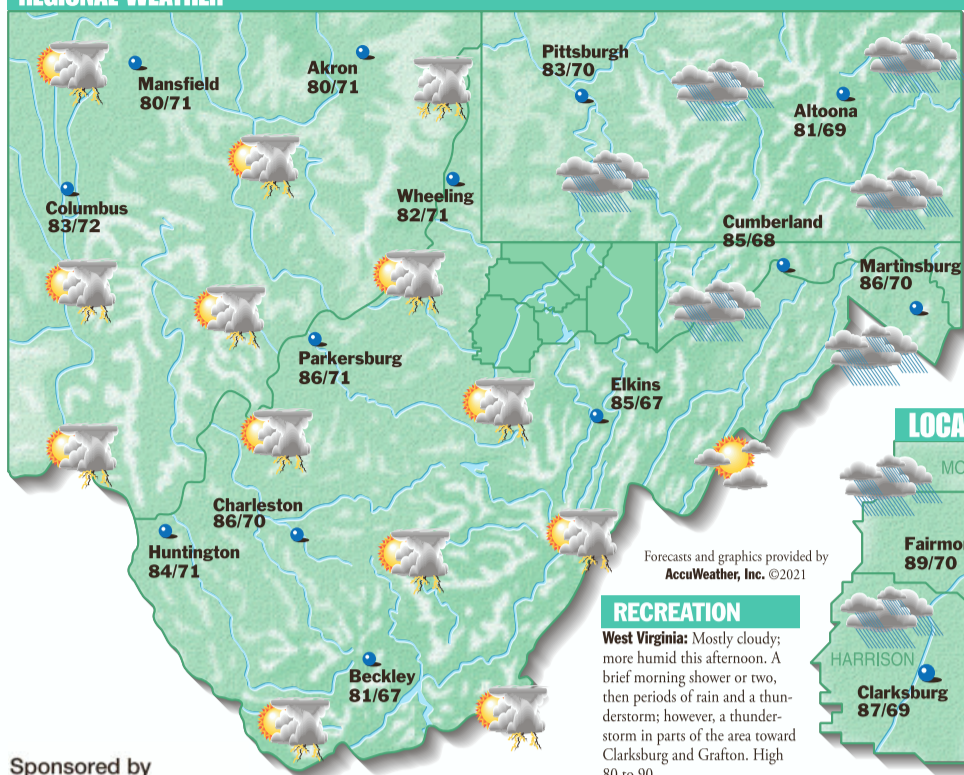
FIVE-DAY FORECAST FOR MORGANTOWN

Mystery of the black hole

They scared me so much that I genuinely thought a black hole would come and suck up my friends and family members and that we would all cease to exist. As time went on, I learned to accept black holes' existence and the fact that it would be unlikely for a black hole to come to Earth anytime soon.

Large stars produce energy at their core. Heat and pressure from this push outwards toward the edges of the star. Directly opposite to them is gravity pushing inwards toward the center of the star.

Eventually, the heat and pressure will die out, and this is when gravity will out-power energy from the core and push all the way inwards to the center of the star. The star then collapses, and there is a supernova explosion (the biggest explosion humans have ever seen). What's left behind is a sphere that has the diameter of New York City but the mass of 10 suns, also known as a black hole.

The more mass something has, the bigger its gravitational pull. The gravitational pulls of black holes are so strong that even light can't escape them. CHARLESTON — The West Virginia Constitution requires Congressional and Legislative boundary lines to be drawn every 10 years using U.S. Census data to indicate changes in population. Despite Census delays at the federal level, public hear-

ings throughout the state will allow residents to weigh in on the process.

The Legislature's Joint Committee on Redistricting will host 12 in-person public hearings and three virtual public hearings, with each set for 6-8 p.m.

An in-person public hearing

has been set for Aug. 12 in Morgantown. The location will be announced later.

House Rule 84 governs public hearings and allows the Joint Committee on Redistricting chairmen to limit the time allowed for public comments at each hearing based on total num-

ber of participants. Senate rules govern standing committees and will be followed in the actions and proceedings of this committee as applicable.

Biden fires head of Social Security agency

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden has fired the commissioner of Social Security after the official refused to resign, and Biden accepted the deputy commissioner's resignation, the White House said. Biden asked commissioner Andrew Saul to resign, and his employment was terminated Friday after he refused the Democratic president's request, a White House official said.

Deputy Commissioner David Black agreed to resign, said the official, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

Both officials had been put in place under President Donald Trump.

Biden named Kilolo Kijakazi as acting commissioner while the administration conducts a search for a permanent commissioner and deputy commissioner.

Kijakazi is the deputy commissioner for retirement and disability policy at the Social Security Administration.

Saul's removal followed a Justice Department legal opinion that found he could be removed, despite a statute that says he could only be fired for neglecting his duties or malfeasance.

The opinion — researched at the request of the White House — concluded that a reevaluation because of a recent Supreme Court ruling meant that Saul could be fired by the president at will.

Biden's move got immediate support from the Democratic senator who would be in charge of confirming a successor to Saul. Republican lawmakers accused Biden of politicizing the agency and pointed to Saul's confirmation by a bipartisan Senate vote in 2019.

Senate Finance Committee Chairman Ron Wyden, D-Ore., said in a statement that "every president should choose the personnel that will best carry out their vision for the country."

"To fulfill President Biden's bold vision for improving and expanding Social Security, he needs his people in charge," Wyden added.

Rep. Bill Pascrell, D-N.J., who several months ago began demanding the ouster of Saul and Black, celebrated their Friday firings.

"Social Security is in deep trouble," Pascrell said.

Sen. Mike Crapo of Idaho, the top Republican on the finance committee, and Rep. Kevin Brady of Texas, the top Republican on the House

Ways and Means Committee, issued a joint statement calling Biden's decision "disappointing." The pair claimed "Social Security beneficiaries stand the most to lose from President Biden's partisan decision to remove Commissioner Andrew Saul."

Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., called the personnel move an "unprecedented and dangerous politicization of the Social Security Administration."

The agency, headquartered in Baltimore, pays benefits, funded by a tax on wages paid by employers and employees, to about 64 million people, including retirees, children, widows and widowers, according to its website. The agency has a staff of about 60,000 employees.

Saul was confirmed by a Senate vote of 77-16 in 2019 to a six-year term that would have expired in January 2025, tweeted Sen. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa.

Ralph de Juliis, spokesperson for the American Federation of Government Employees SSA General Committee and Council 220 President, said employee morale and agency operations had suffered under Saul and Black's leadership.

The 2018 House Bill 4002 requires West Virginia to join the majority of other states electing delegates from single-member districts for the first time in this cycle. The current 100 delegates come from 67 districts, with 22 members elected from 11 two-member

districts, 18 legislators elected from six three-member districts, eight legislators elected from two four-member districts and five legislators elected from a five-member district. Once the initial plans are completed by the Joint Committee on Redistricting, the House and Senate will generate the necessary reports and maps to draft a redistricting bill.

the reality of the ongoing pandemic.

"Of course the pandemic is not over, the variants exist, and the whole thing about paying attention to science and the numbers is that there is no universal, one size fits all, 'This is the answer.'"

"I'm going on a comedy tour to create frivolity, but not frivolously," he quipped.

In that spirit, Kaplan believes that the return to live, in-person shows — and live comedy in particular — only adds to the experience.

"I think the audience experience, because of going through the cold water of the lockdown, it will feel warmer," he said.

Live performance is in

no small part an interaction between the performer and the audience, something that has been difficult to recreate in online Zoom shows and "virtual comedy clubs" of the pandemic. In Kaplan's estimation, it's downright enchanting.

"My friend Dylan Brody said, 'I believe jokes are powerful spells, and they only work if you say them in the right order and the right rhythm.'"

Thinking back to his first time invoking the spells, in the clubs and coffee houses of Boston where he attended college, even after more than 20 years performing, Kaplan still marvels at the power of jokes.

" 'Let there be laughs' was kind of how it felt."

Making your plans for the week and reading this over your Sunday cup of coffee, you may find yourself wondering, "Is this show for me?"

Asked to categorize his style of comedy, Kaplan pondered metaphors about jazz, meditation, and music, before suggesting the curious check out some of his clips from "Conan" or his latest special, "A.K.A." to make up their own mind.

When pressed, he ultimately landed on a simple explanation of his style.

"I like sharing joy, and I hope you also like experiencing it."

more than three times as massive as the sun, the gravitational pull would out-power all other forces and a black hole would appear.

The edges of a black hole are called the event horizon. An object cannot escape the black hole's gravitational pull after passing the event horizon. What happens to the object depends on the type of black hole. There are two types of black holes: the stellar-mass black hole and the supermassive black hole. Stellar-mass black holes are as massive as three to dozens of suns. These black holes are varied throughout the Milky Way. Supermassive black holes are as massive as 100,000 to billions of suns. These are found at the center of most big galaxies, including the Milky Way.

Interestingly, stellar-mass black holes have a stronger gravitational force than the supermassive black holes. Being pulled in by a stellar-mass black hole will cause your

body to be stretched like a rubber band until you are ripped apart. This is called spaghettification and can happen before you even cross the event horizon.

On the other hand, being pulled in by a supermassive black hole means you can cross the event horizon in one piece. You'll then start free-falling until you reach the black hole's point of singularity (the center of the black hole where density is infinite and time and space break down). You'll then be squashed and merged with the point of singularity. But someone observing you from a distance will see you falling in slow motion, then becoming frozen, and then just dimming away until you cease to exist.

At the event horizon, time becomes still and space is moving forward into the black hole (you can think of it as time and space swapping roles). There is also evidence of intermediate-sized black holes, but we don't know too much about them.

When I was in seventh grade, my science teacher

was telling us about how scientists had detected gravitational waves (invisible ripples in space) and it was evidence for a black hole. There are usually two sources of gravitational waves: two neutron stars merging and two black holes merging. When two black holes merge, they create one big black hole.

Even though black holes seem like they're scary, they're a really cool thing that exist all across our universe.

Thrill ride malfunctions during Michigan festival

TRAVERSE CITY, Mich. — A thrill ride at a popular festival in northern Michigan was dismantled and an investigation started after the machine appeared to tip and pitch with riders aboard.

Bystanders recorded the incident with cell-phones Thursday night. No serious injuries were reported.

The Magic Carpet Ride "came off the blocking," said Joe Evans of Arnold Amusements. It was being sent back to the Ohio company that manufactured it.

The ride's operator switched off the power and jumped to safety, the Traverse City Record-Eagle reported.

Bystanders grabbed a guardrail attached to the ride's main base to hold it down.

Rides at the midway are inspected daily by Arnold Amusements employees, annually by the state and three times a year by a third party, the company said.

Company fails to address cyber security

Executives at Miami-based Kaseya Ltd. were warned of critical security flaws in its software before a ransomware attack this month that affected as many as 1,500

companies, according to five former employees.

On several occasions from 2017 to 2020, employees at Kaseya's offices in the U.S. said they flagged wide-ranging cybersecurity concerns to company leaders. But those issues often weren't fully addressed, according to the workers.

Among the most glaring problems was software underpinned by outdated code, the use of weak encryption and passwords in Kaseya's products and servers, a failure to adhere to basic cybersecurity practices.

A Kaseya spokesperson declined to address the accusations.

other synthetic fibers are likely unsafe to steep in hot water. Dyes may also contain chemicals unsafe to drink. Bamboo and rayon fabrics are highly processed with chemicals. Organic cotton, linen or hemp are most suitable for making items which will come in contact with food or drink.

Decide on the size tea bag you prefer. To make a large size (as shown in photos) cut a rectangle about nine inches long and four inches wide. You can also make a smaller bag. Avoid making it too small, as it will be harder to clean.

Zig-zag the edges of all four sides. If sewing by hand, whip stitch the edges. This will keep the fabric from fraying.

Using a straight stitch, hem the shorter sides by folding them down about a quarter of an inch and sewing to secure.

Using a pin or a washable fabric pencil, mark two half-inch lines in the center below and perpendicular to the hemmed edges. Following these marks, make button holes.

If your sewing machine has a button hole feature, use that. If it doesn't or if you are sewing by hand, you can simply cut a slit where you've marked and whip stitch tightly around the edges of the slit.

