Commission to ask Council to replace Columbus Day with Indigenous People's Day

MORGANTOWN — Who was Christopher Columbus?

A devout Catholic and working-class man who spent a decade petitioning royal support for a voyage that altered the course of world history and made him a household name?

A genocidal slave trader who delivered disease and death to

the indigenous people of the Americas?

Both?

Either way, the Morgantown Human Rights Commission would like the city to stop recognizing the holiday bearing his name, which dates back to 1792 and became a national holiday in 1937 under the signature of Franklin Roosevelt.

The commission intends to

ask Morgantown City Council to officially declare the second Monday in October Indigenous People's Day when council convenes for its committee of the whole meeting on Oct. 26.

More than 100 cities and 17 states have already done so. Morgantown would be the second city in West Virginia to make the change. Harpers Ferry did in 2016.

HRC members Don Spencer and Bonnie Brown, who serves as the Native American Studies program coordinator at WVU, recently sat down with The Dominion Post Editorial Board to discuss their upcoming request.

Spencer said the HRC hoped to have the proposed legislation in front of council before Colum-

Body of missing Florida college student found

MIAMI — Authorities say they have found the body of a missing Florida college student who disappeared a week ago. A maintenance worker who entered her apartment unauthorized the day she disappeared and later killed himself is the prime suspect.

Orange County Sheriff John Mina said Saturday that authorities found Miya Marcano's body in a wooded area near an apartment building. Authorities said the 19-year-old vanished on the same day a maintenance man improperly used a master key to enter her apartment. Her family reported her missing after she missed a flight home to South Florida on Sept. 24.

The sheriff previously said Armando Caballero, a maintenance worker at the apartment complex where Marcano lived and worked, is considered the

"prime suspect." Caballero, 27, apparently killed himself; his body was found three days after Marcano was last seen.

Marcano had repeatedly "rebuffed" romantic advances by Caballero. Detectives spoke to Caballero after the Valencia College student was reported missing, but had no evidence to detain him at that time. They obtained a warrant for his arrest after learning he had entered her apartment before she disappeared. His body was then found inside a garage.

Cellphone records from Caballero led them to the apartment complex near where Marcano was found and showed he was there for about 20 minutes the night she was reported missing, Sheriff Mina said. At one point, Caballero also previously lived at that apartment complex.

"Nothing in the records indicate that he ever returned there

before he killed himself," he said, adding deputies are not looking for any other suspects.

The FBI and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement were among the hundreds of authorities searching for Marcano. Meanwhile, friends and family held a prayer vigil and passed out flyers desperate to find the missing teen.

"At this time, we cannot identify a cause of death, so I don't want to speculate on that," Mina said of Marcano's death during a news conference Saturday.

Mina says they notified her parents just hours ago, adding "our hearts are broken."

"Everyone wanted this outcome to be different," he said. "As a sheriff, as a father, obviously we are grieving at the loss of Miya."

Caballero's criminal history revealed one prior arrest in

COVID-19 booster shot now available

Only to those who are high risk, elderly

MORGANTOWN — COVID-19 vaccine booster shots are available to select populations across the United States, and several locations in the Morgantown and surrounding area are available to distribute it to those eligible.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the booster shot is available to certain groups who received the first two doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine at least six months ago. Eligible groups as of Friday include:

- 65 years and older
- Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
- Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
- Age 18+ who work in high-risk settings
- Age 18+ who live in high-risk settings

The CDC defines those at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure as frontline, essential workers and health care workers, including first responders, education staff, food and agriculture workers, manufacturing workers, corrections workers, U.S. Postal Service employees, public transit workers, and grocery store workers.

"For the elderly and for those patients who are immunocompromised who could suffer really bad effects from COVID, it's important to maintain a high level of immunity, which the booster will produce," said Todd Karpinski, WVU Medicine chief pharmacy officer. "For those individuals with a lot of occupational exposures, such as those individuals that are caring for COVID patients in the hospital setting, it just gives them a further immunity to try to prevent them from acquiring the COVID virus."

Trump asks US judge to force Twitter to restore his account

NEW YORK — Former President Donald Trump has asked a federal judge in Florida to force Twitter to restore his account, which the company suspended in January following the deadly storming of the U.S. Capitol.

Trump’s attorneys on Friday filed a motion in U.S. District Court in Miami seeking a preliminary injunction against Twitter and its CEO, Jack Dorsey. They argue that Twitter is censoring Trump in violation of his First Amendment rights, according to the motion.

Twitter declined to comment Saturday on Trump’s filing.

The company permanently banned Trump from its platform days after his followers violently stormed the Capitol building to try to block Congress from certifying

Joe Biden’s presidential win. Twitter cited concerns that Trump would incite further violence. Prior to the ban, Trump had roughly 89 million followers on Twitter.

Trump was also suspended from Facebook and Google’s YouTube over similar concerns that he would provoke violence. Facebook’s ban will last two years, until Jan. 7, 2023, after which the company will review his suspension. YouTube’s ban is indefinite.

In July, Trump filed lawsuits in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida against all three tech companies and their CEOs, claiming that he and other conservatives have been wrongfully censored. The motion for a preliminary injunction was filed as part of Trump’s case against Twitter.

MUB issues precautionary boil water advisory

Morgantown Utility Board will issue a precautionary boil water advisory on Monday for customers at 900-920 Dudley Ave., even numbers only; 901-929 Rawley Ave., odd numbers only; 350, 372 and 376 Oakland St.; and 350-380 Vassar St.

The advisory is a result of a planned service outage to complete system upgrades in that area. Once service is restored, affected customers should boil their water before consumption until the boil water advisory is lifted.

Customers are advised to bring all water to a boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using, or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, brushing teeth and food preparation until this advisory is lifted.

When the system recovers, MUB will collect additional water quality samples in the area of the outage, which require a minimum of 24 hours for analysis.

bus Day this year, but the timing just didn’t work out.

“It’s continuing to snowball around the country. We’re hoping the Morgantown can be a flake in that snowball to help move things along,” he said. “We’re hoping that this will become established and that the schools, instead of teaching something necessarily about Columbus, who never even came to the United States territory and was a very questionable person ...”

Brown added that it’s important that people can still teach about Columbus, “but be aware of the real story.”

She said Morgantown can be a small piece of a growing movement.

“It’s part of a mosaic. It’s part of an overall contribution of greater awareness, greater respect, greater social justice, ending racism, helping people reconcile within themselves, and then societally, having a clearer focus on where we are today, how we got here, and so on,” she said.

Asked if the commission anticipated pushback, particularly from the sizeable Italian American population in the area, Brown said some Italian American communities elsewhere have asked for

the change.

“I think more Italian American communities and community organizations are making the shift. I think that’s just a part of more information being shared. Sometimes we just kind of blindly accept things that have been done,” she said. “They’ve said ‘In the 21st century, we don’t need to align ourselves with someone who became the symbol of genocide of indigenous people in the Americas.’”

While debate about the man is very much up for interpretation, Columbus’ journey ultimately led to the founding of the United States, West Virginia and Morgantown. Why not celebrate both, as some cities and states do?

“I think there are a lot of different ways to answer that and people might answer it in different ways. I guess, personally, to replace Columbus Day with Indigenous People’s Day is a way of correcting hundreds of years of misinformation, and, frankly, white supremacy. I think it’s a way to put the focus on the people who were here first,” Brown said.

The United Nations declared Aug. 9 Indigenous Peoples’ Day in 1994, making it an international holiday.

Alleging rampant sex abuse, alumni sue elite UNC arts school

RALEIGH, N.C. — Seven alumni have sued North Carolina’s most prestigious arts school, accusing leaders of ignoring evidence that faculty and other adults on campus sexually abused them while they were underage students.

The former students, each of whom studied dance at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts in the 1980s, listed allegations against teachers that include inappropriate comments and fondling in class, as well as violent sexual assault off-campus.

UNCSA opened in 1965 as the nation’s first public arts conservatory, housing both high school and university students. Considered by many to be a jewel in the University of North Carolina system, its founders envisioned a salon-like utopia, where artists would pass their craft on to young performers. About 1,250 students are enrolled today.

The former students’ lawsuit says some teachers, including Richard Kuch and Richard Gain, regularly touched students’ breasts, buttocks and groins to push them into straighter posture or higher leaps. They and another dance teacher, the late Duncan Noble, are accused of inviting underage students to their off-campus homes and sexually assaulting them, in one case leaving a student with bruises and bite marks on his chest.

One former student said Kuch demanded that she dance more sexually. He said she needed to have sex with a Black man to loosen up, and forced a Black classmate to dance provocatively with her in front of their peers.

The lawsuit also lists a series of sordid stories from other departments in the school.

They include “Freshman Friday,” when a Drama Department dean called first-year boys to his office to fondle them, saying erec-

tions indicated which ones could be successful in the field.

Graduate film students hunted down 13-year-old girls for sex, dubbing themselves the “vagina hunters.”

The alumni asked that the lawsuit be certified as a class-action claim, allowing other former students to join the case.

The school “turned a willful blind eye to the egregious conduct suffered by so many of the school’s students,” they say in the filing.

UNCSA has faced similar accusations in the past.

In 1995, one of the plaintiffs in the most recent suit tried to sue alone.

Christopher Soderlund said Kuch and Gain sexually abused him after he enrolled in 1983, relying on the student’s desire for mentorship to keep him quiet. Their relationship was common knowledge among students and faculty, he said, but nobody told him it was wrong. When he complained to ballet teacher Duncan Noble, in fact, the man said that he too would have liked to have sex with Soderlund, he claimed in his lawsuit.

As news of the 1995 lawsuit spread, North Carolina newspapers uncovered evidence of earlier complaints. The Winston-Salem Journal that year reported that since 1990 both faculty and students had told administrators about sex abuse in the school.

The Greensboro News & Record interviewed a professor who recounted warning then Vice Chancellor William Pruitt that dance teachers across the nation refused to send male students to UNCSA, citing stories that Kuch and Gain were predators.

Kuch and Gain resigned from the school before their scheduled disciplinary hearing, and the UNC system’s Board of Governor’s created a commission to investigate the scale of sexual abuse on campus, pledging to tamp down any impropriety.

Karpinski said booster shots are available in several locations, including WVU Medicine booster shot clinics and at pharmacies such as Walgreens, CVS and Rite Aid.

Mary Wade Burnside, Monongalia County Health Department public information officer, said MCHD will distribute COVID-19 vaccines as well as booster shots to those who are eligible from 1-3 p.m. Friday and Oct. 15 at the WVU Recreational Center. Sign-ups are available online at novelhealth.ai/practice/monongalia-county-health-department-clinical-services-383538.

“Filling out their insurance information online in advance will save them time at the appointment,” Burnside said. “The insurance is for the administration of the vaccine, which is free.”

Booster shot appointments can also be made by calling the Monongalia County Health Department at 304-598-5119.

Those who receive the booster shot may experience similar side effects to those seen during the initial vaccine doses.

“With any vaccine, the most common side effect that we’re seeing with the boosters is the soreness in the arm at the injection site,” Karpinski said. “The data that’s released shows no more side effects of the [Pfizer] booster dose compared to the first or second doses.”

According to the CDC, data shows protection against the COVID-19 virus may decrease over time after initially getting vaccinated. As more data becomes available, additional populations may be recommended to receive a booster shot.

COVID-19 deaths eclipse 700,000 in U.S. as Delta variant rages

It's a milestone that by all accounts didn't have to happen this soon.

The U.S. death toll from COVID-19 eclipsed 700,000 late Friday — a number greater than the population of Boston. The last 100,000 deaths occurred during a time when vaccines — which overwhelmingly prevent deaths, hospitalizations and serious illness — were available to any American over the age of 12.

The milestone is deeply frustrating to doctors, public health officials and the American public, who watched a pandemic that had been easing earlier in the summer take a dark turn. Tens of millions of Americans have refused to get vaccinated, allowing the highly contagious Delta variant to tear through the country and send the

death toll from 600,000 to 700,000 in 3 1/2 months.

Florida suffered by far the most death of any state during that period, with the virus killing about 17,000 residents since the middle of June. Texas was second with 13,000 deaths. The two states account for 15% of the country's population, but more than 30% of the nation's deaths since the nation crossed the 600,000 threshold.

Dr. David Dowdy, an infectious disease epidemiologist at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health who has analyzed publicly reported state data, said it's safe to say at least 70,000 of the last 100,000 deaths were in unvaccinated people. And of those vaccinated people who died with breakthrough infections, most caught the virus from an unvaccinated person, he said.

"If we had been more effective in our vaccination, then I think it's fair to say, we could have prevented 90% of those deaths," since mid-June, Dowdy said.

"It's not just a number on a screen," Dowdy said. "It's tens of thousands of these tragic stories of people whose families have lost someone who means the world to them."

Danny Baker is one of them.

The 28-year-old seed hauler from Riley, Kansas, contracted COVID-19 over the summer, spent more than a month in the hospital and died Sept. 14. He left behind a wife and a 7-month-old baby girl.

"This thing has taken a grown man, 28-year-old young man, 300-pound man, and took him down like it was nothing," said his father, 56-year-old J.D. Baker, of Milford, Kansas. "And so if young people think that they're still ...

protected because of their youth and their strength, it's not there anymore."

In the early days of the pandemic, Danny Baker, who was a championship trap shooter in high school and loved hunting and fishing, insisted he would be first in line for a vaccine, recalled his mother.

But just as vaccinations opened up to his age group, the U.S. recommended a pause in use of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine to investigate reports of rare but potentially dangerous blood clots. The news frightened him, as did information swirling online that the vaccine

could harm fertility, though medical experts say there's no biological reason the shots would affect fertility.

