**Native American Studies offers assistance to public school teachers**

The West Virginia Board of Education has set standards for each grade level that represent educational goals and expectations for what students should know, understand and be able to do. According to the social studies standards, West Virginia stu-

dents will examine the settlement of North America by Native Americans and determine the causes and effects of European exploration starting in the third grade.

Each year, the West Virginia University Native American Studies Program receives multiple requests from West Virginia educators to provide instruc-

tional presentations and programs for kindergarten through 12th grade students.

"Typically, textbooks are written from the perspective of European Americans," said Bonnie Brown, coordinator of the Native American Studies program at WVU. Brown is also a member of Morgantown Human Rights Commission, which plans to ask

Morgantown City Council to officially declare the second Monday in October Indigenous People's Day when council convenes for its committee of the whole meeting on Oct. 26.

The Associated Press reported that President Joe Biden Friday issued the first-

Dr. Lee B. Smith spent five days in late June, dosimeter in hand, measuring radiation levels inside the former Chernobyl Nuclear Power Plant in Ukraine and the surrounding area, known as the Exclusion Zone.

Dressed in assigned white personal protective gear when inside the domed-off plant, which experienced a catastrophic explosion, meltdown and fire in 1986 that rained radiation at least as far away as Sweden, and in blue PPE outside in and around the ghost city of Pripyat, Smith continued his ongoing training in radiation detection and preparation that he uses for his job as Monongalia County Health Department's executive director and county health officer.

"It's still highly radioactive," said Smith of Chernobyl. "Radioactivity will go on for thousands of years."

Working in conjunction with MCHD's Threat Preparedness program, Smith uses these skills locally, such as by helping to monitor mass gatherings for individuals or groups that might attempt to set off a "dirty" bomb that contains radiological material.

"We were part of a 10-person team to train in taking measurements and performing drills while seeing effects of the explosion 35 years

later," he said.

Smith was accompanied by his wife, Dr. Vicki Everly, an emergency physician at Mon Health Medical Center who prepared for the trip by undergoing training by the U.S. Department of Energy.

"My husband asked, 'Do you want to go to Chernobyl?'" Everly said. "It's not one of the top places I want to go, but I said, 'Yeah, I can do that.'"

Smith and Everly visited locations, including a control room identical to one where an ill-advised test was conducted April 26, 1986, and the sarcophagus that now covers the remaining structures to keep radiation from escaping.

The test triggered a chain reaction nuclear explosion and fire in Chernobyl's No. 4 reactor.

When the accident took place, responding firefighters had no idea how to effectively extinguish radioactive flames from the more than 200 tons of uranium that melted down the reactor. They also were not properly outfitted to do so. Many died within three months and others died later from radiation.

"Many of those guys had lethal doses of gamma radiation," Smith said. "It was reported to us that many of the helicopter pilots who dropped sand and boron on the site also received lethal doses of gamma radiation just from flying helicopters over the open reactor."

Residents were not immediately alerted to the dangers of the nuclear accident and were not

**Atlantic looking to build on former school site**

Broadband company scouts local area

The Sabraton School building stood at 1837 Listravia Ave. for more than 100 years.

Now it looks as if it's about to get a new tenant.

Morgantown Communications Director Andrew Stacy said the city's development services office is working with Atlantic Broadband to determine where on the half-acre tract the cable provider can build a data center, and exactly what it should look like.

Not everyone is happy about it.

A number of the parcel's neighbors turned out in September, when Atlantic Broadband asked the Morgantown Board of Zoning Appeals to grant conditional use to construct what city code calls a "Communications Equipment Building" in an R-1A (single family residential) district.

The cable provider is also seeking variance relief that will allow the building to be 800 square-feet. City code caps such structures at 250 square-feet.

According to architect Ted Jasinski, the building, which he referred to as a "head-end room," will be unmanned outside of regular maintenance checks and completely non-combustible. The only utility running to the building will be electricity.

Ed Keepers, who lives at 1818 Listravia Ave., said that neighborhood is the not the proper location for a broadband server room.

"My home is on the national register. Knocking Run, the creek

evacuated for three days.

The area will not be inhabitable for 30,000 years, and reaching the site required a daily train ride from Slavutych, about 60 miles away, and built for those involved in the clean-up, Smith noted.

He was invited to participate on this trip by Technical Resources Group, based in Idaho Falls, Idaho, which has been conducting this exercise for about 10 years.

"Because of the work Monongalia County Health Department does with radiation training and preparation, we've been involved in a lot of education and drills," he said.

Also, in 2015, the state Department of Health and Human Resources designated MCHD as the Northern West Virginia Radiation Response Team, which includes maintaining a cache of equipment and trained personnel who can respond to radiation events.

"Since then, we've put a lot of time and effort into getting our Threat Preparedness staff up to speed," he said.

That has meant sending staff members to Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education in Oak Ridge, Tenn. Also, Smith just completed Radiation Emergency Preparedness, a yearlong training at the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, Calif.

"That's been an involved

course," Smith said. "We got to meet in person for the class, and there were subject matter experts from the federal government and from state governments, and someone from Oak Ridge was there. There were people from all over the country that were accepted into this program, and they were equally interested in what I had learned at Chernobyl."

That included insight into what prompted the accident. "Reactor No. 4 had about 200 tons of uranium in it, and it was a twin to reactor No. 3," Smith said. There were also twin reactors Nos. 1 and 2. "So there were huge amounts of radioactive materials there."

At the time, Ukraine was part of the United Soviet Socialist Republic and the Cold War that was about to end was still ongoing.

"The Soviets thought that the Americans were going to come and bomb them, and they wanted to know if they could switch the electrical generator from nuclear power, generating steam to turn the turbines, to a diesel-fired generator," he said. "That's why this whole thing happened."

A series of errors occurred, including postponement of the test until the middle of the night when a less experienced shift would be working, and then by going ahead with the test even as indicators continued to emerge that should have stopped them from proceeding.

"Long story short, they ended up trying to shut down a lot of energy created from radiation, and start it back up again," Smith said. "But the reactor power went so low. In order to make it heat up, they drained water from the cooling system, which was another error that sealed their fate."

Then, control rods filled with boron to absorb neutrons were withdrawn to allow more radiation and heat. When radiation reached critical levels, the safety control rods started to lower back down into the reactor. However, the rods' tips were made of graphite, which absorbs radiation. The rods were burned and ruined, jamming the safety rods from being further lowered. "It was a fait accompli. It went critical within seconds."

Although it's been more than 35 years since the Chernobyl nuclear disaster occurred, it reentered public awareness and was introduced to a new generation in 2019 through both an acclaimed HBO miniseries, "Chernobyl," and a bestselling book, "Midnight in Chernobyl: The Untold Story of the World's Greatest Nuclear Disaster," by Adam Higginbotham.

As depicted in the series, in the minutes following the explosion, area residents gathered on a nearby bridge to watch the flames, having no idea of the radioactive fallout that was swirling around the sky.

"Some of them ended up with thyroid cancer, which can be treatable," Smith said. "Not everybody died quickly of acute radiation sickness."

Unauthorized individuals are not supposed to visit Pripjat and the surrounding areas, but natives known as stalkers steal into town.

"Some of the people who were evacuated came back, thinking, 'It's my home and I can live off the land,'" he said. "But can you take the radiation? If you take a meter and hold it up to a tree, it's giving off large amounts of radiation in counts per second. Heavy metals follow gravity and wash into the soil, where it is absorbed by plants."

There are also adventure tourists who want to see the area for the coolness factor of visiting a forbidden place.

Smith recalled seeing a busload of sightseers disembark a bus. "And they have on T-shirts and flip-flops like they are on a picnic, and the leader of the group lets them turn on their meters, which make a big noise," he said. "But they didn't have a clue what they were doing."

On the other hand,

Smith felt very safe as his team was led by experienced professionals who have been conducting the tour twice a year for about a decade.

"It gives you a sense of reality that your meter is singing," he said. "To you, it's a real-world situation. But you are conscious of limiting your amount of exposure."

They were in "harm's way" for five days and were measured for radioactivity before and after. "At the end, we had like 45 microsievarts, which isn't exceptional. It's a really small cumulative dose, like getting dental X-rays."

Pripjat offered its own fascination as a city stopped in time. The group saw abandoned amusement rides such as a merry-go-round and Ferris wheel; circa-1986 televisions, furniture and pianos on display at deserted shops; and a café with beautiful stained glass that served as a reminder of the city's former status as a cultural center.

Also remaining in the area are dogs who survived in spite of a mass effort to eliminate all pets that might have been contaminated with radiation. One

of the group's guides runs a site called "Dogs of Chernobyl" that raises funds for communities affected by industrial accidents.

"He also sets up funds for people with various cancers to get them treatments that for them are not financially attainable," Smith said.

As seasoned world travelers, Smith and Everly compared their experience to previous trips.

"It was one of the most rigorous things we've ever done, maybe other than Machu Picchu," Smith said. "It was 95 degrees a day, and when we were outside in Pripjat, we wore wool polyester-blend pants, big work boots and jackets while we walked about 10 miles each day."

"It wasn't like you could sit down and put your backpack down because everything is contaminated."

But it's an experience that Everly will never forget. "It touches you to see this area, that it is now kind of beautiful and all grown over and green and lush, but it's going to be radioactive for the next 30,000 years. Nothing is going to be able to inhabit it safely."

### NOTICE OF SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT #4 TO THE FY2019 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

The West Virginia Department of Economic Development (WVDED) and the West Virginia Housing Development Fund (WVHDF) are providing a public comment period concerning a proposed substantial amendment #4 to the FY2019 Annual Action Plan (AAP) for funding provided to the State by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The APP summarizes the actions, activities, and the resources that will be used each year for the following housing and community development programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), CDBG CARES Act (CDBG-CV), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), Emergency Solutions Grants - CARES Act (ESG-CV), Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS CARES Act (HOPWA-CV).

**DESCRIPTION OF THE AAP AMENDMENT #4:** To address the impact of COVID-19, the State of West Virginia proposes the following changes to the FY2019 AAP: 1) The addition of public schools as an eligible facility to receive CDBG-CV Public Facilities funding; 2) Reallocation of \$4,000,000 from Public Service Activities to Public Facility Activities; 3) Reallocation of \$412,530 from State Administration and \$112,971 from State Technical Assistance to Public Facility Activities; 4) Allowing the State to act directly and administer activities up to \$10,000,000; 5) Increasing the Public Facilities award limit to \$3,000,000 and the Public Services award limit to \$1,000,000.

**PUBLIC REVIEW:** A comment period will begin on Monday October 11th, 2021 and will continue until close of business on Friday October 15th, 2021. The proposed amendment #4 of the FY2019 Annual Action Plan (AAP) will be available on the West Virginia Community Advancement and Development (WVCAD) website at <https://wvcad.org/resources> or by calling WVCAD at 304-558-2234. # Past pain drives characters in 'Lamb'

**WHEN THE TRAILER** for Vladimar Johannsson's "Lamb" came out, it received a not-surprising amount of buzz. A movie about a lamb-human hybrid filmed at a sheep farm in Iceland? Of course that's going to raise some eyebrows. And I must say, this movie is exactly what you think it is and nothing at all what you think

it is. The film is presented in three chapters. The first is almost entirely without dialogue. Maria (Noomi Rapace) and Ingvar (Hilmir Snær Guonason) are a couple running a sheep farm. We see them helping the ewes give birth, tagging the lambs, caring for the land. One of the only moments of dialogue in the entire first act is a bit where Ingvar remarks that people are theorizing that time travel could happen, and Maria responds that they could revisit the past, ending the conversation cold. Clearly we see that the past holds pain for them.

That pain is clearly what drives this movie. When Ingvar's brother, Pétur (Björn Hlynur Haraldsson) arrives and asks what exactly Ada is, Ingvar replies, "Happiness." And while there are genuine moments of joy and levity in the movie (the scene where the family is dancing together to a video of Pétur's band is just a delightful moment), we are reminded over and over

that this isn't natural, and that it is held together more by the sheer force of will than by any kind of familial bond.

This is a very minimalist film. There are only three actors. The scenery, while beautiful and earthy, is also stark. The dialogue is nominal throughout. There is very little in the way of a score. Ada's form is held back from us until the very end of the first chapter and is used sparingly enough that it is jarring every time we see her.

Where this movie failed for me was in the pay-off. I love a slow-burn horror. I think movies like "It Follows" and "Hereditary" are exceptional at creating and sustaining dread without the use of jump scares and slasher movie tactics.

"Lamb" certainly had an underlying sense of unease throughout, but the sheer sweetness of Ada and the sterility of everything else felt like it undercut the tense moments a bit too much. And when we finally see

the monster in the last few minutes of the movie, the surrealism of it felt like a little too much. A movie grounded in so much realism, subtlety and almost whimsy felt like it couldn't support the final outcome. And yet, there wasn't any other way for it to end.

"Lamb" has some truly wonderful performances in it, and I would wager that you've never seen anything quite like it before. But if you find yourself, like Pétur, asking, "What is this?" — I can't promise that happiness is the answer.

## Death toll continues to climb in W.Va.

CHARLESTON, W.Va. — The death toll continues to surge from the coronavirus pandemic in West Virginia, according to health data released Friday.

There were at least 115 new virus deaths reported during the first seven days of October, according to the state's coronavirus dashboard. It follows a September toll of about 600 deaths — more than the four previous months combined.

The state is on pace to surpass 4,000 total deaths from the pandemic next week.

across from it, was surveyed by George Washington. We have seven or eight properties that qualify to be on the national register," he told members of the BZA.

When it was suggested that city staff work with Atlantic Broadband to make the aesthetic of the building match the surrounding neighborhood, Keepers replied "We could make it look like Williamsburg. That's not the point. The point is, it's zoned for single family dwellings."

Development Services Director Rickie Yeager explained communication buildings are permitted in R-1A zoned areas with conditional use approval from the BZA. It was also pointed out that the parcel's western border abuts a PRO (professional, residential and office) district.

After a vote to table the issue failed 2-2, the board voted unanimously to grant the conditional use and variance relief and tasked Yeager with working with Atlantic Broadband to find a suitable facade and location on the land for the structure.

Morgantown City Council approved a 10-year cable franchise agreement with Atlantic Broadband last month.

The Sabraton School was demolished in July 2019 by Reclaim Co., which is owned by R.J. Williams.

At the time, Williams, who still owns the property through Acme Land Holdings LLC, said he intended to build a "small, high-end housing development" on a six-acre tract that included the former school property.

The bipartisan group — eight Republicans, seven Democrats — was formed earlier this year. Its goal, stated on its website, “is to go into communities and talk with local residents as well as local community and business leaders, to determine what our coal communities specifically need to succeed and what tools are already available.”

Hansen said the idea was first part of a bill he introduced two sessions ago. It didn’t advance, and last session Del. Ed Evans, D-McDowell, brought it back as an amendment to a bill require utilities to maintain a 30-day supply of coal at coal-fired power plants.

As The Dominion Post reported at the time, the amendment required the Public Service Commission to create a Coal Community Comeback Plan. The Senate rejected that amendment. But after the session, Hansen said, the Senate president and House speaker formed the workgroup.

The group’s work, Hansen said, dovetails with the federal efforts of the Interagency Working Group on Coal and Power Plant Communities and Economic Revitalization, led by National Energy Technology Laboratory Director Brian Anderson.

The IWG pools the efforts of 11 federal agencies “to ensure the shift to a clean energy economy creates good-paying union jobs, spurs economic revitalization, remediates environmental degradation, and supports energy workers in coal, oil and gas and power plant communities across the country.”

Hansen said the sate workgroup is “working from the bottom up and trying to coordinate with that [the IWG] to make sure that people in West Virginia communities know about the opportunities and have the resources that they need to put good applications in and funnel as much of these resources as possible to West Virginia.”

Aid would come, he said, in the form of grants to economic development agencies, nonprofits and

local government units for new ideas to develop jobs that build on a community’s assets.

The group, Hansen said, has already met with the IWG along with various local and state economic development leaders. During the listening tour, they expect to hear about challenges communities are facing to access the federal programs.

During the Morgantown stop, he said, he hopes to hear from miners and others affected by the coal economy downturn, and to learn about activity among entrepreneurs and people at WVU on ideas to diversify our economy.

“We’re not as solely dependent on the coal industry as southern West Virginia has been, but we’ve definitely lost a lot of jobs, including this year,” he said, referring to the closure of the mine in Blacksville.

One issue many small communities face, he said, is writing grants for federal aid. They lack the staff to do that. The group will look at ways to connect them with experienced grant writers.

Grants also often require a local match, he said — often 20% — so the group is looking at legislation for the 2022 session to create a state pot of matching dollars, along with other bills to help the coal communities.

One question the group and leaders around the state are wrestling with, Hansen said, is what happens first? Can they diversify without such things as broadband and water and sewer infrastructure?

“There’s just some basic things that are needed to provide a place where entrepreneurs want to start new businesses and people want to move to,” he said. This isn’t necessarily anything new, it’s just a renewed focus on communities that are hardest hit.”

The workgroup’s Morgantown stop is set for 6:30-8:30 p.m. Oct. 20 at the Shack Neighborhood House in Pursglove.

Other stops are set for Oct. 19 in Moundsville, Oct. 25 in Logan and Oct. 27 in Beckley.

ever presidential proclamation of Indigenous Peoples’ Day. The day will be observed Oct. 11, along with Columbus Day, which is established by Congress.