Fold your rectangle so the hemmed edges are together; right sides facing. Sew along the two-side edge (not the folded or hemmed sides).

Turn the bag right side out, and it's ready to use. Fill the bag with tea or herbs, then thread a chopstick or other food-grade stick through the button holes to balance across your mug. Alternatively, thread a natural fiber ribbon or twine through the holes to drape over the side. Add a cute weight to the end of the ribbon if you want, to help keep the bag balanced.

Buying tea in bulk or making your own and using a reusable bag is a great way to cut down on

Morgantown clobbers Post 33 in weekend DH

STEBENVILLE, Ohio — Morgantown Post 2 swept Steubenville on the road a Saturday doubleheader, taking Game 1, 9-2, and running over their Ohio counterparts, 11-4, in Game 2.

Post 2 picked up the early lead in Game 1 with a solo run in the first and three runs kicked off by Jacob Kennell who stole home on error. Zach Owens then singled to send Avante Neal in from third before Aaron Forbes ran the lead up to 4-0 on a double liner to right field to put in Owens.

Morgantown would put up three more runs in the top of the fifth before Steubenville found room on the scoreboard, sending two home in the bottom of the same inning. Post 2's defense held tight, allowing no runs in the sixth or seventh, while the offense tacked on the final two runs of the game in the top of the seventh.

Cassen Sutton took the loss for Steubenville, pitching 4 innings. He allowed five runs on seven hits, striking out and walking four.

Just as in Game 1, Morgantown opened the second installment of Saturday's doubleheader by taking a hefty lead and playing lockdown defense for the majority of the game.

With a two-out count in the bottom of the first, Tony Marsh doubled to center field, giving Avante Neal an easy run. It was nearly a two-run double, but Zach Owens was caught taking home to close the inning.

Morgantown found the board again with another two-out count against them when Aaron Forbes singled to the sweet spot in center field to push in Neal. A following ground out for Marsh saw the third inning close with Post 2 up, 2-0.

It didn't take long for Post 2 to split the game wide open with a big, six-run fourth inning. Cody Thomas kicked off the scoring drive with a sac fly, putting in Ethan Smith. Then, with the bases loaded, Neal singled in one, a hit by pitch put in another and the visitors methodically ran up the score after that. Make no mistake, it's the wild, wild West out there, as college athletes by the thousands have tweeted for companies to direct message them for endorsement opportunities, while the local universities have little to go by in terms of regulating what's happening around them.

The results have been both interesting and expected.

A BBQ joint in Arkansas signed the offensive line from the University of Arkansas to a deal to promote the restaurant.

That one was pretty good.

The flip side is the story out of Miami, where gym owner Dan Lambert signed every University of Miami scholarship football player to an annual \$6,000 deal — \$500 a month — to promote his gym.

That deal will cost Lambert more than \$500,000 per year, in what really is a story of a booster simply handing cash over to college athletes ... legally.

There is more to the NIL story, though, than just the cash exchanging hands.

What NIL has the potential to do is change the landscape of athletics and how the rest of us view wins and losses.

What we're talking about here is not the athletes already signed and enrolled at schools, but rather the impact that NIL will have on where future top-level recruits sign and play.

We're talking about recruiting wars that were once settled by things such as tradition, facilities, the level of conference the schools played in and a possible path to the pros now being settled by what kind of endorsement opportunities are available.

Let's keep this discussion to college basketball, because that truly is the one money-making sport where a team's fortunes can change drastically with just two or three players, as opposed to college football, where you need so much more than just a star quarterback or defensive lineman.

Michigan safety Stokes commits to Mountaineers

The run on the recruiting trail for the West Virginia football program continued Saturday with a commitment from Harper Woods (Mich.) safety Christian Stokes.

Stokes, at 6-foot-1 and 180 pounds, became the eighth prospect to pledge to the Mountaineers since the calendar flipped to June, bringing the total number of commitments to 13 in the 2022 class.

The Rivals.com 3-star prospect had narrowed his options down to WVU, Iowa and Michigan State, but ultimately, the Mountaineers won out. Stokes took an official visit to Morgantown from June 4-6, an unofficial to Michigan State and then finally an official to Iowa from June 25-27.

WVU became the pick for the highly-rated safety in large part because of his fit in the defense and his connection with the coaching staff in Morgantown.

Stokes had a connection with safeties coach Dontae Wright since he was in the eighth grade and became familiar with the

assistant when he was working at Western Michigan. The fact Wright continued to prioritize Stokes even after coming over to WVU resonated with him.

Stokes gives the Mountaineers a versatile safety prospect who could fill several different spots in the backend of the defensive scheme. Also a running back at the high school level, Stokes has a nice blend of size, speed and power to bring to the Mountaineers' safety room.

All eight of the pledges for WVU the last two months have come from prospects that took official visits to campus during June and puts WVU inside the top 25 classes in the nation.

Stokes shouldn't be the last commit, either, as a number of other prospects are set to make decisions in the coming days and weeks heading into their senior campaigns. One of those is another prospect from Michigan in Stokes' close friend, safety Jaden Mangham, who visited campus with him in June.

Another day in July, another commitment for the Mountaineers, and this is one that will help them get into a state where they've not had a lot of success over the years in Michigan.

Busch goes 5-for-5 for Xfinity sweep

HAMPTON, Ga. — Kyle Busch's Xfinity Series sweep wasn't as sweet as he hoped.

Busch completed a 5-for-5 sweep of what he says will be his final season in the Xfinity Series with a late recovery at Atlanta Motor Speedway on Saturday.

Busch knocked teammate Daniel Hemric from the lead with a late push. That cast a pall on what otherwise would have been an ideal way for Busch to say goodbye to NASCAR's second-tier series.

"It's not quite the win we were hoping for," Busch said. "A little bit of a somber win I guess, not just for it being the last one but for the way it kind of happened."

Busch finished 0.550 seconds ahead of Jeb Burton for his 102nd Xfinity victory and 222nd overall in NASCAR's three national series.

Busch took the lead after pushing Hemric on a restart with six laps remaining. Busch appeared to be trying to give Hemric, his Joe Gibbs Racing teammate, a helpful push on the restart. Instead, Hemric lost control and hit the wall.

"I just wanted to hit him forward and straight but turned him sideways a little bit," Busch said.

Busch said he plans for this to be his final Xfinity race, though he left room to change his mind.

"Yeah, this is it," Busch said. "You never say never, but this was the last one, the last scheduled one."

One week after Hemric had a runner-up finish to Busch, he was on the verge of his first career win before spinning on a restart when pushed by Busch with six laps remaining.

Busch said some will say he wrecked his teammate to clear the way for his sweep-clinching victory.

"People would say I did it on purpose, but why would I need to do it on purpose?" he said. "Kid going for his first win. I'm going for 102. I've been there, done that. I don't need it. It would certainly help him a hell of a lot more than it's going to help me and give the perception that now I have on that."

Hemric took the lead on the final stage after Busch won the first two stages.

Busch has 102nd Xfinity victories and 222 overall in NASCAR's three national series.

Noah Gragson was third, followed by Justin Haley and Ty Dillon. Hemric finished 30th.

Xfinity points leader Austin Cindric was 10th.

"Unfortunately, that was the position we were in last time we were here and came with a new setup and tried to make things work today and we found ourselves in about the same position or maybe worse," Cindric said.

Austin Dillon finished 11th as a late fill-in for Michael Annett, who was unable to drive the No. 1 Chevrolet due to a nagging leg injury. Dillon started at the back of the field.

One of Dillon's first radio communications was a question asking for the name of his spotter and crew chief.

NASCAR only allows Cup Series drivers, including Busch, to compete in five Xfinity and five Truck Series races each year. Atlanta was Busch's fifth and final Xfinity event — and fifth win — of 2021.

Busch said the scattered turnout by fans shows NASCAR shouldn't be keeping the big names away from the second-tier series.

"I know it's Atlanta, I know it's 86 degrees out there but those grandstands didn't look too good today," he said. "... Names sell and if you ain't got names you ain't selling."

Alonso's HR lifts Mets to DH split with Bucs

NEW YORK — Pete Alonso homered, Jeff McNeil drove in two runs and the New York Mets beat the Pittsburgh Pirates 4-2 on Saturday night for a doubleheader split.

Alonso gave the Mets a 3-1 lead when he connected on a 1-1 fastball from Max Kranick (1-1) with two outs in the third inning. Alonso's 428-foot solo drive hit a glass window on a club area just inside the left-field foul pole.

It was the 17th homer for Alonso, who is defending his All-Star Home Run Derby title on Monday night in Colorado. Alonso won the competition in 2019, and it was canceled last year because of the pandemic.

Alonso and McNeil helped the Mets to the victory in front of 31,924 fans, the club's largest home crowd since Sept. 28, 2019, when the first baseman hit his 53rd homer to break the rookie record set by Aaron Judge.

The Pirates won the opener 6-2 behind five innings and a tiebreaking homer by Tyler Anderson off Marcus Stroman.

New York got off to a fast start in the second game when McNeil hit a two-run double in the first. Billy McKinney added a pinch-hit RBI single in the sixth.

The Mets played their 10th of 13 doubleheaders this season. It is their most doubleheaders since playing 13 in 1979.

New York is the first team to play at least 10 doubleheaders before the All-Star break since the Toronto Blue Jays in 1978.

All-Star Bryan Reynolds hit a two-run homer in the opener and an RBI single in the nightcap for the Pirates, who were trying to sweep a doubleheader from the Mets in New York for the first time since Sept. 10, 1969. Jacob Stallings connected for Pittsburgh in the second game.

Mets right-hander Tylor Megill allowed one run and four hits in 3 2/3 innings in the nightcap. Jeury's Familia (4-1) got the

final out of the fourth, and Seth Lugo allowed Stallings' homer in the sixth.

Edwin Diaz struck out the side in the seventh for his 19th save in 20 chances.

Kranick allowed three runs and four hits in three innings.

In the opener, Anderson (5-8) won consecutive starts for the second time this season, allowing two runs and six hits. He went winless in an eight-start

span from May 15-June 28.

The game was tied at 2 when Anderson went deep with two out in the fifth, driving a 1-1 cutter from Stroman (6-7) over the wall in right-center. It was Anderson's second career homer in 152 at-bats and first since July 9, 2016, for Colorado against Philadelphia.

"As soon as I hit it, I was hoping it got over the outfielder's head," Anderson said. "And then they were catching home runs ear-

lier in the game. So, once it looked like it had a chance, I was hoping it wouldn't get caught too."

It was Pittsburgh's first homer by a pitcher since Steven Brault on Sept. 1, 2019, and the first go-ahead homer by a Pirates pitcher since Gerrit Cole on Aug. 26, 2017.

Reynolds was robbed of a home run when Mets center fielder Brandon Nimmo made a terrific leaping catch at the wall in the first. But Reynolds easily cleared the fence in right-center on his two-run homer off Trevor May in the sixth.

Jonathan Villar homered and Kevin Pillar hit an RBI single for the Mets in the opener.

Stroman lost his third straight decision. He was charged with three runs and five hits in five innings.

Mets: RHP Carlos Carrasco (strained right hamstring) threw three innings and about 30 pitches in a simulated game. Manager Luis Rojas was particularly impressed with Carrasco's changeup and said he could start a rehab assignment next week. ... 3B/OF J.D. Davis (sprained left hand) is continuing his rehab assignment with Triple-A Syracuse and could rejoin the team next weekend.

Up next

RHP Chase De Jong (1-3, 5.08 ERA) starts Sunday for Pittsburgh. The Mets will likely do a bullpen game.