His wife also was breastfeeding, so they decided to wait. Health experts now say breastfeeding mothers should get the vaccine for their own protection and that it may even provide some protection for their babies through antibodies passed along in breastmilk.

"There's just a lot of miscommunication about the vaccine," said his wife, 27-year-old Aubrea Baker, a labor and delivery nurse, adding that her husband's

death inspired a Facebook page and at least 100 people to get vaccinated. "It's not that we weren't going to get it. We just hadn't gotten it yet."

When deaths surpassed 600,000 in mid-June, vaccinations already were driving down caseloads, restrictions were being lifted and people looked forward to life returning to normal over the summer. Deaths per day in the U.S. had plummeted to an average of around 340, from a high of over 3,000 in mid-January. Soon afterward, health officials declared it a pandemic of the unvaccinated.

2013 for using a destructive device resulting in property damage and discharging a weapon on school property, according to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

An arrest report said Polk County sheriff's

deputies were called to the campus of Warner University after a report of a bomb going off inside a dorm. The explosive turned out to be a toilet bowl cleaner concoction inside a plastic drink bottle. The report said Caballero admitted to using the improvised explosive as a "prank" on other residents of the

dorm. No one was injured.

The apartment complex where Marciano and Caballero worked, Arden Villa, released a statement saying "all potential employees are vetted through a national background check services provider," and no records of burglary or sexual assault were found involving Caballero.

'Everybody is frustrated,' Biden says as his agenda stalls

WASHINGTON — President Joe Biden Saturday acknowledged frustrations as Democrats strain to rescue a scaled-back version of his \$3.5 trillion government-overhaul plan and salvage a related public works bill after frantic negotiations failed to produce a deal.

"Everybody's frustrated, it's part of being in government, being frustrated," Biden told reporters before leaving the White House for a weekend stay at his home in Wilmington, Delaware. He pledged to "work like hell" to get the two pillars of his domestic agenda passed into law, but refrained from laying out a new deadline.

The president had gone to Capitol Hill on Friday for a private meeting with House Democrats that was partly a morale booster for the disjointed caucus of lawmakers. According to lawmakers in the room, he discussed a \$1.9 trillion to \$2 trillion-plus price tag for the larger

package that would expand the country's social safety net.

The White House and its allies in Congress are prepared for protracted negotiations. Biden said he would soon travel around the country to promote the legislation and he acknowledged concerns that the talk in Washington had become too focused on the trillions in new spending and taxes in the bill.

He pledged to do more to educate the public about the plan's new and expanded programs, which he contended have the support of the vast majority of the electorate.

"I'm going to try to sell what I think the American people will buy," Biden said Saturday, adding, "I believe that when the American people are aware of what's in it we'll get it done."

The president said he believed the legislation will be signed into law with "plenty of time to change the tax code for people next year."

Suicide and complicated grief

Grief is the universal reaction to the loss of a loved one.

When a loved one passes away, most people feel **acute grief**, which is the initial painful grief.

After that, this grief turns into **integrated grief**, which is an ongoing form of grief but also the period when people start to heal. While this time period is challenging, when it starts to abate most people find themselves finding new strength and wisdom within themselves.

Some people, however, find themselves unable to move on from their grief. Instead, their grief turns into a very prolonged, unresolved, and traumatic form of grief called **complicated grief**. With complicated grief, feelings of longing don't go away with time. Your pain stays fresh and you don't start to heal. It might be said that someone with complicated grief feels "stuck in time." This is the type of grief that interferes with life and daily activities. This type of grief can also lead to pain so intense that someone may feel like the only possible relief is their own death.

Survivors of suicide (those left behind to mourn the loss) are very likely to feel complicated grief. This is because of the effects of trauma and stigma. Survivors of suicide are more likely to feel emotions such as rejection, blame, and shame compared to other causes of death. It is very common for survivors of suicide to get caught up by feelings that they should have known or should have done something differently to prevent the suicide. It can also be hard to find someone to share your feelings with because you fear judgment and most other people are unlikely to understand what you are going through.

If you find yourself or a loved one experiencing complicated grief know that this is not something that will go away on its own.

One of the most important things you can do if you find yourself feeling complicated grief is to get help. If you can't talk to a trusted friend or family member, find a support group, doctor or counselor you can talk to who will help you process your grief and find the resources you need.

Government and constitution expert John Sanders dies at 94

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — John Sanders, an expert on North Carolina government who helped revise the state constitution, has died at age 94.

Sanders died Sept. 22 in Chapel Hill, according to Walker's Funeral Home and the University of North Carolina School of Government, which he led for 24 years. Obituaries by the funeral home and the school didn't give a cause of death.

A Johnston County native who received bachelor's and law degrees from UNC-Chapel Hill, Sanders joined the faculty of the then-Institute of Government in 1956. He was named director in the early


1960s and late 1970s.

Sanders was a staff member for the North Carolina Constitutional Commission that led to revisions to what became the 1971 constitution. He also led staff work on a panel that helped establish the statewide community college system.


Sanders worked several years as a University of North Carolina system administrator. He drafted the system's first affirmative action plan. He was president for 15 years of the North Carolina State Capitol Foundation, which focuses on restoring the 1840 seat of government in Raleigh.





Local musician’s album prepares for national release

Percussion repercussions — and the banjo in the bathroom. Ask Chris Haddox what he remembers most about the recording of his first-ever album, which is set for national release in coming months, and that’s the two-part answer you’ll get. Yep, percussion repercussions. And, uh, the banjo in the bathroom. We’ll circle back to that one. Meanwhile, Haddox, 61, is known around Morgantown and

the Mountain State for the many circles in which he travels. At WVU, he’s Dr. Chris Haddox, a professor in the School of Design and Community Development, where he teaches sustainable design practices in new building construction. Before that, he was an intrepid executive in cargo shorts, serving as the director of Monongalia County Habitat for Humanity, the organization that helps people achieve the dream of home ownership who may not have the chance otherwise. And before that, the Logan

County native had morphed himself into a community activist and environmental activist, all at the same time. You might spy him at a protest rally one day, and then see him the next day, by himself, poking along the banks of a West Virginia creek, where the rocks are still tinted orange from acid mine drainage. He’s also a musician, known for his old-time fiddle and banjo stylings in the mountain clawhammer style, and he can also tear it up as a flatpicking acoustic guitar player when he wants to. As a songwriter, he crafts blue-

grass foot-stompers, meditative ballads and funny, slice-of-life tunes (just north of the absurd), that can make any self-respecting John Prine or Steve Goodman fan shake his head and grin. **It’s got a great beat?** All of those explorations, and more, are present on his self-named album, which, as said, is about to go forth on the Mountain Soul label. A marquee name was at the soundboard handling the production. Ron Sowell, the musical direc-

tor of West Virginia Public Radio’s landmark “Mountain Stage” show, turned the knobs for this one. Which included dialing in those pesky drums, which Haddox wasn’t sure what to think of at first. Well, check that, the artist said, laughing. He knew exactly what he thought. “I didn’t like ‘em. I’d never played music with a drummer before. I’d never tried to record with a drummer before. I didn’t know if it would fit the songs. I

Fire Prevention Week returns with MFD “Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety” will be held this week

Fire Prevention Week has arrived and the Morgantown Fire Department will teach area children about important sounds of which to be aware. The MFD is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association for this year’s campaign, “Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety,” which will be held today through Oct. 9. Throughout the week, firefighters will share tips on how to recognize different alarm sounds and important actions to take to stay safe. “We try to get those fire safety messages in front of the kids as much as possible, in hopes that they’ll retain that information as they get older and make wise fire safety decisions,” said Andrew Dotson, MFD deputy fire marshal and public education coordinator. More than 10,000 educational items will be distributed to county school systems throughout the week. Kindergarten through second graders will receive coloring books and stickers, third through fifth graders will receive pencils, and teachers will be provided with dry erase marker kits, lanyards, pens and highlighters. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the department has worked to find alternatives to its typical teaching methods. Dotson said members of the fire department will hold activities and lessons through Zoom and will release pre-recorded videos with segments about fire safety. “Fire safety affects you every second of your life,” Dotson said. “If you’re not keeping that in the front of your brain at all times, devastation—even death—could occur. Not trying to be doom and gloom, but we try to get out there and we really try to push our messaging to the children because they’re sponges right now, and they just absorb everything that we teach them.”

Set up your own plush garden in the comfort of your home this autumn

October is upon us, bringing pumpkin spice, pumpkin soup, pumpkin rolls, Halloween, and fall décor. It is time to look up recipes, plan a spooky night for the end of the month, and decorate your home in an autumn theme. Fall décor can be expensive and unexcitingly generic. For a personalized custom DIY display you will only need a few materials and basic sewing skills. To make DIY cloth pumpkins you will need: ■ A choice of fabrics ■ Needle and thread ■ Extra (strong) thread or string, to match fabric ■ Scissors ■ Stuffing or fabric scraps for stuffing

■ Sticks and paint or winter squash stems Pick a set of complimentary fabrics for your cloth pumpkins. Using velvet can make your display look lush. Sweater fabric can look very stylized, flannel will create a cozy seasonal look and patterned cotton fabric can add a funky flare. Mix and match fabric colors, types and patterns to achieve a look you like. You don’t have to stick to an autumn palette — a variety of colors can look just as festive and unique. Cut a rectangle of fabric 12 inches by six inches to start, and then you can make additional pumpkins larger or smaller — if you make the rectangle longer but not taller you’ll have a flatter pumpkin. Sew the shorter ends of the rectangle together. Alternatively you can upcycle old clothing, and cut a section of a shirt or sweater sleeve to get a rectangle already sewn together at the ends. If you are cutting out of a flat piece of fabric try cutting on the bias by placing the rectangle on the diagonal of the fabric. This will give it a little stretch, making it mold more naturally around

Shouldn’t most woodpeckers have brain damage?

If I SLAMMED MY MOUTH against a tree over and over again, I would definitely sustain some serious, lifelong injuries. And I’m sure every other human could attest to this. So then how do woodpeckers slam their beaks into a tree 20 times per second and up to 12,000 times in a day? Woodpeckers are found all around the world, with the exception of Australia and Antarctica. They use their beaks to drill holes into trees to extract sap and bugs. Pecking occurs at a tremendous force — about 10 times more than what causes concussions in humans. Woodpeckers have a bony structure called the hyoid. It supports the tongue, starting in the mouth, wrapping around the head, and attaching between the eyes. It can be thought of as a seatbelt around the brain. It absorbs some of the force that occurs during the collision of the beak into the tree. Additionally, the bones in the skull have an accumulation of minerals that make it stiffer and stronger, especially compared to other birds’ skulls. The skull also is thinner and has less fluid, which limits the amount that move during the motion of the collision. You can think of it as shaking a normal egg versus a hard-boiled egg. The hard-boiled egg’s insides move less than a normal egg’s. This means that the skull is especially tough. Newton’s second law of motion tells us that force equals mass times acceleration. The amount of pain you feel also depends on how much area that force is applied on. For example, if you step on a single nail, it’s going to hurt because all that force was concentrated in a very small region. But, if you were to lie on a bed of nails, it would barely feel like anything because the force is spread out over a large surface. Thus, the area surrounding a

Report says sister saw Brian Laundrie twice in Fla.

ORLANDO, Fla. — The whereabouts of the still-missing Brian Laundrie's movements upon his return to Florida without Gabby Petito continue to be dissected as well as statements made by his sister during the September search that ultimately led to finding Petito's body.

Attorney Steve Bertolino, the lawyer that represents the Laundrie family, stated that sister Cassie Laundrie saw her brother Brian twice after his return to his parents' North Port, Florida, home on Sept. 1, according to a report on WFLA, an NBC affiliate serving Tampa Bay.

Brian and Petito had left on a cross-country trip in July, but a search for Petito began after a missing person report was filed on Sept. 11 by her family.

"Cassie saw her brother Brian on September 1 when he stopped by her home and

again on September 6 at Fort De Soto Park," Bertolino told the TV station in a text message. "Law enforcement agencies are well aware of these dates."

While the Laundrie parents have not communicated with the public except through statements from their attorney, Cassie spoke out on Sept. 17 during an interview with "Good Morning America," saying, "I haven't been able to talk to him. I wish I could talk to him; I've cooperated in every way that I can. I wish I had information or I would give more."

Bertolino addressed the timeline difference, saying it was a case of misinterpretation.

"Any prior communication by Cassie that does not reflect these dates is simply a difference of relating an answer to a question misinterpreted by Cassie or poorly posed by the inquirer," Bertolino told WFLA.

Bertolino had previ-

ously confirmed that Brian and his parents had gone to the park starting Sept. 6, but did not mention Cassie's presence initially.

Law enforcement continue to search for Brian, who was reported missing by his parents, who said he left on Sept. 14 with a backpack, but left behind his wallet and phone, to the massive Carlton Reserve near Sarasota. Police were told three days later on Sept. 17, and a multi-day search began for Laundrie.

They stated they were worried he could have harmed himself. They maintain they do not know where he is.

Petito's body was found in a remote camping area in Wyoming on Sept. 19. A coroner later ruled her death a homicide.

While not charged in Petito's homicide, Laundrie does have an arrest warrant issued by the FBI last week, charged with unauthorized use of a debit card.

the stuffing.

Turn the circle of fabric inside out, and gather one open end of it by running a needle in and out every half an inch (roughly, this does not have to be exact) all the way around, about a quarter of an inch from the edge.

Gather this side by pulling the thread tight. Sew across the gathered fabric to secure it.

Turn the project right side out, and stuff it. You can use polyester stuffing, or you can repurpose stuffing from a worn out pillow or stuffed animal toy. Alternatively you can use fabric scraps as stuffing.