WVU’s programs are designed to address overall issues of concern among history and social studies teachers when it comes to Indigenous Americans.

“Sometimes, it’s a teacher reaching out to us saying, ‘I would like to try this in my classroom. Is there anyone there who can come and do a presentation?’ ” Brown said. “And we try to accommodate as much as possible.”

Members of the NAS program committee deliver the presentations according to expertise and availability in the schools. While committee members may not always be able to deliver an in-person presentation they can direct educators to other available resources.

“What we can do sometimes is offer reference materials or offer age appropriate information.

There are so many materials that are offered online now than ever before.” Brown said. “If we are going to go speak in a classroom, we try to find the best person in our fac-

ulty to handle the request.”

In some cases, teachers are also referred to the National Museum of the American Indian Native Knowledge 360 Program, designed to provide curriculum assistance to teachers.

The program offers assistance to not only public school educators, but any group who would like to learn more about Native Americans and their history. They have also presented information to WVU student organizations and service groups, WVU classes outside of Native American studies and at Extension 4-H summer camps, the Boys and Girls Club, the Shack, Arts in the Park, the Grave Creek Mound Archaeological Complex, Rotary Club, the Morgantown Public Library and elsewhere.

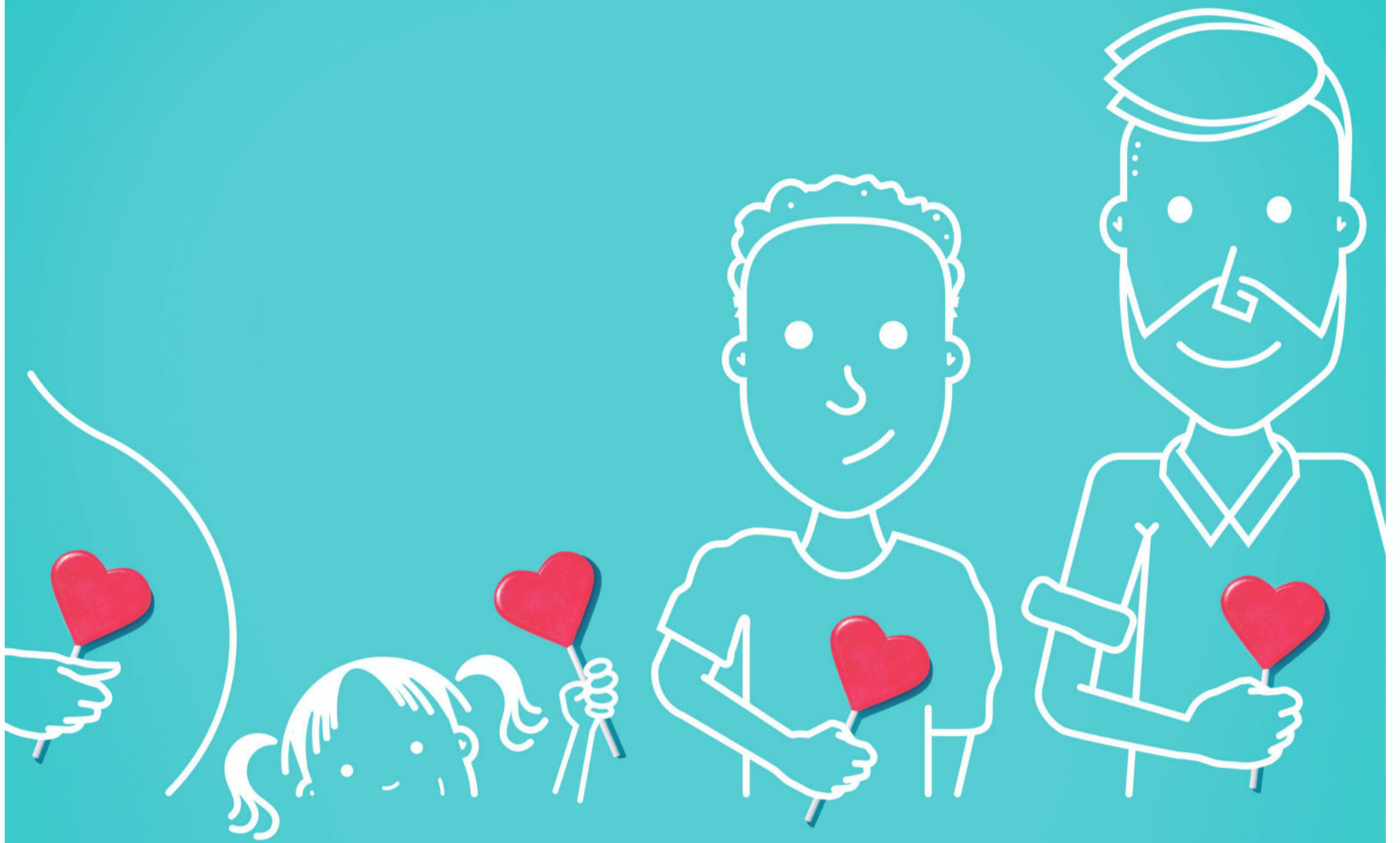

- 8) Help motivate them.** Tell jokes, talk about the positive things that are going on in your lives, share funny videos, and provide encouragement.

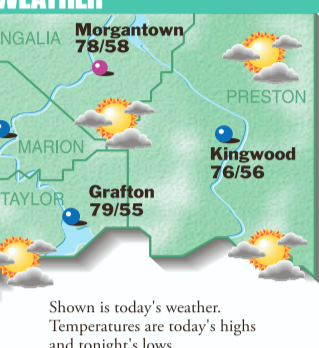

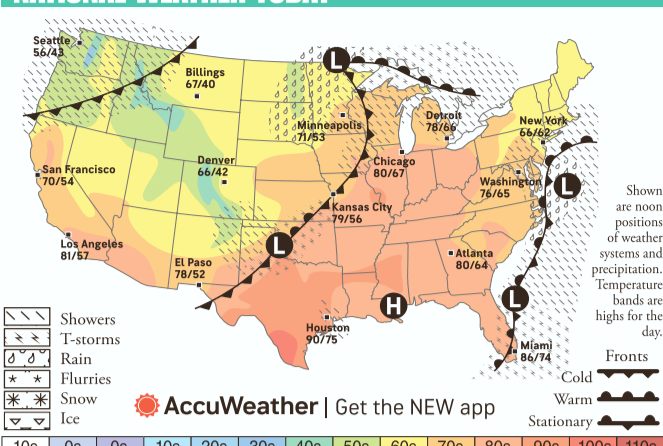

brother. I am sure his absence will be felt by many members of your community. With COVID-19 continuing to spread, one would think people would accept the necessity to be cautious, even when paying last respects to such an important person as your brother. It's possible that in her grief your sister-in-law doesn't fully grasp the fact that what she's planning could endanger people she cares about.

Talk to the pastor who will officiate at the funeral and relate your concern for public safety. Then ask if there is a way for mourners who show up in person to socially distance during the service. It's worth a try, and might prevent more tragedy.

## Commission meets with EMS providers

KINGWOOD — Leaders from four EMS services in Preston County met with the Preston County Commission to discuss their immediate and future needs at a work session last week.

The purpose of the meeting was to make the commission aware of the needs of the EMS services, said Commissioner Dave Price, who has been meeting with the

departments individually.

During previous discussions on uses for the county's roughly \$922,000 in CARES money, Price said he wants to spend at least \$400,000 to enhance EMS services in the county.

"We can sit and say that COVID has caused a whole lot of bad but one good thing that has come from it is that we've had the opportunity to collect some money because of COVID that we can assist with," Commission Samantha Stone said.

One takeaway from the work session is that nothing comes cheap. Bruceton Ambulance Service had to pay \$64,000 to replace heart monitors. President Peggy Gunnoe said the service doesn't have that kind of money upfront and the monthly payment is almost \$1,900.

Pam Thomas, of Kamp Central Ambulance Services, said their heart monitor replacements cost \$48,800 for a monthly payment of \$1,144.

Those costs are in addition to

regular monthly expenses such as insurance and payroll.

Gunnoe said if her service got help with those payments they would try to give raises to their people in an attempt to retain and recruit workers — of which there are fewer and fewer. At Bruceton, drivers start at \$10, EMTs at \$12 and medics at \$15.

"Eventually I really believe seriously that Preston County is going to have to, the commission is going to have to have some kind of a fee. That would be based on

each household or general terms that's what I'm saying, each business or household. And I hope it's not much. But it would be something that everybody contributes."

Stone said while the CARES money needs to be taken advantage of to help with immediate needs it's not a renewable resource and she believes the commission is dedicated to setting up a system to help the services.

## WVU Medicine to offer COVID-19 booster shot

WVU Medicine

WVU Medicine will offer booster vaccines Friday at its vaccine clinic in the former Sears location at the Morgantown Mall. These boosters will be for to those who were vaccinated at least six months ago with the two-dose Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine

The vaccines will be provided by appointment only to the following patients:

- Those who are 65 years of age and older;
- Those who are 18 or older who are immunosuppressed and/or have other underlying conditions that put them at high risk of contracting COVID-19;
- Those who are 18 or older who are in frequent contact with others exposed to COVID-19.

No walk-ins will be accepted. Appointment availability is based on vaccine supply; distribution is controlled by the state and federal governments.

Appointments can be scheduled by using MyWVUChart, by calling 855-WVU-CARE, or by visiting [wvumedicine.org/info/booster-dose-clinic/](http://wvumedicine.org/info/booster-dose-clinic/).

Those who currently have COVID-19 are not eligible for the vaccine. Anyone who believes they may have COVID and have symptoms consistent with the virus should contact their primary care provider and obtain a test. WVU Medicine COVID-19 testing locations and hours can be found online at [wvumedicine.org/covid/testing-locations/](http://wvumedicine.org/covid/testing-locations/).

Those who received an initial series of the Moderna or the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccines are also ineligible.

## DO IT YOURSELF: FALL WREATHES

Make your own fall wreath for a fun decoration that welcomes autumn at your door step.

### This affordable craft is a great decoration, gift or hobby for autumn

With changing seasons comes time to change the wreath on your door, which in my case has been hanging there since the last DIY wreath instruction in this feature.

As leaves begin to change and drop and grasses and flowers dry, a new palette and new materials present themselves.

Embrace autumn by adding seasonal flare to your home via a wreath. This project is so customizable, the possibilities are endless.

Start with a bare wreath. You can make a wreath out of grape vines, wisteria branches, willow branches, an embroidery hoop, or any other circular object.

Next, gather decorative materials. Take a

walk in the woods or along a trail and look for interesting grasses, flowers, leaves, pine cones or other natural objects that strike your fancy.

You can also look for materials and inspiration in your kitchen and craft supply boxes. Cinnamon sticks, citrus sliced and dried along with other materials can all make your wreath look unique.

Next, check your craft supplies for twine, ribbon and other bits and bobs.

Using a simple wreath as a base, such as an embroidery hoop or simple wooden circular picture frame with glass removed, you can make a unique look by decorating in the center of the wreath rather than just along the edge.

Achieve this by filling the center with taut chicken wire (use wire, twine or heavy duty staples to secure along the edges) and then weave dried grasses through, attach dried fruit, or other decorations around the edges and into the center.

Another way to move away from the tra-

## A crash course in stopping for pedestrians

ON MY WAY TO WORK earlier this week, I obeyed traffic laws and stopped for a pedestrian — who appeared to be a WVU student.

She had activated the crosswalk lights at the intersection of Falling Run and University Avenue and watched as cars continued to zip by her.

Only after I stopped and a few more vehicles from the other direction plowed through the intersection did a driver do the same thing and allow the woman to cross safely.

Later that day, I saw something even more alarming on a four-lane road. A driver in the left lane obeyed a crosswalk and stopped for a pedestrian. A driver coming along in the right lane couldn't see the pedestrian and also didn't take the stopped car as a clue. That driver nearly hit the woman.

Around the same time, a friend posted a relevant message on social media. "Red lights are not a suggestion."

And neither is stopping for a pedestrian in a crosswalk.

Pedestrian safety is a matter of public health that Monongalia County Health Department takes seriously. It is also of particular interest to one of our former epidemiologists, who occasionally walked to work and noted that getting cars to stop at the awkward intersection of Van Voorhis Road and W.Va. 705 was very tricky.

It's especially important in a city like Morgantown, which has a large student population, excess traffic and is not known as the most walkable city.

After nearly 18 months of relative quiet in our streets due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the situation noticeably changed when WVU students returned in August. Around the same time, secondary school students also

ditional wreath limitations is to wrap twine across the diameter of the circle in one direction. Wrap a single layer of twine around until you have several inches width.

Into this band, weave the stems of dried flowers, fall foliage or other nat-

ural materials, so the flowers or leaves are above the twine but are secured into it.

Weave materials in densely, or leave space between for a more dramatic effect. This design works well with a range of colors, a limited palette or a monochrome style.

Of course, natural materials foraged at this time of year also work well with a

more traditional style. Gather dried grasses and bundle them. Secure one large bundle to your wreath for an asymmetrical result. Add smaller and shorter bundles to that same area if needed to fill it out.

Or you can secure to your base many small bundles of dried grasses, overlapping each other to fill the entire circumference of

the wreath.

Tuck in pine cones, acorns or other nuts. Rose hips are now on bushes and can add a pop of nice color to your wreath.

Enjoy some time outside as the weather cools to gather materials, and let them inspire you in your autumn wreath creation.

EMS services across the country, including the ones that serve Preston County, rarely collect the full bill for their services. Thomas said she budgets anticipating 50%-60% payment. In 2020, Kamp collected about \$500,000 less than it billed.

Commission President Don Smith asked the services to provide five years of that data to assist in figuring out what the average yearly shortfall is and what the EMS fee should be. He also said the fee needs to consider inflation and have a mechanism for automatic increases.

took to the streets again to walk to school or the bus stop.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2017, nearly 6,000 pedestrians were killed in traffic crashes in the United States, about one death every 88 minutes.

Additionally, CDC research states that an estimated 137,000 pedestrians were treated in an emergency department for nonfatal crash-related injuries in 2017. Per trip, the CDC adds, pedestrians are 1.5 times more likely than passenger vehicle occupants to be killed in a car accident.

In Morgantown, anyone who keeps up with the news has heard of instances in which individuals have been on the more dangerous end of a pedestrian vs. vehicle accident.

The CDC offers tips for pedestrians to make walking safer. Of course, we know that "crossing streets at a designated crosswalk or intersections whenever possible" still has its dangers. But it's better to cross at a designated location and then, obviously, keep an eye out for the vehicles that do not stop.

You've heard of driving defensively. It's even more important to cross defensively.

If it's nighttime, of course, you can increase

your visibility by carrying a flashlight and wearing reflect clothing.

We've all seen individuals walking on busy roads in Morgantown that lack sidewalks. While it's not recommended, if you find yourself in that situation, walk on the shoulder and facing traffic.

And we all understand the allure of wanting to jam while you walk, but keep in mind that listening to music, like using alcohol or drugs, will cause distractions and impair judgment and coordination.

When it comes to school-children, motorists should stop for school buses and also be careful around bus stops.

Parents can teach their children the acronym SAFE, as listed on the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration: Stay five steps away from the curb; Always wait until the bus comes to a complete stop and the bus driver signals for you to board; Face forward after finding a seat on the bus; and Exit the bus after it stops and look left-right-left for cars before crossing a street.

These tips mostly put the burden on pedestrians, who need to do their part by using crosswalks and staying alert. And it's all the more reason for motorists and pedestrians to be careful out there.

**Box covering Columbus statue to come down**

PHILADELPHIA — A judge has approved an emergency order to remove the plywood box covering the Christopher Columbus statue on Marconi Plaza in South Philly.

The order by Common Pleas Judge Paula Patrick was signed Saturday and is effective immediately. It was announced at a news conference Saturday afternoon at Marconi Plaza by an attorney for supporters of the statue who gathered at the statue's base.

“I have a crew on standby,” attorney George Bochetto said, adding they

could remove the box “if not tonight, first thing tomorrow morning.”

City officials immediately appealed Patrick's decision in Commonwealth Court with the emergency judge on duty.

“Removing the plywood covering during this holiday weekend would pose a serious public safety risk,” the city's appeal stated. “A key purpose of the box was to quell civil unrest and violence between groups of individuals on opposing sides of the debate over Columbus's place in history.”

It was unclear, though, what action the city would

take if someone tried to remove the statue's covering before a decision.

Bochetto had said Friday: “We're going to make sure that, by the time the Columbus Day parade concludes at Marconi Plaza on Sunday, that that box is down. If the city doesn't take it down, we'll take it down for them.”

Patrick on Friday had ordered the city to remove the box, which the city has appealed.

About two dozen people attended the news conference Saturday afternoon, and Bochetto's comments were punctuated by calls to arrest Mayor Jim Kenney and a cry of “Viva Columbus!” Behind Bochetto was the veiled statue, and in front of him an empty grandstand erected for the Broad Street Run Sunday.

“It's not right,” said Jody DellaBarba, an organizer of Sunday's parade who handed out Italian flags at the news conference. “It's not right to go against an ethnic group.”



## Bohanon's career day leads Baylor past West Virginia 45-20

WACO, Texas — Gerry Bohanon saw something in his Baylor teammates during the week with the offense coming off a poor showing that helped knocked the Bears out of the Top 25.