How fawns survive the early months

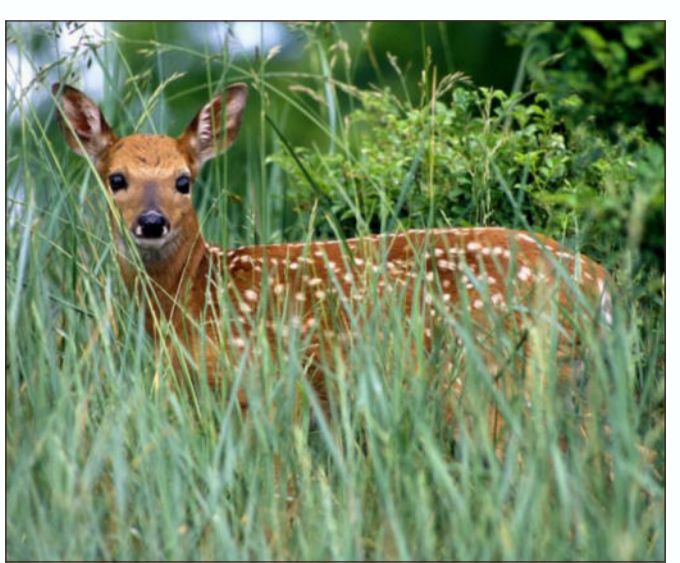

Is there anything cuter than a newborn fawn? Seems sad that roughly half of all fawns die before they are 6 months old. No question that during those first six months there is a lot going on in a fawn's life. The latest issue of Quality Whittails magazine has several articles that focus on fawns. This magazine is the Journal of the National Deer Association. Google their name and become a member and subscribe to this magazine for \$35 a year. If you hunt deer, you will be glad you joined. Kip Adams has forgotten more about whitetail biology than most of us can learn in a lifetime. His article on fawn mortality was fascinating and informative. Does and their newborn fawns have a number of behaviors that allows them to dodge death from predators. For example, the time they are born. Most in our area are born in early June. Those born earlier may not weigh enough to be in the best health when born. Those born later won't be mature enough to survive an early winter. So, early June is good for the fawns. During the first two weeks of the fawns life, does and fawns utilize sev-

eral behaviors that protect fawns from predators. For example, during this period, fawns do not urinate nor defecate. To do so could attract predators. They've evolved a unique behavior where the doe licks the fawn's genital and anal regions to stimulate them to release their wastes. The doe then consumes the urine and feces to prevent those odors from attracting predators. Early in life the fawns nurse, then leave their mothers and bed down alone. They stay alone for a few hours or up to 12 hours while the mother goes off to feed. This is when the fawns are most susceptible to human predation. Yes, this is when well-meaning people pick up fawns that they believe are abandoned. Abandonment at these times is rare, and when the fawn is removed, the doe comes back and can't find her fawn. Taking fawns is illegal and pretty much guarantees its death.

A few weeks ago my daughter (Jennifer) had a fawn bed behind her patio in Greystone all day till dark. The next morning the fawn was gone. I told her that the doe had returned and got her fawn. Last week that same fawn was bedded again almost in the same spot. This time the doe returned in several hours. Why do I think it was the same fawn. First, it was left in the same spot. Secondly, Jennifer had photos from both occur-

rences that showed the patterning of spots on the fawns back. They were identical. An article in Quality Whittails reports on a Mississippi study that shows that such spot patterning tends to be genetically controlled. Back to fawn bedding. The doe doesn't take the fawn to its bedding site, but rather to a general location. This reduces odor in the bedded area, again to reduce predation. When she returns for her fawn, she calls, and the fawn responds and goes to the mom to nurse, then they may hide again. Fawns hold tight when humans or predators come close. They haven't heard the mother call. Neat adaptation for survival. Here's some trivia for you. There's a common

myth that fawns have no odor and this is how they "hide" from predators. Of course all animals have scent, including fawns. The mothers eat the feces early on to reduce fawn scent, but it's still there. Another myth is that touching a fawn will prevent the mother from coming back for that fawn because there's human odor on that fawn. Of course that isn't true. If it was true, then all the newborn puppies and kittens would be abandoned, as would calves, and any wild animal. Doesn't happen.

Munoz takes 1-shot lead at wide-open John Deere

SILVIS, Ill. — Sebastian Munoz tried to imagine what Saturday at the John Deere Classic would have felt like without electronic scoreboards around the golf course. It have created a lot less stress. In rain-softened conditions at the TPC Deere Run, everyone knew that making birdies was the only way to stay in the game. Once the rain cleared and Munoz no longer had to deal with keeping clubs dry and umbrella open, the Colombian ran off three birdies that gave him a 4-under 67 and a one-shot lead going into the final round. But the key is all these guys here can hit those shots, you just have to stay within yourself, and a few bounces here and there go your way, and we'll see what happens." Five players were two shots behind, a group that included Scott Brown, who

boards let him know he was falling behind. "We could see on the leaderboard that people were going low, and you didn't want to kind of fade," Munoz said. Supreme Court says child slave labor OK ...

... as long as it happens outside the United States

In a rather disappointing June decision, the Supreme Court ruled 8-1 that Nestle USA (a subsidiary of the Swiss-based Nestle, most famous for their chocolate) and Cargill Inc. (one of the largest privately held U.S. companies and an agricultural goods transporter and corn syrup processor) could not be held liable for child slavery on the cocoa farms that produce the cocoa they use.

For context, six African men claimed they had been trafficked as adolescents from Mali to Ivory Coast (which, along with Ghana, produces 60% of the world's cocoa) and forced to work on cocoa farms, supervised by armed guards and paid only in basic food. The lawsuit was filed under the Alien Tort Act, "which lets non-U.S. citizens seek damages in American courts in certain instances," according to Reuters. The court's opinion stated that while Nestle and Cargill provided resources to cocoa farms using child slave labor, the plaintiffs couldn't prove decisions made on U.S. soil directly affected child slavery on the farms.

Justice Clarence Thomas wrote for the majority: "Nearly all the conduct that they say aided and abetted forced labor — providing training, fertilizer tools and cash to overseas farms — occurred in Ivory Coast."

We obviously disagree with Thomas. We should not have to argue the immorality of child slavery. Any financial or material help a company provides to a business that uses forced child labor does, in fact, perpetuate child slavery, and that company should be held accountable for human rights violations. In this case, it should not matter that the resources provided did not come directly from the U.S.

As the BBC reported, the plaintiffs say "both companies perpetuated that slave trade to keep cocoa prices low." And that is the other side of the issue.

As long as there is free or cheap labor and resources somewhere else, and no consequences for the companies, American businesses will continue to outsource, regardless of the negative impact it might have.

This is not an indictment of American workers demanding a living wage. All workers, here and abroad, working full-time deserve to earn enough money to live on. This is an indictment of the economic system that incentivizes administrators at the top to maximize profits for themselves, no matter the human or environmental cost.

The solution is not to lower American workers' standards, but to raise the rest of the world's standards and to have repercussions for dangerous or exploitative business practices. Because until it is more cost effective to conduct business ethically than unethically, corporations will continue to turn a blind eye to human rights violations within their companies and supply chains.

The fact of the matter is, Nestle and Cargill, no matter their spokespeople's objections, will continue to work with operations that use child slave labor until there is a consequence for doing so that cuts into their bottom lines.

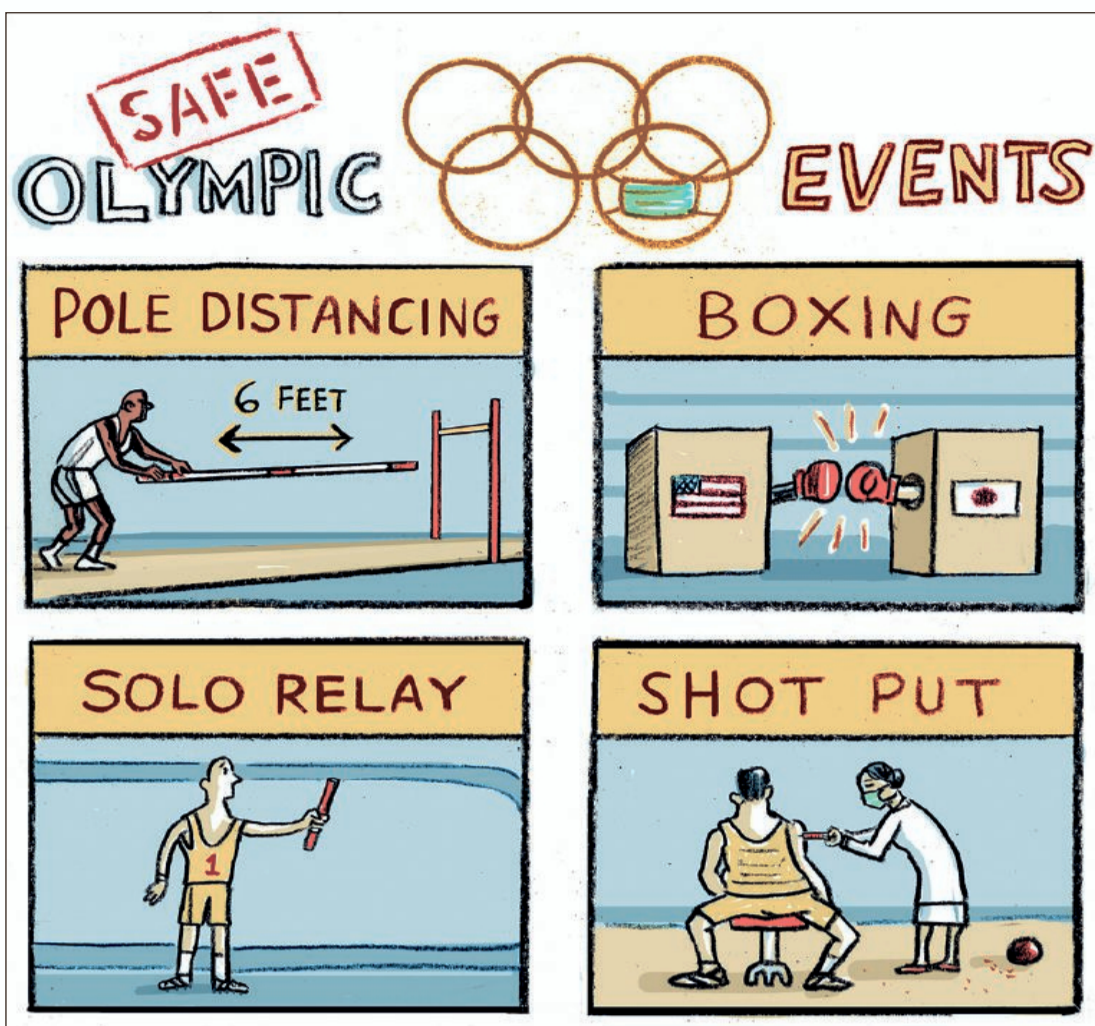

Unstable housing is a health care issue

In the July 4 edition, Joanna DiStefano's guest essay on "Housing crisis needs a federal solution" hit home for me as a physician who has encountered numerous homeless patients or those with unstable housing.

Multiple studies have shown that being without stable housing can be detrimental to one's health. Those who are unfortunately chronically homeless suffer from higher morbidity in both physical and mental health as well as increased mortality.

Lack of stable housing also leads to high health care expenditures due to overuse of emergency departments and inpatient hospital admissions in place of continuity in primary care clinics. Even those who are not chronically

homeless but experience housing uncertainty (couch surfing, falling behind on rent, frequent moves) are more likely to face poor health compared to stably housed peers.

We also know that youth are at increased risk of teenage pregnancy, early drug use and depression when housing is unstable.

Due to disruptions in employment and social security benefits, patients are unable to afford clinic copays or their medications (or even properly store medications if refrigeration is needed).

Providing access to stable housing can improve health and reduce health care costs. In a population of 10,000 people with unstable housing in Oregon, delivering affordable housing led to a decrease in Medicaid expenditure by 12%, increase in outpatient primary care use by 20% and a decrease in emergency department use by 18%.

I agree with Ms. DiStefano that affordable housing should be a priority of our congressional representatives as the benefits include a healthier population.

There's a reason Biden won't talk about Afghanistan

A COUPLE WEEKS AGO, WHEN REPORTERS ASKED PRESIDENT JOE BIDEN WHETHER HE WORRIED THAT AFGHANISTAN'S GOVERNMENT MIGHT COLLAPSE in the face of Taliban military advances, he responded with ill-concealed annoyance.

"I want to talk about happy things," he said.

The president went on to answer — he said the regime could survive, but only if its members stop squabbling — but then called a halt.

"I'm not going to answer any more quick questions on Afghanistan," he said.

It's no mystery why: Subjects like job-creation reports or the U.S. recovery from the pandemic let Biden talk about successes. Afghanistan offers only a choice of failures.

