Manchin
says no to
Senate run
Concedes he'd
'never say never'

U.S. Sen. Joe Manchin, following a national news report about the slim possibility that he could still run for his current seat as an independent, said there's no way. Mostly no way.

Manchin said of Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, "He knows I've already made my decision. I'm happy with my decision."

CNN reported this week that Schumer had talked with Manchin about the possibility of running as an independent for U.S. Senate, a decision that could be made late in the cycle.

That story made clear that Manchin "threw cold water" on the possibility — but included comments from Manchin that didn't slam the door. "I think that's a long, long, long-shot scenario," Manchin told CNN. He continued, "I don't know if anything in Washington, D.C., is 100%."

The CNN story laid out a scenario where Manchin could feel compelled to run as an independent if the winner of West Virginia's Democratic primary is Don Blankenship, a political lightning rod and former coal titan who spent a year in jail on a mine safety conspiracy conviction. Blankenship, a Republican candidate for U.S. Senate in 2018, switched parties and has announced another run.

Manchin's latest comments were made to Jeff Jenkins of West Virginia MetroNews from the state boys basketball tournament in Charleston.

As he said in the CNN story, Manchin conceded to MetroNews, "You never say never

Bus drivers 'scared to death' over Green Bag roundabouts

Nineteen school bus drivers signed their names to a letter asking the West Virginia Division of Highways to reconsider its plan to build roundabouts on

Green Bag Road. "We are a group of concerned school bus drivers who drive this route in Morgantown daily," the letter opens. "Some of us drive this route six times a day. We know what we are talking about when we say a roundabout — let

alone two roundabouts — are not safe here." The letter is about the opening phase of what's planned to be a multi-step process addressing the entirety of Green Bag Road. Among other improvements, Phase I will widen a portion of

the road and build two roundabouts — one at the intersection of Green Bag and Kingwood Pike/Dorsey Avenue and another at the intersection with Mississippi Street.

WVU-led Three Rivers Quest expands environmental research

Private support from the Colcom Foundation for West Virginia University and the West Virginia Water Research Institute is providing \$3.5 million in financial resources to help bolster environmental sustainability and water research efforts at WVU and throughout the region.

The Colcom Foundation, a longtime benefactor of the WVU School of Medicine, is based in Pittsburgh, and focuses on enacting positive environmental change with a focus on aquatic, riparian and terrestrial habitats. Now, the organization is providing additional funds for the West Virginia Water Research Institute that will add a new element to Three Rivers Quest, a water quality monitoring and reporting program supported by Colcom Foundation for more than a decade with upwards of \$3.3 million in grant funding.

Catholic schools will require vaccines

Even if state's public school change policy, diocese will not

If private and parochial schools are allowed to set their own immunization policies under new legislation, West Virginia's Catholic schools would continue to abide by existing standards.

"We're not going to change our practice. We will be requiring the normal set of immunizations for children in our schools," Mark Brennan, bishop of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston said on MetroNews' "Talkline."

"It really is for the good of the children and the staffs, but also the Catholic way is to contribute to the common good. Vaccinations have a more than two centuries track record of really helping to improve public health."

House Bill 5105 removes vaccination requirements for students in virtual public schools, and it also would allow private and parochial schools to set their own standards.

But senators pulled out a provision that would have allowed parents to send in a letter citing a religious exemption to vaccination requirements. The bill passed both chambers on the final night of the regular legislative session and is now awaiting a decision from the governor.

West Virginia's latest figures show 12,494 non-public school students in 143 private/parochial schools. This does not include 25,882 homeschooled students.

Of those, the largest number are private schools associated with the Catholic Church — with total enrollment in 26 elementary and high schools at 4,528 students.

"We need to protect those children and also the teachers and the staff who are with them — but also the wider community. We're helping by having children who have the proper immunizations. It really contributes to the good of the entire state. So we will not be changing our policy," Brennan said.

"It is great that the Legislature wants to recognize our rights to do what we think is proper in our

This work has already been funded.

According to The Dominion Post archive, the project is estimated at \$19 million — including \$3 million in right-of-way improvements in the previous fiscal year and \$16 million in construction in the current fiscal year 2025.

The Dominion Post reached out to the DOH for an update on the project but did not receive a response.

Bert Kessler has been driving a school bus in Monongalia County for the last six years or so. He estimated some 30 buses go through that area daily coming to and/or from South Middle School, Morgantown High School and the Monongalia County Technical Education Center.

“I don’t necessarily understand why it’s always roundabouts that are needed. If they want to do something to help traffic flow, widen out the road and put in turning lanes,” Kessler said, noting his major concern is about the length of the construction process and how buses will be detoured.

He said drivers have been told traffic, including the eight buses that travel Kingwood Pike daily, will be detoured onto Aarons Creek.

“I drove the Aarons Creek bus for a few months last year. It wasn’t too bad because there’s not a lot of traffic on that road. Then one day there was an accident on the Pike, and they sent all the traffic to Aarons Creek,” he said. “It’s not wide enough to pass. I was pretty much stuck sitting there with all that traffic coming at me. That’s going to be every day. It’s not going

to work.”

To put the Green Bag Road project in context, the Morgantown Monongalia Metropolitan Planning Organization conducted a study of the route in 2014-15. The study looked at the entire corridor, including the operation of the Kingwood Pike and Mississippi Street intersections. It indicated both fail to adequately move vehicles during high traffic times.

In the years that followed, the conversation picked up considerably once it became known that roundabouts were a major component of the state’s prescribed solution.

In a 2020 guest editorial for The Dominion Post, MPO Executive Director Bill Austin explained the reasoning for traffic circles.

“The WVDOH’s preliminary engineering study explored this aspect of the project in depth and found that installing a roundabout would make traveling the corridor significantly quicker than signals would. The roundabout alternative is also safer than signals, since there can be no “T-bone” accidents in a roundabout. The WVDOH engineering study also shows that, unlike traffic signals, a roundabout can be constructed at a lower cost to taxpayers and does not require displacing a business or a residence.”

But they will require land.

Members of the Hastings family operate a community garden on their property at the intersection of Green Bag and Kingwood Pike. They rallied the community against the plan, ultimately prompting the DOH to conduct an environmental study for a project it initially said was exempt from

such consideration.

That study opened a public comment opportunity that the state ended up extending due to the amount of community feedback received.

In early 2022, the DOH issued its findings — the project would have no significant environmental impact.

It did, however, require funding for community gardens as a means of addressing the loss of the Hastings property. A grant process to that end is currently open for applications. Information is available on the MPO’s website, plantogether.org.

But the Hastings family isn’t the only property owner to be impacted.

The Mississippi Street roundabout will require about two acres of property owned by the city of Morgantown.

That is the location of the city’s maintenance and public works garage.

Hollie Gregory, with the city’s communication office, said the project has the city’s full support.

“The roundabout’s design mitigates any significant impacts on flow of traffic in and out of the city garage. Additionally, plans to renovate the city garage have taken potential impacts to the property into consideration,” she explained.

According to Kessler and the letter, signed “The School Bus Drivers of Monongalia and Preston County,” not everyone shares the city’s enthusiasm for the changes.

“We are scared to death ... We are against it,” the letter states. “Please consider turning lanes as a less impactful alternative. If we can’t stop the project, let’s at least work together to choose a solution everyone can agree on. Anything but this roundabout — please.”

Cease-fire talks with Israel and Hamas are expected to resume on Sunday in Qatar

CAIRO — Stalled talks aimed at securing a cease-fire in the Israel-Hamas war are expected to resume in earnest in Qatar as soon as Sunday, according to Egyptian officials.

The talks would mark the first time both Israeli officials and Hamas leaders join the indirect negotiations since the start of the Muslim holy month of Ramadan. International mediators had hoped to secure a six-week truce before Ramadan started earlier this week, but Hamas refused any deal that wouldn’t lead to a permanent cease-fire in Gaza, a demand Israel rejected.

But both sides have made moves in recent days aimed at getting the talks, which never fully broke off, back on track.

Hamas gave mediators a new proposal for a three-stage plan that would end the fighting, according to two Egyptian officials, one who is involved in the talks and a second who was briefed on them. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren’t authorized to reveal the contents of the sensitive discussions.

The first stage would be a six-week cease-fire that would see the release of 35 hostages — women,

those who are ill and older people — held by militants in Gaza in exchange for 350 Palestinian prisoners held by Israel.

Hamas would also release at least five female soldiers in exchange for 50 prisoners, including some serving long sentences on terror charges, for each soldier. Israeli forces would withdraw from two main roads in Gaza, let displaced Palestinians return to northern Gaza, which has been devastated by the fighting, and allow the free flow of aid to the area, the officials said.

Nearly one in three children under 2 years old in the isolated north have acute malnutrition, the

U.N. children’s agency said Friday.

In the second phase, the two sides would declare a permanent cease-fire and Hamas would free the remaining Israeli soldiers held hostage in exchange for more prisoners, the officials said.

In the third phase, Hamas would hand over the bodies it’s holding in exchange for Israel lifting the blockade of Gaza and allowing reconstruction to start, the officials said.

Talks were expected to resume Sunday afternoon, though they could get pushed to Monday, the Egyptian officials said.

schools, but we do think it is proper to maintain the protocols we had in place for immunizations for our students.”

As of now, the West Virginia Department of Education boasts that the state has one of the most effective school-entry vaccine preventable laws in the nation: “The vaccination laws have proven to improve attendance rates for students and staff while ensuring children stay healthy, safe, and ready to learn.”

West Virginia students entering school for the first time must show proof of immunization against diphtheria, pertussis,

tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, rubella, varicella, and hepatitis B, unless properly medically exempted.

Asked last week about whether he would sign the bill loosening the requirements for virtual students and private schools, Gov. Jim Justice said he hadn’t yet made up his mind.

“I just need to look at it. I am all for all the understandings of our freedoms. I am not a medical doctor. I do not know the ramifications about the possibilities that can exist or would exist by taking the shots and everything,” Justice said.

“Let me just look at it. I think it’s premature for me to say ‘Yeah, I’ll sign it or

we’ll go another way.”

At a state Board of Education meeting last week, Fred Albert of the American Federation of Teachers-West Virginia, said the bill allowing vaccination loopholes is bad policy.

“I’m all for people having freedom and choice. That’s the American way of life. But when someone’s freedom then infringes upon the safety of others, I think we have a real concern,” Albert said. “Why would we want to go back to the days of measles and mumps and rubella, chicken pox, polio.”

Albert asked people to contact the governor to urge a veto.

“Please veto this bill,” he said. “It’s not a good bill.”

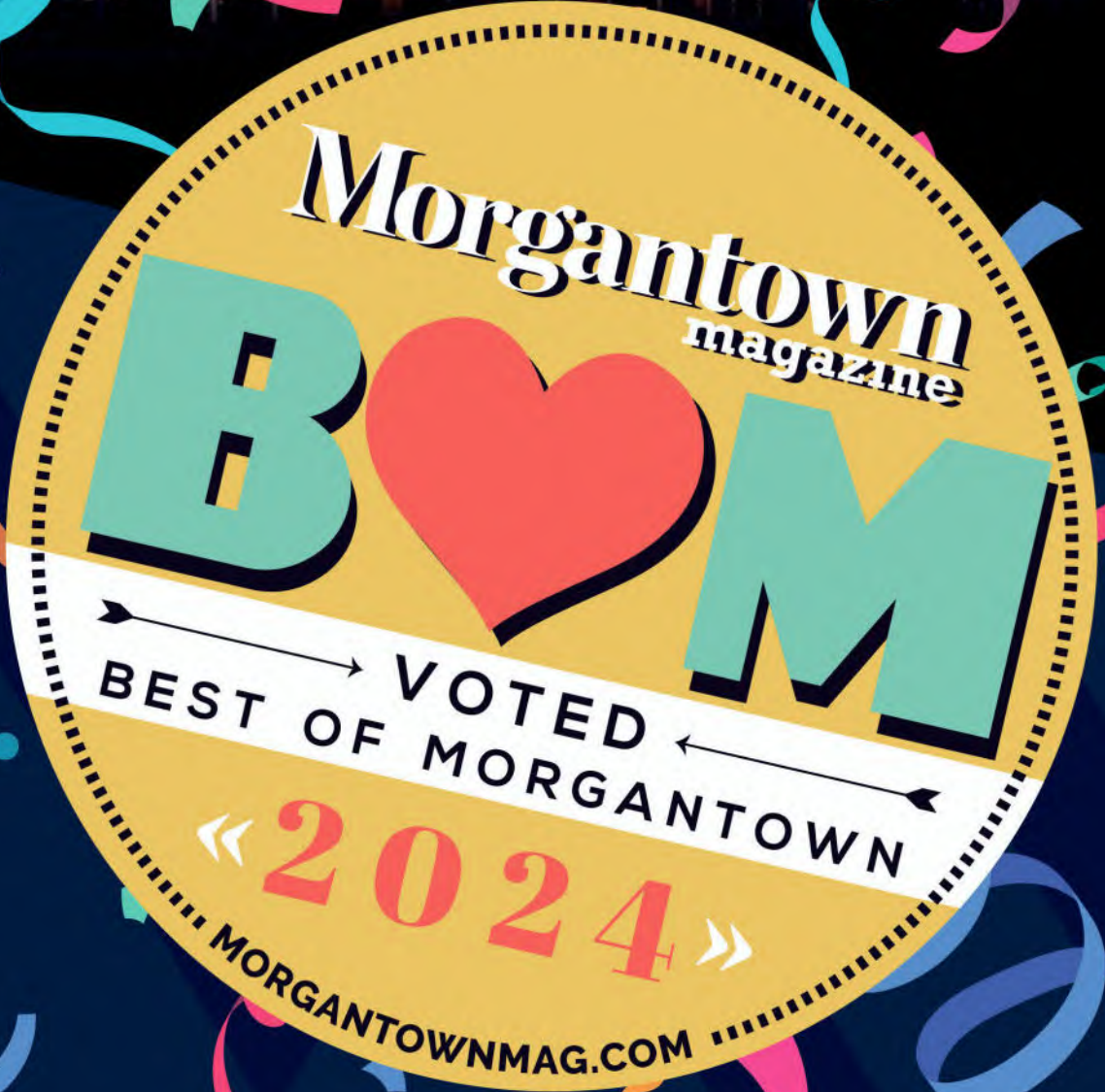

Adolescent Emergency Care at Mon Health Medical Center | Caitlyn’s Story

Fourteen-year-old Caitlyn is a student and a competitive cheerleader in Morgantown. She spends most of her time doing what she loves, cheerleading and competing in cheer competitions. As a hardworking athlete, she’s not unfamiliar with sport-related injuries or visits to the emergency department. One evening, Caitlyn, along with her parents, found themselves in Mon Health Medical Center’s Emergency Department because of Caitlyn’s injured ankle. In an unusually busy night for the hospital, Caitlyn thought she’d be in for a long night, but the Mon Health Medical Center staff stepped up to the plate to

She said the imaging tech made sure that she wasn’t in pain while getting each scan and assured her throughout the

process that she would be taken care of,” said Natalie, Caitlyn’s mom. “The tech’s kindness made her feel more comfortable and assured me that this is where I should have taken my daughter that night.” After reviewing her scans, Dr. Nick Zervos, an orthopedist on the Mon Health Medical Center staff, gave her an ankle brace and instructions for recovery. “Caitlyn is an athlete who’s always on the move,” said Natalie. “Dr. Zervos knows just how dedicated athletes are and always does what he can to get them back to their sport as soon as possible.” Just a few weeks after her visit to the ED at Mon Health Medical Center, Caitlyn is back to cheering

competitively, while wearing her ankle brace. “I’m glad I went to Mon Health because I feel comfortable there. They don’t talk down to me and really care about me as the patient,” said Caitlyn. Mon Health System is an integrated network of physician clinics, outpatient centers and hospitals in north-central West Virginia. It includes five hospitals — its flagship, Mon Health Medical Center in Morgantown; Mon Health Preston Memorial Hospital in Kingwood; Mon Health Stonewall Jackson Memorial Hospital in Weston; Mon Health Marion Neighborhood Hospital in White Hall; and affiliate, Grafton City Hospital in Grafton.