Whatever the quarterback saw showed up on game day.

Bohanon had career highs of 336 yards passing and four touchdowns, including a 75-yarder to Tyquan Thornton on the second play of the game, while also scoring on a 1-yard sneak in Baylor's 45-20 victory over West Virginia on Saturday.

Thornton caught eight passes for a career-best 187 yards and two TDs as the Bears scored on four of their first five possessions a week after starting with eight consecutive punts in a 24-14 loss to Oklahoma State right after

Baylor had entered the poll. "That wasn't our offense," Bonahon said. "So this week, we had a really good week, like a really, really good week. Just stacked days on days this week and we knew we were going to come out and dominate. We knew last week, we couldn't do that anymore."

With the Bears (5-1, 3-1 Big 12) celebrating the 10th anniversary of Robert Griffin III's Heisman Trophy season by showing frequent highlights, Bohanon was 18 of 29 with no interceptions, giving the fourth-year junior 183 career attempts without a pick.

Jarret Doege was sacked six times, and the Mountaineers (2-4, 0-3) again couldn't get the Big 12's worst run game going. West Virginia, which had 90 mostly empty yards rush-

## Neal Brown needs to give glimpse of future on offense

A week after WVU head coach Neal Brown said he was "pissed" about the Mountaineers' performance against Texas Tech, they suffered their first blowout loss at Baylor on Saturday in Waco.

Outside of the first five minutes, the game was never close, and it was ugly all around on offense and defense in a 45-20 loss.

After showing improvement in Year 2 under Brown, WVU now sits at 2-4 and appears to have taken a major step back in

Year 3, which has many questioning whether "The Climb," which Brown coined when he arrived in Morgantown in January 2019, is the right choice for the program.

The problem is a climb continues to go up, and a 0-3 start to Big 12 play has fingers slipping off the rung.

Brown has to do something, especially on offense. Trying to do the same thing week in and week out isn't getting the job done, and with Brown's seat getting warmer and warmer — I say this knowing he will definitely be back for Year 4 — he needs to provide hope to a fan base that is questioning whether he's the right man for the job.

# No. 4 Mountaineers suffer first setback at NIU

The No. 4-ranked West Virginia University men's soccer team fell to Northern Illinois, 2-0, on Saturday afternoon at the NIU Soccer Complex in DeKalb, Illinois.

The Mountaineers conceded a 35th-minute goal before the Huskies added a second in the final minutes of the fixture, handing WVU its first loss of the 2021 campaign. It marked the club's first setback since April 7, 2021, at Akron.

"I think we can learn from the

nature of which the game played out," WVU coach Dan Stratford said. "We were out-competed in the first half. We knew (NIU) would be aggressive and energized for this game, and they showed a greater appetite for it in the first half than we did. We showed some courage in the second half and improved, but again, we haven't been able to find a goal when we really needed it."

WVU (6-1-4, 0-1-1 MAC) tallied just one shot in the first half. Meanwhile, Northern Illinois (10-

1, 2-0 MAC) brought some early pressure into the final third, forcing fifth-year senior goalkeeper Steven Tekesky into a pair of early saves.

Then, the Huskies opened the scoring in the 35th minute when the hosts pounced on a loose ball inside the box off a corner kick. It was the first time West Virginia trailed at any point in a match this season.

The Huskies led, 1-0, after 45 minutes.

In the second half, the Mountaineers created two scoring chances in the 49th minute, as senior forward Tony Pineda and sophomore midfielder Ryan Crooks each put a shot on goal. Perhaps WVU's best scoring opportunity of the day, however, came in the 68th minute. That's when redshirt sophomore defender Bjarne Thiesen nearly tied the game on a shot sent toward the back post, which was shoved away by the NIU keeper.

The Huskies went on to score their second goal in the 88th minute to take a 2-0 lead and close the door on a potential Mountaineer comeback. NIU held a 9-6 advantage in shots on the day, including 6-3 in shots on goal. WVU recorded eight corner kicks, to NIU's four.

Next up, WVU continues its four-match road trip by traveling to Western Michigan for its second straight Mid-American Conference fixture on Saturday, Oct. 16, in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

West Virginia is 14-2 all-time against Memphis. WVU last shot against the Tigers in the regular season on Nov. 3, 2019, at the R.F. Fogleman Rifle Range in Memphis, Tennessee. The Mountaineers defeated

the Tigers, 4714-4654, and captured a 2339-2306 score in smallbore and a 2375-2348 mark in air rifle.

Of note, former Mountaineer great and two-time individual NCAA champion Morgan Phillips returns to Morgantown to lead Memphis as the interim head coach.

WVU picked up a pair of top-10 road victories last week to rise to the top of the Collegiate Rifle Coaches Association (CRCA) national poll. The Mountaineers began the week by defeating then-No. 2 Ole Miss, 4733-4683, on Oct. 2, in Oxford, Mississippi. West Virginia then traveled to Murray, Kentucky, on Oct. 3, and defeated then-No. 8

Murray State, 4725-4674.

**Women's soccer**

The No.9-ranked Mountaineers conclude their two-game road swing through the Sunflower State with a match at Kansas today. Kickoff at KU's Rock Chalk Park is tabbed for 2 p.m.

Today's match will be streamed live on Big 12 Now on ESPN+, while live stats also are available at WVUsports.com.

In its first road match of the Big 12 slate, West Virginia played to a 1-1 draw at Kansas State, at Buser Family Park in Manhattan, Kansas, on Oct. 7. The Mountaineers were on the board early, with an eighth-

minute score from sophomore midfielder Lilly McCarthy, her second goal in as many games. However, WVU allowed a KSU tally just 10 minutes later, and the final score stood from there, despite West Virginia's 10 shots on goal throughout the 110-minute match.

Thursday's contest showed another dominating statistical performance from the Mountaineers, as the squad tallied 17 shots, including 10 on frame, compared to K-State's eight shots with three on goal. WVU created eight corner-kick opportunities, while the West Virginia defense once again didn't allow its opponent to record a single

corner for the second straight contest.

Sunday's contests marks the 12th meeting all-time between West Virginia and Kansas, as the Mountaineers hold an 8-2-1 lead in the series. In last season's match, Stefany Ferrer-vanGinkel scored a pair of goals to help the No. 6 Mountaineers earn a 2-1 win over the No. 11-ranked Jayhawks. WVU and KU have met in the regular season each year since WVU joined the conference in 2012, as well as a pair of meetings in the Big 12 Tournament. West Virginia is unbeaten against Kansas in the last two seasons.

## Mountaineers defense bitten by Baylor play-action fakes

Baylor was second in the Big 12 in rushing prior to Saturday's game against WVU, averaging just over 240 yards per game, so the Mountaineers were expecting a heavy dose of the Bears' ground game.

Baylor, though, figured WVU was going to sell out to stop the run, and had a stellar game plan to counteract that.

Time and time again in the first half, the Bears ran play-action, faking the run game and throwing the ball deep or on quick, immediate slant routes.

"We knew they were going to try and take shots on us, especially early to get a big lead," senior defensive tackle Sante Stills said. "Coming into the game, it was all run — run, run run, run run — they're a big heavy run team."

"We just struggled in the pass-

ing game, getting to the quarterback and defending (in the secondary)."

Baylor finished with 525 yards of total offense — 354 in the air and 171 on the ground.

**Scottie Young, Wyatt Milum don't play**

Senior safety Scottie Young did not make the trip to Baylor after starting the first four games at Spear for the Mountaineers.

"He was not healthy, I'll leave it at that," Brown said.

Jackie Matthews got the start in his place and practiced at Spear all week because Young was out.

Brown went on to say WVU's issues in pass coverage — allowing 354 yards on just 31 attempts — were not because Young missed the game.

"Jackie Matthews has been splitting time there at the Spear anyway, and Jackie got all the reps

this week at practice," Brown said. "I don't mean that as a discredit to Scottie, but our inability to cover didn't have anything to do with him not playing."

Safety Kerry Martin also didn't make the trip, though Brown did not say why. Martin didn't make the trip to Oklahoma on Sept. 25, either, but did dress last week at home against Texas Tech.

True freshman offensive tackle Wyatt Milum was injured in the first half last week and didn't play the rest of the game. Brown said Milum was at about 75-80%, but the reward wasn't worth the risk of playing him against the Bears.

"He didn't play because he wasn't at 100%," Brown said. "I don't think it's fair to a true freshman who's going to have a great career here to put him out there in that situation where he wasn't full speed. At that point, you lose a

player's confidence and I wasn't going to do that with him.

"He would have helped us but that's not fair to him. This is a long-term deal and he's going to start on this o-line for a long time."

**Timeout on first offensive play**

After using two timeouts on offense last week against Texas Tech, the Mountaineers did it again Saturday, but this time, it was on the first offensive play of the game.

Brown, though, didn't sound happy with the officiating, though he would not elaborate further.

"To be honest, I think it's poor officiating," Brown said. "I'm not going to get into it. We've had issues, but it's better for me not to talk about it, I'll say that, but I'm not real pleased with that aspect, either."

Jarret Doege has started 18 games in his career at quarterback. Leddie Brown was an all-conference running back a year ago, but is on the backside of his college career. The wide receivers have been inconsistent for two years now. The offensive line has been the biggest disappointment on the team.

While it's not an indictment on some of the veterans on the Mountaineers' offense, which has struggled most of the season, especially in the second half, it's time to get a look at the future — what do you have in quarterback Garrett Greene, running back Justin Johnson, wide receiver Kaden Prather and offensive line-

man Jordan White?

The offense that was on the field for most of the 4th quarter against the Bears should get a chance regularly in meaningful snaps. With as often as it's brought up that Brown inherited a bare cupboard from Dana Holgorsen, those four were all a part of Brown's two full recruiting classes in 2020 and 2021 and are freshmen, with Greene and White redshirting last year. Johnson and Prather are true freshmen.

The offense is stale and you know what you have in Doege, someone who will stand in the pocket and try to make a throw. Greene's skill set is the polar opposite, making a majority of his plays with his legs.

As good as Leddie Brown is, his future is more in the NFL than with the

Mountaineers. Giving Johnson, or sophomore Tony Mathis, more playing time can help build for 2022.

Brown mentioned on his weekly radio show Thursday that Prather was going to get the start at Baylor, and while he did, he did not see a lot of playing time on offense after the first quarter.

Prather, a 4-star recruit from Maryland who already has the build of a senior at 6-foot-4 and 210 pounds, has a very high ceiling. Getting him reps now could pay dividends down the line.

White is playing more and more already at right guard, replacing Doug Nester, who hasn't played well in recent weeks.

This isn't to say the offense will instantly be fixed, nor is it saying Neal Brown doesn't know how

to use his personnel.

He needs to show there is hope beyond 2021. Playing the future of the program right now is a good step in doing that.

Heading into the bye week, the coaches need to come up with something to get a firm grasp back on the rung, because right now, many are barely hanging on.

ing, has lost its first three conference games for the second time since joining the league in 2012.

"We didn't consistently block them, and we never covered them," coach Neal Brown said. "If you can't block them on offense and you don't cover them on defense it's going to be a long day. And it was."

Thornton caught Bohanon's first pass 7 yards from the line of scrimmage, split the defense and ran untouched on a play that was 3 yards shy of the longest of the senior's career.

"We haven't covered Thornton yet," Brown said. "He may still be running out there wide open."

The Mountaineers needed just 1:38 to get even when Sean Ryan caught a 12-yard pass from Doege that was tipped by Baylor safety Christian Morgan.

Doege was 24 of 37 for 272 yards with a touchdown and was replaced with the game out of reach by Garrett Greene, who had a 13-yard scoring run late.

Baylor scored the next 21 points, including a delayed TD signal on Bohanon's sneak, a score set up by Jalen Pitre's interception at the West Virginia 48.

**Steelers, Broncos meet with questions at QB**

PITTSBURGH — The number of Ben Roethlisberger doubters is growing by the week. Roethlisberger isn't among them. Neither is Denver Broncos coach Vic Fangio.

Fangio remains plenty wary of the 39-year-old Pittsburgh quarterback as the Broncos (3-1) travel to Heinz Field to take on the struggling Steelers (1-3).

"The one thing is that there's a narrative out there that he's gone down and I don't see that," Fangio said. "I've been watching this guy a long time. He's still capable of doing everything he's always done. He throws a great deep ball and has good pocket feel. I don't buy into that narrative at all."

Roethlisberger is the 27th-rated quarterback in the NFL, has thrown as many interceptions as many touchdowns (four) and is dealing with injuries to both his left pectoral and his hips.

"Well, we know it's early," Roethlisberger said. "We've played some good football teams and we feel like we're making some progress. We just have to find a way to, at the end of the game, have a 'W' on the board. You can play well and all those things and get better, but at the end of the day, you want to win the football game."

The Steelers haven't dropped four straight since 2016. That team recovered from the mid-season swoon to reach the AFC championship game. This group simply needs to find a way of falling further behind in what looks to be an ultra-competitive AFC North.

Even with the Broncos off to their best start since 2017, they remain a work in progress. Their first three wins were against teams who are a combined 2-10. A dismal blowout loss to Baltimore at home last week — a game in which starting quarterback Teddy

Bridgewater left with a concussion — did little to silence their skeptics.

A win in Pittsburgh,

even against the current semi-disjointed version of the Steelers, would go a long way to showing Fangio is making progress in his fourth season.

"It's not the loss this past Sunday that defines you as a football team, it's how you respond to a loss that defines you as a good football team," Denver defensive end Shelby Harris said.

"Practice this week has to be more amped than it's been in weeks prior, and then it can't just stop there right. It has to carry over to a tough environment going into Pittsburgh and finding a way to win on Sunday."

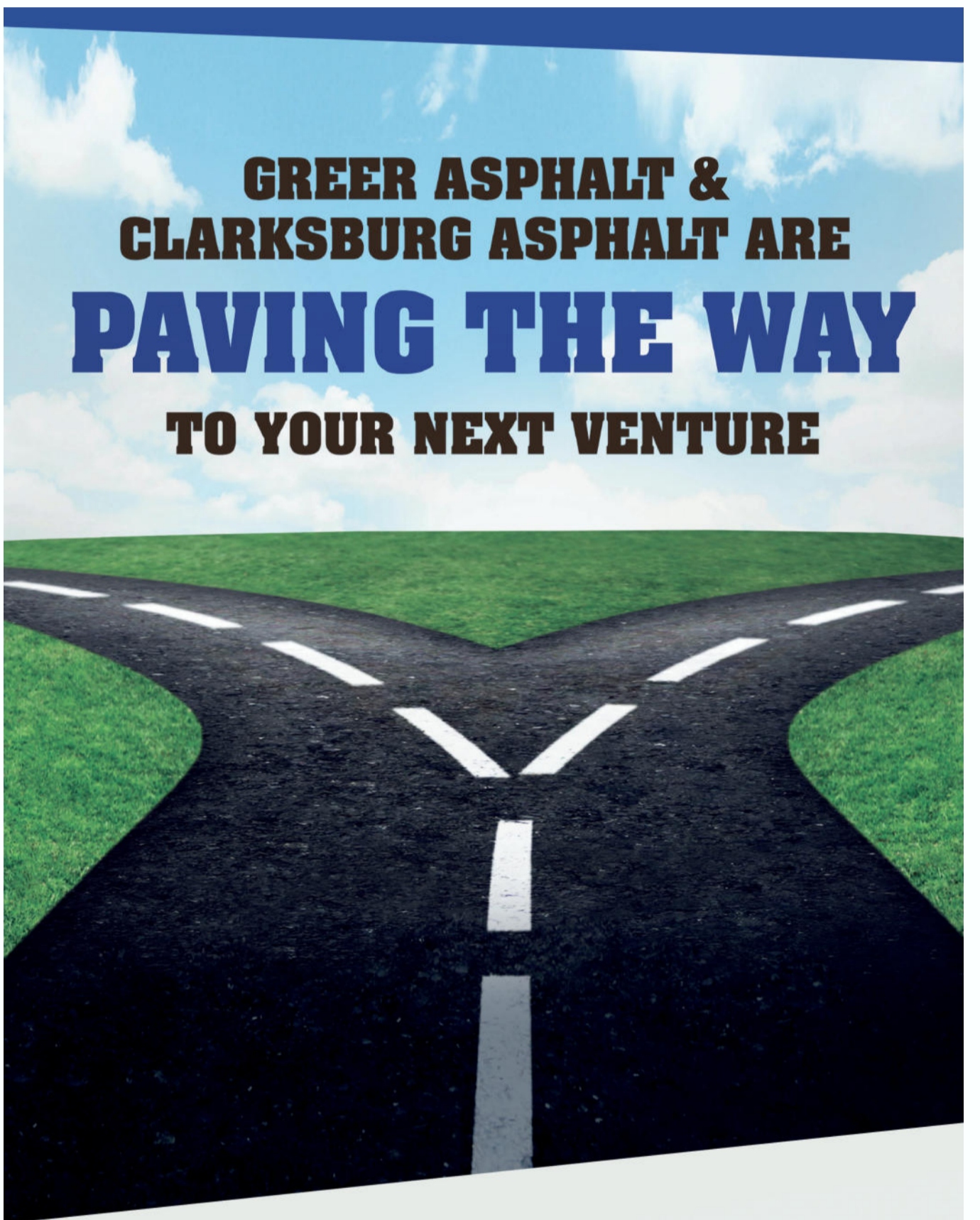
Bridgewater spent the week in the concussion

protocol, meaning there's a chance Drew Lock gets the start. Lock started in Pittsburgh during Denver's visit in Week 2 last year before being knocked out with a shoulder injury in the first quarter of what became a 26-21 loss.