The news is dire. The Taliban has seized much of the country's territory; the Afghan government's armed forces, which the U.S. spent more than \$88 billion building, appear to be disintegrating. In the areas they conquer, the Taliban is reimposing Islamic fundamentalist rule, including oppressive treatment of women. If the government survives, the country could quickly descend into civil war.

"The devastation and the killings ... President Biden is going to own these ugly images," Rep. Michael McCaul, R-Texas, warned last week.

That was a partisan jab but nonetheless true, and Biden knows it: Presidents get blamed for disasters that occur on their watch, whether they caused them or not.

Biden has seen that. He was vice president when President Obama withdrew U.S. forces from Iraq to general acclaim in 2011, only to come under fire when Islamic State rampaged across the country in 2014.

So even if Biden would rather talk about "happy things," he'll have to remain engaged in Afghanistan — for political reasons as well as for national security and humanitarian ones.

That means he'll need to push for negotiations between the Taliban and the Kabul government in hopes of reaching a peace agreement, or at least preventing a bloodbath, which diplomats consider more achievable.

It means warning that the U.S. will use force against terrorists in areas under Taliban control, just as it does in other countries.

It means mounting an energetic effort to help more

than 18,000 Afghans who worked for the U.S. military get out of the country with their families.

And it means updating contingency plans to evacuate the U.S. Embassy in Kabul, which still has about 4,000 employees, including 1,800 Americans, guarded by some 650 U.S. troops.

No wonder Biden is tetchy when asked about the subject. He's holding a bag left to him by three earlier presidents: George W. Bush, who launched the 2001 invasion but then focused on Iraq; Obama, who tried to stabilize the country with a temporary surge of troops; and Donald Trump, who promised to pull out but never quite delivered.

No matter their approaches, Afghanistan's government remained corrupt, factionalized and largely incapable of defending itself.

Biden, who supported the invasion as chair of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, was a skeptic by 2009, when, as vice president, he argued not very privately against Obama's surge. Twelve years later, when he became president himself, only bad options remained.

Trump promised the Taliban that the remaining 3,500 U.S. troops would leave the country by May 1, 2021; in exchange, the Taliban made two promises: not to attack Americans and to engage in serious peace talks. They kept the first — no American has died in combat in 17 months — but

HR 1 should have passed

But not for the reasons you think

NEWS MEDIA GAVE A DISTORTED PICTURE OF THE HISTORIC IMPORTANCE OF THE FAIR-ELECTIONS LEGISLATION OFFERED BY DEMOCRATS IN THE U.S. CONGRESS. To be fair, it's not easy to describe this mammoth bill with its many aspects.

Most stories focused primarily on the impact on registering and voting. These are, indeed, critical aspects of the proposal. The For the People Act would have set national standards for federal elections including: automatic and same-day voter registration, early voting and voting by mail, and purging of voter rolls that some states have used against the poor.

These items got most of the attention, and they are the ones that most fit in with D vs. R framing that appeals to partisan emotions — and which led Senate Republicans to block the bill in its current form last month. But many components of the legislation that garnered less attention are popular with voters on both sides of the aisle and worth pursuing in any compromise versions that develop going forward.

Among them was an effort to shore up election security by requiring voting machines to leave a paper trail and be made in the U.S. But the two most important aspects we should keep are outlawing gerrymandering in establishing districts for the House of Representatives and tackling the growing cancer of money in politics.

Using gerrymandering, a state can set up districts that favor one political party. The favored party is almost guaranteed a comfortable majority in most districts. The other party gets fewer districts and will usually win those seats by huge margins. The powerful party thus gets more seats than its share of the electorate. As an example, Pennsylvania Democratic congressional candidates won more than 50% of the vote in the 2012 November elections but won only five of 18 seats in the House.

Gerrymandering exacerbates voter polarization and cynicism. Because general elections are virtually meaningless for most seats in the House, candidates must pander to the more partisan voters who show up for primaries. And because many voters know that the district is fixed for one party or the other, they are less likely to vote.

Voters detest money corruption of our elections, and they are aware that Congress makes policy for the benefit of big-money donors rather than the people in general. That is why we are living through one of the worst eras of wealth and income inequality in our nation's history. The For the People Act would have ended dark money and restored restrictions on campaign donations from foreign nationals. It would also have set up a public financing program for federal offices whereby candidates for Congress who agree not to accept large contributions could get matching funds for each small contribution from a citizen.

Voters are supposed to choose their representatives. Far too often in the U.S., partisan politicians choose their voters through districting and ultra-wealthy campaign funders choose who can even have a chance to get on the ballot.

For far too many kids, summer also means hunger

Congress can make a difference

WHEN THE SCHOOL YEAR ENDS AND SUMMER BEGINS, kids across the nation look forward to enjoying no more tests and no more classes. Unfortunately, for far too many kids that Mountaineer Food Bank serves in West Virginia, the summer also means no more reliable access to school breakfast and lunch.

Children consume up to 50% of their total daily calories at school, but when school is out for the summer, millions of children who rely on school meals have less food support. Without school meals, a summer of fun can become a summer of hunger, leading to increased risk of experiencing short- and long-term health consequences and summer learning loss.

Summer feeding programs do exist to support kids, but they are only as strong as their ability to reach children. This year, Congress can make a difference by passing strong child nutrition legislation that improves summer nutrition programs to ensure our kids have the food they need to grow, learn and thrive — regardless of the time of year.

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federal food pro-

gram that provides snacks and meals during the summer to children who are low-income — and it also has a striking access gap. In fact, prior to the pandemic in 2019, only around 17% of eligible children across the country received a meal through a summer feeding program. As Feeding America estimates that 19% of kids may experience food insecurity this year in West Virginia due to the pandemic, reducing the SFSP coverage gap should be a top-tier priority for our communities.

One way lawmakers on Capitol Hill can make investments in summer feeding is by strengthening summer feeding sites. Right now, community-based organizations like Mountaineer Food Bank must switch between government programs from the summer months to the school year, and back again, in order to help feed kids when they aren't in school — a move forcing summer meals providers to spend more time on paperwork versus providing food. Providers must also contend with tough area eligibility requirements that constrict the number of available SFSP sites. By allowing providers to run SFSP all year long and by reducing the area eligibility threshold, respectively, providers would be able to seamlessly offer meals all year, and more programs would be able to operate summer feeding.



Additionally, it's critical that lawmakers provide alternate options for helping to feed kids when school is closed. Two potential game-changers: Providing a summer grocery card to provide families with children with extra food dollars to supplement household budgets and allowing non-

school providers to use non-site-based food delivery models to make it easier to provide meals to children, especially those in hard-to-reach areas.

Mountaineer Meals launched in 2017 to help ensure our kids have access to nutritious meals throughout the summer. Partner-

ing with libraries and Family Resource Networks, the summer feeding program serves Braxton, Calhoun, Mercer and, new this summer, Clay counties.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, each site averaged about 10 to 15 participants. Such as many aspects of life, the pandemic changed the way Mountaineer Meals operated and who it served — for the better. With flexibilities put in place for safety of clients, staff, and volunteers, such as non-congregate meal settings, meal-time variations, number of meals provided at each visit, as well as allowing a parent or guardian to pick-up meals, Mountaineer Meals participation and impact sky rocketed.

During the summer of 2020, Mountaineer Meals served 746 kids in Braxton County, 520 kids in Calhoun county, and 150 kids in Mercer County. Let's take these lessons learned and make summer feeding more efficient for kids in West Virginia and throughout our country.

We all agree: No child should go hungry during the school year, the summer, or ever. We call on Congress to use the tools at its disposal to end child summer hunger once and for all.

My grandfather was mainly a figure in a Broadway play to me — until I read his journals

ON MAY 28, 1952, "SUNDAY BREAKFAST," A PLAY ABOUT A WORKAHOLIC SMALL-TOWN JEWELER WHO TORTURES HIS FAMILY, opened at the Coronet Theatre on Broadway. Stella Adler directed. Cloris Leachman played the loose daughter. Neither would consider the play a career highlight. An exasperated New York Daily News critic wrote about the father character, George Decker: "Whenever he has nothing else to do — which is seldom — he polishes silver." The play closed little more than a week later.

My family members may be the last people alive who still talk about "Sunday Breakfast," a play co-written by my dad's cousin Miriam Balf and based on my grandfather Theodore "Teddy" Balf, a workaholic small-town jeweler in Rye, N.Y.

Teddy came to the U.S. from Kovel, Russia, passing through Ellis Island on New Year's Day 1909. He went to work for an Astoria watchmaker and a few years later married Celia Ainkbinder, a recent emigre he had known in the old country. The year they were married, 1915, he began keeping a journal. He would follow up with 41 other yearly journals, writing every day for the rest of his life.

His niece mined them for identifying details that were spread throughout the play — their Purchase, N.Y., address, a glass wind chime he patented, a family trip to Maine. The play was fiction, but it was not.

Teddy died a few years before

I was born, but he looked stern in portraits my artist dad did as a young man: narrow face, sharp nose, thin upkept hair. For a half-century, my grandfather was mainly just a figure in a play to me.

In a pandemic lull, I decided to read the journals, start to finish. It seems nobody in my family had. I was probably looking for a bit of gossip. Instead, I started photographing individual pages — and ultimately took 200 pictures, for what, I wasn't sure. But I began to connect with him, find joys in his quirks and a voice where I expected none.

Teddy loved to walk. My mother, now 91, remembered him inviting her and my dad to a dinner and them walking the five miles between Rye and a Port Chester, N.Y., restaurant. In one

entry he described a perfect day in a forest near a local hamlet. He walked and walked, eventually stopping at a secluded grove to read, write letters, nap, catch frogs and play the fife. He was 62.

Some of the journals were extra-stuffed with revealing personal letters or starred with bright blue WWI war bond pins. The penultimate journal contained a neatly folded obit on Albert Einstein. A four-leaf clover was taped to the title page of the 1950 book.

I began to look up distances between small Westchester County towns and tried to learn the back story to the restaurants, butcheries, and the old Embassy and Capitol picture houses he frequented. A picture began coalescing like descending braids of river water. A narrative improb-

ably gained steam.

The early journals were in English, but when any of the good stuff happens, he reliably lapsed into Yiddish. They tell the story of an immigrant couple struggling for a foothold. The latter years, from 1947 to 1956, were about life on his own, grieving for his wife who died at 49, and drawing unexpectedly close to his two sons.

I found all of it surprising, especially the last part. In 1946 Teddy and my dad, then 19, went on overnight trips, long walks, made records on the "recording machine" my grandfather apparently dragged to every wedding and party. He was complicated, but he wasn't the sharply drawn character of a long-forgotten play.

When my parents announced their marriage plans in spring 1952, after only a couple of months dating, he writes this gem: "When I came upstairs had a heart-to-heart talk with Oliver about his girlfriend. He asked me if it makes any difference to me because she is not of Jewish faith. I assured him that it makes no difference to me as long as they love one another and live for one another."

My family wondered about my monthslong fixation, like families will do when someone, say, flies to East Anglia to find a 17th century headstone and petitions to dig up the grave and rebury the bones in Vermont.

My eldest brother asked earnestly, what is motivating you? I told him about Teddy's

walking everywhere reminding me of my daughter in Brooklyn and how he teared up at movies and during best-man speeches like our other brother did. My grandfather wrote last thing of a long day. It was workman's duty, like locking the door at night, notable only by not doing it. He always did it.

Teddy died in Mount Sinai hospital on April 26, 1956. His many beautiful clocks were eventually given to every family member who wanted one. Mine happened to be one he had picked up on his lone trip to Rockport, Mass., where I would be born, to check on my then-single dad who was spending a month there painting watercolors.

I had been feeling my grandfather's life flow through mine for months. Throughout I regretted that I had barely asked my dad about his father. But it was thrilling to check the date in the journal when he mentioned the Rockport clock purchase — July 23, 1948 — against a deeply faded stock tag of the same date hanging off my clock's top. The handwriting was identical.

Recently, on a beautiful spring day, I visited the Jewish cemetery in Queens where Teddy and Celia are buried. The main inscription on the large granite headstone was rather conventional: "Devoted Husband, Beloved Father and Grandfather." The bottom tagline was not.

"The Pendulum Has Stopped," it read, a bit of dry humor that made me smile. It was a writerly touch I didn't think he had in him.

broke the second.