Gather the open edge in the same way you did the

previous side. Pull it tight, and tuck the edges inside the stuffed project. Stitched carefully to secure the gathered fabric while keeping stitched from being too obvious.

You can use either side as the top. If you so choose you can cut a circle of cardboard a bit smaller than the bottom of the stuffed pumpkin and cover it in matching fabric. Set this aside to cover the bottom with after the next step.

Using strong thread or string or yarn and a needle with a large eye create the pumpkin segments. Do so by sewing through the center of the pumpkin (you will have to squish it to make the needle reach through), looping it over the outside and on the next pass

through pulling it tight.

Repeat until you have enough segments (roughly equally spaced). Tie the thread or yarn tightly off.

If you created a base for the pumpkin hot glue it on now.

Add a stem to the pumpkin by hot glueing a small section of a tree branch or the stem of a winter squash on to the top. You can paint (any color or glitter) the branch to match or contrast with your fabrics.

This is a great project with which to practice your own sewing skills or to teach a child.

You can make a set up pumpkins to stand alone, or to complete a display with candles and other decorations.

Weather challenges crews fighting Cali. wildfires

Crews faced challenging conditions as they worked to contain wildfires in the southern Sierra amid unusually warm temperatures and historic drought.

The KNP Complex fire in Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Park had burned 58,283 acres and was 20% contained as of early Saturday, when it sparked new evacuation warnings in Fresno County. Those in Sequoia Lake, Cedarbrook, Etheda Springs and Pinehurst were told to be prepared to leave.

A thick layer of smoke that had settled over the fire reduced visibility, limiting the use of aircraft, said Cassie Adams, public information officer on the incident. Crews were keeping a close eye on the weather in case the inversion lifted later in the day, which would allow the use of more aircraft but could also cause fire activity to pick up and create dangerous conditions for firefighters, she said. They were also using drones equipped with infrared cameras to conduct reconnaissance that might ordinarily be done by planes, she said.

While the smoke was mostly concentrated over the fire, some of it was draining into the San Joaquin Valley, producing poor air quality along the east side, said David Spector, meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Hanford. Temperatures in the area were five to eight degrees above normal and were expected to remain elevated through Monday, he said.

The fire was active overnight, particularly along the northwestern end where it spotted over

the North Fork Kaweah River on Thursday, Adams said. It also grew to the east, near Castle Creek Grove. About 1,345 personnel were assigned to the incident.

Crews were working to keep flames from moving further north and west, toward communities in the Hartland area, using miles of dozer line that had been put in earlier as a contingency, Adams said. Firefighters were preparing structures in those communities by clearing debris and installing sprinklers and hose lays, but the line was holding as of Saturday morning, she said.

Crews also conducted back burning operations along the northern perimeter farther to the east, in the Dorst Creek area, Adams said.

"If we feel like based on the weather and fire behavior, that we have the ability to control fuels in a given area and we can safely ignite a small fire to create a thick black line that would inhibit the uncontrolled fire from crossing it, then that's what we will do," she said.

The fire had forced 659 people from their homes, with evacuation orders issued Friday for the communities of Big Meadows, Weston Meadows and Quail Flat in the Giant Sequoia National Monument, as well as Grant Grove, Wilsonia and Cedar Grove in Kings Canyon National Park, Adams said.

Along the southern edge of the fire, authorities on Friday downgraded to a warning an evacuation order for residents along the Mineral King Road entrance of the park.

The fire started during a Sept. 9 lightning storm and has been difficult to

control as it burns through dry forests crowded with trees competing for limited moisture that has been made more scarce by climate change and drought, experts say.

California and several other Western states endured the hottest summer on record. And preliminary data indicate that the water year, which ended Sept. 30, was the driest on record for multiple areas in Northern California, including Redding, Red Bluff and Sacramento, the National Weather Service said Saturday.

Farther south in the Hanford forecast area, the picture looked less dire, but there were still areas that ranked in the top 10 for driest water years, Spector said.

"The fuels themselves are very, very, very dry," Adams said. "And there's not a lot of humidity recovery in the evening hours, when usually we're able to go in and be a little more direct with fire suppression efforts. We're not really getting that relief as far as humidity goes that allows fuels to retain more moisture."

The KNP Complex fire, as well as the Windy fire burning in the Sequoia National Forest about 25 miles south, have also drawn concern for the many giant sequoia trees in those areas.

The western slopes of the Sierra Nevada are the only places these ancient trees grow naturally. Although they are considered one of the longest-living and most fire-adapted species on Earth, last year's Castle fire burned at such a high intensity that it wiped out an estimated 10% to 14% of the population.

Garibay's late FG lifts Texas Tech past West Virginia 23-20

The score was tied, Texas Tech was about to take over deep in its own territory with time running down in the fourth quarter, and quarterback Henry Colombi had one thing to say to running back SaRodorick Thompson. "I turned to SaRodorick and I said, 'This is why I play college football,'" Colombi said. "It's for moments like these."

Colombi drove the Red Raiders 70 yards to set up Jonathan Garibay's 32-yard field goal with 18 seconds left for a 23-20 victory over West Virginia on Saturday.

Garibay had three field goals in all and Thompson had two short touchdown runs for Texas Tech (4-1, 1-1 Big 12), which bounced back from a 70-35 loss at Texas.

"We wanted to capitalize on our opportunities this

week," Colombi said. "We had a great week of practice. And I'm real proud of the guys."

Despite missing numerous starters, including key offensive playmakers, the Red Raiders beat the Mountaineers (2-3, 0-2) for the third straight time, all when using a backup quarterback.

West Virginia wasn't able to get past midfield on its final drive.

Texas Tech didn't need Erik Ezukanma to move the ball. The Big 12's leading receiver did not play after getting hurt against Texas last week. But the Red Raiders just didn't go down the field in their customary huge chunks, either. Texas Tech also was without leading rusher Tahj Brooks, who missed his second straight game with a leg injury.

HIGH SCHOOL CROSS-COUNTRY

UHS boys', MHS girls' teams rank top 25 nationally

Two Monongalia County high school cross-country programs are among the best in the nation. Years of consistent results, thousands of hours of training and true dedication to running have lifted the Morgantown girls at University boys into the national spotlight.

According to MileSplit.com, the Mohigans are No. 21 in girls' cross-country and the Hawks are No. 22 in boys' cross-country.

"I've been on Mile Split for

years, checking out teams and seeing what it takes to earn a national ranking," MHS cross-country coach Mike Ryan said.

The website uses speed ratings and rates competitors within races from events around the country. From there, Mile Split comes up with a number that generates a score directly comparing times — some courses are faster, some courses are slower. The site also compares the competition teams and individuals are up against in their meets.

Mile Split uses those basic for-

mulas to come up with their national rankings.

"Those things just kind of pop up," UHS cross-country coach Ed Frohnapfel said. "It's a nice recognition and people that follow those sites will let you know about it. It's nice, I'm just not a stats person who follows that too closely. We just try to do the best we can with what we've got."

What the Hawks have is one of the best individual runners in the country. Josh Edwards, an Oregon commit, is No. 3 in the country individually, according to

Mile Split. He is a three-time state Gatorade runner of the year and he entered this cross-country season on the heels of a record-breaking performance in the 3200-meter run at the state track meet with a time of 8:52.82.

Edwards is only behind Gavin Sherry, of West Hartford, Conn., and Colin Sahlman, of Newbury Park, Calif., in the national rankings.

"He's maturing like all boys runners, especially when you come in as a talented freshman and grow in many ways through

the years," Frohnapfel said. "He's upped his workouts and increased his mileage — he's just such a hard worker."

"When you take natural ability with extreme work effort, you end up with a Josh Edwards."

Frohnapfel said Mile Split sees Edwards grabbing top results and headlines but also looks to his teammates and sees a strong group getting better with each race.

SOUTH BEND, Ind. (AP) — Desmond Ridder threw two touchdown passes and ran for score late in the fourth quarter as No. 7 Cincinnati capitalized on its big opportunity and beat No. 9 Notre Dame 24-13 Saturday in a game the Bearcats hope can be the centerpiece of College Football Playoff resume.

Cincinnati (4-0) wanted to use its first Top 10, regular-season matchup as a statement game, heading into its American Athletic Conference schedule. No team from outside the Power Five conferences has ever reached the playoff. Never even came close.

To break that barrier Bearcats almost certainly needs to go undefeated and this trip to the Notre Dame (4-1) stood as the toughest test on the schedule. Not to mention the biggest stage they'll appear on this season.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Brian Robinson Jr. rushed for career highs of 171 yards and four touchdowns, and

No. 1 Alabama mostly throttled the nation's top offense in a victory over No. 12 Mississippi.

Bryce Young passed for a couple of touchdowns for the Crimson Tide (5-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) but the 'Bama defense and ground game stole some of the thunder from a matchup of the two leading Heisman Trophy contenders coming into the game.

Robinson carried 36 times and picked up the first 100-yard game of his career.

(2) Georgia 37 (8) Arkansas 0

ATHENS, Ga. — Zamir White rushed for two touchdowns and recovered a blocked punt for another score, and No. 2 Georgia pounded No. 8 Arkansas.

Georgia (5-0, 3-0 Southeastern Conference) raced to a 21-0 lead in the first quarter despite playing without quarterback JT Daniels, who was held out with a right lat injury.

Stetson Bennett filled in for Daniels and passed for only 72 yards as the Bulldogs relied on their running game and top-rated defense to beat Arkansas.

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Spencer Rattler threw for 243 yards and two touchdowns, Oklahoma had two crucial calls overturned in its favor after video reviews, and the sixth-ranked Sooners recovered an onside kick with just over a minute left to hold off Kansas State 37-31 on Saturday.

Kennedy Brooks added 91 yards rushing and a touchdown, and Jeremiah Hall reached the end zone twice, as the Sooners (5-0, 2-0 Big 12) overcame a slew of penalties on their offensive line to beat the Wildcats for the first time in three tries.

Skylar Thompson returned from a knee injury to throw for 320 yards and three scores for the Wildcats (3-2, 0-2). Deuce Vaughn had 51 yards rushing to go with 10 catches for 104 yards and a score, and Malik Knowles returned a kick 93 yards for a touchdown with 1:20 remaining for the final margin.

Earlier in the second half, the Sooners twice had to sweat out video reviews.

The first came when Kansas State recovered an onside kick trailing 27-10 in the third quarter, and referee Kevin Hassell went to confirm the ball traveled 10 yards. It did, but the Sooners challenged the play again, contending kicker Ty Zentner had accidentally kicked the ball twice — which he also did. The illegal touching gave Oklahoma the ball.

The second review came after the Wildcats got the ball back trailing 27-17 in the fourth. Landry Weber was ruled to have caught a pass converting fourth down, but the ball had clearly hit the ground and another play was overturned.

Hall scored his second TD on a shovel pass a few minutes later to help Oklahoma put away the game.

Texas 32, TCU 27

FORT WORTH, Texas — Bijan Robinson ran for a career-high 216 yards with two go-ahead touchdowns and Texas won at TCU in the Longhorns' first Big 12 road game since accepting an invitation to join the Southeastern Conference.

Casey Thompson improved to 3-0 as starting quarterback for the Longhorns, even without them finding the end zone at the same blistering pace as in his first two starts. He was 12-of-22 passing for 142 yards with a touchdown and

an interception while under constant pressure and plagued by several drops.

TCU (2-2, 0-1) had three turnovers, matching their total for the first three games, though the Longhorns converted those into only three field

goals by Cameron Dicker.

The Longhorns (4-1, 2-0) have won their last three games since losing at former Southwest Conference rival Arkansas in Week 2. Texas will join the Razorbacks in the SEC no later than the 2025 season.

Pickett leads Pitt through the air in throttling of Georgia Tech

ATLANTA — Kenny Pickett passed for 389 yards and four touchdowns on Saturday, and Pittsburgh dominated Georgia Tech 52-21.

Pitt (4-1, 1-0 ACC) intercepted the first two passes by Georgia Tech quarterback Jeff Sims, with linebacker John Petrishen returning the second 33 yards for a touchdown to help the Panthers to a 42-14 lead by halftime.

Tech (2-3, 1-2) moved the ball effectively on a couple drives in the first half, but failed to convert any of its five third-down tries and misfired on two fourth downs in that time.

Pickett was methodical in completing 23-of-36 passes. On the season, he has passed for 19 touchdowns with just one interception.

Pitt has scored at least 41 points in each of its five games.

Florida State 33 Syracuse 30

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Ryan Fitzgerald made a 34-yard field-goal as time

Jordan Travis had runs of 33 and 25 on a drive in the final minute to set up a Fitzgerald's kick. Travis had 19 rushes for 113 yards for the Seminoles.

Travis completed 22 of 32 passes for 131 yards, including touchdown passes to Camren McDonald and Keyshawn Helton.

North Carolina 38, Duke 7

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. — Sam Howell threw for 321

yards and three touchdowns and North Carolina topped Duke 38-7 on Saturday, keeping hold of the coveted Victory Bell for a third straight year.

Howell connected with running back Ty Chandler down the sideline for a 75-yard score to open the scoring. Less than two minutes later, Kevin Hester hit Duke's Gunnar Holmberg as he was throwing, causing the ball to flutter out of his hand and Trey Morrison returned the fumble

63 yards for a touchdown.

Tennessee 62 Missouri 24

COLUMBIA, Mo. — Hendon Hooker threw for three touchdowns and ran for another as Tennessee routed Missouri, scoring touchdowns on its first six possessions.

Hooker completed 15 of 19 passes for 225 yards and rushed 14 times for 74 yards. He wasn't the only Volunteer who padded his stats against a beleaguered defense. Tiyon Evans rushed 15 times for 156 yards and three touchdowns. Tennessee (3-2, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) piled up 677 total yards and never punted.