Lock didn't exactly thrive after going in for an injured Bridgewater against the Ravens. He completed just 12 of 21 passes for 113 yards with an interception, though Fangio made it a point to lay the blame on an entire offense that managed just 254 yards.

"I still think his below-average play was just a part of our whole offense that day," Fangio said. "We just weren't very good offensively last Sunday."

The Steelers haven't been good offensively all season. That needs to change and change quickly if they want the questions about whether Roethlisberger's issues are fixable or not to stop.

Stroud and the Buckeyes

(5-1, 3-0 Big Ten) had their way with Terps. The freshman quarterback was 24 for 33 for 406 yards and threw two touchdown passes each to star wideouts Chris Olave and Garrett Wilson against a depleted Maryland secondary before taking a seat after three quarters.

### Boise State 26 (10) BYU 17

PROVO, Utah — Hank Bachmeier threw for 172

yards and Boise State forced four turnovers in an upset victory over No. 10 BYU.

Cyrus Habibi-Likio ran for a season-high 75 yards and a touchdown, and Andrew Van Buren added a season-high 60 yards and a touchdown. The Broncos (3-3) snapped a two-game losing streak in the series.

### (11) Michigan State 31 Rutgers 13

PISCATAWAY, N.J. —

Jalen Nailor caught touchdown passes of 63, 63 and 65 yards from Payton Thorne and No. 11 Michigan State used its big-play offense to remain unbeaten with a victory over Rutgers.

Kenneth Walker, who came into the game leading all Football Bowl Subdivision players in rushing, ran for 233 yards, including a school-record 94-yard touchdown.

### (17) Ole Miss 52 (13) Arkansas 51

OXFORD, Miss. — Sam Williams and Tavarius Robinson pressured Arkansas quarterback KJ Jefferson on a potential game-winning 2-point conversion and No. 17 Mississippi held on for a wild victory against the 13th-ranked Razorbacks after allowing a touchdown in the final play of regulation.

Jefferson rolled right on the two-point try and under extended pressure from Williams and Robinson, overthrew Treyton Burks in the end zone.

# Oklahoma pulls off comeback against Texas

DALLAS — Kennedy Brooks ran for 217 yards and two go-ahead touchdowns in the fourth quarter, including a 33-yard romp with 3 seconds left, and sixth-ranked Oklahoma beat No. 21 Texas 55-48 on Saturday in the Red River rivalry that will soon move to the Southeastern Conference.

The Sooners (6-0, 3-0 Big 12), who benched starting quarterback Spencer Rattler in favor of Caleb Williams, appeared to be trying to set up for a game-ending field goal when Brooks instead broke free for a sprint to the end zone.

Oklahoma hadn't even led until Brooks had an 18-yard score with 7:10 left that made it 48-41. His rush was the first play from

scrimmage after OU tied the game and kicked off to Xavier Worthy, who had the ball stripped away by Caleb Kelly.

Worthy did have nine catches for 261 yards and two scores, and his 31-yard TD catch tied the game with 1:32 left before the

winning drive by the Sooners.

Texas (4-2, 2-1) had a 14-0 lead less than two minutes into the game. The Longhorns, who had won three in a row since a loss to future SEC foe Arkansas in Week 2, had never lost when scoring at least 48 points.

The Sooners overcame a 21-point deficit, matching the second-largest comeback in program history. And when it was over, Oklahoma students who were part of the sellout crowd at 92,100-seat Cotton Bowl Stadium streamed onto the field to celebrate with their team.

Williams ran for a 66-yard score and completed 15 of 24 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns after replacing Rattler, who had two turnovers in the first

half that led to Texas touchdowns. Rattler did return to throw the tying 2-point conversion after Williams' 52-yard TD pass to Marvin Mims with 7:25 left.

Mims had five catches for 136 yards, including his first two touchdowns of the season.

Longhorns quarterback Casey Thompson, whose father played for Oklahoma, was 20-of-34 passing for 388 yards and five touchdowns even though he banged his thumb early in the game. Bijan Robinson ran 20 times for 137 yards and an early touchdown.

Gabe Brkic kicked four field goals (26, 29, 35 and 40 yards) for the Sooners, but after the last run instead kicked his fifth extra point.

# Wells rallies Marshall past Old Dominion in OT

HUNTINGTON — Grant Wells threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to Shadeed Ahmed in overtime to give Marshall a 20-13 victory over Old Dominion on Saturday.

Wells forced overtime with a 52-yard touchdown pass to Willie Johnson with 33 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, capping an eight-play, 75-yard drive for Marshall (3-3, 1-1 Conference USA). Old Dominion's Nick Rice, who had made field goals from 47 and 45 yards, was short on a 58-yard attempt as time expired.

Old Dominion (1-2, 1-5) couldn't convert on fourth-and-7 to end it.

Wells was 30 of 46 passing for 299 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. Ahmed had seven receptions for 77 yards and Johnson finished with three catches for 63.

D.J. Mack Jr. threw a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ali Jennings III in the first quarter for the Monarchs (1-2, 1-5). Blake Watson ran for 168 yards on 26 carries.

### Tennessee 45 South Carolina 20

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Hendon Hooker threw for 225 yards and three touchdowns to lead Tennessee to a victory over South Carolina.

The Volunteers (4-2, 2-1) led 35-0 in the second quarter before the Gamecocks (3-3, 0-3) staged a recovery.

Vols' running back Tiyon Evans rushed for 119 yards and a touchdown before leaving midway through the third quarter with an injury.

South Carolina's Kevin Harris scored from a yard out to start the fourth quarter. A missed two-point conversion made the score 38-20. Tennessee's offense generated just 25 offensive yards in the third quarter. Len'Neth Whitehead, replacing the injured Evans at running back, scored Tennessee's last TD from two yards.

Trailing by 31 midway through the third quarter, South Carolina had fourth-and-9 on the Tennessee 44. Punter Kai Kroeger hit wide-open Payton Mangrum with what turned out to be a scoring pass and a 38-14 difference.

A 28-0 first-quarter lead blossomed to 38-7 by halftime. Hooker completed 15 of 20 passes for 217 yards and three scores in the first 30 minutes.

### Georgia Tech 31 Duke 27

DURHAM, N.C. — Adonias Sanders caught a 36-yard touchdown throw from Jeff Sims with 51 seconds left to help Georgia Tech rally past Duke.

The Yellow Jackets (3-3, 2-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) got the ball with 1:42 left and no timeouts at their own 12-yard line. But Sims targeted Sanders for the two big plays on the go-

ahead drive, first when he beat Jeremiah Lewis deep down the right side for a 37-yard gain.

Those were Sanders' only catches of the game.

Duke (3-3, 0-2) had one more drive to respond and

crossed midfield, but Juanyeh Thomas intercepted an overthrown ball from Gunnar Holmberg over the middle with 15 seconds left to seal this one.

Sims threw for 297 yards and three touchdowns with two interceptions for Georgia Tech, which scored the game's first 14 points but found itself in a tight finish to the final seconds. One of those three scoring throws was a 77-

yard pass to Jahmyr Gibbs — who was left completely uncovered coming out of the backfield for an easy catch-and-run on the left side on the Yellow Jackets' first possession.

### Virginia 34 Louisville 33

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Virginia quarterback Brennan Armstrong threw for 487 yards, capping that performance with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Grant Misch with 22 seconds left to give the Cavaliers a stunning comeback victory over Louisville.

Virginia (4-2, 2-2 Atlantic Coast Conference) trailed 30-13 with 89 seconds left in the third quarter before starting its comeback, but then they had to watch the Cardinals (3-3, 1-2) have one last chance.

Malik Cunningham got them to the Virginia 31 in those final seconds. However, James Turner's 49-yard field goal attempt as time expired sailed left and the Cavaliers rushed out of Cardinal Stadium with an improbable victory.

Armstrong completed 40-of-60 passes with three touchdowns and two interceptions.

At halftime, they gave up 20 points in the third quarter. Louisville mounted its comeback behind junior running back Hassan Hall, who ran for 162 yards on 14 carries.

The truth about soils nutrients and plant nutrition for deer

It's bow season and so for the next few weeks I'm going to write about deer.

Even though some of my deer hunting readers don't believe in scientific research, I do, and so the articles will be based on the latest science.

For those readers who don't understand the last sentence let me give my thoughts.

Some hunters only believe what they see in the woods. They might have only seen it once.

They might have only seen it on their property, they might have seen it in mid-summer or late winter, but to them it is gospel and no

science based on large data sets will change their mind. Actually I find that sad, but it happens a lot.

Hunters spend a lot of money putting soil nutrients on their hunting lands to improve the nutrients needed for growth of deer.

Dr. Craig Harper is a professor at the University of Texas and knows more about this topic than anyone alive. He and his graduate students have done numerous research projects on how to manage forests for deer, especially studies on how to get good deer foods growing there.

He looked into the question of whether improving soil nutrients actually translates into better forage nutrition for deer.

He looked at 11 deer forage plant species in 12 states with a wide range of soil quality. He was particularly interested in crude

protein, potassium, phosphorus, and calcium.

Did the availability of these nutrients in plants and the amount of growth of these plants vary with soils? I won't go through the analysis, but the results were surprising and conclusive.

Soil quality had almost no relationship to forage quality. Soil productivity did not alter plant nutrients in pokeweed, sumac, ragweed, and many other tested species. Soil nutrients are a weak predictor of forage nutrients.

Who knew? The nutrients in those plants did not vary at all. Each plant species had the same macro and micro nutrients regardless of soil type.

What quality actually changes is the plant yield. So you can fertilize or add nutrients to the soil and it doesn't change the plant nutrients, but it does

change the amount of forage you get for each species.

Farmers improve soils for their fields all the time, and this gives them more alfalfa, or whatever species they are growing.

Dr. Harper is a major proponent of managing forests and fields for forbs for deer. Forbs are not grasses, but rather are herbaceous flowering plants. Some are labeled as "weeds," but deer love forbs.

Forbs are non woody and usually have broad leaves. If it isn't grass and if it doesn't have woody stems, then it is probably a forb.

Bees love forbs and go to their flowers. Monarch butterflies go to milkweed, which is a forb.

Ragweed is another common forb. Ragweeds are not a farmers friend, but in the summer deer eat a lot of ragweed. You

can plant all the food plots you want, but if you improve your forest areas, you'll get more pounds per acre of forbs than whatever you planted in the food plots.

Harper has done a lot of work with fire to improve forb yields for deer. Cutting trees can also do that.

Just remove non-native trees and shrubs and more sunlight will hit the ground and forb yields will shoot up. This approach can also allow white oaks to produce more acorns for deer.

Harper believes that it's a lot cheaper to use fire to increase forest forbs than it is to plant food plots.

It's easier and cheaper and you get more high quality food for deer. The vast majority of eastern forests could stand to be improved for deer by adding skylights, and the same is probably true of

most of the forested cover where you hunt.

Unmanaged forests quickly become shady and unproductive for deer.

You'll be biting off too much at once if you dive in and try to apply timber improvements to every acre of forest you hunt. Be strategic. Select small stands or patches to tackle each year.

Use this approach and Dr. Harpers idea of managing for high-quality forbs, rather than worry about soil minerals, relative to deer getting adequate nutrition works.

Kevin Harvick out to stave off playoff elimination

CONCORD, N.C. — This is it for Kevin Harvick, a winner of nine races just last year and now on the verge of his earliest career playoff knockout. The steadiest guy in the garage is winless this season — he's on a 38-race losing streak — and needs a big day at Charlotte Motor Speedway to avoid playoff elimination.

Harvick has made it through the second round of the playoffs every year since the elimination format started in 2014, the year he won his only Cup title. Harvick is such a solid bet to be a contender because he's always in the hunt,

always among the leaders, and he's advanced to the championship round in five of seven seasons. And yet he heads to the Roval at Charlotte on Sunday ranked ninth in the standings, the first driver below the cutline. The field will be trimmed from 12 to eight after this race, and Harvick lags nine points below the final transfer position.

Harvick, the same guy who slammed his helmet in rage after on-track shenanigans with reigning

champion Chase Elliott cost him a win last month, was surreally serene headed into the make-or-break race.

"I'm kind of a creature of habit, do the same things on a weekly basis, and it's just another race," Harvick said. "I know that sounds cliché and boring and all the things that come with that, but you just have to go out there and do what you do, the best you can, and see where it falls."

It's been a bad year at Stewart-Haas Racing and Harvick and the No. 4 team are the biggest losers. They dominated all the way up until the third-round finale last season and this year have been fairly mediocre.

His eight top-fives and 21 top-10s are the lowest since 2012, but even in that uncharacteristically off year Harvick still won one race. Harvick's best shot was at Bristol in the first-round finale but Elliott, angry at Harvick over another on-track incident, intentionally slowed Harvick to help Hendrick Motorsports teammate Kyle Larson catch Harvick and steal the win.

The second round has been OK — Harvick was ninth at Las Vegas, and he was running eighth on Monday when Talladega was called for rain — but that's not good enough. Harvick, Christopher Bell of Joe Gibbs Racing and Hen-

drick teammates William Byron and Alex Bowman are all below the cutline going into the Roval, a hybrid track that uses both the road course and oval at Charlotte Motor Speedway.

Denny Hamlin is the only driver locked into the third round and Harvick doesn't need a win to advance. It's tight right ahead of him and Kyle Busch and Elliott are tied for the final two spots, only nine points ahead of Harvick. Ryan Blaney, in sixth, only has a 15-point cushion.

A top-five for Harvick coupled with a disaster for any of the other three might be enough to get Harvick through to the next round. "I've had a lot worse sea-

sons, I know that for sure," said Harvick, a 20-year veteran who turns 46 in December. "I've lived through a whole bunch that are way worse than this one."

The 2001 season is top of Harvick's mind, his rookie year when he was called up the week after Dale Earnhardt's fatal crash in the season-opening Daytona 500. Harvick ran both the Cup and then-Busch Series that season, a grueling 68 races that ended with NASCAR's second-tier championship.

"I personally have been through some pretty tough years and this one has just been a struggle because (we've) had to work so hard to get everything that we have," Harvick said.

## Goodbye Columbus Day, hello Indigenous People's Day

On Oct. 1, two members of the Human Rights Commission, Don Spencer and Bonnie Brown, met with The Dominion Post Editorial Board to discuss the commission's proposal to Morgantown City Council to exchange Columbus Day for Indigenous People's Day.

Unfortunately, the HRC won't be able to formally present its proposed change until after this year's Columbus Day has come and gone, but we wholeheartedly agree that Morgantown should observe the second Monday in October as Indigenous People's Day beginning in 2022.

This isn't about being "politically correct" or "woke." It's not "cancel culture." It's about celebrating something that is *actually* part of America's past — and present, and future.

To be brief: Christopher Columbus didn't "discover" America. He landed in the Caribbean, on an island that's part of the Bahamas. The United States of America gets its name from Amerigo Vespucci, a merchant who sailed after Columbus and "found" Trinidad, Haiti, the Cape Verde Islands and Brazil. In a European publication of the time, it was suggested this "new world" be called Americus or America. And so South America got its European name, later extended to North America. (For more information about Columbus' arrival in the New World, please see Max Flomen's essay on C2.)

There are a lot of quotation marks in the paragraph above because the land these Europeans arrived upon wasn't empty: There were people here, and there had been for thousands of years.

But to the new arrivals, the indigenous population weren't people: At best, they were potential slaves — lesser beings to be used and abused. At worst, they were an obstacle standing in the way of colonizers and therefore had to be destroyed.

Is that what we want to celebrate? As much as Columbus' history has been sanitized and glorified, the history of indigenous peoples has been suppressed, erased and villainized.

Brown, who in addition to her role on the HRC is the Native American Studies program coordinator at WVU, said that she's encountered people who don't think Native Americans still exist. That is how effective the erasure has been.

And that's why we should swap Columbus Day for Indigenous People's Day — to learn about and celebrate a people who are integral to our nation's past, present and future.

This one day could become the focal point around which schools teach *real* American history — not about a European man who never stepped foot on American soil, but about the millions of people who called this land home for 23,000 years, who had languages, arts, societies, religions and more — and how all that was almost entirely lost.

We strongly encourage council to adopt the resolution to observe Indigenous People's Day instead of Columbus Day, becoming one of 139 cities to do so. In Fact, we'd like to see Indigenous People's Day become a statewide, even a nationwide, holiday in the near future.



### 'Even in govt., Job No. 1 is to pay your bills'

Sen. Capito has been playing partisan games long enough.

The most urgent issues deal with budget processes such as the debt limit and a "reconciliation" bill.

Capito voted for huge tax cuts for billionaires, then voted for massive spending, but now votes against raising the debt limit, risking a default by the federal government. Analyses show this would wipe out trillions of dollars of net worth, raise interest rates and likely spark an economic recession. The debt limit has always

been a bipartisan policy process, but Capito is now deferring to partisan Republicans who want to score political points. Capito voted for the tax cuts *and* the spending, but now refuses to pay for it.

Even in the government, Job No. 1 is to pay your bills.