How Texas’ plans to arrest migrants for illegal entry would work

McALLEN, Texas — Texas’ plan to arrest migrants who cross the U.S.-Mexico border illegally is on hold while the

U.S. Supreme Court considers a challenge to Republican Gov. Greg Abbott’s latest move over immigration. The nation’s highest court has put a pause on law through Monday at 5 p.m.

Eastern over a lawsuit led by the Justice Department. The department argues that Texas is overstepping the federal government’s immigration by attempting to arrest migrants and empower state judges to order them to leave the U.S. A federal judge in Texas blocked the law last month in a sweeping rejection of the measure. Once in custody, migrants could either agree to a Texas judge’s order to leave the U.S. or be prosecuted on misdemeanor charges of illegal entry. Migrants who don’t leave could face arrest again under more serious

felony charges. Some places are off-limits. Arrests cannot be made in public and private schools; places of worship; or hospitals and other health care facilities, including those where sexual assault forensic examinations are conducted. Under the law, migrants ordered to leave would be sent to ports of entry along the U.S.-Mexico border, even if they are not Mexican citizens. Critics, including Mexico President Andrés Manuel López Obrador, have said the law could lead to racial profiling and family separation.

Russians cast ballots in an election preordained to extend Putin’s rule

Voters across Russia cast ballots Saturday on the second day of an election set to formalize six more years of power for President Vladimir Putin, who faces no serious challenges after crushing political dissent over his nearly quarter-century of rule. The election comes against the backdrop of a ruthless crackdown that has stifled independent media and prominent rights groups. Putin’s fiercest foe, Alexei Navalny, died in an Arctic prison in February, and other critics are either in jail or in exile.

The 71-year-old Putin faces three token rivals from Kremlin-friendly parties who have refrained from any criticism of him or his full-scale invasion of Ukraine. Putin has cast his war in Ukraine, now in its third year, as an existential battle against the U.S. and other Western powers bent on destroying Russia. Officials said voting was proceeding in an orderly fashion. But despite tight controls, at least a half-dozen cases of vandalism at polling stations were reported Friday and Saturday, including a firebombing and

several people pouring green liquid into ballot boxes. The latter was an apparent homage to Navalny, who in 2017 was attacked by an assailant who splashed green disinfectant in his face. A 50-year-old university professor was arrested Saturday after she unsuccessfully tried to throw green liquid into a ballot box in the Urals city of Ekaterinburg. She was imprisoned for 15 days for “petty hooliganism”, but could face further charges, according to local news outlet Ura.ru. A pensioner in the Altai region in southern Siberia was also detained after attempting to damage ballots, Russia’s state news agency Tass reported. In Podolsk, a town close to Moscow, a woman was detained by police Saturday after she spoiled her ballot by writing an unspecified message, said OVD-Info, a police monitoring group that provides legal aid. She was charged with “discrediting the Russian army” and fined 30,000 rubles (\$342). Russian lawmakers have suggested introducing a new law to punish election saboteurs with sentences of up to eight years in prison.

Young Chinese don’t want to study abroad in the U.S.

WASHINGTON — After the pandemic, young Chinese are again looking to study abroad. But the decades-long run that has sent an estimated 3 million Chinese students to the U.S. could be trending down. The deterrent for some is the high cost of a U.S. education. For others, like Helen Dong, who chose to study in the U.K., safety is a concern. She said Chinese parents fear gun violence in the U.S. But growing tensions between the U.S. and China are contributing to the trend. The Chi-

nese government has criticized the U.S. for what it says is an unfriendly policy toward some Chinese students and is nudging them to attend Chinese institutes instead. The U.S.-China Education Trust acknowledged the predicament facing Chinese students. “Students from China have been criticized in the U.S. as potential spies, and in China as too influenced by the West,” the organization said in a report following a survey of Chinese students in the U.S. between 1991 and 2021.

to anything because you never know. But the bottom line is, that’s not where I’m going. “I’ll support my state and whoever represents my state, I want to help them. Whoever they send as my replacement, I want to help them to take care of West Virginia the way we did.” Manchin announced

Nov. 9 that he would not seek re-election to the Senate seat that he has held since 2010. Polls have consistently shown two-term Gov. Jim Justice leading the Republican primary for Senate against Congressman Alex Mooney. Democrats in the race for Senate include Wheeling Mayor Glenn Elliott and Marine Corps veteran Zach Shrewsbury, along with Blankenship.

One of Manchin’s centrist colleagues, Kyrsten Sinema, recently announced she will not seek re-election in Arizona as an independent. That race is a likely matchup between Democrat Ruben Gallego and Republican Kari Lake. Manchin considered a presidential run as an independent, but ruled that out last month. He has continued to promote centrist politics, working with a new organization called Americans Together with his daughter Heather. “I’m concerned about how divided we’ve become. Washington is broken. It won’t be fixed inside of Washington, so if I can help my daughter through her group, Americans Together, I’ll do whatever I can to let people know it’s the sensible middle that will save our country,” he said from the basketball tournament.

With green and glee, major U.S. parades mark St. Patrick’s Day — a little early

NEW YORK — People across the United States celebrated Irish heritage at several major St. Patrick’s Day parades Saturday, marking the holiday a day early at events that included a big anniversary in Savannah, Georgia, and honored a pioneering female business leader as grand marshal in New York.

The holiday commemorates Ireland’s patron saint and was popularized largely by Irish Catholic immigrants. While St. Patrick’s Day falls on March 17, some parades were moved up from Sunday, a day of worship for the Christian faithful.

Manhattan’s St. Patrick’s Day Parade, which dates to 1762 — 14 years before the U.S. Declaration of Independence — is one of the

world’s largest Irish heritage festivities.

Megan Stransky of Houston and two relatives planned a Broadway weekend to coincide with the parade, seeing it as a prime opportunity to remember their family’s Irish roots and the traditions that helped shape their upbringing.

The event didn’t disappoint.

“There is no comparison to any other parade or city that I’ve been to,” Stransky marveled as she took in the bagpipers, bands, police and military contingents and more.

The grand marshal, Irish-born Heineken USA CEO Maggie Timoney, is the first female CEO of a major U.S. beer company. At a pre-parade reception at New York’s mayoral residence, Irish Minister for Justice Helen McEntee

hailed the recognition for Timoney and noted some other causes for celebrating Irish American links this year, including Irish actor Cillian Murphy’s best actor Oscar win last weekend.

New York City has multiple parades on various dates around its five boroughs—including, on Sunday, the first St. Patrick’s Day parade allowing LGBTQ+ groups to march on Staten Island.

Mayor Eric Adams last month announced the plan for the new, privately organized celebration, arranged after a local organization asked for years to join the borough’s decades-old parade. That longstanding event, which does not allow groups to march under LGBTQ+ banners, happened earlier this month.

State Medicaid offices target dead people’s homes to recoup their health care costs

WASHINGTON — As Salvatore LoGrande fought cancer and all the pain that came with it, his daughters promised to keep him in the white, pitched roof house he worked so hard to buy all those decades ago.

So, Sandy LoGrande thought it was a mistake when, a year after her father’s death, Massachusetts billed her \$177,000 for her father’s Medicaid expenses and threatened to sue for his home if she didn’t pay up quickly.

“The home was everything,” to her father said LoGrande, 57.

But the bill and accompanying threat weren’t a mistake.

Rather, it was part of a routine process the federal government requires of every state: to recover money from the assets of

dead people who, in their final years, relied on Medicaid, the taxpayer-funded health insurance for the poorest Americans.

A person’s home is typically exempt from qualifying for Medicaid. But it is subject to the estate recovery process for those who were over 55 and used Medicaid to pay for long-term care such as nursing home stays or in-home health care.

This month, a Democratic lawmaker proposed scuttling the “cruel” program altogether. Critics argue the program collects too little—roughly 1%—of the more than \$150 billion Medicaid spends yearly on long-term care. They also say many states fail to warn people who sign up for Medicaid that big bills and claims to their property might await their families once they die.

LoGrande says that’s

how she ended up in a two-year legal battle with Massachusetts after her father died. Several years before he died in 2016, she had turned to a local nonprofit for advice on caring for her elderly father. The group suggested she sign him up for Medicaid. She even remembers asking about the house, but was assured the state would only seek the house if it sent her father to a nursing home.

“He never would have signed on with anything that would put his home in jeopardy,” she said.

For years, her father got an annual renewal notice from the state’s Medicaid office. She says it wasn’t until after his death, when the state’s demand for \$177,000 arrived, that she saw the first bill for his care, which included a brief stint in the hospital for pain from cancer, medications and hospice.

watersheds,” Colcom Foundation President John Barsotti said. “Through facilitating collaboration between academic researchers and citizen scientists, this initiative has generated invaluable data, fostering deeper understanding and proactive conservation efforts. Colcom Foundation remains committed to supporting initiatives like Three Rivers Quest that promote environmental stewardship and community engagement.”

Thanks to Colcom’s support, the Three Rivers Quest will continue to provide educational opportunities that will benefit the local region.

“This project aims to

simultaneously address community and WVU student needs by providing innovative opportunities for student-community engagement centered around rural water issues,” Rachel Spirnak, water resources specialist with the West Virginia Water Research Institute, said. “In collaboration with watershed groups and WVU instructors, we will develop a ‘Common Waters Collaborative’ to address key needs on both sides. Watershed groups often have specific problems that need solved through research or technical assistance, but don’t have the personnel or expertise to tackle them.”

Meanwhile, many WVU students are seeking impactful research projects to tackle as they fulfill their

course and degree requirements, Spirnak explained.

“We envision the primary vehicle for this work will be undergraduate capstone courses and other applied courses,” Spirnak said. “By partnering with watershed groups, the students will not only be given a project with real-world impact, but also assistance elevating their project through access to existing data, local knowledge, resources and physical sites for research. Students will learn how to engage communities in research and will be exposed to potential careers.”

With the Colcom Foundation endowment funds, Three Rivers Quest, which was greatly expanded thanks to Colcom funding in 2011, will add this new component to its work in

monitoring rivers, tributaries and headwater streams that drain an area of 25,000 square miles in five states.

“The first objective of the Three Rivers Quest was to prevent sulfate and dissolved solids from exceeding the EPA’s Drinking Water Standards in the Monongahela River so that those treatment costs would not be passed on to water customers,” Paul Ziemkiewicz, director of the West Virginia Water Research Institute, said. “It’s worked for 14 years now, and it is a perfect example of how a modest scientific and management approach succeeds where hundreds of millions of dollars would have been wasted on failed reverse osmosis facilities.

“With the cooperation of

the coal industry and state agencies, Three Rivers Quest’s discharge management strategy went into effect immediately and costs almost nothing to implement.”

Research and data-collection efforts take place across 42 monthly monitoring stations in the Upper Ohio River Basin and contribute to the region’s largest publicly available database on water conditions used by federal agencies, nonprofit organizations and other academic researchers. Three Rivers Quest brings these groups together to analyze data in local rivers and waterways in an effort to impact public policy and conservation efforts.

Three Rivers Quest not only collaborates with watershed groups for research purposes but also provides

them with resources, tools and networking opportunities. For example, 3RQ provides a data warehouse and online mapping tools free to watershed groups and hosts an annual roundtable series. Three Rivers Quest has a repository of data and established relationships with local groups but, until now, has had a limited reach in engaging WVU students in the work. Through the Common Waters Collaborative, WVU students in STEAM programs will conduct research or create outreach products for their partner watershed group.

Grants from the Colcom Foundation are awarded through the WVU Foundation, the nonprofit organization that receives and administers private funding on behalf of West Virginia University.

TikTok creators warn of economic impact if app sees ban, call it a vital space for the marginalized

Alex Pearlman shut the door on dreams of a standup comedy career almost a decade ago, pivoting from the stage to an office cubicle where he worked a customer service job.

Then he started posting random jokes and commentary about pop culture and politics on TikTok. Just over 2.5 million followers later, he quit his nine-to-five and recently booked his first nationwide tour.

Pearlman is among the many TikTok creators across the U.S. outraged over a bipartisan bill passed by the House of Representatives on Wednesday that would lead to a nationwide ban of the popular video app if its China-based owner, ByteDance, doesn't sell its stake. The bill still needs to go through the Senate, where its prospects are unclear.