USC 37, Colorado 14

BOULDER, Colo. — Kedron Slovis threw three touchdown passes and Southern California broke out of its doldrums with a rout of free-falling Colorado.

Slovis completed 19 of 29 throws for 276 yards and hit Drake London, Michael Trigg and Gary Bryant Jr. with scoring passes as the Trojans (3-2, 2-2 Pac-12)

bounced back in a big way from their first home loss to Oregon State in 61 years by rolling over a Buffaloes team whose offense remains stuck in neutral.

Brendon Lewis was held to 10-of-17 passing for 162 yards, was intercepted once and sacked five times. The Buffs converted just 1 of 10 third downs and failed on a fourth-down try.

Minnesota 20, Purdue 13

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. — Minnesota coach P.J. Fleck challenged his team to respond.

Did it ever.

Trey Potts scored the go-ahead touchdown 70 seconds into the third quarter and the Golden Gophers defense pitched a second-half shutout to hold on for a victory at Purdue.

It was just what the Gophers needed after last week's shocking loss at home to Bowling Green.

But Minnesota cleaned up those mistakes and took advantage of their opportunities at Ross-Ade Stadium — despite seeing the Boilermakers (3-2, 1-1) run 33 more plays and picking up 144 more yards.

Mountaineers dominate in 2-0 win over Oklahoma on Saturday at Dick Dlesk

The No. 12-ranked WVU women’s soccer team dominated possession and scored a pair of goals in the second half to tally a 2-0 win over Oklahoma, on Saturday afternoon at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Despite both teams going scoreless in the first half, freshman forward Dilary Heredia-Beltran earned the game winner just 20 minutes into the second period, off an assist from junior defender Gabrielle Robin-

son. Sophomore midfielder Lilly McCarthy added a second goal for the Mountaineers, while freshman forward Lisa Schöppl recorded her first points of the season, earning credit for the helper on McCarthy’s score.

“I thought the team really came together in the second half,” WVU coach Nikki Izzo-Brown said. “I thought everybody really recognized where we had to make some adjustments. We were able to find the win, and it was a big win for

us because Oklahoma has a very good side.”

The first half saw a lot of back-and-forth action from both teams, as only five total shots were recorded in the first 45 minutes. The Mountaineers’ biggest chance of the half came when a shot from junior forward/defender Julianne Vallerand drew the keeper away from the net, leaving the Sooners’ defense to make the team save. However, WVU couldn’t convert on the empty net opportunity, and the teams played

on. Despite WVU’s trio of corner kicks inside the final 20 minutes, the two teams went into the locker room knotted at 0-0.

In the second half, the West Virginia offense took control, dominating possession and making the Sooners defense fend of several Mountaineer opportunities. However, the Mountaineers continued to struggle to find the finish, despite forcing OU keeper Nikki Panas to make a pair of saves. WVU finally found the back of the net in the

64th minute when Robinson found Heredia-Beltran up the far side. The Wichita, Kansas, native weaved in and out of OU traffic, before sending a shot from just outside the box and into the goal.

From there, the Mountaineers seemed to find their rhythm, fending off any chance the Sooners had to take the ball to their attacking third. In the 76th minute, WVU got fancy in front of the net, passing the ball in and out of the penalty area. Eventually,

Schöppl found McCarthy at the top, who squared up and sent it in for the insurance score to give WVU the 2-0 victory.

With the victory, West Virginia improves to 12-0-1 in the series with the Sooners, as well as 34-4-2 all-time in home, Big 12 matches.

The Mountaineers travel to Manhattan, Kansas, for their first road test of the Big 12 season, as they take on Kansas State on Thursday. Kickoff at KSU’s Buser Family Park is tabbed for 8 p.m.

behind Severna Park (Md.). Edwards was the top overall finisher coming in with a blazing time of 15:11.40. Ryan is still giving the team a chance to experience the qualifying course this weekend at the Great American XC Festival in North Carolina.

Ryan said the best teams in the southeast took part, which will give the Mohigans a taste of top competition. But the rest of the field will need to watch out for the No. 21 team in the nation.

“This has been a really fun year,” Ryan said. “This is the first time a West Virginia girls team has been ranked in the top 25 nationally. I’m proud of what these girls have done so far: we have some running left to do so I’m excited to see us take another step forward.”

Former Mountaineers linebacker Darryl Talley has No. 90 retired

Considered one of the best defenders in WVU history, former linebacker Darryl Talley had his No. 90 retired Saturday between the 1st and 2nd quarters at Milan Puskar Stadium.

He joins Ira Errett Rodgers (21), Sam Huff (75) and Bruce Bosley (77) as current retired numbers, showcased in the north end zone. Major Harris will have his No. 9 retired later this season during the Oklahoma State game Nov. 6.

Talley played for the Mountaineers from 1978-82, helping bring in a new era, moving from Old Mountaineer Field to the new stadium in 1980, as well as helping coach Don Nehlen at the start of his tenure.

“The ‘77, ‘78 and ‘79 classes were the three years I think actually turned West Virginia into West Virginia, and those guys, we all put it on the line for each other and did what we had to do for each other,” Talley said.

He totaled 282 tackles, 202 assisted tackles, 28 tackles for loss and 19 sacks in his career, eventually being drafted No. 39 overall to the Buffalo Bills, where he had a 12-year NFL stint before ending his career with the Atlanta Falcons and Minnesota Vikings.

Known as a hard-nosed linebacker, Talley was an all-pro twice and was also named to two Pro Bowls. He played in four Super Bowls, though he never got the win.

He was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame in 1996 and

the College Football Hall of Fame in 2011.

“I’m just truly happy that I finally got to the summit of what it is in college and that’s what I consider this to be — the highest honor you can get,” Talley said. “And I’m just very proud of it.”

Current defensive lineman Akheem Mesidor wears No. 90 and will finish out his career with it, which head coach Neal Brown said is a stellar coincidence.

“I think its fitting that a guy that’s playing at an extremely high level will be the last one to wear 90 here,” Brown said. “Akheem is wearing it now and he’ll continue to wear it as he finishes up his career. I think Darryl would be pretty proud of how Akheem has played in that number so far this year.”

Wright’s decision

On the Mountaineers’ final drive with 18 seconds left after Texas Tech took a 23-20 lead, returner Winston Wright, who had several long returns this season including a touchdown vs. Long Island, took a knee at the 11-yard line.

In appeared to be an odd decision considering Wright’s ability, but Brown said there is a method to the madness.

“You don’t want to return that when it’s on the ground. Once it’s squibbed, you don’t have a really good chance to get it any further than the 30,” Brown said. “You take a knee there to save time. That’s the thought process, it’s a good play. You all can argue with me on other things but that’s a good play.”

the second half. If you want to be upset with all of us in the second half, fair.”

If the head coach opens the door to point fingers ... there were several instances Brown made questionable decisions, but it all started pregame before the game even kicked off.

Defensive tackle Dante Stills, wide receiver Isaiah Esdale, safety Sean Mahone and Brown himself said the energy level was dreadful during warmups, and that carried into the start of the game on offense and defense.

WVU had just four first half possessions, resulting in just 104 yards and no points, while Texas Tech scored on three of their

five possessions in the first two quarters.

“it caught me off guard. We practiced well Tuesday and Wednesday. That’s usually a good indicator,” Brown said. “We did not play well in the first half. That’s not going to be good enough. I told our team that, I told our staff that. It’s not going to be good enough.”

In-game decisions were also puzzling, especially calling two timeouts on first down in the red zone. On the first drive of the third quarter, the Mountaineers were humming on offense and got to the Texas Tech 4-yard line when backup QB Garrett Greene replaced Doege on 1st down.

Despite just coming in from the sideline, Greene didn’t have the play call and forced Brown to call a time-

out. Fortunately, running back Laddie Brown scored on the next play anyway.

Later, on the next to last possession, WVU was again putting together a strong drive to the TTU 12-yard line, but Brown again called a timeout on first down, leaving the Mountaineers with one.

On the Red Raiders’ final possessions where they ultimately kicked the game-winning field goal, WVU didn’t have the timeouts needed to stop the clock, so Tech was able to bleed it down to 18 seconds left.

“On the second one, we had the wrong personnel grouping, and that’s on me. You can blame me,” Brown said. “We had good plays, we should have scored a touchdown.”

And for the last error in judgement by Brown,

which he later admitted himself, was settling for a field goal to tie the game late rather than going for the touchdown on 4th and 4 from the Texas Tech 6.

Doege appeared to miss Laddie Brown open in the end zone on the play prior on 3rd down.

“I should have (gone for it),” Brown said. “When you look back, you always [question decisions]. That’s the one play.

You’re down by 3, so you’re rolling the dice, but the thought goes through your mind. We kicked a field goal and tied it. Then they went 80 yards on us. As a coach, you’re thinking that we’ve gotten after them other than the field goal in the second half. We had a really good kick, pinned them back to start

on the 11, but they hit the big play.”

Brown is now 0-3 against Texas Tech, and his counterpart for the Red Raiders Matt Wells has won just 12 games the last three years, coming in the same year as Brown in 2019.

Easy math says 25% of Wells’ wins have come against the Mountaineers.

With two road games next for WVU, the Mountaineers are staring 2-5 in the face. In Year 3, many are starting to doubt the climb, fair or not.

Adventure shows a rare encounter between mountain goat and grizzly

A recent post in a wildlife journal notes that a hiker in the Yoho National Park in British Columbia found a dead grizzly bear and a necropsy revealed the bear was killed by a mountain goat. They note that such an encounter is rare, and further research proved to me it is very rare. I've mentioned before that bowhunting has given me some great adventures and taken me to some far off places. In August of 2006 I ventured to Atlin, British Columbia to bowhunt for mountain goats.

These critters live in high mountains and often in very steep, inaccessible (by man) areas. Yes, such a bowhunt can be dangerous and one should not wait until they are 66 years of age to attempt it. However, I couldn't afford that hunt when younger so you just do what it takes to fulfill your dreams. I booked a 12-day bowhunt because I knew I couldn't climb those steep mountains every day. I figured I'd hunt one day and recuperate the next, however, the goats had other plans. I hiked up the mountain six hours the first day and harvested a dandy mountain goat. First day. I was thrilled. My guide and I were staying in a remote trapper's cabin on a large lake. We spent the next day capping out the skull, fishing, and resting around the cabin. During the late

afternoon I set up a spotting scope and found a grizzly and tow cubs on a far mountain. The guide did the same and soon we were watching something few people have ever seen. This sow grizzly

one seemed relatively unconcerned as the grizzly closed the gap. Finally the goat jumped up on a big flat rock and the grizzly circled him several times. Then the bear jumped up on the opposite end of that rock and the two faced each other. My guide was going crazy, noting that in all his years he'd never seen such a thing. Obviously this old West Virginia boy hadn't either. Then the billy actually charged the sow at close range, and appeared to butt her with his horns. Billy goats have two 7-10 spike-like horns they use to fight for the females during breeding season. They obviously use them to fight predators, as well. The sow quickly jumped off the rock and slowly returned to her yearlings and was later seen eating berries with them. As I mentioned, when I

got home I did some research on this kind of encounter. It seems that rarely the goat kills the bear and more often the bear kills the goat. My guide was 60 years old and guided in British Columbia for mountain goats for 40 years and had never seen such an encounter and never found dead animals indicating such an encounter. But they obviously happened and we just happened to be there with spotting scopes. Just another part of this hunt that made it one of my best adventures.

Packers, Steelers feature matchup of future Hall-of-Fame quarterbacks

GREEN BAY, Wis. — Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers and Pittsburgh's Ben Roethlisberger haven't faced off as starting quarterbacks since the Packers defeated the Steelers in the Super Bowl a decade ago. That finally changes Sunday when the Packers (2-1) host the Steelers (1-2) in just the third overall matchup between the two potential Hall of Famers. "It's the old cliché — everyone says it's the quarterbacks against each other, and then we'll say, 'No, we play against the defense,'" the 39-year-old Roethlisberger said. "But it's still an honor to share a stadium with one of the greatest and a guy that I admire, and a lot of people admire, that has just done it at such a high level for a long time. It's pretty cool to watch his mastery of the game." Although the Steelers have won two regular-season games with the Packers since that Super Bowl, Rodgers didn't play either time because separate collarbone injuries. Roethlis-

berger led the Steelers to a 38-31 victory in 2013 and a 31-28 triumph in 2017. Green Bay had Matt Flynn at quarterback for the 2013 game and Brett Hundley for the 2017 matchup. Rodgers' lone Super Bowl appearance was a 31-

The Steelers are the only NFL team Rodgers hasn't faced at Lambeau Field as a starting quarterback. "I remember the '09 game very well," the 37-year-old Rodgers said. We were pretty explosive on offense, hit Greg (Jennings) down the middle for I think it was an 85-yard touchdown (actually 83), then hit J.J. (James Jones) on a post late in that game to put us ahead, and then Big Ben took them down to beat us there right at the end. That was a good football game." The Steelers have won their past five regular-season meetings with the Packers, but enter Sunday's game in the AFC North cellar after losing at home to Las Vegas and Cincinnati the past two weeks. Pittsburgh is scoring 16.7 points per game to rank 28th out of 32 teams. "We understand where we are," Steelers coach Mike Tomlin said. "We don't want to be here. We don't like it, but forget about not liking it. What are you going to do about it?"