The reconciliation bill has numerous provisions to reignite West Virginia's economy, but Capito opposes that, too. It seems like she wants to keep West Virginia locked into the current, last-place economy, instead of giving us a meaningful chance to transform our economy and create thousands of good jobs.

We Republicans used to be financially responsible and good for our economy, but Capito does not want to do that job. She should support West Virginia getting the investment we need.

## Corruption abroad, but what about thieving here?

**MY FIRST REACTION WHEN I READ THE SECRET DETAILS FROM THE PANDORA PAPERS ABOUT HOW THE WORLD'S RICH HIDE THEIR ASSETS WAS:** What else is new?

Do we need 11.9 million records leaked from 14 firms in the offshore financial services industries and an international consortium of investigative journalists, including media partners like The Washington Post, to tell us that Vladimir Putin's alleged mistress bought a luxury apartment in Monaco? Or that Jordan's king amassed \$100 million in concealed property in Malibu, Calif., London and Washington? Ditto for Azerbaijan or Kenya?

Kremlin corruption under Putin and his oligarchs is legendary, and any Jordanian can talk of financial folderol in the royal palace. Is anyone startled when the investigators claim to have information on more than 330 politicians and public officials from over 90 countries and territories, including many leaders?

No, because we — myself included — have become too inured to this stuff. In 2016 the Panama Papers, a similar investigative journalism cull, laid bare the corruption of the offshore banking industry, and nothing much happened. Now the Pandora Papers claim to have dirt on twice as many public officials. So?

Indeed, spiraling public corruption has not only

become the new normal abroad but is ensconced at home, where the Trump presidency made it a central feature of the White House. In fact, what bothered me most, in my initial reading of the Pandora Papers' details, was that they didn't focus enough on corruption here.

So I turned to Sarah Chayes, a leading expert on global and U.S. corruption networks and the links between them and author of "Thieves of State: Why Corruption Threatens Global Security, followed by On Corruption in America, and What Is at Stake."

"I am disappointed in the anti-corruption movement for not coming to grips with how we parallel corruption in other countries," she told me, "and for not taking on corruption power structures in our own [Western] countries."

Chayes came up against the links between U.S. and developing world corruption networks in Afghanistan, where I first met her in 2009 in Kabul dressed in military fatigues. She had already run a development organization in Kandahar for several years

and then had helped establish an anti-corruption task force as a special adviser to Gen. Stanley McChrystal, the commander of international troops in Afghanistan.

Her anti-corruption efforts, and those of military officials who backed her, were thwarted by networks of Afghan officials, who reinvented their relatives as businessmen, and U.S. policies that fed piles of money to these Afghan networks for aid and training.

What she learned there informs how she regards the Pandora Papers exposé.

U.S. aid officials knew their money was disappearing, but never explored the links between Afghan ministers and governors and heads of companies that got to bid on U.S. contracts. U.S. contractors and consultants padded their budgets and proposed projects that were clearly unworkable but earned them a hefty overhead.

Afghanistan's elites were grouped in networks of political leaders, businessmen, and criminals. "They were incredibly successful at enriching themselves," she says, "but were not even trying to govern."

These corrupt networks were similar to Kremlin elites, where oligarchs close to Putin fatten off the state in networks intertwined with criminals who often act as enforcers. Similar patterns no doubt fit leaders of other failing states incriminated by the Pandora Papers.

"Afghanistan brings it all together in a profound way," says Chayes, who recently wrote a Foreign Affairs article headlined "Afghanistan's Corruption Was Made in America." "It was not just a foreign policy disaster. It is a mirror of our system, which is more corrupt than many of us are willing to admit."

Chayes worries that a focus on corruption abroad "reinforces the

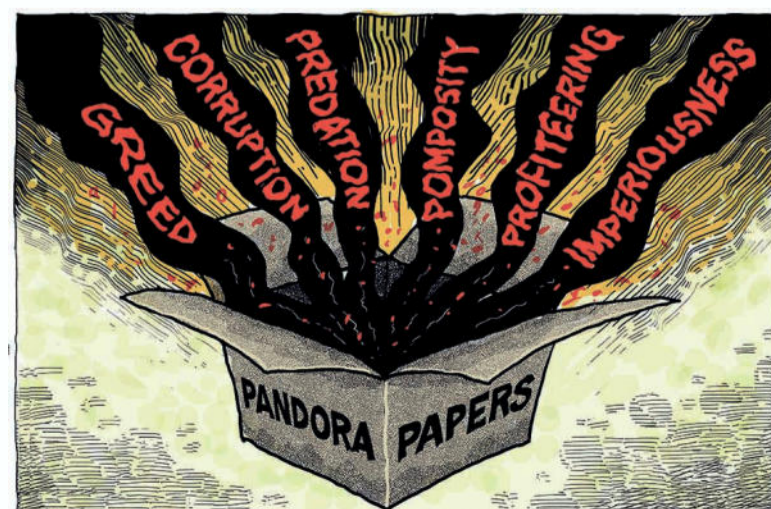

rose by almost \$7.8 trillion. According to the Urban-Brookings Tax Policy Center, the growth in the annual deficit under Trump ranks as the third-biggest increase, relative to the size of the economy, of any U.S. presidential administration. The other two were the George W. Bush administration, who launched two foreign wars following the 9/11 attacks, and the Abraham Lincoln administration, who was paying for the Civil War.

It appears that Manchin is not only principled but also politically savvy. Turns out that fiscal responsibility is popular. According to an Economist/YouGov poll from July 2019, 83% of Americans say the budget deficit is an important issue. Gallup reported in 2019 that 95% of Americans worry about the budget deficit, including 50% a “great deal.” Pew also reported in 2019 that 90% of Americans believe reducing the national debt should be a top or an important priority for the federal government to improve quality of life for future generations.

The truth is the rules of the game have changed. The Republican Party has moved toward a populist/nationalist movement. They no longer care about fiscal responsibility or even principles for that matter. The Democrats are busy fighting among themselves between the more moderate, dare I say conservative wing, and the far-left progressive wing. 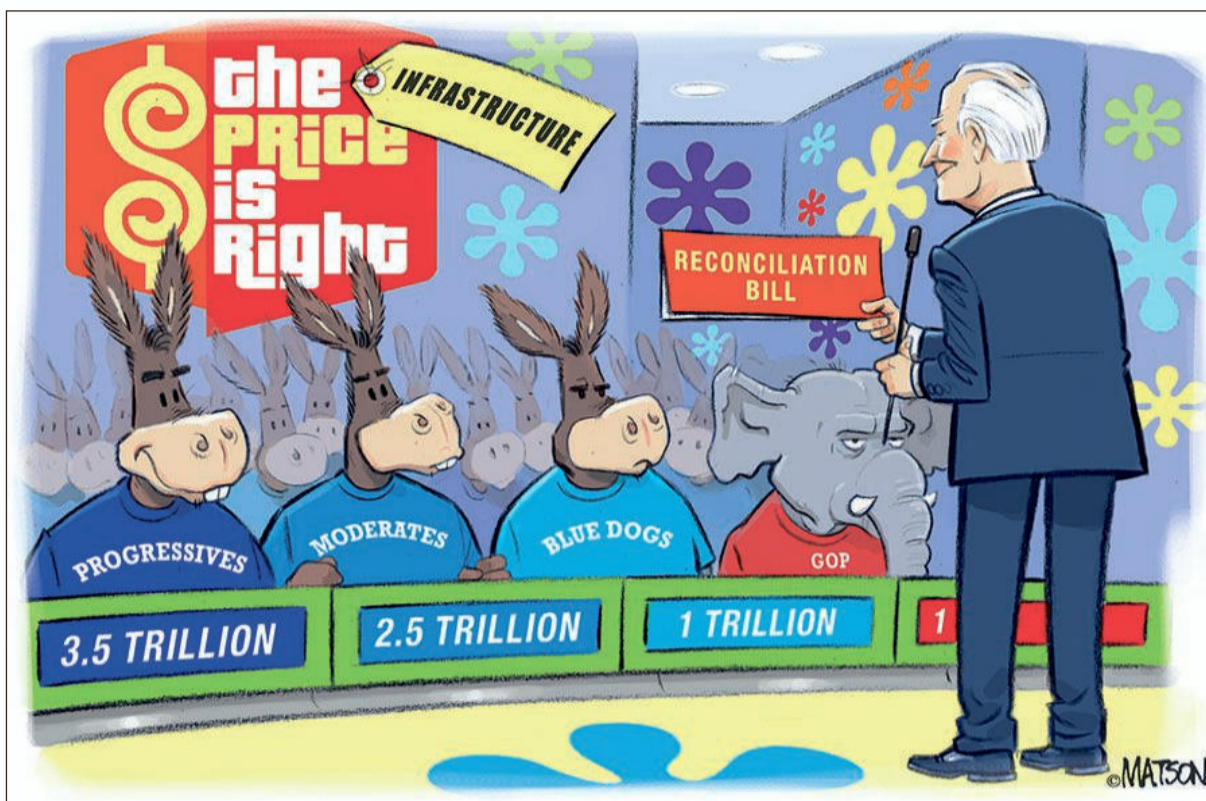

idea that the kleptocrats are over there. It is a way of distancing.”

This takes American minds off a series of immense economic and military failures caused by networks of businessmen, contractors, deregulators and politicians dating back to the 1980s.

Who remembers the Reagan-era deregulation that led to the collapse of the savings and loan industry? Or the Clinton era’s kowtow to reckless bankers who brought us the financial crisis of 2008? That nearly led to the collapse of the global economy, and cost millions of Americans their homes, but never led to the conviction of a single banker.

U.S. networks, Chayes says, include officials in a Defense Department procurement system where former senior officials cycle to companies that get big government contracts. The networks also include the richest donors in what has become a pay-to-play political system, encouraged by the Supreme Court’s 2010 Citizens United decision.

And the corruption network centered for four years in a Trump White House in which the former president actually made pay-to-play an official policy, by encouraging U.S. and foreign politicians to stay at his hotels, resorts and golf courses while refusing to divest himself of his assets or disclose his tax returns.

So it’s fine for the Pandora Papers to open the box on foreign states and their offshore havens, but better to focus on U.S. corruption. Let’s lay bare more than one South Dakota tax haven. Let’s check out corruption networks that are endangering America’s political future, hastening environmental catastrophe, and prolonging the pandemic — before we also become a failed state.

# The truth about Columbus and his ‘discoveries’

**THIS MONDAY BRINGS US TO YET ANOTHER ROUND OF CONTROVERSIES SURROUNDING THE IMPENDING “CELEBRATION” OF COLUMBUS DAY.** (How does anyone actually celebrate? Play golf?)

Stubborn and misguided efforts to continue the tradition of honoring Columbus come at a time when Indigenous peoples and the non-aboriginal residents of our shared hemisphere are embracing varied efforts at truth and reconciliation.

These efforts are commendable not because of the interests of partisan groups or the triumph of one “version” of history over another, but because the work grounds reconciliation in facts and calls for action on behalf of everyone. As persons who live, work and love in this corner of the Americas, we have absolutely nothing to lose by engaging in honest, sustained conversations about the forces that brought us to the present moment. I hasten to add that empathy, truth and forgiveness are the core principles of every major world religion.

Lest I be suspected of advancing the agenda of the “woke police,” as a historian, I’ll confine my remarks to the cold, hard facts about Christopher Columbus, considering both the historical context that produced him as well as his individual decisions.

Born in 1451, a time when Medieval Europe was steadily losing ground to the Ottoman Empire, Columbus was more a product of his era than a radical visionary. A militant, millenarian Catholic, Columbus hoped that revitalizing European trade with East Asia would provide the resources for Christendom to recapture the Holy Land. Regarding his chops as an explorer, learned 15th-century European geographers agreed that the world was round, not flat — a consensus established in most cultures for several millennia. The significance of Columbus as a navigator was his expertise in crossing a vast, unknown ocean.

His actions upon arriving on the island he named Hispaniola also place him in lockstep with most of his conquistador contemporaries. Only in 1492 did Spain

become a unified kingdom after centuries of conflict with the Islamic city-states of the Iberian peninsula. In encountering the native Taino, or Arawak, peoples, Columbus emphasized human differences over similarities. To him, the Tainos were “fit to be ordered about and made to work.”

Columbus’ actions and return voyage in 1493 are hardly the stuff of the Sermon on the Mount. This time the newcomers arrived with lances, firearms, war horses, mastiffs, chains and nets, which they quickly put to use killing, enslaving and terrorizing the locals, primarily for the purposes of selling the captives and extracting tribute in gold.

In 1495, Columbus shipped some 550 Indigenous captives to Spain for sale; other Genoese merchants were busy investing in the new Canary Islands sugar refineries that relied on enslaved labor. The violence and greed of Columbus and his men, exacerbated by a series of epidemics in the following 30 years, appalled many at the time, including Queen Isabella and the human-

itarian theologian Bartolome de las Casas.

Finally, we come to the connection between Columbus and the Italian-American community that he is supposed to represent.

To his death in 1506, Columbus remained convinced he had made landfall on an archipelago off the coast of Japan. Only the efforts of Amerigo Vespucci and others confirmed for Europeans that they had encountered a new and unknown (to them, at least) continent: America. Columbus himself never set foot on the North American mainland, part of which, much later, became the United States. Italy, of course, was even further off, only becoming the unified nation-state we know today in 1871.

Stock characters — heroes and villains — are the stuff of drama, not history. Let us accept the facts about Columbus, and move toward reconciliation with Indigenous peoples on the basis of mutual respect.

# Fighting for a fair deal for farmers

**DENOUNCING CORPORATIONS IS EASY. USING ACTUAL POLICY TOOLS TO HOLD THEM ACCOUNTABLE AND CHECK THEIR POWER IS MORE DIFFICULT.** Yet this is precisely what the National Farmers Union is pushing the Biden administration to do.

In late September, the NFU began its nationwide “Fairness for Farmers” campaign, which seeks to pressure the government to enforce antitrust laws and break up agribusiness monopolies.

Some may scoff at the prospect of challenging corporate power. But, in fact, the Biden administration has given some indication that it is willing to do so.

First, there was Biden’s executive order from earlier this year that mandated a thorough analysis and overview of supply chains, agriculture included, to determine weaknesses and places for improvement.

Let’s remember how the early days of the coronavirus pandemic put a surprisingly fragile food system on display.

Dairy farmers were told to dump milk, and hog producers were urged to euthanize their animals, as consolidated supply chains proved incapable of meeting distribution bottlenecks caused by school, hotel and restaurant closings. Billions had to be sent to farmers in relief — which, by the end of 2020, amounted to 40% of their income.

It’s this system, as documented in a report from the Open Markets Institute, that allowed the four largest poultry processing firms to go from controlling 35% of the market in 1986 to 51% in 2015. For beef, the market share of the top four companies shot up from 25% in 1977 to 85% in that same year. During that same

period, the top four corn seed companies’ control of the market went from 59% to 85%.

According to University of Missouri professor Mary Hendrickson, when four firms occupy more than 45% of a market, we begin to see competition-killing, innovation-suffocating practices such as price fixing and rigging contracts.

In this regard, Biden has made some promising moves. Specifically, the president has chosen Lina Khan as chair of the Federal Trade Commission and Timothy Wu as a special adviser to the National Economic Council. Both are outspoken critics of big business, penning articles and books that place corporate consolidation at the core of democratic decline.

And U.S. Sen. Amy Klobuchar of Minnesota, the lead Democrat on the Judiciary Subcommittee on Antitrust, Competition Policy

and Consumer Rights, has introduced sweeping legislation to reinvigorate the United States’ antitrust laws and restore competition to domestic markets.

Klobuchar’s bill calls for reinvigorating the nation’s pillars of antitrust law — namely, the Progressive Era Sherman, Clayton and Federal Trade Commission Acts. Passed in the early 20th century, these laws were created to investigate and punish anti-competitive practices including mergers, price fixing and rigging contracts.

Klobuchar’s bill would amend these laws, providing officials greater leeway to investigate and punish corporate malfeasance.

Our food system can change for the better. It’s time to join the struggle and help the effort to make our agriculture system work better for everyone.

# LEAF PEEPING PROBLEM

## Why climate change is making it harder to chase fall foliage

PORTLAND, Maine — Droughts that cause leaves to turn brown and wither before they can reach peak color. Heat waves prompting leaves to fall before autumn even arrives. Extreme weather events like hurricanes that strip trees of their leaves altogether.

For a cheery autumnal activity, leaf peeping is facing some serious threats from the era of climate change.

Leaf peeping, the practice of traveling to watch nature display its fall colors, is a beloved annual activity in many corners of the country, especially New England and New York. But recent seasons have been disrupted by weather conditions there and elsewhere, and the trend is likely to continue as the planet warms, said arborists, conservationists and ecologists.

Typically, by the end of September, leaves cascade into warmer hues throughout the U.S. This year, many areas have yet to even pivot from their summer green shades. In northern Maine, where peak conditions typically arrive in late September, forest rangers had reported less than 70% color change and moderate leaf drop on Wednesday.

Across the country in Denver, high temperatures have left "dead, dry edges of leaves" early in the season, said Michael Sundberg, a certified arborist in the area.

"Instead of trees doing this gradual change, they get thrown these wacky weather events. They change all of a sudden, or they drop leaves early," Sundberg said. "It's been a few years since we've had a really good leaf year where you just drive around town and see really good color."