Content creators say a ban would hurt countless people and businesses that rely on TikTok for a significant portion of their income, while also arguing TikTok has become an unrivaled platform for dialogue and community.

Pearlman, who lives outside Philadelphia, said TikTok has transformed his life, allowing him to live a dream, provide for his family and spend the first three months of his newborn son's life at home. His customer service job only offered paternity leave equivalent to three weeks off, with two weeks paid.

"I don't take a day for granted on this app, because it's been so shocking," said Pearlman, 39. "In reality,

TikTok has been the driver of American social media for the last four years. Something will step into that place if TikTok vanishes tomorrow. Whether or not that will be better or worse, Congress has no way of knowing."

TikTok, which launched in 2016, has skyrocketed in popularity, growing faster than Instagram, YouTube or Facebook. The push to remove the app from Chinese authority follows concerns from lawmakers, law enforcement and intelligence officials about the insecurity of user data, potential suppression of content unfavorable to the Chinese government and the possibility that the platform could boost pro-Beijing propaganda, all of which TikTok denies.

To date, the U.S. government hasn't provided any evidence showing TikTok shared U.S. user data with Chinese authorities.

The move comes as the pandemic saw huge growth in digital marketing as people were stuck at home consuming — and creating — content at levels not seen before.

Jensen Savannah, a 29-year-old from Charlotte, began making TikToks of her travels around the Carolinas during the pandemic. Now a full-time influencer, she has tripled her income since leaving her telecommunications sales job.

"Social media Influencer" is almost to be looked at as the new print and the new form of radio and TV advertising," she said. "It's going to bring your dollar much farther than it is in traditional marketing."

Suspect barricaded in New Jersey home after killing 3 people in Philadelphia suburb, police say

TRENTON, N.J. — A gunman killed three people in their Philadelphia-area homes and then barricaded himself in a house in New Jersey's capital city Saturday, authorities said, in a string of violence that spread fear among the suburbs and prompted a major police response spanning two states.

The mayhem forced the cancellation of a St. Patrick's Day parade and shut down a Sesame Street-themed amusement park. Authorities in Pennsylvania's Bucks County issued a shelter-in-place order for some areas for several hours.

The suspect, identified as 26-year-old Andre Gordon Jr., killed his stepmother, his teenage sister and the mother of his children in

shootings that stretched into two homes in eastern Pennsylvania's Falls Township in the morning, Bucks County District Attorney Jennifer Schorn said.

Officials said they couldn't yet speak to a motive for the attacks.

While Gordon had had some minor brushes with the law, they were "nothing that would indicate that anything like this would happen," Falls Township Police Chief Nelson Whitney said at a news conference.

Police said Gordon was

believed to be homeless. It was unclear whether he had an attorney or anyone else who could comment on his behalf.

After fleeing in a stolen car, then taking another in a carjacking in a store parking lot, Gordon holed up in a home in nearby Trenton, New Jersey, authorities said. By midafternoon, officers surrounded the house on a taped-off block, calling to Gordon through a loudspeaker and trying to persuade him to come out.

"Andre, get away from the windows. If you would like to surrender, dial 911 now," one message went.

Neighbors gathered by the barricade to watch what was happening. The home's residents had been taken to safety with no injuries, the Trenton Police Department said.

Long recovery ahead for some in path of deadly tornados in central U.S.

LAKEVIEW, Ohio — Residents in a swath of the central U.S. hit by deadly tornadoes were cleaning up, assessing damage and helping neighbors on Saturday. But it will be a long recovery from the storms that ripped through parts of Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana and Arkansas.

Thursday night's storms claimed three lives in the Indian Lake area of Ohio's Logan County, one of the hardest-hit regions, and about 40 people were injured and dozens of homes damaged in one Indiana community. Tornadoes were also reported in Illinois and Missouri.

Samantha Snipes, 33, said that when she first heard the tornado warning, she called her father who lives seven minutes away and told him to take cover. He said he was trying to by getting into the closet

in her childhood home and then the phone cut out, she told The Associated Press.

She and her husband tried to drive down the main road to get to him but couldn't do so. They were able to get through the back way after the tornado passed.

"It looked like out of a movie, like 'Twister' " she said. "My dad's garage was leveled. The back of his house is gone. Like everything's gone."

They climbed over everything screaming for him. When they found him, he wasn't injured and he

told them to stop crying, she said.

Her father, Joe Baker, had always told his children to hide in the closet if there was ever a tornado.

"We grew up here. Like this is our childhood home," said Snipes who Saturday was throwing away things and figuring out what could be saved. "And you see it on the news. But you never imagine it's going to happen to you."

Steve Wills, a pastor, who owns a vacation home down the road on Orchard Island, said Saturday he was bringing a family crew to finish cleaning up and cover a hole in the roof.

"We're saddened for the families that lost people. There's three deaths in our community. You know, that breaks our heart," Wills said. "But it could have been so much more, so much more. Yeah, so I still have faith."

Alec Baldwin seeks dismissal of grand jury indictment in fatal shooting of cinematographer

SANTA FE, N.M. — Defense attorneys for Alec Baldwin urged a New Mexico judge on Thursday to dismiss a grand jury indictment against the actor in the fatal shooting of a cinematographer on the set of the Western movie "Rust."

The indictment in January charged Baldwin with involuntary manslaughter in the death of cinematographer Halyna Hutchins on Oct. 21, 2021, at a movie ranch on the outskirts of

Santa Fe.

Baldwin has pleaded not guilty to the charge. His attorneys in a new court filing accused prosecutors of "unfairly stacking the deck" against Baldwin in grand jury proceedings that diverted attention away from exculpatory evidence and witnesses.

They say that prevented the jury from asserting their obligation to hear testimony from director Joel Souza, who was wounded in the shooting while standing near

Hutchins, as well as assistant director and safety coordinator Dave Halls and props master Sarah Zachry.

"The grand jury did not receive the favorable or exculpatory testimony and documents that the state had an obligation to present," said the court motion signed by defense attorney Luke Nikas. "Nor was the grand jury told it had a right to review and the obligation to request this information."

Prosecutor Kari Morrissey declined to comment

and said a response will be filed with the court.

Baldwin's motion also asserts that the grand jury received inaccurate and one-sided testimony about the revolver involved in the fatal shooting.

"Rust" armorer Hannah Gutierrez-Reed was convicted by a jury last week in the shooting and is being held without bond pending an April sentencing hearing. Involuntary manslaughter carries a felony sentence of up to 18 months in prison and a \$5,000 fine.

Joseph M. George, who died on March 8, 2024, at age 98, was born in Waynesburg, Pa., on Oct. 13, 1925. He and his wife Catherine had been married for nearly 70 years.

He was the seventh of eight children, and the fifth of five sons, born to Michael George, a coal miner and railroad laborer, and his wife Susan Attiyah George, both of whom were immigrants from Syria. As a child he developed a lifelong love of fishing. He also enjoyed ruffed grouse and rabbit hunting. In high school he was a wrestler and football player.

Brought up during the Great Depression, of which he retained vivid memories, he placed great emphasis throughout his life on working diligently and with gratitude for the blessing of having a job, living within one's means, saving for a rainy day, and being compassionate and generous to those in need.

A kindness done to him or a member of his family, however small, was never forgotten.

In 1944, while still a senior in high school, he was conscripted to serve in

the United States Army in World War II. As a member of the 264th Regiment, 66th Infantry Division — known as the Black Panthers — he was aboard the troop carrier Leopoldville when it was sunk by a German torpedo while crossing the English Channel. He was rescued from the sea by the crew of a British patrol boat and transported with other uninjured survivors to serve in the Normandy campaign and the St. Nazaire and L'Orient Pockets. There he suffered shrapnel wounds while under intense shelling by 88-millimeter German artillery.

On May 10, 1945, then-Sgt. and Squad Leader George participated in the formal ceremony near Caudon, France, in which 50,000 German troops under Lt. Gen. Wilhelm Fahrmbacher surrendered to the 66th Division, led by Maj. Gen. Herman Kramer. As a member of the Honor Guard for the ceremony, appointed by Col. James R. Hamilton, his commanding officer whom he revered, he was handed a dagger and a side-arm by a German officer.

He was transferred to the 42nd Rainbow Division and was among the soldiers who saw the concentration camp at Dachau which the division had liberated a few weeks earlier on April 29, 1945. Fearing that the reality of the Nazi camps would

be disbelieved or denied, Gen. Eisenhower had instructed commanding officers to ensure that American GIs serving in the vicinity of the camps witnessed their enormity.

At the war's conclusion, he was with the U.S. troops who marched through the Arc de Triomphe and was among those to receive the personal greeting of General de Gaulle.

He served with the four-power occupation forces in Nuremberg, Germany, and Vienna, Austria. He received the Combat Infantry Badge, the Bronze Star, and other decorations and was later made a Chevalier (Knight) of the Legion of Honor of France and a member of the Order of Lafayette.

After returning to the United States, he met Catherine, and the two married and settled in Morgantown. They became parents of five sons.

He found employment as a sales representative in the wine and spirits industry, and later established George Associates, a brokerage and marketing firm. He also became a real estate developer in north-central West Virginia and southwestern Pennsylvania. He was co-founder of the Mid-Atlantic Control States Beverage Journal, published for West Virginia, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Ohio and North Carolina. He was a founding mem-

ber of the Mount Morris Sportsman's Club and was active in the VFW and served as post commander of the American Legion.

As a boy, he had watched elderly Civil War veterans marching in Memorial Day parades. For more than 70 years, he marched in the annual Mount Morris Memorial Day Parade alongside his fellow veterans from conflicts stretching from World War I to Iraq and Afghanistan.

He was a member of several civic and fraternal organizations, including Toastmasters, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, and the Rotary Club. He and his wife enjoyed dancing as members of the Beau Monde Club. He was also a member of the Johnson & Chesterton Club of Oxford, England, and was a recipient of the Club's Edmund Burke Award.

He served as an appointed member of the Monongalia County Condemnation Commission and the then-Monongalia General Hospital Property Board.

Throughout his life, Joseph was a person of deep Christian faith. Brought up in the Antiochian Orthodox tradition, he was received into the Catholic Church as a young man. He and Catherine were parishioners of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Star City. Faith was always at the center of their

family's life.

Joseph George is survived by his wife; and his sons, Robert (Cindy), a professor at Princeton University, Leonard (Rebecca), a businessman in Morgantown, and Kent (Georgette), Keith and Edward (Andrea), all of whom are lawyers in Charleston; grandchildren, David (Saniya), Rachel (Mark), Alexandra, Nicholas, Francesca, Hannah, Amanda and Sarrah; and great-grandchildren, Rayaana and Lily.

He was a voracious reader, a trait he shared with his beloved sisters, especially of history, biographies, current affairs and business. Known for his kindness, especially to anyone in need, cheerfulness, and exceptional gift for friendship, he loved to laugh and to sing. He is considered a "second father" by many, including, William Porth, Pragnya Patel, Eduardo Vigil, Andrew Ostrom, David Russo, Nidal Makhoul, Patrick McGinley, Gordon Copeland and Chuck Hempel.

Joseph George was also known for his exceptional courage. In 1967, with his young children watching in fear and awe, he rushed into a burning house to rescue a paraplegic man in a wheelchair. That he would unhesitatingly do such a thing was no surprise to anyone who knew him.

Westwood Middle School takes on NASA's challenge to find ways to plant crops on the moon

That's one small step for interstellar irrigation ... one giant leap for space-spinach, to be.

"Took us a couple of days," Will Bolyard said.

"Then it was like, 'Well, you know it is zero gravity.'"

Will, a sixth-grader at Westwood Middle School, is a budding scientist who wants to dig in to Mars some day.

NASA does, too.

The space agency in recent years has rocketed up the Artemis project, with a goal of putting astronauts on the Red Planet in Will's lifetime — provided the aforementioned, gravity-defying groceries work out.

To get there, the Earth's moon will serve as the literal launch pad, and that means colonizing the orb we see nightly from our window.

The infrastructure of outer space will abound.

Structures will be have to be built to safely house the astronauts, and there's something else.

A certain something, in this case, that couldn't be more earth-bound.

Something oh-so-organic and elemental.

Everybody's gotta eat.

Which, Will's teacher Lindsay Smalls said, means going back to the land.

Of another planet.

"You can't truck soil up there," she said. "Not at \$15,000 a ton."

You can't haul a bunch of ready-made food up there either, she added, though NASA did get pretty good at that during its Apollo run in the 1960s.

The idea of Artemis is to grow your own, once you get there.

Salad bar from outer space

With the help of the Institute for Competitive Sciences, which is a sort of think-tank for students from elementary school to college, NASA two years ago launched the "Planting the Moon" challenge, an effort to see who could devise the best, most efficient ways to plant crops on the moon.

Like every experiment, it began with a series of questions:

Will plants and vegetation actually be able grow in the lunar "regolith" — that dusty, grainy layer of rocks and minerals covering the moon like a tablecloth?

In outer space, what will food sustainability actually mean?

What about nutrients, fertilizers and everything and anything else that might need to be deployed to make the regolith more hospitable to literal alien invaders?

Westwood Middle is among schools from the north-east and southeast taking part in the experiments.

How does the tech behind fingerprinting work?

HUMANS ARE 99.9% GENETICALLY SIMILAR. THAT 0.1% DIFFERENCE IS WHAT ACCOUNTS FOR OUR DIFFERING PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS, SUSCEPTIBILITY TO DISEASES AND OTHER TRAITS. That difference is also the reason each person — even those who are "identical" to others — has unique fingerprints.

Fingerprints are one of the earliest features to develop inside the womb. The pressure of amniotic fluid across the surface of the hands and the growth rate of the fingers influence the formation of patterns on the fingertips. Fingerprints develop at about the 24th week of fetal development. The pattern of hills and valleys grows over time, but the overall shape itself stays the same throughout people's lifetimes.

There are three basic

classes of fingerprints: Whorls (mostly look like swirls or circles), loops (curvy lines that start and end on the same side of the finger) and arches (start and end on opposite sides of the finger). The basic purpose of fingertips is to help us detect the smallest changes across surfaces and/or to grip objects.