Talladega the host for unpredictable race with seven playoff spots available

TALLADEGA, Ala. — Denny Hamlin is already through to the third round of NASCAR's playoffs with nothing to worry about at Talladega Superspeedway. His championship rivals? Not so much. NASCAR's challenging second round of the playoffs — three wildly different circuits — moves Sunday to the behemoth 2.66-mile Alabama superspeedway where luck is as important as skill. The white-knuckled race falls between Las Vegas, a traditional 1.5-mile speedway where Hamlin won last week, and the twists and turns of the hybrid oval/road course at Charlotte Motor Speedway next week. The unpredictability expected this week and next has the 11 drivers vying for seven remaining playoff slots slightly on edge. "You can't freak out and try any harder because I'm already trying as hard as I can," said Alex Bowman, who narrowly raced his way through to the second round only for Las Vegas to drop him right back to 11th out of 12 in the standings. "We're not in a great spot and we're going to a place that's a huge wild card," he said. "We've just

got to wait and see how it shakes out. If it works out for us, it does. And if it doesn't, it doesn't." Hamlin, who automatically advanced to the third round with his Las Vegas victory, is the defending race winner, and Brad Keselowski scored his only win of the season at Talladega in April. Keselowski returns to the track only four points above the cutline, a mere two points separating him and teammate Joey Logano. "It is stressful because your whole season can be decided this weekend and

derby over the last couple of years," Harvick said. "It's one of those places where you want to race up front and race hard all day. ... I believe you have better odds at the front of the pack when it comes to staying out of a wreck if you can keep that track position all day. "You're going to race in a pack, three-wide at times, and you're going to get pushed and have to push at times. You just never know what's going to happen because Talladega is its own animal. It's hard to finish a race there." Ryan Blaney, a two-time Talladega winner who is above the cutline alongside his Team Penske teammates Keselowski and Logano, said drivers need the same mindset for this playoff race as any other event. "You have to be aware that you can get wiped out and it's none of your doing. We've all been there. You're just minding your own business and you get blindsided and you're destroyed the next thing you know," Blaney said. "But you can't let that eat at you. You've just got to say, 'Let's focus and let's do these things like we know how to do them, and go racing.'"

Hydrogen is not always clean energy

If we have any complaints about the still-pending (as of this writing) bipartisan infrastructure package, it would be the \$8 billion Sen. Joe Manchin slipped in there for blue hydrogen energy.

Hydrogen can and should be part of our energy future, but when we talk about hydrogen-based energy, we need to distinguish between blue hydrogen and green hydrogen.

Blue hydrogen is made from natural gas, but it's touted as producing fewer emissions than regular hydrogen energy production. Blue hydrogen uses an energy-intensive process that uses steam, high heat and pressure to break down methane into hydrogen and carbon monoxide, paired with carbon capture (catching carbon before it can enter the atmosphere and storing it underground). The energy needed to fuel this process? Provided by more fossil fuels.

According to the peer-reviewed study "How green is blue hydrogen?": "Far from being low carbon, greenhouse gas emissions from the production of blue hydrogen are quite high, particularly due to the release of fugitive methane. ... [T]he greenhouse gas footprint of blue hydrogen is more than 20% greater than burning natural gas or coal for heat" based on the study's default parameters.

Green hydrogen, on the other hand, is made from water and powered by renewable energy. Using electricity, water is broken down into hydrogen and oxygen.

Green hydrogen is obviously the better option. The problem? At the moment, green hydrogen isn't a feasible large-scale solution.

The first stumbling block: As reported by The New York Times, "In most places, there simply isn't enough renewable energy to produce vast amounts of green hydrogen." As America finally starts investing in widespread renewable energy systems, we will hopefully see that change.

The second stumbling block: The device used to create green hydrogen doesn't last very long. And this is where Manchin could have — and should have — thrown West Virginia a bone. Researchers at WVU are working on solving that problem right now.

The device in question is a solid oxide electrolysis cell. The cathode materials connected to the cell are susceptible to chromium poisoning, which can negatively affect the cell's output or even block the pathways through which the oxygen diffuses, according to a study from the University of Birmingham.

As we reported this past Monday, WVU's Wenyan Li, Xingbo Liu and Edward Sabolsky are working on making solid oxide electrolysis cells a commercially viable option — which in turn makes green hydrogen a viable large-scale solution to reduce carbon emissions.

Instead of throwing yet more money at the fossil fuel industry (which Manchin still profits from), Manchin and his colleagues should be providing funding for research and development like that taking place at WVU on green hydrogen. If he had done that, rather than slating \$8 billion for high-carbon blue hydrogen, Manchin could have supported West Virginia *and* the fight against climate change.

Sorry, that's a rhetorical question, because everyone knows the answer: Of course it's "no." DeJoy is about to prove it once again by mandating crummier service on first-class mail and hiking prices on your packages.

As of Friday, the U.S. Postal Service is giving itself extra time to deliver letters longer distances than can be reached by a six-hour drive.

Instead of the previous standard, which called for first-class mail to reach its destination in a maximum of three days regardless of the distance, the maximum will be five days. Obviously, that would apply to a letter sent, say, from New York to Los Angeles. The change started Oct. 1.

The USPS is also raising prices on domestic parcels by anywhere from 25 cents to \$5, depending on the packages' distance and weight. The service says the price increase is "temporary," starting today and remaining in effect through the holiday season, ending Dec. 26. The increases can come to 10% or more.

In an absurd example of corporate-speak, the Postal Service describes the aim of reducing delivery standards as improving "delivery reliability, consistency, and efficiency." As USPS spokeswoman Kim Frum put it: "With this change, we

will improve service reliability and predictability for customers while also driving efficiencies across the Postal Service network."

Let's be clear about this. Increasing the time you have to wait to receive a letter isn't an improvement in reliability or efficiency, but just the opposite. As for "consistency," the service's strategy is perfectly analogous to what airlines do when their on-time flight performance deteriorates: They increase the standard for "on time," and presto! Every flight is on time again.

Consistently bad performance is consistent all right, but that doesn't make it something to brag about. The Postal Service said the changes would leave 61% of first-class mail volume unaffected, as if that were all to the good. The math indicates,

however, that fully 39% would take longer to reach its destination.

A USPS spokeswoman called the old three-day standard "unattainable," but that's so only because the service doesn't choose to meet it. Doing so would require the service to "rely on air transportation, yielding unreliable service," she told USA Today. She didn't explain why air service is inherently more unreliable than trucking mail across country or sending it by train.

The Postal Service's complacency in the face of deteriorating performance must be blamed on DeJoy, whose appointment was orchestrated in May 2019 by a Trump-controlled USPS board of governors.

He was the first postmaster general in two decades not to have any experience with the service. On the other hand, he had been a major fundraiser for the Trump campaign. Insiders related how DeJoy's name had been inserted into the short list for postmaster candidates seemingly out of nowhere.

Questioned by congressional committees about noticeable declines in service on his watch, DeJoy, a former executive of a private logistics company, truculently defended his intention to make the service operate more like a business than a government agency.

To that end, he oversaw a 10-year strategic plan designed to narrow the service's deficit the way a strug-

W.Va. has the right election formula

WEST VIRGINIA SHOULD BE PROUD OF HOW WELL IT PERFORMED DURING THE 2020 ELECTION.

When confronted with the challenges of the pandemic, Gov. Jim Justice and Secretary of State Mac Warner acted quickly to ensure that West Virginians would have full and secure access to the ballot. And, given all the strife around the country surrounding the 2020 election, the other 49 states would do well to consider the West Virginia way of doing things.

As Secretary Warner put it, "West Virginia offered more ways to cast a secure ballot than any other state." Indeed, more than 802,000 West Virginians voted — the second-highest in state history. As Warner said: "[W]e held one of the best, and safest, elections in the United States, and in the history of West Virginia." Indeed. There was no question about the result; the counts were accurately recorded and reported on election night. What a success!

Unfortunately, not all the other states did as well as West Virginia. There was confusion about mail-in ballots and concerns about fraud. Many states took a long time to count votes. Election integrity is an ongoing worry. But, if the states are laboratories of democracy the results are in: Mountaineers have the right formula. So, why keep it to ourselves? Enter Sen. Joe Manchin, who has crafted a bill that establishes smart national standards based on the West Virginia law that has worked so well here.

The Freedom to Vote Act creates automatic online voter registration guidelines, early voting periods, firm voter roll maintenance requirements, and protects military ballots. Perhaps most importantly, the Manchin bill includes voter identification standards for in-person voting — an unprecedented Democratic compromise on this issue.

The bill creates basic mail-in voting standards, a system that is essential for those who cannot make it to the polls because of work, medical, or family obligations. It also requires states to maintain paper records in case an audit is necessary. To fund those changes, Manchin spearheaded a new State Election and Innovation Fund that provides grants for state election officials so that county clerks have the resources they need.

Some critics have mistakenly described these measures as some kind of federal takeover of West Virginia elections. Not true. All this plan does is clarify and streamline some of the basic things all Americans can expect when it comes to voting. Besides, Article 1, Section 4 of the Constitution clearly grants Congress a role in writing election laws.

Without this kind of baseline, partisan actors in major swing states could implement lax voting laws that are weak and unreliable. West Virginians certainly have an interest in making sure other states run national elections that are as good as ours. Otherwise, it would be too easy to have our voices drowned out on the national level.

Manchin was right to join Republicans in opposing HR 1, which was the Democrats' original election reform bill and

gling private business would — by stretching out mail delivery deadlines, raising postal rates (perhaps steeply), cutting back on post office hours and closing branches.

The changes in standards and rates that DeJoy is implementing in the next few days come right out of that strategic plan. The changes are expected to save about \$170 million a year, or about two tenths of a percent of its operating budget of more than \$82 billion. But they will have significant impacts on many postal customers.

DeJoy’s actions are somewhat subject to the independent, five-member Postal Regulatory Commission, which has limited powers to block service changes. The commission, which has a 3-2 Democratic majority, issued a critical analysis of the changes this past Wednesday.

The analysis said that DeJoy’s estimate of cost savings from the changes seemed inflated and that they could “diminish its reliability.” The commission said it doubted the USPS could even manage the changes it was implementing, and recommended that they be delayed. The betting here is that DeJoy won’t pay the recommendation any attention.

It should go without saying that the USPS is not a business, but a public service. It’s true that its traditional standards can’t be profitable in customary business terms. It’s expected to deliver letters anywhere in the United States for the same flat fee, whether it’s traveling across town or coast-to-coast.

With few exceptions, its carriers are expected to reach every household. In return, it’s endowed with an effective monopoly on first-class mail. Its postmarks can legally serve as documentation of when an item was mailed, whether a postcard or a ballot.

It’s true that the service’s revenues have come under pressure as letter mail gives way to electronic communications, and banks and retailers move away from mailing account statements and bills to customers in favor of dealing with them online.

But it’s well-known that the biggest single burden on the service’s bottom line is a 2006 congressional mandate that it prefund its retiree health care liability, which no other government agency and few private businesses do. (Most fund those obligations on a pay-as-you-go basis.)

Absent that mandate, the Institute for Policy Studies calculated in 2019, the USPS would have consistently reported operating profits instead of losses. DeJoy has acknowledged the burden of the prefunding mandate, the repeal of which would require congressional action. But his treating congressional committees as troublesome busybodies wasting his time with their questions doesn’t make him a very suitable advocate for that change.

It’s also true that DeJoy doesn’t serve at the president’s pleasure, but rather that of the nine-member USPS board of governors.

At the moment, the board is split 6-3 with Trump appointees in the majority, but one of those Trump appointees is a holdover member whose term ended last year, and the term of another expires in December and two more in December 2022. That means that Biden can have a majority by the end of this year.

Nothing is keeping the present board from canning DeJoy right now, anyway.


To beat the opioid crisis, lift people out of poverty

WHAT IS THE BEST THING WE CAN DO TO ADDRESS THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC? I’ve been asked this question countless times. The best answer that I have is that it’s never only one thing, but the many things that stand to make a difference. One often overlooked strategy is to provide resources and support for at-risk low-income families.

In 2019, there were 70,000 West Virginian children living in poverty. Growing up in poverty is stressful and families that struggle economically often cannot meet their children’s basic needs for safe shelter and access to healthy foods. Children living in poverty may encounter more stressful life events and have an increased risk of experiencing adversities or trauma that can have lasting impacts on their health. At times these adversities can be character building, but in the context of poverty, children may become less resilient. The more adverse events that children endure, the higher the likelihood that drug use and mental illness occur. The COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated the challenges faced by low-income families in West Virginia; nearly a quarter of West Virginia parents report feeling down, helpless or blue.

Too many West Virginia families have already lost a loved one to overdose, and our child welfare system simply cannot adequately care for the thousands of children impacted by parental addiction. As our state has increased access

to evidence-based treatment for parents with substance use disorders, expanded resources for low-income families and reduced childhood poverty will be critical to the prevention of multigenerational drug addiction.

The Build Back Better budget proposal currently making its way through Congress contains many components that will help low-income families. One of the most significant pieces of this legislation is seeing that the recent

enhancements to the Child Tax Credit are made permanent and fully refundable. Columbia University researchers estimated that after the first CTC payment went out to families in July, there was an immediate 25% increase in the number of families reporting that they had enough food to eat. Recent data from the West Virginia Center on Budget and Policy has demonstrated that West Virginia families are spending their CTC on household

essentials including food, utilities and clothing. WVCBP estimates that if all eligible families access the CTC, then nearly 50,000 West Virginia children would no longer live in poverty.

Sen. Joe Manchin has recently expressed his hesitation to support this proposal, referencing a number of concerns relating both to its potential to discourage self-reliance and the bill’s inability to weed out the undeserving.

It is my sincere hope that what will inspire Sen. Manchin to act now, as it has so many times in the past, is that no one is more deserving than a child in poverty.