The reason climate change can be bad for fall foliage has a bit to do with plant biology. When fall arrives, and day length and temperature drop, the chlorophyll in a leaf breaks down, and that causes it to lose its green color. The green gives way to the yellows, reds and oranges that make for dramatic autumn displays.

Achieving those peak colors is a delicate balance, and one jeopardized by changes in the environment, said Paul Schaberg, a research plant physiologist with the U.S. Forest Service based in Burlington, Vermont. Warm fall temperatures can cause leaves to remain green longer and delay the onset of what leaf peepers

look for in terms of fall color, he said.

Worse, dry summers can stress trees and cause their leaves to miss the fall color turn altogether, Schaberg said. A 2003 study in the journal *Tree Physiology* that Schaberg cowrote stated that "environmental stress can accelerate" leaf deterioration.

"If climate change is going to mean significant drought, that means trees are going to shut down, and many trees are just going to drop their leaves," he said. "Severe droughts that really mean that the tree just can't function — that doesn't improve color."

It's happening already. This summer's heatwave in the Pacific Northwest brought temperatures of over 110 degrees

Fahrenheit (43 Celsius) to Oregon, and that led to a condition called "foliage scorch," in which leaves prematurely browned, said Chris Still, a professor at the Forest Ecosystems & Society department at Oregon State University.

The leaves' pigment was degraded and they fell shortly thereafter, Still said. That will lead to a less scenic fall season in parts of Oregon.

"That's a really big example of color change just due to heat-wave shock," Still said.

Climate change also poses longer-term threats that could disrupt leaf peeping. The spread of diseases and invasive pests and the northward creep of tree species are all factors tied to warming temperatures that could make for less vibrant fall

colors, said Andrew Richardson, a professor of ecosystem science at Northern Arizona University.

The onset of fall colors, which has been drifting later into the fall, could also continue to arrive later, said Jim Salge, foliage expert for *Yankee* magazine.

"My observations in the last decade have had more years that were later than what we would consider historical averages," he said.

The economic impact of poor leaf peeping seasons could also be consequential. Officials throughout New England have said fall tourism brings billions of dollars into those states every year.

Conservationists say that's a good reason to focus on preserving forests and reducing burning fossil fuels. Recent fall seasons have been less spectacular than typical in Massachusetts, but leaf peeping can stay a part of the state's heritage if forests are given the protections they need, said Andy Finton, landscape conservation director and forest ecologist for The Nature Conservancy.

"If we can keep the big, important forests intact, they will provide what we've depended on — clean air, clean water, clean forests, as well as fall inspiration," Finton said.

## God gave us all free will

**Q:** Dear Rabbi Gellman, in your article, you answered a question from S: How come God puts us through difficult challenges that will just make us sad and could initially make us give up? You answered: "If God knew that we would give up, God would never test us. The point is that God does not know how we will react to the bumps and burdens of our lives. This is because we have free will and with free will, God cannot know what we will do next." If "God does not know how we will react to the bumps and burdens of our lives," and "with free will, God cannot know what we will do next," is God not omniscient? I thought omniscience was an attribute of God. Thank you for your column that I read every week. — J, Wilmington, N.C.

Dear J: If I was limited to answering the same question every week, it would surely be the question of how can an all-powerful good God coexist in a world filled with evil and suffering?

You believe that God has promised or that God ought to have promised to protect us from all evil. You simply cannot believe in a God who cannot prevent every war and murder, eradicate every disease, and keep us far away from every storm and earthquake. For those of you who believe this, every act of suffering is a refutation of God's power or goodness.

Let us begin with your question about omniscience. What we must ask ourselves is this, "If God knows what I will decide to do before I do it, am I really free to choose to do something else?" It is obvious to me that this is impossible. If God knows what we will choose, we are not free to make a different choice. We are, in a word, fated to make the decision God knows we will make, and fate is the opposite of freedom. God's decision to grant us free will was, to put this another way, also a decision to limit God's omniscience.

Some people try to argue that we do have free will even if God knows what we will choose, but God does not interfere with our choices. I can accept that, but it is not really what we mean by free will.

God's omnipotence is perhaps the greatest obstacle to faith for those who believe that any act of evil is a betrayal of us by God. I had a teacher, a brilliant rabbi, who lost all his faith because he could not reconcile an omnipotent God with the Holocaust. However, take a moment and just ask yourself whether the unwillingness of humanity to stop the rise of fascism in Europe and Japan before it became so powerful is a failure of God or a failure of humanity? If we choose to despoil the environment of planet earth, is that God's fault or our fault?

It seems completely clear to me that we are blaming God for our own collective failures. In some fantasy world I guess it would be possible for an omnipotent God to prevent us from ever making bad choices, but that fantasy world bears no similarity to our world. God's role is to show us the right way to live, and our role is to try to live that way. Why is that so hard for people to understand?

God has given us freedom and intelligence. What we need is just a little dose of gratitude.

# What are 'slipped discs' and how do you treat them?

**Q:** I was helping to lift furniture last week and hurt my lower back. My brother said I probably slipped a disc. It still hurts. Could I have slipped a disc and what should I do about it?

**A:** When the conversation turns to back pain, you'll often hear mention of a "slipped disc." You may wonder just what a disc is and how it "slips."

The human spine is made up of 24 individual bones, each called a vertebra. Between each vertebra is an oval-shaped cushion of cartilage that is called a disc. Each disc is firmly attached to the vertebra above and below it, so they don't actually "slip." But they can be

damaged and could make you feel like one has "slipped" out of place. Inside the disc is a jelly-like substance called nucleus pulposus. The outer ring is a tough assemblage of fibrocartilage called the annulus fibrosus, which holds in the nucleus.

Injury, commonly a bending and lifting mechanism, can tear the exterior

fiber and let the nucleus leak through cracks and compress or "pinch" nerves in the area. If the nucleus pushes against the annulus, the condition is referred to as a disc bulge. If the nucleus breaks through, the condition is called a herniation. Sciatic pain, sometimes referred to as a pinched nerve, occurs when a herniated disc compresses nerves in the lower back, also called the lumbar spine.

It is likely that you have sprained some of the ligaments that make up the disc and they are swollen, causing pressure around the nerves. You need to have an evaluation to see the severity and if treatment is required. Not com-

monly is surgery necessary but it is possible that without treatment and instruction on avoiding further injury you could make it worse to the point that surgery will be needed.

Usually, treatment consists of 3 phases. Pain relief phase to remove swelling, corrective phase to rehab tight and weak muscles, and stabilization phase to return to optimal function and strength. Talk with your chiropractor about the nature and role of the disc and about ways you can avoid damaging them.

# What to know about pet insurance: Costs, coverage and more

All pets, like people, get sick or have a medical emergency at some point in their lives.

But unlike with human medicine, many people have not considered or accurately estimated the cost of care or how they would pay if their pet needed expensive care. Veterinary medicine has come a long way in the past several decades, and people now expect the same quality medicine for their pets they would expect for themselves or their human family members.

Some costs in owning a pet can be relatively easy to estimate, like the cost of food and basic care. But wellness visits and pet medical costs are a large unknown and often underestimated. Today, if a dog or cat has an illness, vet bills can easily run into the thousands (and sometimes tens of thousands) of dollars.

What is the difference between savings and pet insurance?

While some people may be disciplined to regularly put away a set amount of money for a savings account for their pet's care, many people find that difficult to do. Unless you can commit to saving money on an ongoing

basis for your pet's emergency and critical care, pet insurance may be your best option.

Pet insurance is a way to protect against the potential financial shock of a pet who needs extensive or expensive medical treatment and can lessen the emotional anxiety of having to make hard decisions based on money rather than the optimal treatment available. Even with pet insurance, pet owners may have to pay first for the care and seek reimbursement after-

ward from the insurance company, so it's best to be prepared.

Pet insurance plans follow the common foundation of basic insurance coverages such as injuries and accidents, hereditary and congenital conditions, but there are differences in prices and benefits. Like human health policies, the age of the animal will figure into the cost. But unlike human health insurance, a pet's breed may play a significant role in determining insurance costs.

Most pet insurance can be broken into four basic group types:

■ **Comprehensive insurance policy:** This type of plan includes medical bills for accidents and injuries, acute and chronic illnesses, hereditary conditions, diagnostics tests, surgeries, treatments and wellness checkups and vaccinations.

■ **Accident and illness policy:** A type of policy that covers bills for accidents, injuries and illnesses including cancer.

■ **Accident-only cover-**

age policy: This type of policy only covers costs occurring if a pet is injured in an accident.

■ **Pet wellness policy:** This type plan covers only wellness-related expenses like vet checkups, vaccinations and parasite prevention including flea and tick prevention and intestinal parasites.

There are also various deductible, reimbursement and payout options ranging from typical deductions of \$10, \$250 and \$500, and reimbursement choices from 70% to 90%. As in all insurance policies, having higher deductibles will mean having lower monthly insurance bills.

It's important to note that some insurance policies may become invalid if you don't keep your pet up to date with wellness exams and vaccinations. Having a savings account or having pet insurance is likely to create one less agonizing thought to consider when the time comes to make a medical decision for your dog or cat. Having to make a life-or-death decision is always one of the most difficult moments you will have to have in your life. This can be especially difficult if you must make your decisions based on the cost of care instead of your preferences for your pet.

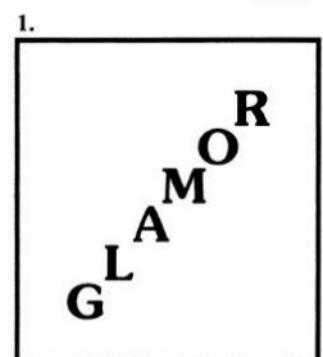

## The ins and outs of mortgages

**WHAT IS A MORTGAGE?** It is a legal agreement between the borrower and mortgage lender. The lender provides money to the borrower to purchase real estate and the borrower agrees to repay the loan plus interest. Mortgages are secured by the real estate (i.e., home) so if the borrower fails to repay the loan, the lender can foreclose and repossess the home.

Most people who buy a home do so with a mortgage. A mortgage is a necessity if you cannot pay the full cost of a home out of pocket. There are some cases where it makes sense to have a mortgage on your home even though you have the money to pay for it. For example, investors sometimes mortgage properties to free up funds for other investments.

So, where do you begin? First, check your credit history and credit score. This will help you and your lender determine if you will qualify for a loan. Second, contact a local lender. You should ask your Realtor for a recommendation. It also does not hurt to shop around a bit. Each bank will have different loans, terms and fees. These are all important things to consider. Customer service is key. Does the lender have online banking? Do they sell your loan or keep it in house?

Once you choose the lender, you need to get pre-approved. This will help you and your Realtor when searching for your next home. Pre-approvals look more favorable when making your offer to the seller. Your lender should be able to do your pre-approval over the phone. They may ask for your bank statements, W2s and to pull your credit.

Let us assume you found a house and you are under contract, do not apply for credit or make large purchases with credit. Do you want to buy new furniture? Your lender will advise you to wait until after closing. In fact, according to most lenders, there are several things you do not want to do before or after applying for a mortgage.

Do not make large deposits or withdrawals from your accounts. Anything out of the ordinary can raise a red flag with the bank. Do not change jobs unless it is necessary. Your lender will want to see a steady income history. If you own your home, do not run up a home equity line of credit. This can affect your debt-to-income ratio. Do not close your credit accounts. This can set off a chain reaction reducing your available credit and raising your debt-to-income ratio.

A valuable resource is your mortgage lender. They can guide you to make the right decision for the loan that best fits your needs. Do your research and make sure your credit is in the best standing so you can purchase that home.

Rates are holding at an all-time low during this last quarter of 2021. The average 30-year fixed rate is still below 3%. Is this a good time to buy? Ye! Contact your local lender to get pre-approved and your Realtor to find that perfect home.

Sometimes you have fair warning when guests are coming over, such as for major holiday events. Other times people drop in with little or no warning. Whatever the case, you want your home to make the best impression. If you're short on time, here are some tips on how to quickly prep your home for maximum comfort and give your guests a great experience.

- Walk through your house and think like a visitor. What are the things you notice first that might not look so great? Pay special attention to common areas, guest bedrooms and bathrooms.

- Prioritize what needs to be cleaned first. You can always

close the door to your home office, your bedroom and other areas guests aren't likely to wander.

- Be aware of your guest's needs. For instance, if they have allergies to particular scents, avoid cleaning materials that use them.

- Wash all the bedding and other linens in the guest rooms.

- Wipe down commonly touched surfaces such as countertops, doorknobs and light switches. For the best results to get rid of germs and viruses, use a two-step process. Clean with soap and water first, then disinfect using a bleach or alcohol solution. Store-bought alcohol wipes are good for the second step.

- Give your oven and refrigerator a good cleaning. The oven

will probably get a lot of use, so you want to make sure it's in the best order. Remove all outdated food from your fridge.

- Check all your bulbs, indoors and out. Sometimes it's easy not to notice a burned-out bulb in an area you can walk through with your eyes closed, but your guests won't have that familiarity.

### Prep the bathroom

You want your bathroom(s) in particular to give your guests a good impression. Give each bathroom they might use a good wipe-down, particularly the toilet, shower basin, sink, floor and fixtures.

Make sure the supplies are up

to date. Clean expired medicine from the cabinet. Make sure soap, towels, shampoo, conditioner and a hair dryer are available. Stock the cabinet and sink with commonly used items such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, disposable razors, feminine products, allergy medication, over-the-counter painkillers or cotton swabs.

Leave room for your guest's stuff. An empty, flat surface will be perfect for their own toiletries.

If you lack the time yourself, you can always hire a professional housecleaner for the job. Housecleaning services cost between \$40-\$80 per hour, per cleaner, and the average one-time job runs between \$150 and \$200. Keep in mind you might have a hard time getting a housecleaner on short notice if you don't have an existing relationship, and could pay a premium for same-day scheduling.

# Resting ram sells for \$144 at auction

**ANTIQUE STONWARE** was often used in small local potteries in 19th-century New England. They made useful objects in molds and fanciful figurines and vases that could be decorated by hand.

Bristol-slip glaze was popular because it was scratch-resistant and added color. One amateur artist made a resting ram to be used as a doorstop. The 9-inch hand-molded animal sold for \$144, probably because it was missing part of his horn and an ear.

**Q: I was left a Lane Cedar Chest that has an aroma tightness feature. The size of the chest is 17 1/2 inches high, 19 inches deep and 44 inches wide. The inside of the chest is in excellent condition, but the outside does have some wear on it. I'm not sure if it's worth holding on to. Is it worth anything?**

**A:** Lane started in 1912 as the Standard Red Cedar Chest Co. in Altavista, Va. John Lane was president and his son, Ed, was vice president and general manager. It became The Lane Co. in 1922.

The company was known for its cedar chests, which were often used as "hope chests" by brides-to-be. Lane began making occasional tables in 1951 and expanded to include lines of bedroom, living room and dining room furniture in the 1960s and 70s. Today, Lane is owned by United Furniture Industries.

You can find the age of your Lane chest by looking for the serial number on the bottom. If you read the number backward, you will find the production date. For example, serial number 753150 indicates the chest was produced on 05/13/57. An extra digit at the end of the serial number is the plant number.

Lane cedar chests made before 1987 have the old-

style locks that can latch shut and trap a child inside. Those locks should be removed or replaced. Value depends on style and condition. Some Lane chests sell for less than \$50, others for over \$100.

**FROM A READER:** The advertisement for the cold Cream of Wheat pictured on your July 2 column was not showing cold, lumpy breakfast cereal. It was showing a pudding. The pudding was made from uncooked Cream of Wheat, lingonberry or other fruit juice, lemon juice and sugar. It was cooked for about five minutes and then set aside to cool. When cool, it was beaten

with a mixer for at least 10 minutes, until it was light and fluffy. Then it was chilled for at least two hours. It was served with fruit, cream or whipped cream.

**Q: I have a piece of Weller pottery that was my grandfather's. It's stamped "Weller" on the base. He was a barber and used this piece to hold used towels in the barber shop. I'm not looking to sell, but I would like to know more about the piece. I've seen some pieces with a similar glaze (dark green and burgundy) but haven't been able to find anything else the same shape or size.**

**A:** Samuel A. Weller started a pottery in Fultonham, Ohio, in 1872. The pottery moved to Zanesville, Ohio, in 1882. By 1915, it was the largest art pottery in the world. Hundreds of lines of pottery were made. Weller's

prestige lines were discontinued around 1920. Commercial lines were made until the pottery closed in 1948. Some old Weller pottery sells for thousands of dollars. Pieces made in the 1920s and later are more affordable. It's impossible to do a good appraisal if you can't handle the piece. You should take it to someone nearby who sells antique pottery or send an email with a picture to Kovels.com.

**Q: I want to sell a vintage lamp made by H.A. Best Lamp Co. of Chicago. It has a bronze base and domed glass shade. What is its value?**

**A:** Harry Arthur Best started the H.A. Best Lamp Co. around 1915. The company made lamps in art nouveau and arts and crafts styles. It was in business until about 1935. The value of your lamp depends on the type of shade. Some H.A. Best Company lamps

with caramel glass shades have sold for \$250 to \$850.

# Real estate Q&A: Is now a good time to start being a landlord?

**Q: We are getting older and ready to move to a smaller home. Our plan has always been to rent our existing house to make extra money toward our retirement. After the eviction moratorium, we are nervous. Is it a good time to be a landlord? — Jerri**

**A:** Not collecting rent is

a scary prospect that every landlord needs to be prepared for.