Biden's choices were to either maintain the U.S. troop presence, which would almost surely prompt Taliban attacks, or to complete the withdrawal.

He chose to lance the boil and get out.

So far, the political cost has been negligible, largely because most Americans have long since accepted that the military effort had failed. (A majority reached that conclusion by 2014, according to a Pew Research Center poll.)

Republicans are divided over the issue — a legacy from Trump, who broke from his party's traditional hawkish stance. When Biden announced

his decision to withdraw the last troops, Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell of Kentucky called it "a grave mistake," but Sen. Ted Cruz of Texas said he was "glad the troops are coming home."

Many polls suggest that Americans have simply lost interest in the faraway conflict, especially when no U.S. troops are getting killed.

Still, Biden will rightly be judged by the outcome; especially by whether a Taliban victory turns Afghanistan into a base for Al Qaeda or other terrorist groups — the reason American forces invaded in the first place.

With gerrymandering banned, "safe" seats would vanish for Democrats and Republicans alike and all voters would have a much more equal say in who will represent them. We must ban gerrymandering before 2022 when the districts will again be set for a 10-year period.

With disclosure, voters would know who is paying for the attack ads. With public campaign financing, candidates

would have a real incentive to talk to working people rather than sit in a cubicle for several hours per day calling people who can afford a maximum contribution (\$2,900 per year).

This bill should have passed because it repairs root causes of damage to our democratic republic — extreme partisanship and money corruption of our politicians. It's now up to Congress to reintroduce those efforts in legislation that actually has a shot at being enacted.

Richardson shouldn't have to apologize for being human

LAST MONTH, SHA'CARRI RICHARDSON'S NAME WAS SPLASHED ACROSS THE SPORTS PAGES AS SHE BECAME THE SIXTH-FASTEST WOMAN TO RUN 100 METERS, FINISHING IN 10.72 SECONDS. Her bold hair, tattoos and unabashed love for her girlfriend made her a symbol for other 21-year-old queer women of color like myself, seeing her break social conventions and become a contender for a gold medal at the Tokyo Olympic Games.

As swiftly as the praise came, so followed the backlash after Richardson tested positive for marijuana, putting her Tokyo Olympic dreams on hold. Richardson apologized in an interview with NBC's "Today" show and later tweeted, "I am human."

What's heartbreaking is seeing Richardson explain to the public how marijuana was a way to cope with her emotional distress in the wake of her mother's death. What's enraging is the fact that marijuana is legal in Oregon, where the Olympic trials were held, and there's been no indication that marijuana is a sports-enhancing drug. If anything, marijuana would decrease one's athletic performance, because it impairs judgment and movement. The World Anti-Doping Agency has listed the substance as a danger to athletes for this reason, but penalizing athletes who need mental health support only exacerbates the problem.

A lot has changed since 2009, when photos leaked of Olympic gold medalist Michael Phelps taking a hit on a bong; the laws on marijuana use are simply outdated. Thirty-six states have legalized medical marijuana, and in certain social contexts, consuming or smoking marijuana is as commonplace as taking a sip of wine.

The issue to focus on is more than just antiquated approaches to cannabis but also the way Black women athletes face intense scrutiny in the media. These women are put on a pedestal because of their athleticism and what they represent as symbols enduring sexism and racism, but we forget that they too are like us, experiencing moments of intense grief, private pain and occasional lapses in judgment.

Recently, Brianna McNeal, who had qualified for the 100-meter hurdles in Tokyo, was forced to come out publicly about having an abortion in order to challenge a five-year suspension by the Court of Arbitration for Sport for a drug test violation. In March, Naomi Osaka, ranked as one of the top players by the Women's Tennis Association, refused to take part in news conferences at the French Open for mental health reasons and was fined \$15,000, leading her to withdraw from the tournament to rest.

Richardson has apologized and taken responsibility for her actions, vowing to never again fail a drug test, but she shouldn't have to be sorry for anything.

In the world of high-level sports, where bodies are fine-tuned like machines cranked to their optimum levels, athletes are under immense stress. Officials apply the rules in a legalistic manner under the banner of equality, but it seems at times more like a witch hunt to prove fault and error. We hold athletes to impossible standards of perfection because they represent to us the best of the human spirit and work ethic. It can be easy to forget that life is messy and people aren't always performing at their best.

Richardson's gracious acceptance of the consequences and willingness to learn show the depth of her maturity and strengthen the example she sets for young people. She is human just like us, struggling through the loss of a loved one and trying to find ways to heal.

The good news is that, as the fastest woman in the U.S. today, Richardson should have more chances for gold at future Olympics.

Testers are back, but with safety in mind

NEW YORK — When Pat Curry spotted bite-sized wood-fire rotisserie chicken with portabella mushroom at her local Costco in early June, she felt "giddy." After a 14-month hiatus, free samples were back.

"It was one of the markers that told me that we turned a corner," said the 60-year-old who lives in Augusta, Georgia. "It's the little things that you do that were taken away, and now they're back."

When the pandemic was declared in March 2020, retailers worried about the potential spread of the coronavirus so they cut off free sampling of everything from food to makeup to toys. But now with vaccinations rolling out and the threat of COVID-19 easing in the U.S., stores like Costco are feeling confident enough to revive the longstanding tradition.

For customers, sampling makes it fun to shop and discover new items — not to mention getting all the freebies. For retailers, they're critical tools to keep shoppers coming back and battle against online retailers like Amazon.

Food sampling converts browsers into buyers at a 20% higher rate than if customers weren't allowed to test, says NPD Group Inc., a market research firm. The conversion rate is 30% higher when beauty products are sampled.

"Sampling is critical," said Marshal Cohen, NPD's chief industry analyst. "Impulse alone drives 25% of the retail business."

Jake Tavello, a senior vice president at Stew Leonard's, said promoting new items had been challenging without sampling, a tradition started by his grandfather who founded the regional grocery chain in 1969. Sales of a new item pink glow pineapple were OK this past spring, for example, but have tripled since demonstrations were reintroduced.

"When people taste it, that's what can makes people want to buy it and decide what they want to eat for dinner," Tavello said.

But while sampling is back, it's not clear if everyone is ready to bite. With that in mind, some retailers are putting various safety protocols in place to ease any safety concerns.

At Costco, masked workers prepare the hot and cold samples behind plexiglass counters and distribute to its members one at a time. Stew Leonard's also brought back hot samples with similar safety measures.

Meanwhile, Walmart and its wholesale club division Sam's

Club are only serving pre-sealed food samples. And Sam's Club is limiting to sampling on the weekend. Target said that staffed food and beverage sampling has remained on pause since March 2020 but it has been allowing self-service sampling of individually wrapped items.

With beauty testing, retailers appear to be even more cautious. Beauty chain Ulta Beauty said it's still figuring out how to bring back makeup testers. Target said in May it will resume beauty product sampling in stores this year where customers can take home individually wrapped items. Kohl's would only say that it hadn't brought back makeup or fragrance sampling.

Lawrence Gostin, a public health expert at Georgetown University, said handling and eating food has not been a major route for the spread of COVID-19. But food sampling can lead to people congregating together, and that increases the risk of transmission. He also pointed to concerns about food sampling that go beyond the coronavirus: "Multiple hands grabbing samples can lead to the spread of germs, while contaminated gloves can also disperse unwanted bacteria."

As for makeup testing, Gostin said it's "much safer and wiser" to use samples that are fully packaged.

And with letting kids play with toys, frequent sanitizing of objects is recommended to contain viruses like influenza, which unlike COVID-19 can be easily spread through touching contaminated surfaces.

Toy retailer Camp, which centered its shopping experience around children playing with toys, now has individually wrapped craft kits in the store instead of letting kids dig around for art supplies, says Tiffany Markofsky, the company's marketing director. For testing out toys, it's sticking to items that can be easily cleaned, like remote control toy cars instead of dolls with faux hair.

Marianne Szymanski, president of Toy Tips Inc., a toy guide, believes toy testing overall will be "limited" because of the lingering fears about germs due to the pandemic.

Some retailers are doing away with sampling altogether. For instance, West Hollywood, California-based beauty company Blushington isn't reopening its six stores and is instead moving more toward virtual makeup sessions and offering services at shoppers' home, says CEO Natasha Cornstein. She thinks shoppers believe they have better control of their environment and hygiene in their own home.

"The consumer is coming out of COVID with very different habits," she said. "It's not only about COVID now."

The posture perils of parenting — chiropractic can help

idays bringing sacrificial offerings. However, since it is a psalm of David it predates the construction of the Temple in Jerusalem and is referring to the portable tabernacle and ark that was carried by the people from Mt. Sinai, through the desert wanderings and finally into Jerusalem. On the broadest and deepest spiritual level, we spend way too much time telling God what we want from God and way to little time reflecting upon what God wants from us. Psalm 15 is a rectification of that spiritual imbalance.

What is interesting to me is that nothing God wants from us is purely ritual. Everything God wants from us is purely ethical. Lighting candles is a ritual act that can be done by an evil person. Being kind to those in need is an ethical act that can only be performed by a good person. It is really that simple. Only good people, kind people, loving people, compassionate people, just people are worthy of coming close to God. The highest truth is that such people do not do good things and then come close to God. They are already close to God when they do good things. Each verse of Psalm 15 gives us a list of good things to do. Here is the list in my own translation/commentary.

4. Honor those who are morally worthy of being honored. Keep your word.
5. Be generous and charitable with your money. Don’t accept a bribe.
So, the preparation for doing religious rituals properly is to live an ethical life properly. This is not a rejection of rituals. It is a rejection of rituals performed by people who live unexamined lives. This was the secret of my friendship with Father Tom Hartman. Tommy and I did not share a single ritual practice. In the springtime holidays of Passover/Easter, he ate chocolate bunnies, and I ate horseradish. Even when there were similarities between our rituals they were still different. I ate unleavened bread, but it was just bread. In the Eucharist, he ate unleavened bread that was the body of Christ. I blessed

wine that was just wine, and he blessed wine that was the blood of Christ. However, we shared in full and equal measure every ethical practice taught to us by God. Truth be told, Tommy was better than me in performing rituals and in living an ethical life, but we were on the same path up the same mountain to the same God. That was our bond. That was the secret of the God Squad. That is the meaning of Psalm 15. One final thought. What if the abode in the tabernacle of God is not the ancient Temple of Solomon but Heaven or, in Judaism, The World To Come? There is an old rabbinic legend that when we die and our souls are brought to God the first question God will ask us is, “Were you honest in your work?” Do you think God cares more about our moral virtue or our ritual

punctiliousness? I am voting for the moral life. In fact, if God lets me, I am voting twice! Let us study:
■ What ethical practices do we most need to take more seriously?
■ Are there some ethical commandments that psalm 15 left out?
■ Why do we so frequently call people who are ritually observant religious but people who are good through and through not religious but just good? Psalm 15 ends with a promise from God. The promise is not that moral people will be rewarded. The promise is that moral people will not be defeated or shaken or deterred or broken or abandoned by God. saw the guestbook. Truthfully, there are all sorts of responsibilities you can assign to bonusparents that show them how much you care while reserving the official walk for dad. If you decide that your bonusdad will not officially participate in the ceremony, you can assign him other responsibilities that will demonstrate how you feel. A special toast at the reception thanking him for his support is always lovely. It was done tastefully, with a pause and an offer of cooperation. The bonusdad did not cut in on the dance. That might be perceived a little differently. Ultimately, it’s up to you. This can help the Realtors determine the market value of your property. Next, they will do a comparative market analysis looking at active and sold listings similar to your property.

A Realtor determines your home's value by more than just one factor. While they look at price per square foot to get a starting point, they consider other details such as location, lot size, upgrades and amenities. Layout is important too. If the rooms are smaller in size than other comparable properties, this can affect the price.

Market conditions are a huge factor when determining price. Are houses flying off the market? Is your economy booming? Paint color mistakes to avoid

Thinking about painting your home? Make sure you choose your colors carefully.

It's a minor job compared to other home renovations, but how you paint your wall and plan your wall and trim colors makes a major impact on how you use your space.

But you can put this to work when designing your painting plan. Your color and finish choices can make a bold statement, so choose wisely.

Choosing the right properties of color

Color is the first thing you perceive when you enter a space, which means you're evoking a mood from the very moment someone enters. When selecting color, think about the various properties and how they will interact with light and each other.