Fingerprints were used in place of signatures as early as 1,000 B.C. in China, Babylon, Persia and Nova Scotia. Today, fingerprints are used for

‘Love Lies Bleeding’ is an unhinged yet funny tale of revenge

SOMETIMES MOVIES ARE PREDICTABLE, AND THAT JUST MAKES THEM BORING. Often, when you can see what's coming in the story, it takes all of the joy out of watching it unfold. But every now and again, a movie comes along that has fairly predictable plot beats and still manages to surprise as it unfolds. That was absolutely the case with Rose Glass's sophomore film, "Love Lies Bleeding."

When Jackie (Katy O'Brian) rolls into New Mexico with a toothbrush and dreams of being a bodybuilder, she finds her way to Lou's (Kristen Stewart) gym and then to Lou's bed. Lou is primarily concerned with keeping her sister Beth (Jena Malone) safe from her abusive husband JJ (Dave

Franco) while also trying to navigate a difficult relationship with her criminal father Lou (Ed Harris). When Jackie and Lou get tangled up in a murder, they must confront their pasts and look to the future together.

many similar purposes: a unique identifier for the person used to associate them with various records and accounts. For example, I used my fingerprint to scan in for lunches during middle/high school. Fingerprinting is also used by law enforcement and employers to link a person to certain records.

Back when fingerprinting first began — and before the development of the fingerprinting technology we have today — inking was used. Individuals would press their fingers down onto an ink pad and then roll their fingertips around on a fingerprint card.

There are three types of fingerprint scanners: optical, capacitance and ultrasonic.

The main optical scanner is called the CCD, which is the "charged coupled device." It is a circuit that has an array of capacitors. Each capacitor can transfer its charge to the next capacitor. There are photo sites containing the light and

Bernie Sanders wants to adopt 32-hour workweek

The 40-hour workweek has been standard in the U.S. for more than eight decades. Now some members of Congress want to give hourly workers an extra day off. Sen. Bernie Sanders this week introduced a bill that would shorten to 32 hours the amount of time many people in the U.S. can work each week before they're owed overtime. The far-left independent from Vermont says U.S. companies can afford to give employees more time off without cutting their pay and benefits given advances in automation, robotics and artificial intelligence. Critics say a mandated shorter week would force many companies to hire additional workers or lose productivity.

Voters decide on age limit to serve Congress

BISMARCK, N.D. — North Dakota voters will decide in June whether to prevent people from running for Congress if they're old enough to turn 81 during their House or Senate term. Secretary of State Michael Howe announced on Friday that his office validated more than enough signatures to qualify the initiative for the June 11 ballot. The vote is set to take place amid a rematch between the oldest men to be president, Joe Biden and Donald Trump. Political observers say the measure appears unconstitutional and could lead to a challenge of a Supreme Court ruling that said states can't set qualifications for Congress beyond those listed in the U.S. Constitution.

whole film rooting for them to stay together and begging them to break up.

The sound design in this is spectacular. It's shot in a way that somehow looks both hyper-realistic and surrealist at the same time. The story is unhinged and surprisingly funny. dark aspects of the light. Altogether, this forms an image of the scanned fingerprint.

Capacitance scanners use electrical current. There are one or more semiconductors that have cells. The cells are smaller than a single ridge on the finger. When the ridges of the fingerprint are placed over the conductive plates, the charge is stored in the capacitor of the semiconductor while the air gaps between the ridges leave the charge on the capacitor unchanged. These changes are tracked by an operational amplifier integrator circuit and recorded by an analog-to-digital converter, where the digital data is analyzed.

When you press your finger against an ultrasonic fingerprint scanner, it transmits an ultrasonic pulse of sound waves (inaudible) against the finger. This information is then bounced back to a receiver, which maps out where the ridges on your fingers are, creating a 3D rendering of your fingerprint. This type of scanner works even if your

fingerprint is wet or oily at the time because of the 3D scanning. Out of the three methods, ultrasonic fingerprint scanners are the most accurate.

Fingerprints are just one way to attribute a unique identifier to use. There are also eye scans, facial recognition tech and even DNA. As similar as we humans are, there is an amazing uniqueness to all of us.

Young’s 3-pointer in overtime lifts MHS over Spring Mills to win 3rd-straight state title

CHARLESTON — It was unlike any game Morgantown High had played this season, but the result was the same as senior Sharron Young capped off his brilliant high school career by nailing a game-winning three-pointer to lift the Mohigans to an overtime win over Spring Mills in the Class AAAA state title game Saturday afternoon in the Charleston Coliseum and Convention Center.

Young hadn’t made a three-pointer through the first 35-and-a-half minutes of play in a tough-nosed defensive struggle against the Cardinals, but got the chance to be the hero with 32 seconds left and his shot from the left wing rattled through to put the Mohigans up 33-32.

“It’s almost like a dream come true,” Young said. “I’m in my driveway with my grandpa all the time and we’re always doing situations just like that.”

Fellow senior Izzy Everett made a pair of free throws down the stretch as Morgantown claimed its third-straight Class AAAA championship, 35-32.

“What an ugly game,” MHS coach Dave Tallman said. “Our defense was incredible, their defense was incredible.”

The game-winning inbound pass from Everett to Jacob King and then to Young coming around a screen, is appropriately called ‘game-winner.’

“There at the end, the staff was kind of banging our heads against the wall trying to figure out how to score and I said ‘let’s win this thing, let’s run the play game-winner and get the ball in Sharron’s hand,’” Tallman said. “Let’s get the ball in his hands, let him finish this and let’s get the heck out of here.”

Despite being 0-5 from range up to that point and just 3-18 from the field, there was no one better than Young to take the final shot. Morgantown High’s all-time leading scorer has played in 12 state tournament games in his career with a pair of titles already under his belt

“I was pretty confident,” Young said. “I knew one had to fall sooner or later. They weren’t falling and I knew if I got the chance to get the ball for the last shot I was going to take it and I was going to make it.”

Morgantown, an offensive force this season, struggled to score all game long. The Mohigans finished 14-51 from the floor and 3-20 from three-point range as Spring Mills played a deliberate and punishing defense.

In his four years as a Mohigans, Young played in the maximum amount of games possible in Charleston at the state tournament (12) and has an 11-1 record with his only loss coming in his freshman year in the state title game by one point, 47-46 to George Washington.

“Coming in my freshman year I was trying to learn and get better, I had a role that year and learned it early on,” he said. “I’m very thankful that I was able to play up with those guys my freshman season.”

GRANVILLE — With one swing of the bat, Hank Thomas ended West Virginia’s three-game winning streak Saturday, while forcing a deciding third game.

Thomas, a pinch hitter in the sixth inning, hit a two-run home run to the power alley in right field to lead Ohio State to a 7-4 victory over West Virginia at Kendrick Family Ballpark.

“They deserved to win that game,” WVU head coach Randy Mazey said. “They had 14 hits. They hit around our pitchers. I don’t think we gave the game away, but we didn’t execute on the mound.”

times in Game 1, Ohio State (9-8) came back with 14 hits and three extra-base hits.

Thomas, a transfer from Georgia Tech, grabbed hold of a fast-ball and sent it about 390 feet, while racing around the bases on his home run trot.

An inning later, Thomas added an RBI single after Stevenson hit an RBI double to add to the lead.

Clark, a transfer from Division II Northwood (Mich.), gave up three runs in the first inning, but

settled in from there.

He went five innings, allowing seven hits, two earned runs and struck out four.

“They scored three runs off one of our better pitchers, so all credit to them for being awake when the game started,” Mazey said. “He settled in a little bit. He’s a strike thrower. Any time you face a strike thrower, the time to get him in is in the first inning, before he settles in.

“He was throwing balls in the middle of the plate early on and they were smashing them.”

Comparing European attitudes toward hunting to ours

Last week I came across a 2024 published survey on trophy hunting attitudes from five European countries. An independent polling company (YouGov) interviewed 7,188 adults from Denmark, Germany, Italy, Poland and Spain online in November, and asked several questions. They then compared the results from those ques-tions to the same issues published by the anti-hunting group, Humane Society International in 2021.

On the question that asked, “no matter your opinion on hunting, to what extent do you agree or disagree with the fol-lowing statement. It is acceptable for other people in my country to hunt if they do so legally and in accordance with hunting laws and regulations.” In other words, do you sup-port regulated hunting? For the five countries an average of 63% agreed, 20% disagreed, and 17%

were undecided. In our country hunting as a tool for wildlife management has overwhelming support of the general public. Around 80% of the public support hunting as man-aged by our state wildlife agencies and in recent years that percentage has increased slightly.

On the question “to what extent do you agree or disagree with the fol-lowing statement. It is acceptable for a hunter from my country to keep a part of a legally hunted animal (e.g. horns, antlers) as a keepsake pro-vided that the hunt sub-sidizes conservation efforts and adheres to international regula-tions.” For the five coun-tries an average of 53% agreed, 23% disagreed and 24% were undecided. This question appears to be get-ting toward keeping mounted animals as tro-phies. In America, when the public is asked about trophy hunting, the response is negative with around 75% opposed. I believe that this is because lots of people have little knowledge about tro-phy hunting, and some studies have shown this to be true. When asked, those who oppose “trophy”

hunting why they feel the way they do, you’ll find that many believe it threatens endangered species. That’s just not true. In fact, legal, regu-lated hunting in America, Europe, and Africa has not eliminated any species.

The trophy deer hunter in America passes up numerous chances to har-vest smaller animals, wait-ing for that bigger-antlered buck. Most have already harvested a doe to put meat in the freezer, then they pursue a larger buck. In so doing they hunt more and in so doing, they spend more money on hunting, which helps the economy, especially the rural economy. Trophy deer hunters are also eth-ical in that they wait for that good shot, not want-ing to wound the trophy they admire. And, yes, after the trophy harvest, they put the mounted buck on the wall of their den. A few do that to show off to friends, but most do that to remind them of the hunt, the challenge. And the older one gets, the longer one hunts, the more they become a “trophy” hunter. Apparently Europeans approve of mounting “tro-phies” more than Ameri-

cans, as long as it subsi-dizes conservation efforts. They apparently under-stand the importance of getting the cost of wildlife management paid by hunters.

On the question of whether it is acceptable for parts of legally hunted animals to be kept if legal and regulated the Humane Society International acceptance was only 7.4% and 84% opposed. The Humane Society of the United States has often said that they strongly oppose hunting. Apparently their philosophy is the same everywhere.

It appears that the per-centage of Europeans who favor hunting is not quite as high as ours, but from all I read, hunting is now more accepted there than it was previously. And re-lative to the trophy aspect of hunting, there is a big push in Europe to demon-strate to the general pub-lic that as long as trophy hunting is legal and pro-motes wildlife manage-ment and conservation, it gets support. It would be nice if our general non-hunting public understood that.

Morgantown graduate Cam Rice continues impressive start to college career

WEST LIBERTY — Defensive lineman Cam Rice wasted no time pick-ing up where he left off following his freshman season as a sophomore defen-sive lineman at West Lib-erty this fall. Rice, a Mor-gantown High graduate, was one of 38 athletes nationwide this season to be nominated for the pres-tigious Harlon Hill Trophy as the NCAA Division II College Football Player of the Year.

“Being nominated for the Harlon Hill trophy was a huge honor,” he said. “I was very surprised because there has only been one defensive player to win the Harlon Hill, so just being nominated is a huge accomplishment.”

The accolades have con-tinually rolled in for Rice. He has also been named to the D2Football.com Elite 100, a Cliff Harris Award finalist, Honorable Men-tion Don Hansen Football Committee All-America Team, All-Super Region 1 Second Team, All-MEC First Team, earned three MEC Defensive Player of the Week honors and was named the D2Football.com National Defensive Player of the Week once.

means a lot to me because it is nice to be recognized as one of the top 100 players in Division 2 football,” Rice said. “Receiving all of those accolades showed that my hard work is paying off. Before the season I made most of those accolades my goals for the end of the sea-son and it felt good to be recognized.”

He forced four fumbles, blocked two kicks, and intercepted two passes, returning both for touch-downs in the season finale against Wheeling.

“The season finale against Wheeling was prob-ably the best game I’ve ever played in my entire career

so far,” Rice said. “Scoring two touchdowns against our rival was an awesome moment.”

He finished the season totaling 58 tackles, 23.5 tackles-for-loss and 9 sacks. He ended the year ranked first nationally in tackles-for-loss per game (2.4), third in total tackles-for-loss, tied for fourth in total forced fumbles, tied for fifth in forced fumbles per game (0.40), tied for tenth in sacks per game (0.90), tied for 16th in blocked kicks, and tied for 20th in the country in total sacks. He put up career highs of 10.0 tackles, 4.5 tackles-for-loss three times,

and 3.0 sacks.

Though he accom-plished a lot this season, Rice feels there is still work to do next year. On Friday, Rice announced that he has entered the transfer portal.

“I think I made a big jump from my freshman year to my sophomore year but there is still a lot I need to improve on,” he said. “I am looking forward to next season — the main goal will be to win a conference championship and make it to the playoffs.”

Rice excels both on and off the football field. He was named to the Academic All-MEC Honor Roll for having a GPA of at least 3.70 during the 2023 fall semester.

“Being named Academic All-MEC was a huge accom-plishment; finishing the semester with a 3.9 GPA while being successful on the field takes a lot of deter-mination and hard work,” he said. “I changed my major to Sports, Recre-ation, and Wellness in the Community Education Program.

“After college, I plan to play football at the profes-sional level. Wherever I end up playing, I want to im-me-diately get involved in the community. I plan to start a Youth Sports Program for the at-risk kids in the community.”

No. 7 Iowa State blitzes No. 1 Houston in second half, wins Big 12 title 69-41

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Keshon Gilbert wrapped up a spectacular Big 12 Tournament for Iowa State with 16 points, and the seventh-ranked Cyclones blitzed No. 1 Houston to begin the second half Saturday night, allowing them to roll to a 69-41 win and their sixth championship in six appearances in the title game.

Milan Momcilovic had 18 points and Hason Ward scored 13 for the Cyclones (27-7), who have beaten five different programs to raise the trophy, including Oklahoma, which at the time was led by current Cougars coach Kelvin Sampson.

He probably felt even worse than he did in 2000. Iowa State turned a 30-23 lead at halftime into the kind of blowout Sampson has rarely experienced with an 18-3 run to start the second half. That gave the thousands of Cyclones fans that paint Kansas City red and yellow every

March plenty of reasons to stand on their feet and roar their approval.