Whether it is because of a pandemic, natural disaster or non-paying tenant, you need to have enough of a cushion to carry the house's expenses for at least several months.

Renting property, done correctly, can be rewarding. The good news for landlords coming out of the coronavirus crisis is that

rents are higher now.

To be a successful landlord, treat it like a business. Write everything down and save your receipts. Keeping track of your financials can help when it is time to file your taxes.

Tenant selection is critical to successfully renting your property. It is better to spend extra time upfront choosing your tenant than spending even

more time evicting them. Check work history and do a background and credit search to ensure your prospective tenant is financially stable.

Take the time to read the landlord-tenant statute. It is written to be understandable to non-lawyers and reads almost like an instruction manual for renting.

Knowing your rights and responsibilities is key

to a good experience. If you feel intimidated by the process, you can hire a real estate agent to help you.

Once you find a good tenant, do not ruin the relationship by trying to be friends. Being friendly is good, but who wants to evict a buddy for not paying the rent.

Remember to treat this as a business relationship. Respond to repair requests quickly.

In return, your tenant also needs to take the relationship seriously. Explain that they need to treat the house as their home and must pay their rent on time.

Accepting excuses rather than rent rarely works out. Posting a warning notice for nonpayment sends a clear message that the rent needs to be paid each month to avoid immediate consequences.

## Spain's gov't eyes rent controls in new housing bill

MADRID — Spain's left-wing ruling coalition wants to rein in soaring housing costs by imposing rent increase caps on landlords who own 10 or more residential properties.

Opposition parties and leaders of business organizations have criticized the proposal as an improper intervention in the free market by Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez's government.

Government ministers approved draft rent control legislation during a weekly Cabinet meeting on Tuesday. Vulnerable families and young adults in Spain's biggest cities would be the main beneficiaries of the proposed law, the government said.

Low salaries and a 35% youth unemployment rate — the highest among the 19 nations that use the shared euro currency — mean that many Spaniards cannot afford to live on their own. They leave the family home at an average age of 30, compared to a European Union average of 26.4 years old.

The most controversial provision in the bill would set

price hike caps for landlords with multiple residential properties, a move designed to target large real estate companies and investment funds. The government has not yet published the draft so details about the cap were not immediately available.

But officials said the bill also includes tax discounts of up to 90% for landlords with fewer than nine properties who decide to lower their rents.

The prime minister announced that as part of a separate initiative, the government plans to help adults 18-34 with their rent by awarding them a 250-euro (\$290) monthly bonus for up to two years if they earn less than 1,977 euros (\$2,291) per month.

The proposed law also would set aside 30% of all public housing as rental units instead of making them available for people to buy at a reduced price, and would significantly increase local taxes on vacant residential properties.

Regulating the housing market was the main obstacle that prevented Sánchez's Socialists from agreeing on a national budget for 2022 with

the coalition government's junior partner, the anti-austerity United We Can party.

Lawmakers are expected to pass the annual spending plan on Thursday, both parties said Tuesday. The vote in the Congress of Deputies, the lower house of the Spanish parliament, is regarded as a test of the government's strength.

To get the budget passed, Sánchez's minority government needs the votes of lawmakers outside the coalition, including separatist parties from Catalonia and the Basque Country.

"Housing is a grave problem in our country," Sánchez said.

Labour minister and United We Can leader Yolanda Díaz said the bill opened the path "to a new country."

"The moment has arrived for great multinationals to pay what they must," she said.

But the conservative opposition Popular Party accused the government of mounting "an unprecedented attack against private property."

"We have a government with communists that intervene markets on a daily basis," party spokeswoman Cuca Gamarra said.

## California's median home price seen topping \$800,000 in new peak

The median price for a home in California is set to jump north of \$800,000 next year, adding to a long-simmering affordability crisis in the state.

The state, which has grappled for years with a shortage of affordable housing, will see prices rise 5.2% to a median of \$834,000 in 2022, according to a forecast by the California Association of Realtors.

That comes after a surge of roughly 20% this year, and would push the median price for an existing single-family in California even further beyond the national average of about \$357,000.

"Demand for homes will continue to outstrip available supply as the economy improves, resulting in higher home prices and slightly lower sales in 2022," Jordan Levine, chief economist for the California Association of Realtors, said in a statement.

A shortage of homes to buy and rising mortgage rates mean that only 23% of households in California will be able to afford the median price, according to the report.

California is home to four of the five most expensive U.S. housing markets, led by the Silicon Valley metro area of San Jose, Sunnyvale and Santa Clara where the median price is \$1.7 million.

## U.S. average mortgage rates decline; 30-year at 2.99%

WASHINGTON — Average long-term mortgage rates declined this week, with the benchmark 30-year loan slipping back below 3%.

Mortgage buyer Freddie Mac reported Thursday that the average rate for a 30-year mortgage eased to 2.99% from 3.01% last week. The rate stood at 2.87% this time last year. It peaked this year at 3.18% in April.

The rate for a 15-year loan, a popular option for homeowners refinancing their mortgages, fell to 2.23% from 2.28% last week.

The Federal Reserve

recently signaled its belief that the economy has recovered sufficiently from the pandemic recession for it to soon begin dialing back the emergency aid it provided after the spread of coronavirus.

The number of Americans applying for unemployment benefits fell last week, another sign that the U.S. job market and economy continue their steady recovery from last year's coronavirus recession. Jobless claims fell by 38,000, to 326,000, the first drop in four weeks, the Labor Department reported Thursday.

# 'Nothing secretive' about Jordan king's real estate, FM says

AMMAN, Jordan — Jordan's foreign minister on Thursday pushed back against a report that the country's monarch, King Abdullah II, went out of his way to hide the purchase of more than a dozen luxury homes worth more than \$106 million, saying there was "nothing secretive" about the transactions.

Ayman Safadi also told The Associated Press that none of the billions of dollars of international aid the king-

dom has received over the years were used to fund the purchases, and that strict safeguards are in place to prevent any abuses.

"Any insinuation that the financing of those properties came through illegal manners is also baseless, because his majesty paid from his personal funds for this," he said. "Any attempt to link between these and donor money is again baseless because every cent in donor money is accounted for and audited by us and by the

donors themselves."

The International Consortium of Investigative Journalists, citing information from a trove of leaked documents, reported earlier this week that Abdullah obtained the properties through offshore shell companies.

Advisers to the king "spared no effort to conceal his real estate holdings," the report alleged. It said that accountants and lawyers for the king "concocted plans to shield his name from public and even confidential gov-

ernment registries."

The consortium said it has reviewed close to 12 million leaked documents about offshore transactions, dubbed the "Pandora Papers." Abdullah was one of scores of public figures from countries around the world who were identified as holders of hidden offshore accounts.

Abdullah's offshore dealings drew particular attention, along with those of several other bold-faced names. This may have been, in part,

because of the contrast between his luxury real estate holdings and Jordan's heavy dependence on international aid and the nation's continued economic crisis.

The Royal Hashemite Court issued a statement earlier this week denying any impropriety. The king bought the properties in the United States and Britain from his own funds and details about them were being kept quiet for security and privacy reasons, the statement said.

Safadi, who is also deputy

prime minister, said Thursday that "there is nothing secretive" about the purchases, which according to ICIJ took place over the past decade. He said that "accusations of secrecy that somehow insinuate wrongdoing are baseless."

When asked about the optics of the ruler of one of the region's poorest countries owning multi-million-dollar homes, Safadi suggested the focus on the king was disproportionate.

## New Tucson Breaks the Mold

### Hyundai's Freshly Designed Crossover Looks Like No Other

As popular as they are, I have one consistent complaint about crossover vehicles.

They often look like boring, copycat metal blobs that make it tough for the average person to tell the difference between a Ford, a Volkswagen or a Honda.

When completely redesigning the Tucson for 2022, though, Hyundai decided not to go down that drab, lookalike path. The all-new Tucson actually looks different from every other small crossover for sale today.

The overall shape is familiar, but the body has waves, bulges and creases that catch the eye, especially from the side profile. Its back end has taillights shaped like a predator's teeth and a logo placed up high on the glass, not on the sheet metal, to avoid disrupting the pretty lines.

It's a daring move from Hyundai that seems to value the input of talented designers more than corporate focus groups.

Will it work? I hope so, because a sales hit would encourage other companies to look outside the dull box crossovers have inhabited for the past decade.

Fortunately, the new Tucson has more selling points to pile on top of the crisp look.



Dramatic creases make the completely redesigned 2022 Hyundai Tucson catch the eye. It's a bold move in the small-crossover segment, where cookie-cutter looks are more common.

Its interior is fabulous for the price point, starting under \$25,000 but mimicking the modern design and solid feel of more expensive vehicles. The vents are cleanly integrated into the dash, and two digital screens mounted behind the steering wheel and high on the center stack make its myriad tech goodies easy to access.

The graphics alone make it feel like a next-generation car. Again, Hyundai is giving authority to some talented designers, and it shows in the finished product with menus and functionality that seem as sleek as the newest Apple devices.

The new Tucson has all the things that make today's buyers want to upgrade to a new car — advanced safety features, semi-autonomous driving assistance, seamless smartphone integration and more — all executed in a top-notch way.

A great example is Highway Driving Assist, the feature that lets the Tucson essentially pilot itself on freeways, albeit with the driver still paying attention. It doesn't ping-pong between lane markers or slam on the brakes unnecessarily, instead reacting more smoothly and naturally as if a human driver were in control.

It's a better experience than many similar systems from other companies.

While the gasoline Tucson is fitted with a 2.5-liter, 187-horsepower, four-cylinder engine, my tester was the Hybrid model. Not only does it get 30 percent better fuel economy than the gasoline Tucson, Hyundai claims, but it also makes 20 percent more torque for easy acceleration.

On the highway, it offers one of the best experiences of any small crossover I've driven. It's smooth, quiet and quick to respond to input from the driver, including plenty of power for passing, like a smaller

version of Hyundai's spectacular Palisade.

The new Tucson feels more mundane around town, though, with a blend of comfort and sportiness that's neither exciting nor disappointing.

It does offer an exciting optional feature: the ability to let you stand outside the vehicle and remotely move it forward or backward using buttons on the key fob. It's designed to let you park in and out of super-tight parking spaces, but I envision it more often being used to gather your friends in the driveway to say, "Hey, look what my new car can do!"

## How often do I really need an oil change? Should I be concerned about increasing tire pressure?

**Q: I have 2001 Lexus RX300 with only 46,000 miles. I bought it new and have kept it in mint condition. In recent years, I have only put on 1,000 miles per year and have switched to a once-a-year oil change. I know the "law books" say you should change oil every six months, but I have also read a lot of commentary that you can go much longer than a year depending on how you use the car and mileage. In your opinion, is once a year OK? — D.E., Naperville, Ill.**

A: Oil change intervals have changed from 3,000 miles/3 months, then to 7,500 miles/12 months, and now to whenever the warning appears on the

instrument panel. But if your 1,000 annual miles are all due to short trips, I suggest you change the oil and filter at least once a year. Short hops do not allow the engine and oil to get hot enough to cook off any moisture that may have condensed in the crankcase.

**Q: Can you recommend a good and reliable heavy-duty portable tire inflator? I need one that is strong and powerful enough to be able to add air to my Titan pickup tires. The one I have is OK for the smaller tires on my Kona and Soul and bicycle tires but it struggles with airing up the Titan tires. — D.S., Georgetown, Tx.**

A: I have not personally used a 12-volt compressor in the 100-

psi range, but there are plenty out there. Many Titan pickups also have power inverters that provide 120 volts AC power; usually one in the cabin and another in the truck bed. More power to you.

**Q: How does one know what grade of gas he's buying? I was buying gas at a top-tier gas station when a generic tanker truck pulled in and started filling up the storage tanks. Years ago, tanker trucks went to gas stations with the brand on the truck (Shell, Sunoco, BP, etc.); now all I see is generic. I asked the tanker driver about top-tier etc., and he said all gas at the tanker farms come out of the same storage tank, hence, it's all the same. Gas is gas. Who puts in the detergent**

**additives in gas? — D.C., The Villages, Fl.**

A: Gasoline is a commodity shipped from major refineries by pipeline or shipped to tank farms. Before that gas is shipped to the retail stations, it is blended by the marketers. Some even have fancy names for the additive package. Top-tier fuel has a better detergent package than the EPA requires and is worth seeking. A few companies have their own dedicated fleets of tanker trucks, while many contract with various carriers.

**Q: Before a recent 600-mile trip, I checked my tire pressure and all four were at the recommended cold tire pressure of 35 psi. The dashboard monitors also indicated the same readings. About 1 1/2**

**hours into the trip (it was a hot day), the tire pressure light on the dashboard lit up. I checked the info center and saw that all four tire pressures were now at 37 psi. Is this something that I should be concerned with? They are original tires (only 39,000 miles on them). — J.A., Cetrionia, Pa.**

A: Tires flex as you drive and flexing causes friction, and heat. The air pressure then goes up. We check our tires cold to provide the best baseline reading. Warm tire pressures vary. You may ignore common increases in pressure.

## Used vs. New Cars

When purchasing a car, deciding between new and used is a big decision.

The U.S. News & World Report offers some advantages to buying new.

than you will likely find on a used car.

**You can get the latest technology.** If you're the kind of person who likes to have all the newest bells and whistles,

buying a new car will ensure you get the latest technology in the marketplace. Each year brings new developments in safety, entertainment, connectivity and efficiency.

## Tesla builds first store on tribal land, dodges state car laws

Carmaker Tesla has opened a store and repair shop on Native American land for the first time, marking a new approach to its years-long fight to sell cars directly to consumers and cut car dealerships out of the process.

The white-walled, silver-lettered Tesla store, which opened last week, sits in Nambé Pueblo, north of Santa Fe, on tribal land that's not subject to state laws.

The electric car company can only sell and service its vehicles freely in about a dozen states, while it faces restrictions in others. Some, like New Mexico, ban Tesla from offering sales or repairs without going through a dealership. In January, the company struck a deal with Michigan to resolve a 2016 lawsuit, a symbolic victory that allowed it to sell in the backyard of the nation's largest carmakers.

Supporters of Tesla say the shop in New Mexico marks the first time the company has partnered with a tribe to get around state laws, though the idea has been in the works for years.

From Oklahoma to Connecticut and other states, consumers can't buy Teslas because the company won't partner with dealer-

ships and hasn't been successful in winning over the courts or lawmakers to allow its direct sales model.

"These states have lots of sovereign Native American nations in them that could be interested in Tesla," said Brian Dear, president of the Tesla Owners Club of New Mexico. "I don't believe at all that this will be the last."

Supporters say dealership laws protect middle-class jobs and force dealerships to compete, lowering prices. Critics say people can get information online and direct sales would lower costs.

New Mexico, Alabama, and Louisiana have the strictest bans, barring Tesla from both operating dealerships and repair shops. That makes repairing a Tesla more expensive and more of a hassle. Owners have to get their cars serviced in neighboring states or through traveling Tesla technicians who fix problems with what they have in a van.

The New Mexico Tesla shop, built on the site of a former casino, is nestled between two gas stations along a highway about an hour and a half north of Albuquerque, where most of the state's Tesla owners live, Dear said.

# Back in action: Streamer picks up fifth season of 'SEAL Team'

Still spinning from the loss of one of their own, television's favorite SEALs are jumping into their next mission when "SEAL Team" returns for an epic Season 5 on Sunday, Oct. 10, on CBS before moving exclusively to Paramount+.

"SEAL Team," created by Benjamin Cavell ("The Stand") and produced by CBS Studios, is a TV military drama series that premiered on Sept. 27, 2017. It follows an elite unit of United States Navy SEALs led by David Boreanaz ("Angel") as Master Chief Special Warfare Operator Jason Hayes. Hayes' Bravo team also includes Clay Spenser (Max Thieriot, "Point Break," 2015), a second-generation Navy SEAL in training, and Amanda "Mandy" Ellis (Jessica Paré, "Atypical"), Bravo's CIA liaison.

Also returning for Season 5 is Chief Warrant Officer 2 Raymond "Ray" Perry (Neil Brown Jr., "Bayou Sales," 2019), the longest-tenured SEAL and best friend to the team captain, and Special Warfare Operator First Class Sonny Quinn (A. J. Buckley, "Pure"), a loyal but unpredictable SEAL who would just about always choose a firefight over a leadership position.

And viewers can't forget about Lieutenant Junior Grade Lisa Davis (Toni Trucks, "Corporate"), the DEVGRU Intelligence Officer assigned to Bravo.

In the season's opening episode, the team is stunned to discover that the "training" it's currently undergoing is actually a front for an ongoing underground mission that seeks to extract a weapons expert from one of the deadliest corners of the globe.

Though not exactly thrilling news to the team, especially after a particularly difficult fourth season, the SEALs are up for whatever mission the United States of America asks.

The Season 4 finale was catastrophic, to say the least, leaving its audience and characters in a rather precarious situation. The Bravo team lost its comrade Scott Carter, aka Full Metal (Scott Foxx, "Only the Brave," 2017), to injuries after he shielded his team from a shoulder-fired missile. And as if that loss weren't enough to grapple with, a slew of personal problems surfaced for various members of the SEAL team.