Saturation: Higher saturation can crank up the effect of even a moderate tone, while

lightly saturated variants of bright colors dial it back.

Tone and hue: Even within a broader color range, different shades set different moods. A cool forest green creates a restful bedroom feeling, while olive gives the impression of militaristic productivity.

Contrasting colors: Remember the color wheel from grade school? It's important for more reasons than just "yellow and blue make green." Colors from across the wheel can complement each other, which is why warm shades such as yellow or orange provide a striking look when paired with complements like green or purple.

Surfaces: The texture of surfaces impacts the appearance of color. Rough walls appear darker than smooth walls.

Room size: Darker colors tend to contract the size of a room, while lighter colors make it look more expansive. Keep this in mind so you don't accidentally create a small claustrophobic black room, or a large white room that seems infinite.

Picking the best finish

Choosing a paint finish might seem like a minor detail after you select the color, but it makes a difference. More reflective finishes create a brighter, bolder and more stimulating

look, even when the underlying color is the same.

Flat: A common matte finish that doesn't reflect much light. It hides imperfections but also creates a low color saturation. It tends to have a generic, neutral look, and you need to be careful when cleaning it so as not to lose color.

Eggshell: Though still a matte finish, it gives an understated shine. Eggshell cleans more easily than flat, but you should still be cautious when cleaning it.

Satin: This offers a balance point between high-gloss and flat, with a smooth and attractive surface. It's easily washable and stands up well to high levels of humidity. Satin works well in kitchens and bathrooms.

Semi-gloss/high-gloss: These finishes are at the high end of reflectiveness. They provide a lovely sheen, but imperfections in your wall will stand out. If you don't want to paint the entire wall with a gloss finish, consider using it for baseboards, trims, or other accent possibilities.

Read all about it; newsboy wagon sells for \$160

TOY WAGONS, those that are large enough to give rides to children or to haul packages of newspapers for a newsboy, were first made in the 1880s in the United States. Most were made of wood that was painted red. Newspapers were sold to newsboys by the bundle. The boys kept them in a wagon and moved around the city, shouting the headlines to sell the papers. Most of the boys were homeless and this is how they earned a living.

In 1899, the newspaper owners raised the price of 10 papers sold to the newsboys from 5 cents to 6 cents. It started the famous newsboy strike that tied up traffic and caused fighting in the city. The boys eventually won the strike and a better price.

The newsboy wagons were usually made of painted wood with the name of the newspaper on the side. Some, like this one, had built up sides that could be removed. The type of wheel on the wagon helps to date it. Early wheels were metal with a rubber rim. Later wheels were rubber.

Another clue to the age of the pictured wagon is the name of the paper. The paper was started in 1883, destroyed by fire and started again in 1900. William Randolph Hearst bought it in 1921, around the time the paper's name was changed to "Detroit Times." It closed in 1960.

The most famous toy wagon was manufactured by Antonio Pasin in 1917 in Chicago. He made the Liberty Coaster in 1921 and the famous red Radio Flyer in 1927. His company became

the largest wagon maker in the country. The wagon at the Cowan auction sold for \$160.

Q: I inherited what my family calls "the lobster dish." It originally belonged to my grandmother, who died in 1969. It's a divided dish with a large gold-color figural lobster in the middle. The dish is 15 inches by 11 inches and is in excellent condition with only slight wear on the lobster body. It's marked with a birdlike creature above the letters "C.T." Below that, it's stamped "Germany." My grandmother was a plate collector and cherished this piece. Can you give me any information and value that I can pass on to my granddaughter?

A: The lobster dish was a popular shape from the 1880s to early 1900s, and variations were made by several companies. Your lobster dish was made by C. Tielsch Porcelain Factory, founded by Carl Tielsch in Altwasser, Silesia, Germany (now Walbrzych, Poland), in 1845. It merged with C.M. Hutschenreuther in Hohenberg, Germany, in 1918, but the name "C. Tielsch" continued to be used. This mark was used from about 1887 to about 1934. Selling price,

\$150 to \$200.

Q: My mother was a small reseller of, among other things, head vases. We recently discovered, to our surprise, that she actually had quite an extensive inventory. What we thought was a collection of about 20 to 30 head vases has turned out to be more than 250. How would we go about locating someone interested in buying the lot of brand new in-the-box Cameo Girls head vases?

A: Lady head vases were a fad in the 1960s and '70s. United Design Corporation made many of them. The company was founded in 1973 by Gary and Jeanie

Clinton, who started with a single kiln in a backyard chicken coop. They quickly found their niche in clay figures, and the business grew from neighborhood sales to nationwide distribution. It closed in 2004. Cameo Girls head vases sell from \$30 to \$200, with most in the \$50 range. You could sell your mother's collection on Etsy and other online retailers, or you might find an auction gallery that would like to sell a collection of 250. For the best advice for selling collections, you can go to Kovels.com and click on the "How to Buy or Sell" tab.

Q: I have a modest collection of Anri bottle

stoppers, bookends, figures, letter openers, mugs, tie racks and other wooden objects they produced. I'd like to know the current value of Anri items.

A: Anri was in business in St. Christina, Italy, by 1912. The company was founded by Anton Riffesser. The name of the company is a combination of the first two letters of his first and last names. Several artists and woodcarvers worked at the company. After World War II, the quality of the carving and painting declined. Anri stopped making bottle stoppers, corkscrews and other bar accessories in 1976, but wooden figures continued

to be made. The company is now closed, and no new figures are being made. Anri items sell on many websites. Some sell for \$10 or less, some for \$50 or more. You can get an idea of value by checking several websites to see what items like yours have sold for. Be sure to look for sold prices, not just asking prices. Some recent prices were \$10 for a bottle stopper, \$53 for a happy birthday music box, \$79 for a figurine of a couple reading the newspaper and \$250 for dog bookends.

Spokane-Coeur d'Alene housing market booming, prices rising

SPOKANE, Wash. — The way Darin Watkins sees it, the real estate boom in the once-sleepy Spokane, Washington, metropolitan area is a numbers problem. Far too many people are moving in, far too few homes are being built and prices have skyrocketed.

Half of renters in Spokane County want to buy a house, but they can't find one, said Watkins, government affairs director for the Spokane Association of Realtors.

"We're at the lowest level of inventory in the history of Spokane County," he said.

In May, the Wall Street Journal/realtor.com Emerging Housing Markets Index ranked Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, part of this combined metropolitan statistical area, as having the fastest-rising home prices in the nation. Spokane County came in at No. 5.

It's an astonishing development in an area that had long languished behind the glitter of the booming Seattle area. It illustrates how many people are moving out of crowded coastal cities seeking cheaper land and an easier lifestyle in secondary cities, Watkins said.

The COVID-19 pan-

demically accelerated the trend as millions of people found they could work effectively from home without going to an office. "There are a lot of portable jobs," Watkins said.

The phenomenon has also led to housing booms in other cities in the inland West, such as Bozeman, Montana, and Boise, Idaho.

High prices may pose little problem for people selling million-dollar homes in California and moving north, but it's a major issue for homebuyers stuck in low-wage cities like Spokane and Coeur d'Alene, Watkins said.

Of the roughly 200 homes for sale in Spokane County in any given week, only about five are priced under \$300,000, Watkins said. In 2015, the average home in Spokane cost \$179,000.

The high prices have also put pressure on the rental market, leaving the area with a vacancy rate of less than 1%, according to the University of Washington's Center for Real Estate Research. In King County, which includes Seattle, the vacancy rate was 7.1% of apartments.

As a result, rental costs have also skyrocketed.

"It creates a two-caste

system," Watkins said of the rising housing costs. "The haves are happy with their home equity growth."

But for lower-income people, "their costs keep going up," he said.

"Poor people, minorities, are under-represented in the home ownership model," Watkins said.

Ben Stuckart, executive director of the Spokane Low-Income Housing Consortium, has called on the city of Spokane to declare a housing state of emergency.

On the other end of the spectrum, Coeur d'Alene, built along the shores of a beautiful lake, has boomed as a destination for the rich and famous, and well-off retirees. A custom luxury estate just steps away from Lake Coeur d'Alene is currently on the market for \$27 million, making it the most expensive home listed in Idaho.

But it's not all rich people drawn to the region. Amazon has added about 4,000 jobs in the Spokane area in the past year, and it plans to add 1,000 more. Other employers are also expanding. But many jobs don't pay well enough to afford a home, Watkins said.

An issue is Washington state laws that sought to limit urban sprawl by con-

centrating housing largely within existing boundaries, Watkins said. Those laws were enacted three decades ago as the population of the Seattle area surged thanks to the high-tech boom.

Those laws need to be revisited so builders can start erecting needed homes, Watkins said.

Spokane County is short about 32,000 housing units right now, while one in five houses sold in Spokane County is selling for cash,

he said.

The Spokane-Coeur d'Alene area has more than 745,000 residents and is ranked 71st among combined metro areas in the nation, between Lexington, Kentucky, and Syracuse, New York. The population is expected to continue growing in the metro area in the next decade.

Grant Forsyth, the chief economist for Avista, the region's primary electrical utility, pointed to a lack of home construction since

the recession of 2008 as a major contributor to the rising home prices. He also cited very low interest rates and a pandemic-spawned desire among people to own their own homes.

He noted the United States as a whole is barely growing in population, at less than half a percent a year. But Spokane is growing at 1% and Coeur d'Alene about 2% per year.

"Compared to the rest of the U.S., we are growing quite rapidly," Forsyth said.

U.S. average mortgage rates continue to fall; 30-year at 2.90%

WASHINGTON — Mortgage rates continued to fall this week, tracking a decline in yields on Treasury securities as the bond market continues to signal concerns over the strength of the recovery from the pandemic recession.

Mortgage buyer Freddie Mac reported Thursday that the average for the 30-year home loan eased to 2.90% from 2.98% last week. By contrast, the rate stood at 3.03% a year ago.

The rate for a 15-year loan, a popular option among homeowners refinancing their mortgages, fell to 2.20% from 2.26% last week. Freddie Mac economists expect economic

growth to gradually push mortgage rates higher in the second half of the year.

The bond market has been signaling the economic recovery concerns for months, specifically that it may have peaked and is now leveling off to a steadier pace. Home loan rates tend to track moves of the yield on the 10-year Treasury note — which rises when bond prices fall. The benchmark yield has been falling steadily in recent weeks as traders shift money into bonds. It was quoted at 1.30% around midday Thursday, after trading as high as 1.74% at the end of March.

The market concerns also

spilled into stocks, which were broadly lower Thursday as investor caution set in after the market hit a series of record highs last week.

Last week's government report on the job market in June showed that in an encouraging burst of hiring, U.S. employers added 850,000 jobs. That was well above the average of the previous three months and a sign that companies may be having an easier time finding enough workers to fill open jobs. But the Labor Department reported Thursday that the number of Americans seeking unemployment benefits rose last week by 2,000 from the previous week to 373,000.

Residents evacuated from condo can retrieve essential items

NORTH MIAMI BEACH, Fla. — Residents of a South Florida condo who were forced to evacuate over concerns about the building's structural integrity will be allowed to return to retrieve essential items on Friday, officials said.

North Miami Beach officials ordered the 156-unit Crestview Towers evacuated a week ago following an audit of high-rise buildings 40 years old or older. The audit was ordered in response to the collapse of the nearby Champlain Towers South condo complex in Surfside, which killed at least 64 and left 76 people missing in the rubble.

Crestview Towers residents will be escorted by a police officer and will have 15 minutes to pick up necessary items, city officials said.

On Thursday, city officials reaffirmed the decision to

evacuate the building, saying it still hasn't been deemed safe for occupation. The city rejected conclusions from an engineer hired by the condo association that the building is structurally sound.

The city released records showing more than \$500,000 in fines for illegal construction, electrical problems and 18 different fire code violations. Officials said the building must stay unoccupied until the condo association submits a new 40-year recertification report that addresses all structural and electrical issues.

The building is about 5 miles from the site of the condo in Surfside, which collapsed June 24.

The audit found that Crestview Towers, which was built in 1972, had been deemed unsafe in January, officials said.