Doesn’t seem to matter who is coaching them, either: T.J. Otzelberger is the fourth to win the tournament for Iowa State.

Jamal Shead had 10 points on 3-for-17 shooting for Houston (30-4), which was outscored 39-18 in the second half. L.J. Cryer was held to seven points and Emanuel Sharp to five as the Cougars shot 4 of 22 from the 3-point arc and 15 of 56 from the field.

Iowa State built its half-time lead by playing the role of Houston better than Houston.

The preternaturally poised Cyclones never wavered when they fell into an early hole. They exhibited some exquisite interior ball movement for easy layups when the Cougars’ guards tried to lock down the perimeter. And when they got those buckets to go, it freed up Momcilovic and and the rest of the Iowa State sharpshooters to begin

draining 3-pointers.

On the other end, the Cyclones forced Shead into off-balance runners and long 3s at the end of the shot clock; the Big 12 player of the year — and defensive player of the year — was 2 for 11 in the first half, and it didn’t get any better in the second.

Cougars big man J’Wan Roberts was largely ineffective, too, after hurting his right leg and playing sparingly in their semifinal rout of Texas Tech. He started the game and played 13 first-half minutes before sitting out the second half.

He probably wouldn’t have made a difference the way the Cyclones were rolling. They scored the first 10 points as part of their run to start the second half, and Momcilovic’s 3 from in front of his bench pushed their lead to 48-23 with 12:40 to go.

Resorting to desperation shots, the Cougars went 9 1/2 minutes without a field goal as the game got away from them.

Xander Schauffele overcomes a 4-shot deficit to take lead

Xander Schauffele erased a four-shot deficit Saturday with another bogey-free round on a course where trouble is around every corner, capping off a 7-under 65 with a superb chip to save par and take a one-shot lead into the final round of The Players Championship.

U.S. Open champion Wyndham Clark, who had a four-shot lead at the start and stretched it to five with a birdie on the opening hole, did well to make sure the deficit

wasn’t greater.

They were tied going to the island green on the par-3 17th. Clark hit it so clunky that his wedge shot came up some 15 yards short of land. But he hit the next one to 7 feet and escaped with bogey, and then saved par on the 18th for a 70.

For a short time on a balmy afternoon, it looked like The Players could turn into a two-man race between Clark and Schauffele. But there were enough birdies, enough bold shots and big rallies,

to suddenly make today filled with possibilities.

Schauffele was at 17-under 199.

Scottie Scheffler, the No. 1 player in the world coping with a neck pain this week, kept alive his chances of becoming the first back-to-back winner in 50 years of the PGA Tour’s premier championship. He birdied his last three holes for his 26th straight round under par this year, a 68, that left him in range at five shots behind. He was joined by Sahith Theegala (67).

for it all.”

Young averaged 20 points, 4.6 assists, 7 rebounds, and four steals through the three games at the 2024 state tournament.

For the 2024 regular season, Sharron averaged 22.5 points, 7.2 rebounds, 6.9 apg, and a whipping 6.1 steals per contest playing 25 minutes a night.

In four years at Morgantown (88 games) he averaged 15.7 points, 5.8 rebounds, 5.0 assists, and 3.5 steals. These numbers do not include the totals of the 2024 postseason.

On February 3rd, Sharron earned another outstanding achievement for

his career when he became the new all-time leading scorer at MHS, breaking a 68-year record that was held by Jay Jacobs.

Young will now finish his senior year at MHS before moving on to join Akron in the fall. He will be joining a Zips program that has enjoyed some good success over recent years, including a 20-win season for the last three years.

“I’m excited for the opportunity,” he said. “It’ll feel sort of like my freshman year at Morgantown, I will come in with a role and try and do what I can for the team and work hard to continue getting better.”

Despite being close to leaving his hometown of Morgantown and the community of MHS, Sharron

says he couldn’t ever forget the love and support he’s been given.

“It’s been a blessing this past four years, I want to thank Coach (Dave) Tallman, my teammates and coaches, everyone that was there for me,” Young said. “I felt a little down today when my shot wasn’t falling but my brothers kept cheering me on and kept the same confidence in me that they always have.”

“Morgantown is a great community that has supported us from day one, our baseball team is playing close in Hurricane this weekend so they stayed the night and came to the game today, it means a lot. I just want to thank the entire Morgantown family for their support.”

“That was exactly how we wanted it to go until the end,” SM coach Luke Samples said. “It played out exactly how we wanted it to. We were confident in the scout and it worked out until the very, very end.”

The teams combined for just 15 points in the opening frame as Spring Mills led 9-6 after the first quarter. An even lower-scoring second quarter saw Morgantown up 14-13 at halftime.

“You’ve got to give credit to them,” Tallman said of the Cardinals. “They’re long and athletic and they make it hard to score, especially when you can’t make an outside shot.”

Spring Mills opened the second half with a 6-0 scoring run to create the first, and only, two-possession lead of the game, 19-14. MHS responded, however with a pair of buckets from Marty Johnson and Brady Savage to make it 19-18.

MHS started 0-13 on three-pointers until senior J Shrewsberry connected at the end of the third quarter to knot the game at 21-21.

“We knew their length was going to be a problem, there’s no way around that,” Tallman said. “I thought we got good looks, I really do. We were 3-20, that’ll never happen again at Morgantown High.”

Spring Mills led 28-26 with two minutes to play as both teams continued to struggle to put the ball through the hoop. That score stayed until the final 20 seconds.

Morgantown called a play for Everett, who was 0-8 from the field at that point, and he delivered, driving to the hoop and

making a contested layup to send the game into overtime tied 28-28.

“I caught the ball and really wasn’t open for the three so I just drove it,” Everett explained. “I had to make a play and my teammates trusted me to make a play. I really wasn’t playing well, but my teammates trusted me.”

Trust was the key for the Mohigans on Saturday. Despite their offensive struggles in the game, Tallman and the MHS coaching staff trusted Everett and Young when the game was on the line and the seniors delivered both times.

“I don’t think anyone can understand the fellowship, the love, the brotherhood we have,” Tallman said. “We just have that relationship, I can’t say enough things about it. It’s just kind of the program we’ve built.”

MHS did not score until there were only 32 seconds left in the overtime period. Spring Mills led 31-28 before Young stole an inbounds pass and found Savage for a wide-open layup. Young then hit his three-pointer and Everett sank two free throws as the Mohigans scored all seven of their overtime points in the last 30 seconds.

“I thought we lost the game six times, that’s what it felt like,” Tallman said.

Young, who was named state tournament MVP, led MHS with 11 points while pulling down 10 rebounds, dishing out four assists and grabbing five steals. Savage

finished with eight points and seven rebounds to finish a stellar tournament run for the junior. King and Shrewsberry each scored five while Everett had four and Johnson scored two.

It was the final high school game for seniors Young, Everett, King, Shrewsberry and Jaylon Hill.

Spring Mills, by contrast, will only graduate one senior. It was the Cardinals’ first state tournament appearance in program history.

“I’m not sad at all, I’m happy,” Samples said. “I’m happy for these guys, I’m happy for our school, I’m happy for our community.”

Young and Savage were named to the all-tournament team along with Spring Mills’ Xavier Anderson, Caleb Thomas and Akwasi Opoku-Achampong. Huntington’s Jayden Clark and Tayvean Wilson and Wheeling Park’s Mykel Davis were also named to the all-tournament team.

Thomas led all scorers with 14 points and nine rebounds. Opoku Achampong had nine points and Anderson scored four.

Kids told teachers how they had made a difference You can, too

Sometimes, we just need something to restore our faith in humanity. The recent “You Made a Difference” Awards by University Motors was exactly that.

During the ceremony, 18 educators were honored, received awards and \$500 checks and got to hear the letters nominating them read aloud by the students who felt they had made a difference.

It was a beautiful reminder of the impact teachers have on students. And that while a single person may not be able to change the whole world, they can change someone else’s whole world. They can make a child want to learn. They can foster passion and curiosity. They can build a child’s confidence. They can make the classroom a safe place in a child’s life. They can — and do — make a difference.

It was also a reminder of how rarely we tell the difference-makers in our lives that they did make a difference and how much we appreciate them.

Think for a moment about someone who impacted your life for the better. Maybe it was a grade-school teacher who supported your dreams or talents, or a college professor who opened your eyes to a whole new world. Cut, don’t phase out, Social Security tax

Elected officials in West Virginia remain concerned about the state’s workforce participation rate and the state’s stagnant population.

The West Virginia workforce participation rate is about 7% below the national average of 62.5%. In the age group 65-74, 19% of that age group continue to work.

Two of my friends were excited by Gov. Justice’s decision to eliminate the tax on Social Security benefits for those with incomes over \$50,000. One of my friends is a school bus driver whose income would be below \$50,000 if he didn’t work. Nationally, 72% of school bus drivers are age 50-plus. The average age of a school bus driver is 59. More people would work after the age of 65 if they didn’t have to pay a

tax on their Social Security benefits.

Because of West Virginia’s great natural beauty, many assume that it would be easy to recruit retirees to the state. When a new retiree is thinking about moving, they consider three items: weather, the location of their grandchildren and the tax burden of the state under consideration. Since West Virginia is

one of 10 or so states that tax Social Security benefits, many people eliminate West Virginia from consideration.

House Finance Chair Vernon Criss believes that individuals making over \$50,000 are rich. But Parkersburg is not Morgantown. The Parkersburg cost of living is 1.9% below the state average — Morgantown is 13.1% above.

Chairman Criss proposed the phasing in of the tax cut over three years.

He was concerned that the total elimination of the tax would break the bank. But the \$37 million in taxes in a \$5 billion budget is just 75 cents on every \$100.

The West Virginia Legislature needs to re-evaluate the phasing out of the tax on Social Security benefits during its next special session.

Can St. Patrick & green beer save American democracy?

LET’S MAKE A FEW THINGS CRYSTAL CLEAR RIGHT UP FRONT. First and foremost, green beer has always been a bad choice and is without any saving grace. I also doubt that even St. Patrick in his prime could drive all the political snakes out of today’s Washington. The history of St. Patrick’s Day itself is not without major warts — particularly regarding who could and couldn’t participate.

But despite these caveats, I believe there is something about America’s version of the holiday that embodies strengths our nation can and should lean into — particularly going into a high-stakes, take-no-prisoners election year.

This suggestion isn’t coming from a rabid St. Patrick’s Day fan. Growing up with a distinctly Irish name, I was ambivalent at best about a holiday that reinforced so many caricatures and myths. As a kid (with a big dose of adolescent snark) I would say it was my job to be Irish 364 days a year and March 17 was my one day off. I also saw many efforts to define Americans by ethnic, religious or racial differences doing more to fuel divisions than to build healthy pride.

As time went by, I’ve softened my view. What brought that about? Part of it was learning more about history. We’ve been at this in America for a very long time — in fact our first St. Patrick’s Day parades took place well before the Declaration of Independence was signed. First as a reflection of Irish pride (and sometimes defiance), over the centuries they have become more welcoming. Like the greatest aspects of the American story itself, more and more people have been allowed to participate — both as parade marchers and celebrants.

This hasn’t come easily (it never does) and even involved

a landmark Supreme Court case concerning access for LGBTQ groups. Today it can feel like the Supreme Court decides everything, but while that decision actually affirmed the right to restrict parade participation it wasn’t the final word. What turned the tide was changing attitudes and the willingness of political and business leaders to stand up for pitching a bigger tent.

As important to changing my attitude was personally witnessing several St. Patrick’s Day “miracles.” These included a longstanding breakfast tradition in Boston that features Republicans and Democrats putting aside their differences and making jokes rather than scoring political points. Humor is a really important part of the St. Patrick’s Day magic. Punch lines that are bitter and come at the expense of others feed our collective anxiety and anger. Laughing at ourselves and with each other is what heals and builds bridges.

I’ve also attended multiple parades — including a big one in my conservative Florida town — where I’ve seen a cross-section of Americans joyfully marching and cheering each other on. Celebrating anything as a community is a very beautiful and powerful thing — and all too rare in today’s America.

The sad fact is that navigating holidays has become much too complex and politicized lately. We now need to walk on eggshells when we sincerely offer best wishes — for example, the whole “Merry Christmas” vs. “Happy holidays” thing. To date, St. Patrick’s Day has been spared — and it’s really important we keep it that way. There are no sides to take, nobody is keeping score, and it isn’t about red and blue — it’s just about different and often crazy shades of green that are almost

invariably unflattering. Just come as you are to celebrate Irish culture and/or the coming of spring. It’s an example of what America can be at its most authentically exceptional and unpretentious.

We desperately need to expand the number of special days like this — when we put aside “us vs. them” thinking and come together. We need days where we can wear silly stuff, not talk politics, and celebrate the contributions of different members of the American family. This attitude and the values behind it should have an important role to play every single day.

For example, I can envision Election Day as a celebration of these aspects of the American character. Sure we will vote for different candidates, but we could also see it as an opportunity to express shared gratitude for the freedoms we enjoy and for those who sacrificed so much to secure them for us. The bottom line is that St. Patrick’s Day shows we’re capable of celebrating together without putting our differences, frustrations and anger front and center. If we can pull that off (albeit imperfectly) for even one day, it means we can do it more often. I sincerely believe that for the American experiment to survive and thrive we need to find the wisdom and courage to do just that.

By the way, if our toxic politics is making you consider green beer or even something stronger to deaden the pain, try Citizen Connect first. It’s a nonpartisan online platform I co-founded that puts 600 organizations dedicated to finding common ground at your fingertips.

What ‘Barbie’ can teach working men

ECONOMISTS SPEND A LOT OF TIME TALKING ABOUT JOBS. WORK IS NOT ONLY HOW PEOPLE SUPPORT THEMSELVES FINANCIALLY, IT CAN ALSO BE THE WAY IN WHICH THEY CONTRIBUTE TO SOCIETY, CREATE UNIQUE IDENTITIES AND FIND MEANING IN THE WORLD. When work disappears or shifts, people can feel as unmoored and confused as Ken in Greta Gerwig’s “Barbie,” who had one last moment in the spotlight at last Sunday’s Academy Awards, when Ryan Gosling performed the Oscar-nominated song “I’m Just Ken.”