Addressing the opioid epidemic has been a chief priority for Sen. Manchin during his time in public office. One of the greatest contributions he can make to it now is to give his full and energetic support of the Build Back Better agenda and its robust anti-poverty policies.

The strength of our communities is inseparable from the wellbeing and resiliency of our children. We have the means now through policy to truly reduce childhood poverty in our state and across the nation. In doing so, we will give families the resources they need to raise healthy children and allow them to lift themselves above the despair caused by poverty.

Pandemic spurs popularity of nonprofit's retail stores

SEATTLE — It's a Tuesday afternoon, and a steady stream of vehicles is pulling up to the donation station at the Goodwill in Renton, Wash. Employees in fluorescent vests dash back and forth, offloading the day's haul: garbage bags bulging with clothes, a fishing net big enough for a 20-pound Chinook salmon, two plastic crates crammed with half-used bottles of hand lotion and shampoo, a small rototiller, a bathmat and DVD player in a paper sack, a black lacquered chest of drawers.

The pace of donations has been good this summer, averaging about 1,600 a week, said store manager Lisa Wojtech, who is watching her crew stack goods in blue bins, then shuttle them inside for sorting. It's not overwhelming like last year, when millions of people stuck at home by the pandemic decided to weed out their possessions, and Goodwills across the country were swamped.

When stores and donation centers were shuttered in early 2020, many people just dumped their castoffs outside and drove away. "It was horrendous," said Wojtech, who had to call in staff to clean up the mess. The real stampede in donations began the moment sites reopened. At Seattle's flagship complex near the intersection of interstates 5 and 90 — the world's largest Goodwill store by area — cars backed up almost to the stadiums in Sodo.

For a charitable organization that leverages society's discards to provide free job training and education for some of western Washington's most disadvantaged residents, it wasn't a bad problem to have. By packing warehouses to the rafters and renting storage space, Evergreen Goodwill of Northwest Washington — a regional affiliate with 24 stores from Bellingham to Ballard — was able to absorb the deluge.

If anything, the pent-up demand to drop off donations underscored how much we depend on Goodwill to help with the mind-boggling amount of stuff we dispose of every year. If Goodwill didn't exist, communities would need to invent it, said Adam Minter, journalist and

author of the 2019 book "Secondhand: Travels in the New Global Garage Sale."

"It provides an essential service. And the proof of that is how it's become the Kleenex of 'secondhand.' You don't say: 'I'm going to take things to the thrift store.' You say: 'I'm going to take this stuff to Goodwill.'"

The nonprofit's retail stores are enjoying a surge in popularity driven partly by the economic toll of the pandemic and partly by a new consciousness among younger people, said Evergreen CEO Daryl Campbell.

"They're very discerning about where they spend their money — and social values, environmental values, sustainability are increasingly important."

Goodwill Industries International's 156 North American affiliates and 3,300 stores collectively divert about 4.6 billion pounds of reusable goods from landfills every year. That's more than any organization — but still only about 6% of the textiles, furniture and other durable goods Americans toss out annually. The average for Evergreen Goodwill (the name recently was changed from Seattle Goodwill)

is about 120 million pounds a year sold or recycled.

Most people experience Goodwill only as a place to shop or drop off those boxes of goodies from Grandma's basement. Behind the scenes, though, is a sophisticated operation designed to extract the maximum value from every donation. That includes using e-commerce for collectibles and other prime merchandise and tapping into global markets to sell goods that local shoppers spurn.

But the business model the charity has relied on since its founding in 1902 also faces challenges on multiple fronts.

The quality of new merchandise has been falling for decades — which Minter singles out as perhaps the greatest threat to the secondhand economy. China is now the fastest-growing exporter of used clothing and soon could dominate international markets. Online consignment sites such as thredUP and Poshmark are also exploding in popularity, diverting the "good stuff" that Goodwill covets.

The nonprofit's biggest advantage lies in its ubiquity and expertise at finding markets for goods that others would toss in the

trash, Minter said. "Goodwill can do that at a relatively low cost because they have so much volume, and they can do it in a way nobody else can."

The process starts at the curb, Wojtech, the store manager, explains.

Workers plug in televisions, computers, microwaves and other large electronics and separate the duds to be sold as scrap metal or to authorized recyclers for about 11 cents a pound.

Things that are clearly unusable, like moldy clothes, broken furniture, bags of actual garbage — yes, it happens — are shuttled straight to the Dumpster.

When something especially cool is dropped off, staff members alert Wojtech and debate the price. "They get excited," she said. "It's like Christmas every day, and you never know what you're going to get." Recent thrills include an antique dresser (\$79.99) and an electric bike (\$350).

Wojtech steps inside the bay doors and into a scene of nonstop activity. One team sorts the loot by type: toys, small electronics, housewares, books, shoes, accessories and the category that

accounts for the lion's share of Goodwill's revenue: clothing.

Then the specialists take over. At stations devoted to one category, sorters with an eye for quality pick what they think will sell and set the prices.

Alicia Ross is at the shoes and accessories station, working her way through racks of overflowing blue bins. She's been at Goodwill for seven years and knows a good pair of shoes when she sees it. If she doesn't recognize a brand, she can refer to a list taped to her workbench that includes Keds on the low end and Gucci on the designer side. Prices range accordingly, from \$2.99 to \$49.99.

"You're going on style, quality, condition," Ross said.

The bar is high for the retail sales floor. Anything broken, scuffed, torn, worn-looking or stained goes into a big cardboard box destined for Evergreen's two outlet stores.

Ross fishes a brown leather purse out of the reject box and pulls out the lining to reveal a big blue blotch.

"People don't want a purse with a huge ink stain inside," she says, tossing it back.

Outlet-bound rejects at other stations include a Cuisinart coffee maker encrusted with years' worth of residue, frayed shirts, a Mickey Mouse doll with stuffing bulging out of its back, a clear plastic platter with a crack through the middle and an endless array of three-ring binders.

Ross loads merchandise that makes the cut into what she calls her "shiny" cart and wheels it onto the sales floor, where it's not uncommon for customers to start grabbing things before she can even unload.

Across the aisle from Ross' station is a pile of potential treasures for online sales. While it's still possible to find gems at bauble prices on the store shelves, Goodwill has become much savvier about marketing vintage, collectible and high-end items.

Brent Frerichs, vice president of e-commerce, retail and donations strategy, is visiting the Renton store and pulls out his phone to check Evergreen's listings on eBay, Amazon and shopgoodwill.com.

"We have over 14,000 items active online," he said. And that

A new season and a visit to the botanic garden

SOMETIMES, AS I TURN the page of my calendar, I wonder how a month could have whizzed by almost without notice. The signs of coming winter are all around us, if we care to look.

How the ambiance of outdoor dining changed over the seasons! Spring mornings found birds busy with their nest-building, chattering and singing as they worked. The air was alive with their activity. Squirrels entertained us with their acrobatics at the feeders. Summer brought a quieter time, a time of satisfaction and satiation. The small creatures who share our backyard were still with us, still active, but the pace was slower. The activity at the large wall feeder seemed more like a jumble sale, with everyone pushing and squawking, each trying to get a better position. As we sipped our morning coffee and watched the flurry at the feeders, an

abundance of bright flowers bloomed in the background. Full-leaved trees rustled in a gentle breeze.

Now in October, breakfast is taken in the kitchen. When we do sit out on the patio later in the day, the change is noticeable. Birds empty our feeders much more quickly. Squirrels gather nuts that fall from the trees and they hang upside down from the round feeder, determined to grab as many seeds as possible. Leaves cover the patio floor and many of the flowers have gone to seed.

Yesterday, we decided to visit the West Virginia Botanic Garden. We had talked about doing this all summer, but time got away from us. With Pierre bouncing around on the back seat we set off on a breezy, sun-warmed morning. The paths in the botanic garden are cleverly designed to lead walkers around wetlands, woodlands, a fairy garden, a butterfly garden and much more. Since we had waited so late to finally visit the WVBG, most of the summer flowers and flowering bushes had lost their blooms.

Even so, it was delightful to walk through fern-filled woods, over running streams, surrounded by nature that seemed untouched by the hand of man. Surely a spring and summer visit to the garden would be breathtaking, yet the untouched nature that surrounded us as we walked the trails held us spellbound.

Of course, Pierre had a great time, smelling new smells, poking his nose into holes in the ground, not knowing what might jump out at him from those holes. Our stroll through the garden took almost two hours, the trails twisting and turning, leading us ever onward. There are benches placed here and there on the trails and we took advantage of some of these to rest and try to figure out where we were on the map. Pierre would lie panting beside the bench, tired but ever eager to see what was around the next bend. Back at the parking lot, we gave Pierre a long drink, then set off for home, promising each other we would return to the WVBG in the spring and mid-summer. Filled with sunshine and fresh air, we talked of fall and the coming winter. Both bring their own delights: time to read and rest, hearty meals and cozy evenings in front of a fire.

doesn't include nearly 120,000 books, DVDs and CDs.

Today's Renton stash includes snakeskin cowboy boots, gold-rimmed demitasse cups, vintage Air Jordans, an etched glassybaby candle holder and a full set of antique Limoges china. In-house experts estimate values, post the offerings and track bidding.

The average online sale is about \$35, but every manager hopes for the kind of hidden gem that was dropped off at a Portland Goodwill in 2006. That small watercolor by American impressionist Frank Weston Benson sold for a record-setting \$165,000. That record was shattered in August, when a 1987 factory-sealed copy of the Nintendo game "The Legend of Zelda" donated in Connecticut sold for \$411,278.

Wojtech's best performers have been an oil painting and a blue mink coat that both went for around \$5,000.

Like many at Goodwill, she's a veteran of for-profit retail, including JCPenney. But she wanted work with more meaning. "You know what you're doing here is making a difference," she said, threading her way through carts and bins to the rear of the processing area.

About 4,000 new products are rolled out every day at the Renton store. Each gets a color-coded tag and a four-week life span on the floor. As the clock ticks down, the items are increasingly discounted. Customers purchase about 58% of the goods stocked in Evergreen stores, which is much higher than the 30% Minter estimates nationwide.

The rest, Wojtech said, is "ragged off" — pulled and packed for the outlet. She points out stacks of appliance-size boxes on the loading dock awaiting pickup. What happens when those boxes arrive at the outlet is perhaps the most surprising — and least understood — part of Goodwill's operations.

A line every morning outside Evergreen's Sodo outlet store. Some customers sleep in their cars to be the first through the doors.

"A lot of them are regulars," said Hamilton Lardizabal, who started 17 years ago as a sorter and now manages the 106,000-square-foot facility. He was here when local rapper Macklemore filmed a video segment for his 2013 hit "Thrift Shop."

On a recent afternoon, double rows of what look like elevated troughs are arrayed across the cavernous sales floor, each flanked by people picking through the contents. The 6-foot-long bins are heaped with "soft" goods, like clothing, blankets, purses and belts, or "hard" things, like baskets, cutlery, jigsaw puzzles and wooden bowls.

The commingled merchandise is sold by the pound: \$1.79 for soft, \$1.09 for hard. A pound of books goes for 49 cents.

Each batch sits on the floor for about an hour, then it's wheeled away and replaced by another set of brimming bins.

The regulars are mostly resellers, Lardizabal said. Some have their own shops or online storefronts. Others send clothing back to their home countries or gather merchandise for consolidators.

But when the bins' time on the outlet floor is up, they're still far from empty. What remains is called salvage. It is Goodwill's final opportunity to extract value, avoid the cost of disposal, and find a new life for millions and millions of reusable items.

"Pretty much everything is pennies on the pound," Frerichs said. "But there's still some revenue that can be made, as opposed to putting it in the landfill."

Salvage is essentially a global commodities market, he said, as workers begin picking through the bins for the items somebody will pay for: hard toys, soft toys, backpacks, luggage, accessories. Scrap metals fetch about 1.25 cents a pound. Five cents buys a pound of balls — basketball, football, soccer. But as in the retail store, the real money is in clothing.

In the middle of the warehouse, workers feed garments and other textiles into balers, which spit out 1,000-pound cubes of trussed-up bras, sleeping bags, jeans, pillows and T-shirts by the hundreds.

Dealers like Seattle-based Buffalo Export LLC pay roughly 27 cents a pound for the bales, which are loaded into shipping containers. The Sodo outlet usually fills five containers a week, bringing in about \$55,000.

A fifth-generation family business, Buffalo Export buys from multiple thrift-store chains, shipping hundreds of containers a month, said Vice President Anthony Benezra. Most of the shipments are destined for Pakistan, Africa, and South and Central America.

For his book, Minter followed the trail of secondhand clothes, visiting dealers in Ontario, Pakistan and the West African nation of Benin who sort the contents of the bales for specific markets. Stylish clothes sell well in Africa, for example, but not winter coats. Up to a third of salvage textiles is turned into rags or furniture stuffing.

Americans might cringe at the idea of their castoffs being peddled in impoverished villages around the world, because secondhand clothing from wealthy countries has been blamed for the collapse of Africa's textile industries. But suggest the major factors were privatization of government-owned textile companies and trade policies that opened African nations to the type of Asian competition that undermined the United States' own textile manufacturers.

Minter's travels and research convinced him the global trade in secondhand

goods is something to celebrate. Reusing products benefits the environment and people who can't afford to buy new, he said.

Today in Africa, imported used clothing from Goodwill and other thrift stores mainly competes with imported new clothing from China. And many Africans prefer the secondhand garments because they are often higher-quality, Minter found.

"When activists in the West complain about secondhand clothing going into Africa, they're essentially asking people in Africa to pay more for their clothing and generally have lower quality," he said. "It's a very odd argument."