Jason finally convinced Ray to get therapy, and after months of fighting, Ray unloaded all of his trauma on his wife, Naima (Parisa Fakhri, "Castle"). Their relationship had become a dark cloud looming over the reunion between Clay and Stella (Alona Tal, "Burn Notice"), with Clay seeing Ray and Naima's story as a kind of sinister foreshadowing for their own future.

Still, the show knows that for every great tragedy, there needs to be some levity, so why not a wedding? Clay popped the question to Stella and they ended up getting married at city hall.

Sonny and Lisa also had their own decisions to make about the future — both together and apart — at the end of Season 4, as Sonny searched for ways to stay closer to his newborn baby girl. And Jason's alleged "headache" at

Clay and Stella's wedding reception raises some red flags for PTSD in a residual reaction to last season's events.

The characters' problems and the danger they face seem all too real on occasion, and for good reason. Though the show is not based on a true story, it is inspired by Navy veteran SEALs and common issues veterans face on missions and when they return home. This, in part, is the reason COVID-19 will be taking a back seat to the story writers wish to tell.

Like most other shows in the past couple of years, "SEAL Team" had to suspend production in early 2020 to deal with COVID-19, putting at least two of its Season 3 episodes on the backburner. And while they've been back filming, everyone involved is now required to follow a list of safety protocols, including

mandatory quarantining and regular testing. While writers have played with the idea of incorporating the pandemic into the storyline, "SEAL Team" is one show that won't acknowledge it in its plot.

Just about the only role the coronavirus will play in the military drama will be to impact the number of guest actors on the show, due to quarantine and travel requirements. In fact, showrunner Spencer Hudnut ("Unforgettable") has vowed to exclude it 100% from the show, saying he believes that viewers need "an escape" (nearly all TV series have included it, from "Grey's Anatomy" to "NCIS").

Hudnut believes "SEAL Team" is already, as it is, all about people risking their lives on the front lines, continuing, "We talked about it, and because we

have to finish what we started, to all of [a] sudden be in a pandemic world felt wrong."

Critically speaking, "SEAL Team" has been well received, and CBS announced the show's renewal back in May 2021. The season premiere is one of four episodes to be shown on the network, this time on Sundays right after "The Equalizer" and "NCIS: LA." That said, fans should expect this time-slot to move around a bit due to Sunday Night Football.

Also, as of the fourth episode, "SEAL Team" will be moving exclusively to Paramount+, where it will still air weekly as it once did on CBS.

Don't forget to mark this next mission on your calendar! "SEAL Team" premieres Sunday, Oct. 10, on CBS before moving to Paramount+.

## Bring out the Zamboni: NHL hockey is back with new team

The new NHL season arrives with a week of marquee matchups, including the Seattle Kraken's first game and the great Canadian rivalry between the Toronto Maple Leafs and Montreal Canadiens. Beginning Tuesday, Oct. 12, the action airs live on ESPN.

For the first time in three years (fingers crossed), the NHL will have a "normal" season. The divisions have been realigned to suit their usual structure and the schedule returns to 82 games. One difference is, of course, the expansion of the league to 32 teams with the inclusion of the Kraken.

Another exciting game taking place amid opening week is a rematch of last season's North Division final and one of North America's oldest sports rivalries: the Maple Leafs versus the Canadiens, aka the Habs, on Wednesday, Oct. 13.

Despite some turnover during the off-season, both teams' rosters remain largely the same as last season when Toronto dominated the North Division but was ousted by the Canadiens during their magical run to the Stanley Cup final. This season Montreal will be hoping Nick Suzuki can continue his development as one of the team's main offensive weapons, while Toronto will be hoping to get over its final hurdle and translate regular-season success into the playoffs.

Don't miss the opening week of this NHL season as the Kraken take on the Golden Knights on Tuesday, Oct. 12, and the Leafs face off against the Habs on Wednesday, Oct. 13, live on ESPN.

## Engineering a winner

'Baking Impossible' takes cake to new heights

From "Cake Wars" to "Holiday Baking Championship" and even "Buddy vs. Duff," viewers have been treated to some incredible sculptural cake displays that seem to defy the laws of physics. Now, Netflix's newest baking show wants to push the boundaries even further, and to do so, it has enlisted the help of some non-bakers who are used to applying the principles of science to structural designs.

You might have already caught a glimpse of "Baking Impossible" while surfing through the Netflix library. The first six episodes debuted on the streamer on Wednesday, Oct. 6, but another batch of episodes is set to drop this Wednesday, Oct. 13.

Part baking show, part building challenge, "Baking Impossible" features nine competing teams of

two that consist of a baker and an engineer (henceforth known as a "Bakineer"). In each challenge, these unlikely duos compete to create extraordinary cakes resembling edible boats, skyscrapers and miniature golf courses. (And no, they can't just layer on a bunch of icing on a structure and call it a day — each cake has to be delicious, too.)

Here's where it gets interesting: like an armchair made by a famous Swedish retailer, all those creations will have to be able to withstand an engineering stress test. Take, for example, the aforementioned skyscraper: it would have to be structurally sound enough to survive an earthquake.

The judging panel consists of Andrew Smyth, an engineer and finalist on "The Great British Baking Show"; Joanne Chang, a James Beard Award-winning pastry chef; and Hakeem Oluseyi, an aerospace engineer. They're the ones who'll critique each creation based on ap-

pearance, ingenuity and flavor, and the winners will get to take home a \$100,000 grand prize.

"Baking Impossible" is hosted by Justin Willman, and given the nature of the gravity-defying creations featured in the show, it seems fitting to have a magician serve as the MC. Willman is also a comedian and the star/creator of the Netflix series "Magic for Humans," though if you're a fan of cake shows, you probably know him as the host of the Food Network shows "Cupcake Wars," "Cupcake Champions" and "Halloween Wars."

It's a cake competition like fans have never seen before! The complete season of "Baking Impossible" is available to stream on Netflix beginning Wednesday, Oct. 13.

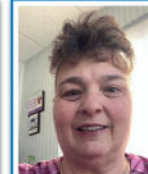

# Molina's mystery: Actor leads TV adaptation of Louise Penny series

**Molina's mystery:** Look for actor Alfred Molina to return as Doc Ock in the upcoming MCU film, "Spider-Man: No Way Home," due out in theaters this December, but until then, the "Spider-Man 2" (2004) star will be busy filming a new Amazon Prime Video series in Canada.

An eight-part mystery, "Three Pines" is based on the bestselling books from Canadian crime novelist (and former CBC broadcaster/journalist) Louise Penny. The novels, including 2021's "The Madness of Crowds," follow Chief Inspector Armand Gamache as he investigates a series of murders in the idyllic (but fictional) community of Three Pines, which was inspired by the Eastern Townships village where Penny resides.

British-born Molina stars as Gamache, a man who seemingly sees things that others do not, and whose investigation will uncover some long-buried secrets — including a few of his own ghosts. Filming is already underway in Montreal and rural Quebec, and production should continue through to December.

It's worth noting that "Three Pines" is the first Canada-based project for Left Bank Pictures, the British production company behind Netflix's "The Crown," which was the big winner at last month's Emmy Awards.

In an official statement, the company's CEO, Andy Harries, stated, "Alfred Molina is one of my favorite actors, and it's thrilling to be working with him again. His warmth, talent and charisma are perfect to play Louise Penny's much-adored Inspector Gamache. We are privileged to be shooting 'Three Pines' as our first-ever series in Canada, and bringing the originality and popularity of her incredible stories to a worldwide audience."

Christina Wayne, head of Canadian originals at Amazon Studios, added, "The series will be our first locally produced scripted drama, and we are thrilled to work with Left Bank to bring these layered characters, unique setting and masterfully constructed mysteries that Louise created to Prime Video. Alfred Molina perfectly embodies the cerebral and compassionate nature of Gamache and leads a tremendous cast."

That cast also includes Rossif Sutherland ("River," 2015), Clare Coulter ("I, Daniel Blake," 2016) and Anna Tierney ("Deceit").

**Shue in:** If you were around in the '80s, you know Elisabeth Shue from such films as "Adventures in Babysitting" (1987), "Cocktail" (1988), "Back to the Future 2" (1989) and "3" (1990), and, of course, "The Karate Kid" (1984) — in fact, she recently reprised her role as Ali in the third season of Netflix's "Cobra Kai."

More recently, Shue starred in and served as executive producer of the Netflix comedy "On the Verge," and she put in a pretty memorable turn in Amazon Prime's "The Boys."

Count on Shue to keep adding more acting credits to her already lengthy resume as the actress recently joined the cast of the upcoming Showtime anthology series "Super Pumped," which brings viewers a different story from the business world every season. And given some of the scandals that have played out in the news in recent years, it seems there are plenty of stories to be mined there.

Season 1 will focus on the rise of Uber, the ride-hailing app that changed how we travel (and order takeout), as based on the book "Super Pumped: The Battle for Uber" by Mike Isaac.

While Joseph Gordon-Levitt ("Inception," 2010) leads the cast as Uber co-founder and CEO Travis Kalanick, Shue is now set to play his mother, Bonnie Kalanick, who is described as "the one person he can always count on for wisdom and truth."

Kyle Chandler ("Friday Night Lights"), Hank Azaria ("The Simpsons") and Kerry Bishé ("Penny Dreadful: City of Angels") also star.

**Drop Dead' Do-Over:** According to Deadline, CBS is giving "Drop Dead Diva" the reboot treatment, and there's a twist.

The original series, which spans six seasons, is the story of self-centred model and "diva" Deb (played by Brooke D'Orsay, "Two and a Half Men"), whose soul resurfaces in the body of plus-size attorney Jane (Brooke Elliott, "Sweet Magnolias") after a car crash. The comedy-drama's focus on body positivity and its takedown of the beauty myth resonated with viewers and critics alike, and it was rewarded with multiple GLAAD Awards.

What's more, the last two seasons probably wouldn't have happened if it weren't for the fans: Lifetime, which ran the series from 2008 to 2014, canceled the series in January 2013 but resurrected it less than two months later after negotiating a more cost-effective arrangement with Sony Pictures Television. (It's worth noting that "Drop Dead Diva" remains one of the studio's top-streamed TV titles today.)

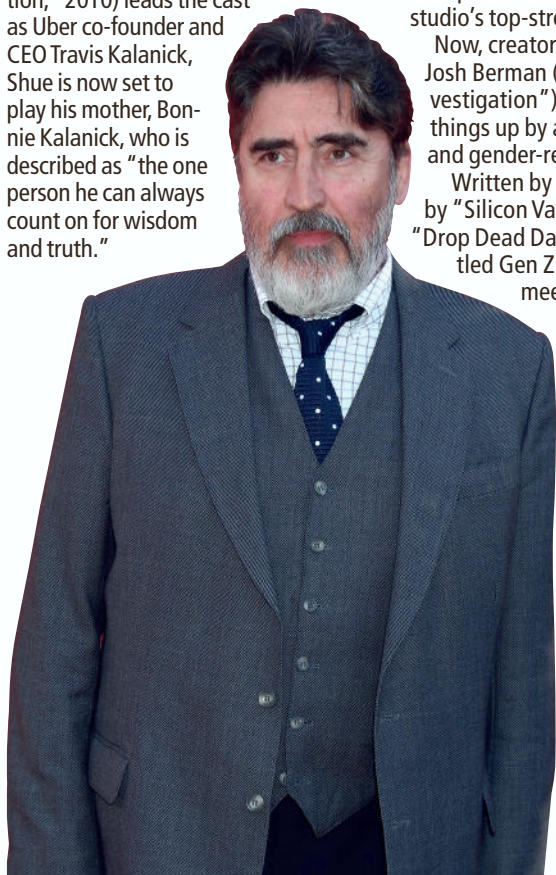
Now, creator/executive producer Josh Berman ("CSI: Crime Scene Investigation") is looking to freshen things up by adding a generational- and gender-related spin.

Written by Berman and directed by "Silicon Valley's" Jamie Babbit, "Drop Dead Dave" is the story of entitled Gen Z lawyer Dave, who

meets an untimely end in a freak accident. As you'd expect, his soul resurfaces in the body of Rita, a complicated Gen X attorney, forcing Dave to gain an entirely new perspective on life, love and identity.

"Drop Dead Dave" is still in development as an hour-long series, but "Drop Dead Diva" is currently available to stream with a Starz subscription across various platforms.

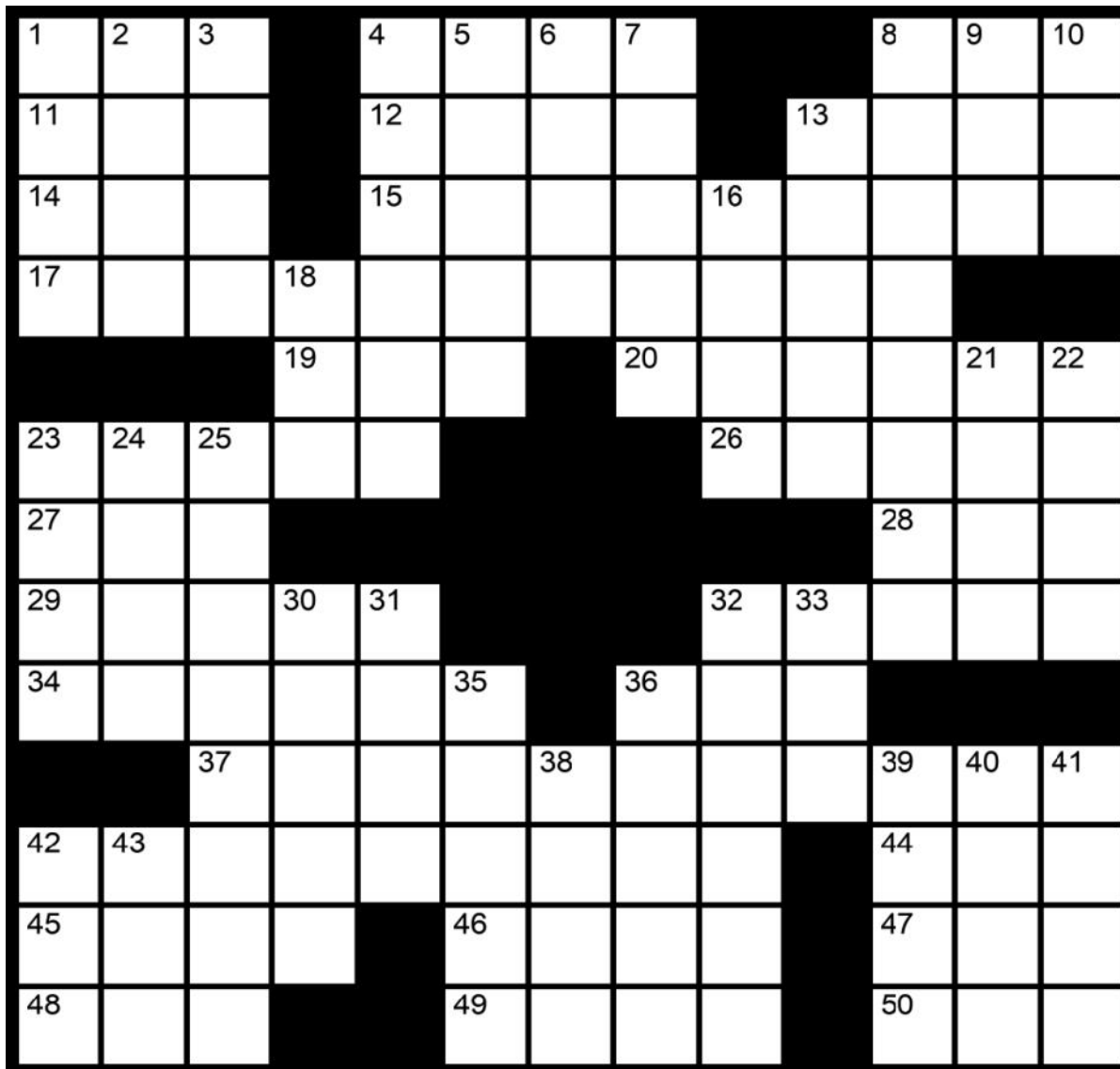

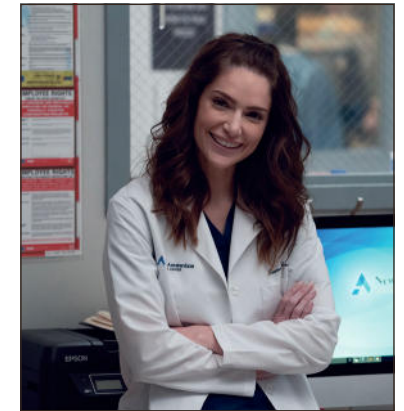

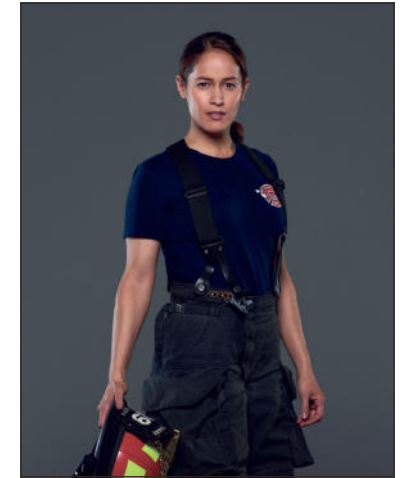