Gosling lost — to his fellow Barbie nominee Billie Eilish — just as Ken is emotionally lost in Barbieland. Ken’s identity crisis, born from the lack of a clearly defined purpose, mirrors a narrative that has been unfolding for American working-class men for decades. The economy has shifted beneath their feet, leaving many like Ken: struggling with a mix of anger, hurt and confusion.

In the mid-1960s, roughly a third of U.S. jobs involved manufacturing and other goods-producing sectors. Men held roughly 80% of those jobs. In the decades since, the number of jobs in the goods-producing sector has been largely stable. At the same time, the service sector has exploded, adding about 100 million jobs.

Men still hold 77% of jobs in the goods-producing sector. Unfortunately, the U.S. and global economy have moved on — and the shift has happened without the creation of a new narrative for men. So working-class men like Ken are stumbling around a socioeconomic landscape seeking a foothold in a society that seems to have no role for them, largely eschewing the new working-class job opportunities in the service sector.

The result is that job growth has disproportionately gone to women, 92% of whom work in services. But unlike in Barbieland, in the real world the division is not just between men and women, but between college-educated and working-class men. Men with college and advanced degrees have high labor force participation rates, high marriage rates and high earnings. These elite men have thrived in an economy that evolved to prioritize intellectual prowess.

In Barbie, Ken confronts this contrast when he goes into the real world. He is granted respect and authority from the patriarchy, but once they learn what his skill set is — “beach” — men turn their backs on him. When Ken tells a male executive that the executive isn’t “doing patriarchy very well,” the response is a knowing smile and reassurance that patriarchy is still being “done well” — it is just better hidden.

The moment reflects the tensions between highly educated and working-class men. The first group continues to give their male colleagues a slight edge in promotions and hiring, and to abandon working-class men.

In the real world, working-class men are often seen at the center of attempts to roll back the social clock, perhaps because they have witnessed the biggest

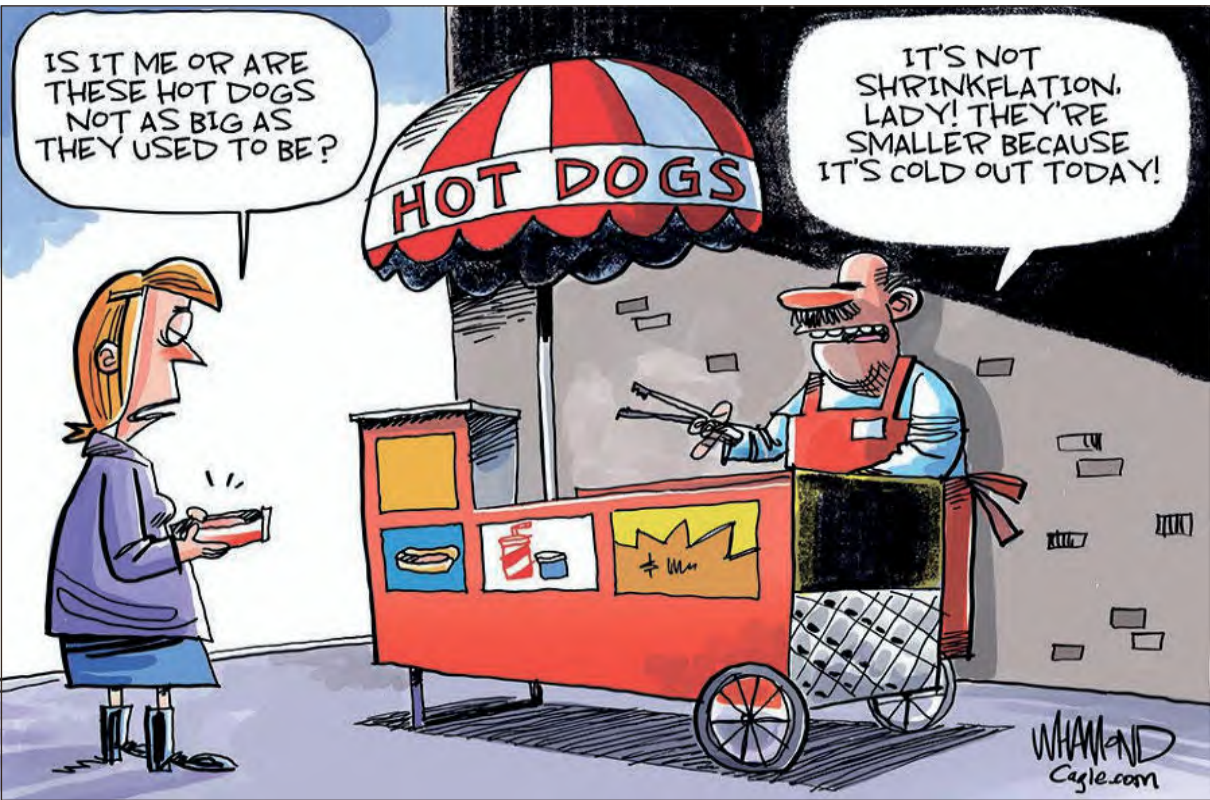

Our daddy-daughter dates occur whenever you play. We sit back, relax, and watch you dominate. I see the same transformation in her as I did in myself when I first learned of the grit and

While I was getting my fingernails painted and playing with dolls, it was hard for me to impart the "be like Mike" lessons that shaped my own childhood.

I spent an outrageous amount of money to see you in person with my 5-year-old daughter. You were electric as usual and we

jumped and danced and cheered. At one point, my daughter leaned over to me and said, "She hits that shot in the game because she works on it a lot in practice, right daddy?" It was worth every penny. You even graciously stuck around and signed our jersey at the end of the game. I said, "Thank you! You are amazing!" I wanted to say so much more, but there were hundreds of other little girls with their moms and dads waiting to see you.

Allow me to try one more time now that the throngs of adoring fans are gone:

Dear Caitlin Clark,

If you read this, I want to say thank you.

Thank you for being an electrifying, transcendent athlete who is actively changing the world of sport. But mostly, thank you for helping me be a better dad.

losses, both socially and economically. But making divorce harder, or passing policies to revive the moribund goods-producing sector, cannot solve the problems of men.

Trapping people in marriage is not a good way to make it work. Marriage takes real work — the work of blending identities and narratives. With men struggling to understand their place in society, it is hardly surprising that they are struggling to build a shared vision for a life as a father and a partner.

So how can men move forward when the traditional roles and economic pathways no longer hold the same promise? The answer is to take the advice of Barbie. At the end of the movie, she implores Ken to find himself. Working-class men now have an opportunity to find their passions and use them to form a new narrative for their life. What does masculinity look like in a society that has little room for physical toughness, sexual prowess, dominance and aggression? Or a society in which emotional vulnerability and connection is central?

The world is on the cusp of another technological wave that will reshape the economic landscape by giving an increasing number of tasks to robots and artificial intelligence. Efforts to protect or revive the U.S. manufacturing sector are like adding more water to a draining bathtub. It will keep the water level higher for a while, but eventually the tub will empty.

In a world in which artificial technology increasingly replaces our work, our humanity will become ever more important. As humans, we have never been more free to make the life and relationships we want. But unless we update our expectations, we won't be able to take full advantage.

The challenges of working-class men today are a problem for all of us — and a warning for all our futures. Creating a new role for working-class men in the 21st century won't be easy, but doing so is essential. And if we can forge a new narrative for men and masculinity, it might just be Kenough.

Josh Eilert: A true Mountaineer

YEARS FROM NOW, A YOUNG MOUNTAINEER FAN WILL BE THUMBING THROUGH THE WVU BASKETBALL MEDIA GUIDE and notice the nine wins and 23 losses in the 2023-24 season. That youngster will wonder what went wrong.

Hopefully, a long-time fan will be around to tell the full story, and it will take a while. No need to repeat all those challenges here. Mountaineer Nation loyalists know them well.

The logical follow-up question by the young fan will be whether Josh Eilert was a bad coach. If the aging fan remembers the year accurately, they will answer that, in fact, he was a great coach.

For some, that will be impossible to reconcile. However, this season will best be remembered for how Eilert and his staff conducted themselves while trying to manage the unmanageable and scratch out wins in the toughest league in the country.

Eilert had plenty of opportu-

nities to gripe and whine about, well, everything; getting a late start with the team, the transfers, the eligibility issues of key players, the injury to Jesse Edwards, the lurking presence of a Hall of Fame coach who wanted his job back.

But Eilert never complained. Whatever frustrations he had — and there must have been many — he kept them inside the program and did not vent publicly. In doing so, he demonstrated the valued qualities of a true Mountaineers: strength, wisdom, perseverance, stoicism, personal responsibility.

As the late WVU football Coach Bill Stewart said of his career, "All

my life I have been in tough situations," Stewart said. "You jut your jaw, you bow your back, you shut your mouth and you go play as hard as you can play."

That is what Eilert did.

In a message to fans, Eilert continued to take the high road while expressing his gratitude for the opportunity, despite the difficulties. "We should all be so lucky to be put in a position to DO HARD THINGS, to be pushed to the brink and to expose what we're made of or where we have room for expansion."

That is the kind of attitude you hope for from a leader of young men and a representative of the university. Unfortunately, that too often gets lost in the ultra-competitive and big money world of college athletics. However, some of us still want to believe that, in all the chaos, there are still individuals who maintain a value system consistent with their schools.

As WVU Director of Athletics Wren Baker said, "All of Mountaineer Nation owes a debt of gratitude to Coach Eilert for his leadership during a challenging season, as he and his staff faced obstacles with class and professionalism."

What more could fans have asked for? Sure, more wins. Fans always want that and should expect that from a major university, and some let Eilert know just how much they wanted him to be gone from the sideline as soon as possible. However, there are occasions where, yes, there are more important things than wins and losses.

Eilert told the fans, "I'm grateful for it all. The highs, the lows, the setbacks, the comebacks, the hate, the love. Everything."

The most important story to be told to future fans about this season is about a coach who set, and then lived up to, the standard of what it means to be a Mountaineer.

The housing shortage is the economy's real problem

RECENTLY RELEASED GOVERNMENT DATA HAMMERED HOME WHAT WE HAVE KNOWN FOR AT LEAST A YEAR: A national housing shortage, not broad-based price increases, is driving inflation.

Inflation over the past year was 3.1% — far less than in 2021 but still high enough for the Federal Reserve to keep interest rates elevated. However, unlike the inflation we saw soon after the onset of the pandemic, the more recent bout was overwhelmingly driven by the rising cost of what the Consumer Price Index classifies as "shelter" — including rent actually paid and the estimated rent that could be charged for owner-occupied homes.

Since the start of last year, most prices have risen very slowly or not at all. The price of goods — the tangible things we buy — remained essentially the same, rising just 0.1%. Food inflation, a source of post-pandemic pain for many households, was less than 3%. And other categories of prices actually fell: Household energy prices are down 2.4%, and the price of cars has fallen just over 1%. All told, for everything other than housing, inflation was just 1.5% — low enough that if housing prices had grown at historical rates, the Fed could have declared victory.

But housing costs have not grown at historical rates: The two-year price increase came in hotter than at any point in the past four decades. This lopsided picture tells us a lot about who is most affected by inflation and



how it should be addressed.

The outside role of shelter inflation means that homeowners and renters whose leases haven't changed are experiencing inflation very differently from those who were more exposed to rising housing costs. Indeed, rising housing costs are a double-edged sword, increasing the wealth of homeowners even as they punish many renters. Since the beginning of 2022, housing wealth has added over \$2 trillion to homeowners' balance sheets.

This trend has important implications across generations. People under 35, with a homeownership rate roughly half that of those of retirement age, are much more likely to suffer from rising housing costs while also missing out on the resulting wealth boom. Retirees, with rising housing wealth and

protection from inflation through Social Security and Medicare, are more likely to fare better.

The remedy for housing-fueled inflation is also different from standard responses to broad-based price growth. One might have expected the Fed's interest rate hikes — which caused mortgage rates to rise with unprecedented speed — to slow down housing prices. But while prospective homebuyers did pull back from the market, residential listings were in free fall during the pandemic and have yet to recover. That means would-be buyers face tight inventories and higher prices.

The only effective long-term answer is of course to build and rehabilitate more housing — a lot more. America's housing crisis is a big problem that requires an equally big solution, with various

estimates putting the nationwide shortfall between 1.5 million and 5.5 million units.

Legislation passed by the House in 2022 would have made meaningful progress by allocating around \$40 billion to supply-boosting programs such as the Housing Trust Fund, the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit and HOME Investment Partnerships Program block grants. Unfortunately, the bill fell short in the Senate and is effectively dead until at least the next Congress.

In the absence of major legislation in Washington, state and federal policymakers have been increasingly focused on incremental responses to the shortfall. The Biden administration recently announced a series of reforms — including grants for low-income seniors and funds to help rehabilitate manufactured homes — that will add tens of thousands of new homes to the market. But the data show we still need to do much more to ease and encourage building to tame shelter costs.

Fed Chair Jerome Powell and the Federal Open Market Committee have made it clear that they will do whatever it takes to fight inflation. That's an admirable and responsible position. But Congress has yet to help by addressing our national housing shortfall. If it had, pandemic-era inflation might already be behind us.

A picture is worth a thousand ... edits?

Delete a background? Easy. Smooth out a face? Seamless. Digital photo manipulation is now mainstream

NEW YORK — It’s been a common refrain when seeking proof that someone’s story or some event actually took place: “Pics, or it didn’t happen.”

But in a world where the spread of technology makes photo manipulation as easy as a tap on your phone, the idea that a visual image is an absolute truth is as outdated as the daguerreotype. And a photo can sometimes raise as many questions as it was meant to answer.

That was seen in recent days when controversy descended upon an image of Kate, Princess of Wales, and her three children. News agencies including The Associated Press published, then retracted, the image given out by Kensington Palace over concerns it had been manipulated, leading to Kate saying on social media that she occasionally “experimented” with photo editing.

In that, she’s hardly alone.

From something that was time-consuming and required a great deal of technical expertise in the days of actual film and darkrooms, digital editing has become something practically anyone can do, from adding filters to cropping images and much more. Apps abound, offering the easiest of experiences in creating and retouching photos and videos which can then be easily trans-

mitted online and through social media.