After the bins at the outlet have been picked clean of salvage materials, what's left is trash. Among the thousands of items at the end of the line this afternoon are a vacuum cleaner hose, a single flip-flop, dozens of photo albums, a paint-by-numbers scene of Venice, a dog collar and a clown face-painting kit.

In 2019, Evergreen received about 143 million pounds of donated goods. Of that, only about 15% wound up at the landfill — but the costs are significant. As dumping fees and donations increased over the past decade, the organization's annual garbage bill has nearly doubled to almost \$3 million.

Goodwill's leadership would much prefer to spend that money on its programs, which operate on about \$12 million a year. But they are reluctant to discourage donations of any kind.

"What I would say to potential donors is: 'Bring us everything, because no one is going to get more value out of it than Goodwill,'" said Campbell, the CEO.

With its focus on jobs programs, the organization has rarely touted its environmental impact, but that's something Campbell is working to change. "It's important, and it's a story we haven't told as well as we could."

He and his colleagues are also thinking about the nonprofit's next century as the 100th anniversary of Seattle's first store, which opened in 1923, approaches.

One top priority is to counter the competition from online thrift stores. Among the options they're exploring in collaboration with other affiliates is a new Goodwill website with set prices, rather than an auction format.

What can Goodwill offer that thredUP and Poshmark can't?

The opportunity to do good with your purchases.

"I think the pandemic has caused a lot of us to take stock of what's really important, what's really valuable to us," Campbell said. "If a business is clearly contributing to the community, I think that's going to be the distinguishing factor."

Children should have an eye exam earlier than many parents think

Q: My 2-year-old seems to have some hand-eye coordination issues, but otherwise is healthy and normal. Should I be concerned, and where to begin?

A: Mothers are every day asking us, “When should my kids have their first real eye exam?” It does seem to be a well-hidden secret, but in reality the answer and reasons are simple — by age 1.

Infants do not have normal, clear distance vision at birth. But by about 9 months, vision should be about normal. Ideally, we

would like to see every child between 6-12 months of age.

It is true that the “screenings” done in non-eye care offices are beneficial. However, they are very limited compared to what we do in the eye care clinic. We will assess

not only vision clarity in each eye, but also how the eyes work together for accurate alignment and focusing.

Please realize that scientists say about 50% of what we need to know in life is learned in the first year of life. About 25% more basic skills for life are learned in our second year of life. Clear and accurate vision is essential to establish this foundation for normal learning and behavior.

Unfortunately, but true, is that one in 30 babies will develop “lazy eye” or amblyopia, while one in

25 will develop eye muscle imbalance and cannot use both eyes together as a team. One in 33 will have significant vision blur like nearsightedness, farsightedness or astigmatism. One in 100 will have an eye disease. Even retinal malignancies like retinoblastoma, which are rare, will develop in one in 20,000 children.

Even healthy vision problems are generally more permanent than you may think. Parents and other providers too often mistakenly hope or believe that the child will eventually outgrow a vision dis-

order. At 3, this is very unlikely.

My advice: Schedule your 1-year-olds, and older, with an eye doctor who genuinely includes pediatric care as a priority. In fact, the American Optometric Association has for years offered a program of free eye exams for infants called InfantSEE. This free service is excellent and generally offered only by optometric physicians who truly enjoy caring for the little ones.

Schedule your pre-school age children for a comprehensive optometric exam. For those in school,

some of us prefer to let them begin the new year and to see them in the fall after you have some observations about their reading and learning skills to report. And for the little ones, do not let cost be a barrier. Find a nearby doctor of optometry who participates in the InfantSee program online at infantsee.org. Be sure your children have the visual learning tools they need to succeed in life and school.

EX-ETIQUETTE

Stop trying to control parents' relationship with ex

Q. Why would my ex-wife continue to have a relationship with my in-laws after four years of being divorced? I understand we have kids, but it's beginning to be troublesome now that I'm in a serious relationship and thinking about getting married again. What's good ex-etiquette?

A. It sounds like intellectually you understand why she's staying in contact — they are your children's grandparents — but you don't really like it because it cramps your style now that you have a serious relationship. But these relationships are not

about you.

If, following the rules of good ex-etiquette, we put the children first (Ex-etiquette for Parents Rule No. 1), then she's supporting the children's relationship with their grandparents — and the thing that many of us don't like to admit? They continue to be your children's grandparents even when we are not around. Therefore, when there is a special occasion or a milestone when the kids are scheduled to be with her, she probably invites them. That relationship was cultivated when you were together. Now that you are

no longer together, you want to cultivate a similar relationship with your new partner.

The key here is to stop comparing and trying to control the situation. Your parents are big people and can make the choice themselves. If your new partner is feeling threatened, that's a red flag. A relationship with you will not be like a first-time relationship. You have a past, and kids, and your life didn't start when you met your new partner. Anyone you meet will have to understand that she has an opportunity to make a wonderful life with you,

and that life includes past relationships that may gum up the works a little — but that's who you are. Those relationships began before you met.

An important tip that may be helpful? Stop comparing. Let the relationships fall where they may. Just as your relationship is different with every child, your parents' relationship is also different with every child they have. If you have a sibling, I will venture to think they love you both, but see the differences in you two. It's the same with new partners. If both are kind, both are respectful, and most

importantly, your parents can see your new partner is supportive of you and doesn't put you or them in awkward positions, your parents will care for both — not necessarily one more than the other, but differently.

This is often a problem for new partners who see themselves as the true and real partner and the one who should be respected as such. That's either-or mentality, and it complicates your life when you are with someone who had children before you got there.

For this reason, good ex-etiquette reinforces an inclusive approach. You

will be married twice; your parents and your ex want to maintain a relationship. There's no reason why your new partner and you can't cultivate a loving, positive relationship with your parents and leave the past to them to maintain.

If it makes you uncomfortable, you can always have two birthday parties, two Christmases, two everything. The final question is, always, are you doing that to make your life easier or for the kids? If the answer is “for the kids,” that's good ex-etiquette.

Twenty-six bids later and this box has a home

HAND-DECORATED storage boxes were important for storage in the 18th century when there were few places, other than shelves, to store small personal items. Collectors today treasure the work of the Bucher family in Berks County, Pennsylvania, made from about 1750 to 1800. There are memorials with dates ranging from 1792 to 1876 with Heinrich, the father's name.

Heinrich Bucher, and eventually his sons, made and sold bentwood boxes decorated with yellow, green, red and white trees, tulips and other foliage on a black background. The boxes sell today for thousands of dollars. This box sold in a Conestoga auction for \$4,260 after 26 bids. It had been estimated at only \$1,000.

Q We bought a four-piece dresser set at a consignment shop for \$15. There is a powder box with a lid, a hair receiver, a small tray and a large tray. All four pieces seem to match. Three are marked "T & V Limoges, France." One is only marked "A.L. Minaud." There is a small chip on the edge of the powder jar lid. Can you tell me more about this set and an approximate value?

A: Your dresser set was made by Tressemanes & Vogt, a company in business in Limoges, France, from 1891 to 1907. Emilien Tressemanes and Gustave Vogt bought two small porcelain factories in 1891 and began making white porcelain for export to the United States. China painting was a popular hobby in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Amateur painters bought undecorated porcelain dishes and dresser sets and painted them with flowers or other designs. After Tressemanes retired in 1907, Vogt renamed the company Porcelaine Gustave Vogt. He sold the company to Martial Raynaud in 1919. A.L. Minaud is the artist's name. Dresser sets can be found with a variety


of pieces. In addition to the pieces you have, some sets include a hatpin holder, pillbox, trinket dish, small bowl, comb and brush, mirror or candleholder. Your four-piece dresser set might sell for \$80 to \$100 or more.

Q: I'm trying to downsize so my children aren't saddled with "things." I'd like to sell a large, framed photo taken of my grandfather's battalion at the Mexican border during the Spanish-American War. It pictures all the men, covered wagons, and a train in the background.

A: The Spanish-American War only lasted for 10 weeks, from April 21 to Aug. 13, 1898. It was fought between Spain and the United States, and took place during the Cuban War of Independence. Theodore Roosevelt, who was Assistant Secretary of the Navy, resigned his position and joined the fight. He led his Rough Riders in the battle to capture San Juan Hill. Unless the photo pictures an important person or a unique event, it may be worth only a few dollars. Pictures of Roosevelt, African American troops, and the hanging of a prisoner of war have sold for a few hundred dollars. Contact a nearby auction house that sells photographs to see if there is any interest in your photograph.

Q: I recently came across an old copy of "People's Home Journal" dated August 1923. It sold for 15 cents. It's in good condition. Is there any value to this magazine? If so, is there someone I can contact?

A: "People's Home Journal" was published by F.M.

Lupton of New York from 1885 to 1929. The magazine had about a million subscribers and included recipes, household hints and short stories. Most issues sell online for \$10 to \$15, some for a few dollars more. Condition and desirability of the cover art is important.

Q. My daughter just got her first apartment, and I found her four Corning Ware casserole dishes in different sizes and one glass lid in a resale shop. I looked up the decoration and learned it is the Pastel Bouquet floral pattern. I paid less than \$10 for the whole lot. Is it collectible?

A. Corning Ware was first introduced in 1958 by Corning Glass Works. The

company was sold and is now known as Corelle Brands. The most popular patterns of Corning Ware are Cornflower Blue, made from 1957 to 1988; and Spice of Life, made from 1972 to 1987. Your Pastel Bouquet pattern was made from 1985 to 1990. Most pieces in this pattern sell from \$15 to \$50 each. It's too bad you only have one lid, but you got a good deal!

Soaring home prices juice average U.S. homeowner equity growth

LOS ANGELES — Soaring home prices have pushed up average homeowner equity growth to the highest level in more than a decade, though recent signs of a cooling U.S. housing market point to more moderate gains in the second half of the year.

Homes with a mortgage gained an average of \$51,500 in equity in the second quarter, an increase of 29.3% from the April-June quarter last year, according to real estate information company CoreLogic. That's the highest quarterly average gain in home equity since the second quarter of 2010, the firm said.

That works out to nearly \$3 trillion in equity gained by U.S. homeowners with a mortgage, which is about 63% of all homes, CoreLogic said. Average homeowner equity jumped

nearly 20% in the first quarter from a year earlier.

Home equity growth can have broad impacts on the economy, giving homeowners more financial flexibility to spend on big purchases or build a nest egg. Rising home values also make it increasingly tougher for would-be homeowners to buy.

Homeowners in California, Washington state and Idaho saw among the biggest average equity increases in the second quarter: \$116,000 in California, \$103,000 in Washington state and \$97,000 in Idaho.

The surge in homeowner equity gains follows a record run up in U.S. home prices this year amid a searing hot housing market fueled by ultra-low mortgage rates, a thin inventory of properties for sale and many would-be buyers' desire for more living space during the pandemic.

S&P said this week that its closely watched S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller 20-city home price index surged 19.9% in July from a year earlier, the largest gain on records dating back to 2000.

Still, there are signs the soaring home price gains may have peaked. The National Association of Realtors' most recent housing market snapshot showed the median home price of previously occupied U.S. homes rose 14.9% in August from a year earlier to \$356,700. That's a more modest gain than earlier this year, when year-over-year increases were running at 20%-25%.

"It seems that there was that shift from July to August where there starts to be a little bit of pushback in terms of where prices have gone," said Ali Wolf, chief economist at Zonda Economics, a real estate

industry tracker.

Wolf projects that U.S. home price growth will slow to about 5% next year, citing expectations of modestly higher mortgage rates and a small, but notable increase in the number of homes on the market.

"The days of runaway home price growth are behind us," she said.

In its most recent quarterly housing forecast, mortgage buyer Freddie Mac envisions home prices growing 5.3% next year, down from a projected 12.1% increase in 2021.

If those home price outlooks hold, it would translate into a less torrid pace for homeowner equity growth next year. Still, the outsized growth in homeowner equity this year will have ripple effects for the broader economy, and the housing market.

Rising homeowner equity

creates a buffer for borrowers against potential financial hardship, such as job loss. And it can give homeowners financial flexibility to borrow against their equity to pay off high-interest debt or finance large purchases, such as home improvement projects, which can give a boost to the economy.

"It is good for wider economic growth, but there's an ugly side to today's level of pricing," Wolf said. "Those who have chosen not to purchase a home or have been unable to are finding it very hard to enter the market now, and in a lot of cases these individuals are missing out on wealth accumulation."

The surge in home prices this year has made it tougher for would-be homeowners to buy. First-time buyers accounted for 29% of home sales in August, according to the National

Association of Realtors. A year ago they made up 33% of buyers.

The U.S. homeownership rate was 65.4% in the second quarter, down from 66.6% last year and 66.2% a decade ago.

The increase in home equity has helped limit the number of homeowners who end up "underwater" on their mortgage, or owing more on their loan than their home is worth. Also known as being in negative equity, that can happen when a home's value declines, or when the size of the mortgage increases, say when someone takes out a home equity loan.

At the end of the second quarter, 1.2 million homes, or 2.3% of all U.S. homes with a mortgage, were in negative equity, CoreLogic said. That's down 30% from the same quarter last year.

Record July jump in U.S. home prices, sidelining more buyers

WASHINGTON — U.S. home prices soared in July by a record amount from a year earlier as buyers desperate for homes bid up prices amid a limited supply.

The S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller 20-city home price index surged 19.9% in July compared with a year ago, the largest gain on records dating back to 2000. In 17 of the 20 cities, prices rose more quickly in July than in June. And prices reached all-time highs in 19 of 20 cities. The one exception was Chicago, where prices are just 0.3% below their 2006 peak.

Sales of new and existing homes have jumped this year, driven by low mortgage rates and a desire for more living space during the pandemic. Sales of existing homes are up 16% in the

first eight months of 2021 compared with last year, and they're up 12% from the same period in 2019.