In documents presented to the city by condo officials on

Monday, surveys by an engineering firm and an electrical engineer concluded the building's integrity has not been compromised by structural deficiencies. The problems were outlined in the 40-year certification review the association filed in January, according to city officials.

An engineer retained by the board in January had concluded the building was structurally and electrically unsafe for occupancy.

The city said it rejected the condo association's response because the documents didn't comply with the 40-year certification process or address the issues raised in January.

It is the only building so far to be evacuated since municipal officials in South Florida, and statewide, began scrutinizing older high-rises to ensure that substantial structural problems are not being ignored.

Real estate Q&A: What will happen to our house when my husband dies?

Q: My husband's is the only name on the deed to our home. He has children from a prior marriage and does not have a will. What happens to the house if he passes away? — Carol

A: Probate is the court-supervised process of settling a person's final affairs after their death.

In this process, a trusted individual, called in "personal representative" in Florida, or an "executor" in some other states, will gather and liquidate the person's assets and use the funds to pay any creditors.

The remaining money goes to the heirs and beneficiaries.

Because probate involves going to court and hiring a lawyer, plus paying creditors, it is best to avoid it. This is where "estate planning" comes in.

One goal of estate planning is to avoid going through probate, saving your loved ones the time and expense. Probate is needed when someone passes away owning property, a bank account, or other assets in just their name.

Speak with your husband now about this to avoid having to deal with a

bigger hassle later. After the creditors have been paid, the probate court will look to the decedent's will to determine who gets what.

The judge will give the will a lot of weight when deciding, but some assets, such as a family home, may not go to the person selected. This protects certain people left behind, such as spouses and minor children, from being left without a home or necessary funds.

If the person dies without a will, the rules of "intestate succession" will dictate who inherits.

There are different rules for your primary residence, called your "homestead." If someone dies without a will and is survived by a spouse and children, the surviving spouse will get a life estate in the home, and the children will get the remainder.

This means you can remain in the house for as long as you are alive, and ownership will automatically transfer to his children after you pass.

As the surviving spouse, you also have other rights to a portion of his estate regardless if he has a will or even if he has one but leaves nothing to you in it.

Condo buyers shun older buildings after Surfside collapse

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. — The collapse of the Champlain condo building in Surfside could reverberate through the real estate market in South Florida for months to come, real estate experts say.

The red-hot condo market could cool as buyers might hesitate to buy in older buildings, worried that the buildings have put off maintenance and that mammoth repair bills could be coming, brokers say.

Sellers, meanwhile, might discover they can't find buyers as quickly as they'd hoped — and can't get the price they were looking for. Over time, their investments in their condos could shrink.

"I can see property values falling in buildings until they renovate them to put them into a safe structure, not just something that is cosmetically nice to look at," said Bobbi Ocean, executive vice president at Galleria International Realty in Fort Lauderdale.

The Champlain South Tower collapsed June 24 after numerous engineering reports had warned of concrete deterioration and \$9 million in needed repairs. The exact cause could take years to determine, but cities across South Florida are scrambling to ensure their buildings are safe.

It's too early to say whether condo buyers are setting their sights elsewhere, but experts say fear could douse a condo market that had been boiling.

As of May, condos had reached their highest sales prices since 2012, according to data from RedFin, a national real estate brokerage. The median sale price for a condo in Palm Beach County was \$225,000 in May, compared with \$180,000 in Broward and \$325,000 in Miami-Dade.

Real estate experts say the condo market could slide for six months or so

before stabilizing.

"All things being equal, condos could take longer to sell than they would otherwise. There's a lower likelihood of successfully marketing your property, and we could see a short-term price effect," said Florida Atlantic University real estate economist Ken H. Johnson.

Newer buildings should remain in demand, experts say, but buyers may be skeptical of older condos, knowing that many have deferred maintenance and now will try to catch up.

"Condo associations that were typically waiting will be doing [repairs] faster, and costs are rising. I think we are going to see even more costs," said Adam Mopsick of Amicon, a general contracting and construction management firm in Miami.

Shelby Morgan, a Realtor at Galleria International Realty, said none of his clients have yet backed out of contracts to buy condos. But, "any older condo is going to be looked at very hard," he said. "In the older buildings, people will probably be more hesitant to buy."

Less certain is whether condo shoppers will opt for single-family homes, which are generally more expensive and in historically short supply. For the same reason, condo owners may not look to flee, even knowing they could face large assessments for repairs.

"Condos have always been popular, especially ones on the ocean," said Bonnie Heatzig, executive director of luxury sales at Douglas Elliman in Boca Raton. "But now, buyers will place greater emphasis on maintenance and past engineering reports for older buildings as part of the due diligence process."

Mathew Cicero, with South Florida Condominium Management in Miami, doesn't expect the condo market to bottom out. Prices should remain stable, he predicted. They'll just grow more slowly.

Billy Graham's family house in N.C. for sale. Here's how much it would cost you

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — The original family house of the late evangelist the Rev. Billy Graham was put up for sale in Montreat, North Carolina, this week for \$599,000.

It's the first and only property owned by the Graham family that entered the real estate market, according to Florida-based agency Premier Sotheby's International Realty, which is marketing the house in partnership with Kevin B. Jones, LLC.

A Charlotte native, Graham was one of the most influential Christian leaders of the 20th century. He died at age 99 in February 2018 in Montreat.

Graham and his late wife, Ruth Bell Graham, purchased the house at 198 Mississippi Road in the late 1940s. It's a four-bedroom, two-bathroom cottage with two levels of living space. Within walking distance of the house is the Montreat Conference Center and Montreat College.

The family lived in the house during the years that

Graham made his name as "America's Pastor." In 1949, Graham attracted national attention during a series of revival meetings in Los Angeles.

"It is where it all began," said Ruth Graham, the third child of Graham, in a statement to Premier Sotheby's. Ruth Graham is the one who put the home up for sale.

Location, location, location

According to Ruth Graham, her parents selected the house for its location.

Right across the street was her grandparents' house, and her uncle by marriage still lives there. Montreat is outside of Asheville and about two hours northwest of Charlotte.

Ruth Graham was born in the house in 1950 and owned the house before she decided to sell it. Since the summer of 2019, the house has served as a vacation rental on VRBO.

As for why she is selling the house now, the 71-year-old Ruth Graham told Premier Sotheby's, "I have a gravely ill daughter that

needs serious and expensive medical attention. I feel it is always better to be upfront with things like that."

Home in Charlotte

Another of Graham's homes resides right in Charlotte.

The evangelist's childhood home was restored as part of the Billy Graham Library complex near Billy Graham Parkway off of Westmont Drive in South Charlotte. The 40,000-square-foot library showcases collections of

photos and historical records documenting Graham's life.

In over 55 years of ministry, Graham preached his Gospel message to more than 215 million people in over 185 countries, according to the library. He also served as a confidante to a number of presidents.

Last year, the \$14 million Billy Graham Archive and Research Center broke ground near the library. It is dedicated for researchers to study historical archives from the late preacher.

Single-family home sale prices hit record high on Oahu

HONOLULU — The median sale price for single-family homes on Oahu hit another record high in June, the fifth time that's happened in the last six months.

The Honolulu Board of Realtors released a report Tuesday that said the median price for single-family homes increased 27% in June to \$979,000, The Honolulu Star-Advertiser reported.

That's compared to \$770,000 in June, 2020.

Last month's median sale price topped the previous record high of \$978,000, set in May. Prices in March were \$950,000, in February at \$917,500 and \$883,000 in January.

Economist Paul Brewbaker said the price surge is because of low inventory not meeting demand as people work from home amid the pandemic.

"Demand went up, supply can't respond," he said at an online event organized by Honolulu-based real estate brokerage firm Luxury Homes International last month. "It's a supply chain breakdown, just like computer chips and toilet paper. Single-family homes weren't being listed at a moment when demand for those types of dwellings went up."

There were 451 single-family home sales in June, up 49% from 302 in the same month last year.

Escape the everyday: Tropical comedy 'The White Lotus' premieres on HBO

After months of sticking close to home, it's time for a holiday. For those of us who can't afford a five-star luxury resort, a new comedy offers a look at life in paradise. Well, almost paradise anyway.

The staff of a luxury tropical resort welcome affluent guests in the social satire "The White Lotus," premiering Sunday, July 11, on HBO. As the miniseries follows various guests and staff members over the course of a week, it quickly becomes clear that their picture-perfect lives are anything but.

Series creator Mike White also directed and wrote all six episodes of the limited series. He's known primarily for writing the screenplays for "School of Rock" (2003), "Nacho Libre" (2006) and "Chuck & Buck" (2000), but this isn't White's first outing with HBO.

White was the co-creator of the comedy-drama "Enlightened," which earned a Golden Globe nomination for Best Television Series - Musical or Comedy, so the folks at the cable giant seem happy to welcome him back into the HBO fold with "The White Lotus."

"We couldn't be happier to collaborate with him again on yet another hilarious and perceptive piece that exposes the complexities of life and humanity itself," Francesca Orsi, co-head of drama programming at HBO, said in an official release about the series.

"The White Lotus" features an ensemble cast that includes seasoned veterans and talented up-and-comers.

Australian actor Murray Bartlett leads the way as resort manager Armond, who, after experiencing a sudden trauma, begins to spiral downward. Bartlett may be best known from his role as Dom in the HBO series "Looking" and the subsequent film "Looking: The Movie," and he was recently seen in the Netflix revival "Tales of the City." His other credits include the television series "Limitless" and "Nashville."

Fans of "Nashville" will also recognize Connie Britton for her starring role as country singer Rayna Jaymes in that drama. She's cast in

a whole new light in "The White Lotus" as Nicole Mossbacher, a successful executive who comes to the resort with her family. luxury resort. TV fans most likely remember Lacey as Pete in the final season of the NBC hit "The Office." More recently, he starred in the FX shows "Fosse/Vernon" and "Mrs. America." Daddario rose to fame as Annabeth in the Percy Jackson film series and shared the screen with Dwayne Johnson in both "San Andreas" (2015) and "Baywatch" (2017).

Jennifer Coolidge ("2 Broke Girls") stars as Tanya McQuoid, a wealthy woman still reeling from the loss of her mother, at the hotel to scatter her mom's ashes. A longtime member of the famed comedy troupe The Groundlings, Coolidge is well known for her comedic roles in such films as "Ameri-

can Pie" (1999) and "Legally Blonde" (2001) as well as Christopher Guest's mockumentary films "Best in Show" (2000) and "A Mighty Wind" (2003). Her television credits include "Friends," "Sex and the City" and "Glee."

Natasha Rothwell rounds out the main cast of "The White Lotus" as down-to-earth spa manager Belinda. The performer and writer is known for her work on HBO's "Insecure," which earned her a 2019 NAACP Image Award nomination. She has also written for legendary sketch-comedy series "Saturday Night Live." As an actress, she's appeared in "Brooklyn Nine-Nine," "The Simpsons" and "Bojack Horseman."

"The White Lotus" features a number of recurring cast members as well, including Molly Shannon ("Saturday Night Live"), Jolene Purdy ("WandaVision"), Lukas Gage ("Euphoria"), Keko Kekumano ("Aquaman," 2018) and Jon Gries ("Lost").

The other "star" of the show is paradise itself, and if the idyllic setting looks authentic, it is. The lucky cast and crew got to film at a real Hawaiian resort last fall, while adhering to strict COVID-19 guidelines, of course.

Now viewers can escape to the tropics thanks to "The White Lotus," premiering Sunday, July 11, on HBO.

When 'All-Stars' align: MLB airs live specialty game from Denver

Tune in to a midsummer classic when the MLB All-Star Game airs live on Tuesday, July 13, from Coors Park in Denver on Fox.

Originally scheduled to take place at Truist Park, home of the Atlanta Braves, the game was moved to Denver in response to Georgia's controversial new voting law.

Now at the Colorado Rockies' ballpark, the high altitude should have a fun effect on the game — with the ballpark being more than 5,000 feet above sea level (the second highest sits just over 1,000 feet above sea level), the atmosphere is less dense, leading to balls being hit farther (i.e. more home runs).

In an effort to make all-star games more competitive, in 2003 MLB introduced a World Series home-field advantage clause for the winning team (e.g. if the American League won the all-star game, then the team

representing the American League in the World Series would have home advantage). This rule was replaced in 2017, however, and home-field advantage was given to the team with the better regular season record.