“Cover blemishes and let the real you shine through,” says an ad for the smartphone app Facetune. “Remove and change backgrounds instantly,” the Fotor app’s website enthuses. “Our AI object remover is ready to assist you in getting rid of unwanted objects.”

This Wild West of image-altering abilities is opening new frontiers for everyday people — and creating headaches for those who expect photos to be a documentary representation of reality.

Photojournalists and major news organizations follow standards and ethics codes around photos. These organizations typically place an absolute premium on image authenticity and reject photographs that have been altered in any way. But efforts to identify altered imagery can be impeded by the increasingly easy-to-use apps for phones and computers that allow anyone to chip away, piece by piece, at what a camera actually recorded.

The mainstreaming of manipulation, placing such abilities at people’s fingertips, has made for some interesting and viral moments — like the one in March 2023 when an artificially generated image of Pope Francis wearing a puffy white coat took in many people who thought it was real.

But there are risks and dangers to a world where just because you see something doesn't mean you can absolutely believe it, said Ken Light, a photojournalism professor at the University of California Berkeley's Graduate School of Journalism.
"The role of photography has been to witness and to record for the moment, but also for history. And I don't think any of us know where it's going," he said. The rise of visual manipulation that casts doubt on whether something is real or not "frays the fabric of the culture tremendously in the moment but also for the future."

Fred Ritchin, dean emeritus of the school at the International Center of Photography and a former picture editor at The New York Times Magazine, agreed. "'The camera never lies' is a 20th-century idea. It's not a 21st-century idea," he said. "These are all mythologies that we're still hiding behind and we have not really confronted."
People have long known that some images are manipulated, like cover models on magazines, and some have raised concerns about that impact that artificial and manipulated standards of beauty can have on girls and women.
But they haven't really come to terms with how widespread digital manipulation is in other areas like social media, done by a wide variety of everyday people, said Lexie Kite, who with her sister Lindsay has done research into body image and media and wrote "More Than A Body: Your Body Is an Instrument, Not an Ornament."

"It is important for all of us to anchor ourselves in the truth that digital manipulation is our reality," she said.
People can take steps to deal with the creeping effects of photo manipulation, said Hany Farid, a professor at UC Berkeley whose research examines digital forensics and image

analysis.
Viewers need "to just slow down a little bit, be a little bit more careful, be a little more thoughtful" about what they're looking at instead of just assuming any image they see is fact, he said.

On the technology side, he said there are ways being developed to track visual images and to make it clear if they've been altered after the photos were taken.
But while such steps may mitigate some of the issues, he said, it won't eliminate the problem or take us back to where we could have abiding faith in an image, as previous generations did with photos we now consider unforgettable.

"Almost every major incident in our history, wars, conflicts, disasters, there's this iconic photo," he said. "They're so powerful because they capture this incredibly complex set of facts and emotions and history in one photo. And I don't know that we can have that anymore. It's a very different world going forward now."
Or, if the adage was modified: "Pics, and maybe it still didn't quite happen."

Economy, American Dream

BECOMING A HOMEOWNER HAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS THE AMERICAN DREAM BY U.S. PRESIDENTS AND THOUGHT LEADERS. The catch to achieving the American Dream, however, is that it isn't easy. It is *not* an entitlement. In most cases, it takes hard work, saving money and building credit to reach this milestone, and one of the biggest pieces in that process is gainful employment. Sometimes it requires working multiple jobs. I would argue that this is what America was built upon and made our country great.

Important factors in the real estate market include good paying jobs and the overall economic conditions of a region. Of course, the economic conditions of the nation affects interest rates, and despite a sluggish national economy, I want to focus on the economy of West Virginia.

Here in north-central West Virginia, we're experiencing a strong jobs market for a region our size.

Several weeks back, I listed several employers who have either relocated to, expanded in or announced new startups in the Mountain State. Some of these companies are in our smaller communities, which is an incredible boost to those areas. Others are in our cities, such as Charleston, Martinsburg and Morgantown. Mountaintop Beverage is one of the newest employers in Mon County, and their arrival was a massive relief after the huge loss of Mylan. The following is from Mountaintop's LinkedIn page:

"Mountaintop Beverage is in (the) early-stages of building out a clean manufacturing facility and is preparing to operate, produce, process and package aseptic and extended shelf-life beverages on behalf of its signed customers (brands) in the food and beverage industry. Initial plant size will be 330,000 square feet and the company plans several plant expansions over next several years to more than double that size."

I had a client who is a former Mylan employee and landed a job at Mountaintop. He and a coworker I met are pleased with their new employer. Mountaintop and other potential tenants of the industrial park, not to mention WVU, our hospitals and others, are all integral to our overall economy.

Of course, north-central West Virginia has essentially developed into a small metro area reaching past Fairmont and down to the Clarksburg/Bridgeport area. Other employers within our metro area include Fairmont State University, NASA, Mon Power, the FBI, Mitsubishi Heavy Industries and many other large and small businesses.

In addition, more retailers are popping up in places such as Westridge near Morgantown and Middletown Commons in White Hall, as well as all the shops in Bridgeport. Government funding for a road-widening project along Chaplin Hill Road will benefit Mylan Park. The Mileground project finally came to fruition, and the proposed Harmony Grove interchange off I-79 will greatly enhance conditions for more growth. In addition, another industrial park is in the works off I-68 near the airport.

All of this is vital for a strong real estate market, and we should be grateful that Morgantown is the economic engine of the Mountain State.

Home decorating has seat on 'slow' train

In a world where speed and convenience have been the siren song to consumers, there's a movement toward buying more mindfully, sustainably, "slowly."

You've heard of slow fashion. Slow food. Slow travel. And when it comes to the home, "slow decorating."

A reaction against rooms filled with mass-produced "fast furniture," slow decorating embraces a more deliberate approach that prioritizes a personal connection to the stuff we live with. It might mean giving new life to heirloom or found pieces. Or buying new things that have the quality to last.

The journey of creating a space is as important as the destination.

New York City designer Gideon Mendelson thinks the movement echoes the Japanese philosophy of "ikigai," which centers around finding meaning and purpose. Applied to interiors, it's about creating spaces that promote all-around well-being.

"To me, good design makes room for living and doing. Decorating with meaningful pieces isn't about chasing an aesthetic, but curating spaces that resonate with authenticity and personal stories," he says.

"It's not just about how it looks; it's about how you want to live."

And you don't have to spend a

lot, he says. He framed some inexpensive yet eye-catching vintage deli signs, adding a playful element to the Hamptons dining room of a family of five.

The trend toward "slower," more thoughtful interior design, Mendelson thinks, lies in subtleties: "The cherished heirlooms, and the intimate connection between a space and its inhabitants."

Fast furniture's association with cheaper materials, excessive packaging and frequent replacement clashes with consumers' growing interest in minimizing our lasting impact on the planet.

Now, we're buying more mindfully, but we're also having a lot of fun DIYing.

During the pandemic, slow assembly lines and stalled container ships meant a lot of brand-new homewares weren't getting made or sent to market, so upcycling stuff we had or found became hobby, and often necessity.

If you could find a great credenza at a flea market or online reseller that just needed a little TLC, why not?

Not too long ago, decor trade shows would include a handful of studio labs offering reclaimed wood items and organic textiles. Today, at global fairs like Ambiente in Frankfurt, Salone in Milan and Paris' Maison et Objet, hundreds of companies show new design made with

environmental and social impact in mind. Fair trade manufactures like hemp, bamboo and cork. Cushions made of soy-based foam instead of petroleum-based foam. Recycled glass and metal accessories.

Mid 20- and 30-somethings are seen as drivers of the slow design trend. TikTok and Instagram feeds are full of refinish-and-reveal videos, and modest abodes full of found treasures.

Stephen Orr, editor in chief of Better Homes & Gardens, says he's spent the past couple of years renovating a 1760s house on Cape Cod.

"The first year was during the pandemic, so antiques and flea markets were a godsend considering all the supply chain disruptions," he says.

"But during that process, we came to the realization that pieces with a patina of age better celebrate the house's long history anyway."

He also added some new, modern pieces "so it doesn't look like we should be dressed in period Colonial Williamsburg costumes."

Furniture for sitting, sleeping and eating is where you should spend more money on quality, says Jillian Hayward Schaible of Susan Hayward Interiors.

"We encourage clients to invest in pieces like sofas/sectionals, beds, dining tables and

upholstered items, because you can really feel the difference when these items are well-made," she says.

Peter Spalding of the designer furniture sourcing platform Daniel House Club notes that imitations of Chipendale and other legacy-style pieces — think cabinets and wingback chairs, for example — were common in the '80s and early '90s.

"Now, the imitations aren't very valuable, but the originals remain highly sought after," he says. "As you collect 'slow furniture,' buy the most authentic versions you can afford."

Dan Mazzarini of BHDMDesign and ARCHIVE echoes the advice.

"If you're looking for a good investment, go straight to vintage. Things that have already stood the test of time often have another 50 years left in them! Side tables, desks, even cabinets are great pieces to look for," he says.

Mendelson mentions a pair of vintage French plaster shell sconces in his Sagaponack, New York, home. He bought them 15 years ago "and they still feel fresh and relevant today."

"I think a desire for one-of-a-kind and bespoke is at least starting a conversation about handmade," he says. "Quality vs quantity. Living with intention."

Snake cigar lighter could be a warning to smokers

WHETHER IT'S AS SUBTLE as the serpentine front of a Chippendale chest or as lifelike as the three-dimensional snakes that slither across, Palissy ware majolica, snakes and snake shapes often show up in decorative arts. They are among the oldest, most-common symbols in history, standing for concepts like wisdom, healing and renewal. They can also have negative meanings, often appearing as mythological monsters and carrying the threat of poison. After all, St. Patrick's Day honors a saint whose legendary feats include banishing all snakes from Ireland.

The sinister side of snakes is on display in this figural cigar lighter, which sold for \$1,599 at Morphy Auctions. Maybe it was a way to subtly reference the poisonous qualities of tobacco: the cigar would be lit in the snake's open mouth, right between its exposed fangs.

Some collectors see a similar message regarding alcohol in the famous snake jugs made by Anna Pottery. Others believe any reference to poison was meant ironically, or even coincidentally. Maybe the designers simply liked the look.

Q: I have a Jacob Josef Kohn chair. It still has its original labels. The cane seat is long ago gone. What is its current value as is? Where should I sell it?

A: Jacob Kohn opened a lumber factory with his son Josef in 1850. As the company, called J. & J. Kohn, grew, they started making bentwood furniture, one of the many furniture innovations of the 19th century. Many well-known European designers worked for them. J. & J. Kohn merged

with the Mundus manufacturing group to become Mundus-Kohn in 1914. Today, a single chair by J. & J. Kohn can sell at auction for more than \$1,000. A barrel back chair missing its cane seat sold at a recent auction in Europe for \$2,800. A label always increases the value of antique furniture. A furniture dealer or repairer in your area can help you get more information.

Q: My husband was a DP following WWII. While in the resettlement camps, he was given two khaki-colored wool army-style-sized blankets. One is gone, the second in good condition. It has a red embroidered "2" on it. Does it have a value?

A: After World War II ended, there were more than a million displaced persons, or DPs, who had been forced out of their

homes during the war and could not be repatriated. Many were concentration camp survivors or had been forced laborers. The Allies established DP camps in occupied Germany, Austria and Italy. Conditions were often poor because of limited space and shortages of food and supplies, but people living in the camps established schools, job training programs, newspapers, recreation, arts and cultural activities. The United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) provided economic assistance. The United States Displaced Persons Act of 1948 provided for resettlement of some displaced persons, and an amended version in 1950 removed some restrictions in the original act. Army blankets from World War II sell for about \$25 to \$50 at auction. We have seen items relating to DPs sell

for higher prices, around \$100, so yours might have a higher value.

TIP: If you want to keep your collections free from harm, always clean and dust items yourself.

Many voters frustrated by U.S. economy because of home prices

WASHINGTON — Lori Shelton can't fathom ever having the money to buy a home — and that's a major reason why so many voters feel down on the economy ahead of this year's presidential election.

Shelton, 67, drives an Uber to help pay rent in Aurora, Colorado. An advance on her pay covered her apartment's security deposit. But it also cut into her next paycheck, leaving her bank account dangerously low when the rent was due — a cycle that never seems to end.

"I'm always one step behind," said Shelton, her voice choking up. "It's a nightmare, it's a freaking nightmare right now."

The United States is slogging through a housing affordability crisis that was decades in the making. At the root of this problem: America failed to build enough homes for its grow-

ing population. The shortage strikes at the heart of the American dream of homeownership — dampening President Joe Biden's assurances that the U.S. economy is strong and underscoring the degree to which Republican Donald Trump, the former president and presumptive GOP nominee for 2024, has largely overlooked the shortage.

The lack of housing has caused a record number of renters to devote an excessive amount of income to housing, according to a Harvard University analysis. Not enough homes are for sale or being built, keeping prices elevated. Average mortgage rates have more than doubled and further worsened affordability.

In fact, the Census Bureau reported that homeownership fell slightly at the end of last year in an otherwise solid economy. If it wasn't for shelter costs, inflation —

Biden's most pronounced economic problem — would be running at a healthy and stable 1.8%. Instead, it's hovering around 3.2%.

Administration officials are confident that shelter inflation will soon cool, but the damage across several years is apparent to advocates and economists.

"I've been doing housing work for 30 years — the housing affordability challenge is the worst I've ever seen in my career," said Shaun Donovan, a former secretary of Housing and Urban Development in the Obama years who now leads the nonprofit Enterprise Community Partners.

Donovan noted that this is an increasingly bipartisan challenge that could bring the political parties together. Expensive housing was once the domain of Democratic areas such as New York City and San Francisco. It's now moved into Republican states as places such as Boise, Idaho, grapple with higher prices.

"It is a first-tier issue almost everywhere," he said. "And that is changing the national politics around it in a way that I think is quite different than I've ever seen."

Mark Zandi, chief economist at Moody's Analytics, said that the outcome of the November election could ultimately depend on the path of 30-year mortgage rates.

Rates currently average about 6.74%. If they dropped closer to 6%, the odds of a Biden victory would increase. But rates moving near 8% might enable Trump to prevail, Zandi said.