Phoenix, San Diego, and Seattle reported the biggest price increases, with Phoenix leading the nation for the 26th straight month.

The rising prices are making it harder for younger would-be buyers to purchase a home, with the proportion of sales going to first-time homebuyers falling to 29% last month, the lowest since January 2019, according to the National Association of Realtors. Meanwhile, investors snapped up 15% of homes in August, up slightly from a year earlier.

There were just 1.29 million homes for sale in August, according to the NAR. That's down nearly one-third from a year earlier.

A third decade of 'Crime': 'CSI' hits Vegas for sequel series

In an industry currently teaming with franchise reboots and sequels, one fan favorite has seemed to be missing. Though do not fret, the gruesome 2000s procedural "CSI" is back, and it's picking up right where the original "CSI: Crime Scene Investigation" left off when it wrapped up in September 2015.

That's right, we're headed back to Vegas, baby, and the crime lab is still open. "CSI: Vegas" premieres Wednesday, Oct. 6, on CBS and to stream on Paramount+.

At this point in the reboot process, audiences generally want to know what has changed. In this case, fortunately, not much. It's not too often that minimal change to an old TV series equates to a feeling of relief, but given "CSI's" resounding success and massive popularity, it's clear the show's formula works, proving sometimes you don't have to reinvent the wheel.

Even so, "Vegas" does promise some new energy, thanks to a handful of newcomers joining veteran cast members. New to the "CSI" family are Paula Newsome ("Chicago Med"), Mandeep Dhillon ("Star Wars: Episode IX - The Rise of the Skywalker," 2019), Matt Lauria ("Little Birds") and Jay Lee ("Looking for Alaska").

Newsome plays Maxine Roby, the head of the crime lab. With a background in genetics and a slew of on-screen procedural and medical roles, she's perfect for the position.

Laurie plays Josh Folsom, a Level 3 CSI, and Dhillon portrays Allie Rajan, a Level 2 CSI. Lee fills the role of their cohort, whose name and title has yet to be released as of press time.

These new faces are, of course, accompanied by familiar favorites, including that of Jorja Fox ("The Map of Tiny Perfect Things," 2021) as Sara Sidle, Wallace Langham ("Ford v Ferrari," 2019) as David Hodges and William Petersen ("Manhattan") as Dr. Gil Grissom.

With a diverse ensemble cast and many topical issues to draw from, "CSI: Vegas" should have no problem incorporating real-world events into the series continuation.

For those who may be unfamiliar

with the CSI franchise, or who may simply be in need of a refresher, the show essentially follows a group of Crime Scene Investigation agents who face crime and forensics head-on from the streets of Sin City to their sleek and technically astounding crime lab. This time, however, the team is also dealing with a threat to the lab itself — a threat so major they need to call in reinforcements. Enter Grissom and Sidle, who leave their idyllic lifestyle behind and jump back into the thick of it.

"It's at once this familiar thing in my mind and also brand new," returning cast member Fox said during a panel discussion promoting the show. "The world, weirdly enough, is even more topsy-turvy than it was in 2000. There's [so] much new [stuff] happening, and it's great to be grounded with William Petersen and be back as Sara and Grissom. Boy, what a thrill that is,

and that's what kept my feet on the ground a little bit."

Another possibly pleasing tidbit for audiences: the lab threat had already been identified, meaning "CSI: Vegas" may well be intense from the very beginning. The show's creator and producer, Jason Tracey ("Elementary"), has noted that the attack on the lab involves beloved character Jim Brass (Paul Guilfoyle, "The Morning Show").

"CSI" fans will remember Brass's departure from the series after 14 seasons. Having him back, if even to just be "attacked," is a major callback to the original series — he's also the catalyst for something much bigger as the trailer for "Vegas" shows someone mysteriously typing out, "Jim Brass is just the beginning."

While this warning could signal the potential loss of some major franchise characters, it is a good indication that

"CSI: Vegas" has some major plans in place for its 10-episode first season. And as wonderfully familiar as the basic plot may seem, the show is getting a major upgrade in both storytelling and gear.

In just six years, a lot has changed in the world of science, forensics and the technology used by crime labs, and the show's writers have not forgotten to update their scripts to match these latest practices. After all, the franchise was first launched more than 20 years ago, and two decades in the world of forensic technology is no small tweak.

"It's an enormous challenge and responsibility," Tracey said of updating the lab technologies and jumping into the procedural game in 2021. "Fortunately, this franchise that Anthony [Zuiker] devised has always been about evidence and science and following the evidence. ... It's a solving

story ... and we take the responsibility of entering the criminal justice realm really seriously. We're trying to tell some really thoughtful stories about getting justice for victims."

It's clear the return of the CSI franchise is more than just a fun idea from producers; it's a celebration of sorts.

"CSI: Vegas" was originally meant as a special 20th-anniversary gift to audiences, though, as with just about everything last year, it was delayed due to the pandemic. Las Vegas is where it all began — before spinoffs were launched in Miami, New York and Cyberspace — and now, in a sense, both the characters and the viewers are going home.

So don't miss the premiere of "CSI: Vegas" when it airs on CBS this Wednesday, Oct. 6, as well as for streaming on Paramount+. And hey, fans, welcome home.

Finding the final four: Weeklong WNBA semifinals air live

The quest for the 25th Women's National Basketball Association championship is nearing its conclusion as the remaining teams move into the semifinals. Tune in to ABC on Sunday, Oct. 3, and throughout the rest of the week on ESPN2, as the final four take to the court.

The favorites heading into the semifinals are the Connecticut Sun, who finished the regular season as the No. 1 seed. Led by MVP Jonquel Jones, the Sun outscored their opponents by an average of just under nine points a game. The home-court advantage will surely suit them, as they also finished the regular season with the best at-home record in the league.

Another team to clinch a spot in the semifinals was the Las Vegas Aces. (The top two teams in the regular seasons receive a bye into the semifinals, while the third- and fourth-place teams get a bye into the second round, leaving the teams seeded fifth to eighth to play in the first round.) Led by A'ja Wilson (2020 WNBA MVP) and

The Mercury — led by star center Brittney Griner and guard Kia Nurse from Hamilton, Ontario — have been hoping their slow, methodical offence is enough to carry them through to the playoffs (they had the second-best offensive rating and the second-slowest pace).

Meanwhile, Seattle could prove to be the toughest challenger in the league as the reigning WNBA champions and the winner of the inaugural Commissioner's Cup — the WNBA's mid-season tournament. Led by future hall-of-famer Sue Bird, who has been with Seattle since 2002, and forward Breanna Stewart, the Storm will be looking to secure their fifth championship.

Hulu rolls out new baking competition

Shows like "The Great British Bake Off" and Food Network's Baking Championship franchise have proven that one should never underestimate the skills of an amateur baker — well, except those appearing in "Nailed It!" (but that's the whole point).

Now Hulu, home of "Taste the Nation with Padma Lakshmi," is rolling out a sweet new competitive baking series, and it, too, promises to make a star out of a baker, regardless of their amateur/professional status outside the kitchen.

Premiering Thursday, Oct. 7, "Baker's Dozen" is a fast-paced, unscripted competition series that pits 13 (hence the title) home-taught and professional bakers against each other in a series of weekly baking challenges.

The inaugural season consists of

eight episodes. In each one, the competitors will pull out all the stops in hopes of becoming the next viral baking sensation and the winner of the Golden Rolling Pin (there's a cash prize, too).

Fresh off her appearance in "The Masked Singer," actress/talk show host Tamera Mowry-Housley of "Sister, Sister" and "The Real" fame is the enthusiastic co-host of "Baker's Dozen." She stands alongside author/pastry chef (and pie master) Bill Yosses, who served as White House executive pastry chef from 2007 to 2014.

In addition to Mowry-Housley and Yosses, a guest judge will appear in each episode to help critique the baked goods. The guest judges include award-winning cake artist Joshua John Russell, TikTok baking star Robert Lucas, macaron master Leanne Pietrasinski, cake artist Rachel Teufel, writer and Instagram pie sensation Lauren Ko, Irish baker

Gemma Stafford, Teri Cellutto and pastry chef Loria Stern.

Each episode is a self-contained competition (kind of like "Nailed It!"), so you can jump in at any point. At the start of every episode, viewers are introduced to a fresh baker's dozen of contestants, and by the second challenge the field is whittled down to just five bakers — but only the Top Three advance to the final round.

In the first episode, the contestants are challenged to decorate cake pop bouquets. The five best bakers will move on to Round Two, in which they'll have to create their best delight dessert (think layers of pudding) and mashup dessert if they want to impress the judges.

Who will win? "Baker's Dozen" is available for streaming on Hulu beginning Oct. 7.

Festive fall fun: Lose your gourd over the festive competition series coming back to Food Network. "Outrageous Pumpkins" Season 2 premieres on Sunday, Oct. 3, with more treats than tricks in store for viewers.

shave the skin of a pumpkin before carving it?!"

'Monarch' matriarch: Sarandon joins cast of Fox country music drama

'Monarch' matriarch: When you hear the name Susan Sarandon, you probably associate the actress with the 1975 film "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" or 1991's "Thelma and Louise" or her Oscar-winning performance in "Dead Man Walking" (1995), just to name a few.

Sarandon's acting resume is chock-full of film and TV credits (including "Ray Donovan"), and another TV series has just been added to the list: Fox's "Monarch."

Set to premiere Jan. 30, the upcoming drama series is the fictional multigenerational story of a country music dynasty headed by the talented but tough as nails matriarch Dottie Cantrell Roman (Sarandon) and her beloved husband, Albie, played by country music star Trace Adkins ("The Lincoln Lawyer," 2011). Dottie is known as the Queen of Country Music and the Roman family name has become synonymous with authenticity, but it turns out their success was built on a lie — and per Fox, "their reign as country royalty is put in jeopardy."

There have been quite a few other additions to the cast. British actress Anna Friel ("Pushing Daisies") has been cast as the heir to the crown, Nicolette "Nicky" Roman, who will stop at nothing to protect her family's legacy while embarking on her own quest for stardom.

Another English actor, Josh Sasse ("Galavant"), has been tapped to play son Luke Roman, who, despite being the CEO of Monarch Entertainment (the family's business), never seems to get his father's approval.

It seems Luke isn't the only one struggling with the family dynamics. Actress/singer Beth Ditto ("On Becoming A God in Central Florida") will star as sister Gigi Taylor-Roman, who feels like an outcast despite being immensely talented.

Finally, "Dave and Pitch" actress Megan Holder will play the role of Gigi's ambitious wife, music manager Kayla Taylor-Roman, whose relationship with the rest of the Roman family reflects a complicated history.

Fraser, the 'Pro': A big name in Hollywood during the late '90s and early 2000s, American-Canadian actor Brendan Fraser has been making a well-deserved comeback of late, what with his prominent role in HBO Max's "Doom Patrol" and in Martin Scorsese's upcoming film for Apple TV+, "Killers of the Flower Moon."

Fraser has also been in the news for a series that has already aired — in Europe, anyway. Stateside, CW recently scored the rights to air "Professionals," meaning North American audiences will finally get a chance to watch the 2020 Irish-South African action series starring Fraser and "Smallville's" Tom Welling.

A loose remake of the 2012 film "Soldiers of Fortune" starring Christian Slater ("Mr. Robot"), "Professionals" centers on Welling's character, Vincent Corbo.

Corbo is a top-tier security operative who is paid to protect the interests of his rich and powerful clients by any means necessary, legal or not. He is hired by billionaire futurist and rocket designer Peter Swann (played by Fraser), who suspects sabotage after his next-gen medical satellite explodes on launch.

Corbo's latest gig is complicated by the fact that his former paramour, medical visionary Dr. Grace Davila (played by Elana Anaya, who was Doctor Poison in the 2017 film "Wonder Woman") is now Swann's fiancée.

According to the official logline: "As Corbo and his team of veteran security professionals investigate the rocket disaster, they expose a lethal conspiracy of Swann's corporate rivals, corrupt government officials and a shadowy crime syndicate — all working to destroy Swann and take control of his tech empire."

That's not all: Corbo also has to deal with a rogue Europol agent played by Ken Duken ("Inglorious Bastards," 2009), who is intent on busting the leading man for his past crimes.

A premiere date will be announced at a later time.

Keep spinning:

Pat Sajak and Vanna White are staying put.

Sony Pictures Television renewed Sajak's and White's contracts prior to the launch of the hit game show's 39th season, meaning the "Wheel of Fortune" duo, who have been synonymous with the show since its current version debuted in 1983, are set to remain on the air through the 2023-24 season, at least.

Sajak also picked up some additional duties: for a second year, Sajak will serve as consulting producer in addition to his on-screen role as host — an extra credit that may have added significance this year, given the events that have been unfolding behind the scenes of "Wheel of Fortune" and its sister show, "Jeopardy!"

Until recently, both shows shared an executive producer. Mike Richards had also joined "Jeopardy!" as executive producer in 2020 and was slated to replace the late Alex Trebek as host. That decision didn't sit well with fans, who decried the "inside hire." The controversy brought new scrutiny to discrimination lawsuits filed against him during his time at "The Price Is Right" (two were dismissed and one was settled out of court).

Richards ultimately stepped down as host over offensive comments made on a podcast he hosted in 2013 and 2014, and a few weeks later he was out as executive producer, too. (Embassy Row executive Michael Davis stepped in to fill the EP role on an interim basis.)

As for Sajak, the 74-year-old host represents continuity. While more than a few changes were introduced this season, Sajak's dual role as consulting producer and host means he'll

continue to play a big part in maintaining the show's overall tone in the next few years.