Teams are decided through a combination of fan and manager voting — fans vote on the starting lineups, while the managers decide on the pitchers and the position player backups. Despite the fact that fan voting is often based less on performance and more on popularity (which is really the essence of an all-star game), this year is special in that the most popular players are also some of the best in the league.

Vladimir Guerrero Jr. of the Toronto Blue Jays, Shohei Ohtani of the Los Angeles Angels, Ronald Acuña Jr. of the Atlanta Braves and Fernando Tatis Jr. of the San Diego Padres are all likely to play a big role in the game.

New discovery+ competition travels 'The Globe'

Anyone with wanderlust has been counting down the days until international travel returns, or rather until it returns to "normal." Maybe you're longing to visit extended family, unwind on a beach or explore an unfamiliar place (or any place that isn't your house, really). Or maybe you're just craving some new flavors and food experiences.

With all the additional restrictions and talk of new variants, international travel might not be an option for most, but "Restaurant: Impossible's" Robert Irvine and discovery+ may have found a way to bring the world to you — or at least some of its food.

Hosted by Irvine, "The Globe" is a new culinary competition series that begins streaming on discovery+ on Saturday, July 17. In each episode, four talented chefs compete in three rounds of culinary challenges. And here's where the "Globe" part comes in: everything takes place in an arena, where immersive LED screen backdrops will transport the chefs and the viewers to different places in the world.

That description might trigger memories of virtual calls with relatives who keep cycling through the backdrop options while you politely look on, but this isn't just for optics or to channel a "vacay" vibe. Those changing backdrops determine the theme for each round and the ingredients used, because the chefs will have to keep

things "local." If they can't do that, or if their global dishes fail to impress the judges, they'll be eliminated, "Chopped" style (one in each round), until the last one standing wins a trip to one of the featured destinations.

But even if they win, their journey isn't done. The first four episodes are preliminary heats for the big finale, in which the ultimate winner gets a \$25,000 grand prize.

Chef Daniela Soto-Innes will serve as the resident judge, while the rotating panel of guest judges includes chefs and food celebrities

with ties to each region.

On the July 17 episode of "The Globe," the first stop is Beijing, China, where the chefs can only cook with the traditional Beijing hot pot. Next up is Tel Aviv, Israel, where they must create Israeli Shipudiya (skewers) and Salatim (salad), before moving on to Accra, Ghana, where plantains and cassava are on the menu.

Where will they go next? A new episode of "The Globe" will be available for streaming each Saturday on discovery+ following its July 17 premiere.

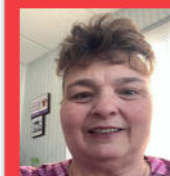

Paused 'Playlist': NBC, Peacock pass on 'Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist'

Paused 'Playlist': Despite hitting all the right notes with fans and critics, "Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist" won't be back for a third season — at least, not on NBC. And it won't be popping up on Peacock, either.

Back in May, NBC quietly decided it wouldn't be renewing the musical dramedy for a third season (fans got the bad news last month). The second season averaged a little over 2.5 million live viewers, but it had a huge digital fan base, making it a prime contender for Peacock to swoop in and keep it going.

Even the cast, led by Golden Globe nominee Jane Levy ("Evil Dead," 2013), seemed to think the switch to streaming was a sure thing. In an interview with Vanity Fair last month, Levy explained, "When we finished [shooting] Season 2, I put all my stuff in storage in Canada [where the show films]. I was like, 'Of course we're coming back.'"

Then came the news that Peacock wouldn't be reviving it: "Last Friday it seemed like it was a green light. And then Monday morning, it was a red light."

Understandably, that came as a shock to the cast and its passionate following once the news broke. Still, there's hope the cast — Levy, Skylar Astin ("Pitch Perfect," 2012), Alex Newell ("Glee"), John Clarence Stewart ("Luke Cage"), Mary Steenburgen ("Curb Your Enthusiasm") and more — haven't performed their last number together. Lionsgate Television, which co-produced the series, is reportedly shopping the series elsewhere, similar to when it successfully relocated "Nashville" to CMT after ABC cancelled that series.

"I guess we're holding on to a little hope," said Astin in a recent interview with EW. "But the Peacock play was looking very optimistic ... down to details of what it would look like and shoot like and how it would be transitioned. It was actually a very exciting notion, which probably made it harder because that carrot was dangled in front of our face and then the rug was completely pulled, kind of at the last minute. So that's why it feels more surreal."

New to 'NCIS': The upcoming season of "NCIS" will feature a few new faces and fewer appearances by at least one cast member.

Long-time star Emily Wickersham ("I am Number Four," 2011), who has played Ellie Bishop since Season 11, confirmed in May (via Instagram) that she was exiting the crime procedural. That opened the door for a minor cast shake-up and the addition of two new series regulars ahead of Season 19.

After starring on ABC's "Mixed-ish" for two seasons, Gary Cole ("Veep") is set to join the "NCIS" cast as FBI Special Agent Alden Park. Executives have been pretty tight-lipped about his character; they haven't released a lot of information about him, but they did point out that he wasn't replacing Mark Harmon's character, Special Agent Gibbs. Not completely, anyway.

There has been a lot of speculation about Harmon's involvement in the new season, and it seems he won't be appearing in a lot of episodes. The exact number of episodes involving Gibbs hasn't been confirmed (Deadline suggested it might be "just a handful"), but it would make sense for Cole's new character to be brought in to help fill the void.

In an interview with Deadline, CBS President Kelly Kahl explained, "We take it year by year with Mark, we'd love to have him as long as he'd like to be here. Even in this past season, he might have been light in a couple of [episodes], so we're happy to work around his schedule."

As for the other new series regular, Katrina Law ("Arrow"), she'll be playing Special Agent Jessica Knight. She's not exactly new, though: Law was a recurring guest star last season, but Wickersham's departure left a vacancy for a strong female character.

More 'Ziwe': In a changing late-night TV landscape, it seems Showtime likes what it sees in comedian Ziwe Fumudoh ("Our Cartoon President") and her eponymous variety show.

A late-night TV newcomer, "Ziwe" debuted in May and wrapped its six-week run last month, but Showtime has already renewed it for a second season. Not only that, Showtime has ordered 12 episodes, effectively doubling up on the skits, songs and interviews that caught the attention of critics.

"This show has exceeded my wildest imagination thanks to my brilliant cast, crew and iconic guests," said Ziwe, in an official statement. "I am famously delighted to continue my collaboration with Showtime and [producer] A24."

Season 2 will be divided into two installments, and it should be interesting to see who the guests will be after Season 1 featured author Fran Lebowitz, New York City mayoral candidate Andrew Yang, journalist Gloria Steinem and popular Georgia state politician Stacey Abrams.

With Emmy nominations set to be announced on July 13, it will be interesting to see if 'Ziwe' picks up a nod in the Outstanding Variety Sketch Series category. In the meantime, the host is already looking ahead to the new season.

"Is there a season where I interview Hillary Clinton and Kim Kardashian or talk to the Obamas? What's nice about the show is that I can talk to anyone," said Ziwe, in an interview with Deadline. "I can talk to 'Duck Dynasty' or the president of Morehouse. I just look forward to meeting new people and having more compelling, interesting conversations and constantly pushing the boundaries."

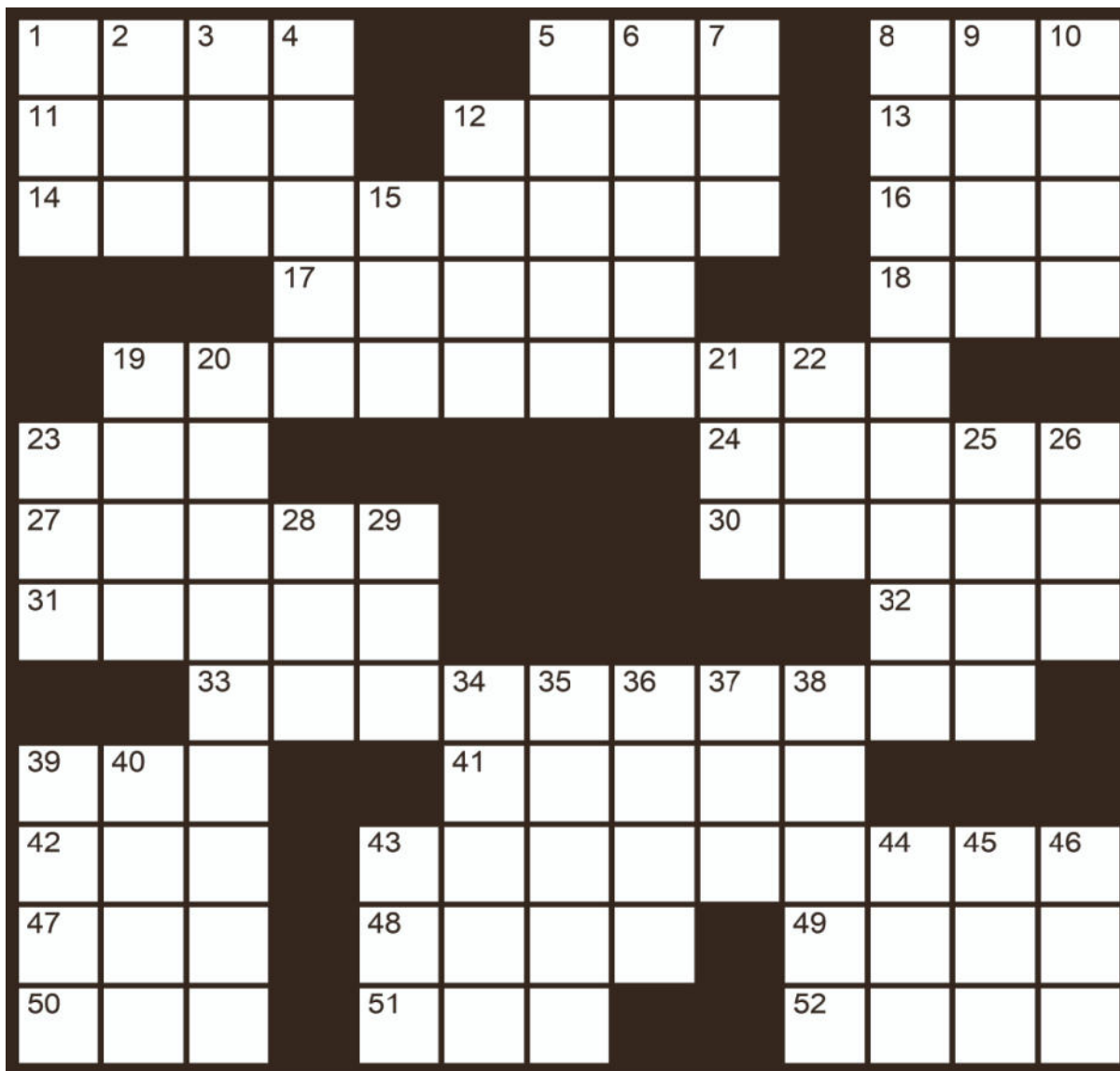

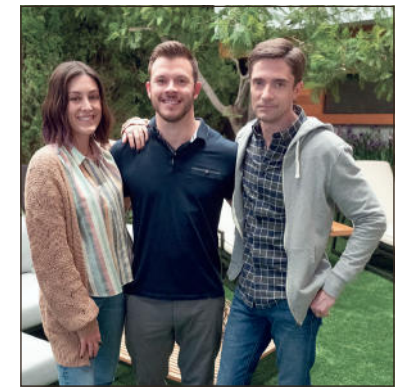

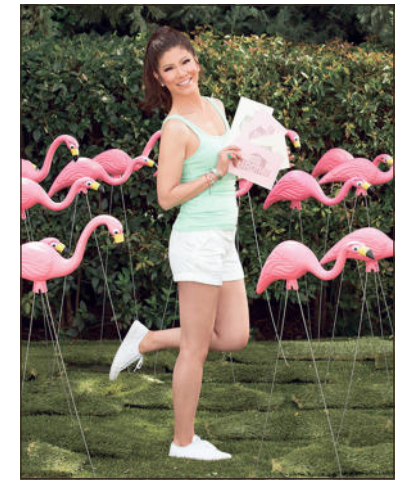