"Given the current housing affordability crisis,

higher rates will make owning a home completely out of reach for nearly all potential first-time homebuyers," he said. "Since homeownership is a key part of the American dream, if it appears unattainable, this will deeply impact voters' sense of the economy."

Biden, a Democrat, acknowledged the pain many are feeling in his State of the Union address earlier this month and in his budget proposal released on Monday.

The president wants to fund the building and preservation of 2 million housing units — a meaningful sum, but not enough to solve the shortage. He also proposed a tax credit worth up to \$10,000 to homebuyers. Over the past three years, he has increased rental assistance to 100,000 households.

"The bottom line is we have to build, build, build," Biden said Monday in a speech to the National League of Cities. "That's how we bring down housing costs for good."

Rapidly climbing home prices were also a festering problem under Trump, who first achieved celebrity status as a real estate developer. While president, Trump called for limiting construction in the suburbs. He claimed during the 2020 election that Biden's policies to spur building and affordability would "destroy your neighborhood."

During the 2018 to 2020 years of Trump's presidency, the country's housing shortage surged 52% to 3.8 million units, according to the mortgage company Freddie Mac.

The Associated Press contacted Trump's campaign for his policy plans

but did not get a response. The America First Policy Institute, a think tank promoting Trump's vision, said the key is to cut government borrowing to reduce mortgage rates. The former president has pledged to reduce deficits, but an analysis by the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget shows that his policies in office will have likely added more than \$8 trillion to the national debt.

"The best way for us to improve access to homeownership for young people is to get interest rates back down, not to provide subsidies that cause housing unaffordability to worsen," said Mike Faulkender, chief economist at the institute.

Lower rates might play well with voters, but most economists say they would at best offer temporary financial relief. Purchase prices would likely adjust upward in response to greater demand from falling rates.

Construction, the more enduring solution, would take years to achieve and require new rules by states and cities. The administration is trying to incentivize zoning changes, but the major choices are outside the White House's control.

"Even as incomes are going up and the economy is doing well and inflation is coming down, people can't buy homes," said Daryl Fairweather, chief economist at the brokerage Redfin. "That's like the biggest problem for Biden because it's not one that he can solve."

The general rule of thumb is that people should pay no more than 30% of their income on rent or a mortgage. A typical house-

hold looking to buy a home would have to devote 41% of its income to mortgage payments, according to Redfin.

There are far-reaching economic risks because of this. High housing costs can lead people to cut back spending elsewhere. Advocates said it enables landlords to neglect their properties since there is always a ready tenant.

Evictions can worsen health and educational outcomes for children and exact an even wider cost on society, said Zach Neumann, a Denver-based lawyer who provides more than \$30 million annually in rental assistance through the nonprofit Community Economic Defense Project.

The cumulative costs of evicting poorer renters are "\$20,000 to \$30,000 a year when you include shelter nights and emergency room visits," Neumann said. "It's really overwhelming when you think about the total numbers and these folks are fighting to have a roof over their heads."

While there is bipartisan agreement on the need for more housing, there has yet to be a significant plan that has passed the House and Senate. Biden has proposed housing aid throughout his administration that never materialized.

"Had Congress passed some of the investments that the president has called for since the beginning of the administration, had they done that three years ago, as he was advocating, we'd have affordable units coming online right now," said Daniel Hornung, deputy director of the White House National Economic Council.

Real estate Q&A: My fiance died and left home we lived in to a friend. What are my options?

Q: I have been living with my fiance in his house for a few years. Unfortunately, he passed away recently. When I checked the deed, I found out that the house was set up as a life estate to go to his friend, who also lives there. The friend is now eager to sell the house, but I have been helping to support it and make repairs for the last couple of years. What options do I have in this situation? — Claudette

A: Losing a loved one is never easy, and it can be even more challenging when you are left with complicated legal and financial issues to sort out.

Even though you have been living with your fiance in his house for a few years, you face a difficult situation because the house was not set up to go to you.

Many people dread facing their mortality, and when entering a new situation, like becoming engaged, updating their estate plan is far down the list of what most people are thinking about.

If you have been helping to support the house and make repairs for the past couple of years, you may have a claim for some form of compensation.

However, the specifics of your situation will dictate what your rights are. Your first step is to speak with the friend to see if reaching a mutually agreeable solution is possible, such as allowing you to continue living in the house or receiving some form of compensation when the property is sold. Another idea may be to buy the property from the friend at a favorable price.

If the friend is unwilling to work with you, you may need to take legal action to protect your interests.

National Realtors group to pay \$418M to settle commission lawsuits

A powerful real estate trade association has agreed to pay \$418 million and change its rules to settle lawsuits claiming homeowners have been unfairly forced to pay artificially inflated agent commissions when they sold their home.

The National Association of Realtors said Friday that its agents who list a home for sale on a Multiple Listing Service, or MLS, will no longer be allowed to use the service to offer to pay a commission to agents that represent potential homebuyers. The rule change leaves it open for individual home sellers to negotiate such offers with a buyer's agent outside of the MLS platforms, however.

NAR also agreed to create a rule that would require MLS agents or other participants working with a homebuyer to enter into written agreement with them. The move is meant to ensure that homebuyers know going in what their agent's service will charge them for their services.

The rule changes, which are set to go into effect in mid-July, represent a major change the way real estate agents operate.

The NAR faced multiple lawsuits over the way agent commissions are set. In October, a federal jury in Missouri found that the NAR and several large real estate brokerages conspired to require that home sellers pay homebuyers'

agent commission in violation of federal antitrust law.

The jury ordered the defendants to pay almost \$1.8 billion in damages — and potentially more than \$5 billion if the court ended up awarding the plaintiffs treble damages.

The NAR said the settlement covers over one million of its members, its affiliated Multiple Listing Services and all brokerages with a NAR member as a principal that had a residential transaction volume in 2022 of \$2 billion or less.

The settlement, which is subject to court approval, does not include real estate agents affiliated with HomeServices of America and its related companies, the NAR said.

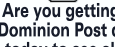

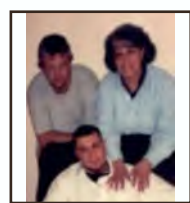

Masterpiece romance

Lasting love takes to the screen in 'Alice & Jack'

Show PBS some love this St. Patrick's Day when "Alice & Jack" makes its premiere on Masterpiece. Starring Irish actor and screenwriter Domhnall Gleeson ("Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 2," 2011) and English actress Andrea Riseborough ("To Leslie," 2022), the six-episode drama series premieres Sunday, March 17, on the network.

While "Alice & Jack" premieres to North American audiences midway through the month of March, it first premiered on England's Channel 4 this past Valentine's Day (Feb. 14) — a timely release due to the ongoing romantic theme of the series.

The six-episode series, which was created by "Mad About You" and "Mad Men" producer Victor Levin, spans 15 years and "explores the seminal question of whether the bonds between us are stronger than the forces that would tear us apart" (per PBS).

When Jack (Gleeson), a calm, reserved scientist, meets a young, tightly wound financier named Alice (Riseborough), the pair instantly hit it off despite their many differences in both lifestyle and personality. They spend just one night together before returning to their separate lives, but over the course of a decade and a half, Jack and Alice meet repeatedly — often by chance — and begin to question what it is about the other person that keeps them both coming back.

Described by Fremantle, the show's distribution company, as a "love story for the ages," "Alice & Jack" is arguably a more

realistic representation of romance in the modern world than the traditional meet-cute romantic comedy. With so many possibilities to interfere with love, trust and friendship these days, the nature of our relationships have changed drastically, and TV fans need look no further than these star-crossed lovers for confirmation.

Following the series' September 2023 premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival, PBS Masterpiece executive Suzanne Simpson described "Alice & Jack" as "exceptionally beautiful and profound" and added that Masterpiece is "proud to add" it to their lineup. And while it is easy to praise the show for its will-they-won't-they quality that has every hopeless romantic on the edge of their seat, critics, such as Marya E. Gates of RogerEbert.com, are just as quick to point out that "Alice & Jack" is far from a fairytale romance.

"As each character does unthinkable things, Levin's script slowly reveals emotional layers that color why they might make such decisions, asking viewers to examine the thornier sides of life," writes Gates, later adding that the miniseries is "more honest about human behavior than most romances allow."

All this said, the heavy subject matter and at times brutal honesty do not weigh the series down, a feat that is largely due to moments of comic relief on the part of the supporting cast. Chief among these providers of levity is Aisling Bea, who plays Jack's later-in-life partner, Lynn. Bea, now best known for her work in the Irish comedy "This Way Up" and the low-key sci-fi dramedy "Living With Yourself," is gaining popularity stateside for her quick

wit and cheerful banter — a welcome addition to the uncertainty brought to the screen by Alice and Jack.

Other notable cast members include Sunil Patel ("Borderline") as Jack's friend and co-worker Paul, who often finds himself rooting against Alice out of protection for Paul; Aimee Lou Wood ("Sex Education") as Alice's co-worker and best friend, Maya; and relative newcomer Millie Ashford ("Choirboy," 2022) as Celia. Additional casting comes in the form of Thalissa Teixeira ("Ragdoll"), Rachel Adejiji ("Hollyoaks"), Clare Burt ("Cuffs") and Ben Dilloway ("Masters of the Air").

As for the two leading actors, Gleeson and Riseborough are reuniting in "Alice & Jack" for the first time on screen since their time together as Rodney and Chrissie in "Never Let Me Go," the 2010 Mark Romanek ("One Hour Photo," 2002) adaptation of Kazuo Ishiguro's novel of the same name.

While the pair seem to have trouble letting each other go in "Alice & Jack," Gleeson remarks he also had a rough time separating himself from the character of Jack following filming.

"It's an amazing privilege to be an actor,"

Gleeson told U.K. online magazine *Readly*, following a 10-month hiatus at the end of filming the Channel 4/PBS series, "but as a piece of work, I found it very tough to shake off at the end of the filming process — one of the most difficult to move on from."

Co-directed by Hong Khaou ("Baptiste") and Juho Kuosmanen ("Compartment Number 6") and featuring original music from Irish composer Stephen Rennicks ("Room," 2015), the series was largely filmed on location in London.

Whether you are in the mood to celebrate the little things that bring us together or mourn the sticking points that tear us apart, PBS's newest television experience, "Alice & Jack," has you covered.

Don't miss your chance to meet the impulsive Alice and her forever-beau Jack when Channel 4's heartbreaking series premieres Sunday, March 17, on PBS Masterpiece.

Formula One returns down under for the 2024 Australian Grand Prix

Round 3 of the 2024 Formula One season gets underway as drivers make their way down under for one of the fastest courses on the calendar. The Australian Grand Prix kicks off Friday, March 22, and runs through Sunday, March 24, at the Melbourne Grand Prix Circuit in Melbourne, Australia, with practices, qualifiers and race day all broadcast live on ESPN.

With a new season comes new challenges, and for the Visa Cash App RB Formula One team, formerly known as Red Bull Racing's sister team, AlphaTauri, expectations are certainly higher. RB Formula One made great steps forward in the off-season, including upgrades to the newly branded VCARB 01 front and rear suspension and a gearbox from Red Bull, with the hopes of making some significant progress on the grid.

Following the release of driver Nyck de Vries last summer, RB Formula One was able to provide 34-year-old Daniel

Ricciardo the opportunity to make his return to F1, proving to be a solid choice with Ricciardo going on to earn the team's best finish last year — a seventh at the Mexican Grand Prix.

The team looks to make big strides this season and with Round 3 about to get underway, Ricciardo is keeping expectations realistic with the hopes of reaching the top five a few times this calendar year — if all goes to plan.

"You have to aim high, but being in this sport for so long, you want to remain as realistic as possible as you don't want to end up ultimately disappointed," said Ricciardo, speaking to F1.com. "Top-five finishes should be the target, and if we get in that position, maybe some podiums present themselves. Of course, we want to win, but, you know ... I think we made steps last year, let's make a few more steps.

"Do I think top-five results are on the table — and could they be on the table in the first half of the season?" Ricciardo continued. "I'd like to think so."

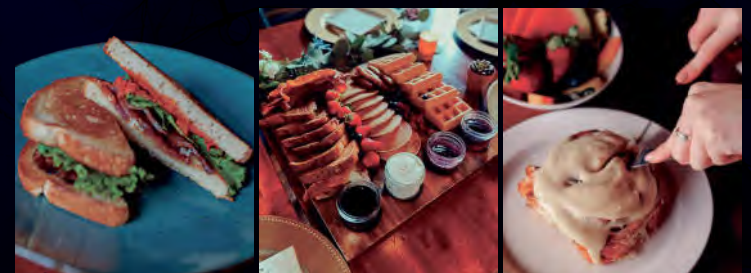

as Wolverine; JP Karliak ("Spidey and His Amazing Friends") as Morph; Lenore Zann ("X-Men: The Animated Series") as Rogue; George Buza ("X-Men: The Animated Series") as Beast; A.J. LoCascio ("Voltron: Legendary Defender") as Gambit; Holly Chou ("Players") as Jubilee; Isaac Robinson-Smith ("Hamster & Gretel") as Bishop; Matthew Waterson ("Trollhunters: Tales of Arcadia") as Magneto; and Adrian Hough ("Home Before Dark") as Nightcrawler.

"Life Below Zero"

It's time to bundle up and make some hot cocoa, as Season 22 of the bone-chilling National Geographic series, "Life Below Zero," makes its Disney+ debut on Wednesday, March 20. Having aired earlier this year on National Geographic, the nine-episode season joins Sue Aikens, Eric Salitan, Chip and Agnes Hailstone,

and other residents of the remote Alaskan wilderness as the resilient citizens do what it takes to manage freezing temperatures, unpredictable storms and man-eating beasts. As Disney explains: "When bears, wolves and foxes are your only neighbors, life can be pretty lonely. Add minus-60-degree days and a constant battle for the most basic necessities, and you have the daily challenges of people who live in remote corners of Alaska." As Season 22 begins, however, so do the Last Frontier's warmest, sunniest seasons, not often seen throughout the series: spring and summer. Coming with their own slate of challenges, the Arctic Summer brings longer days and more resources to the north — with more game to hunt, flowing water to fish in and blooming flora to forage — meaning the local residents must take advantage of the bounty while they can, before the Dark Winter strikes yet again.

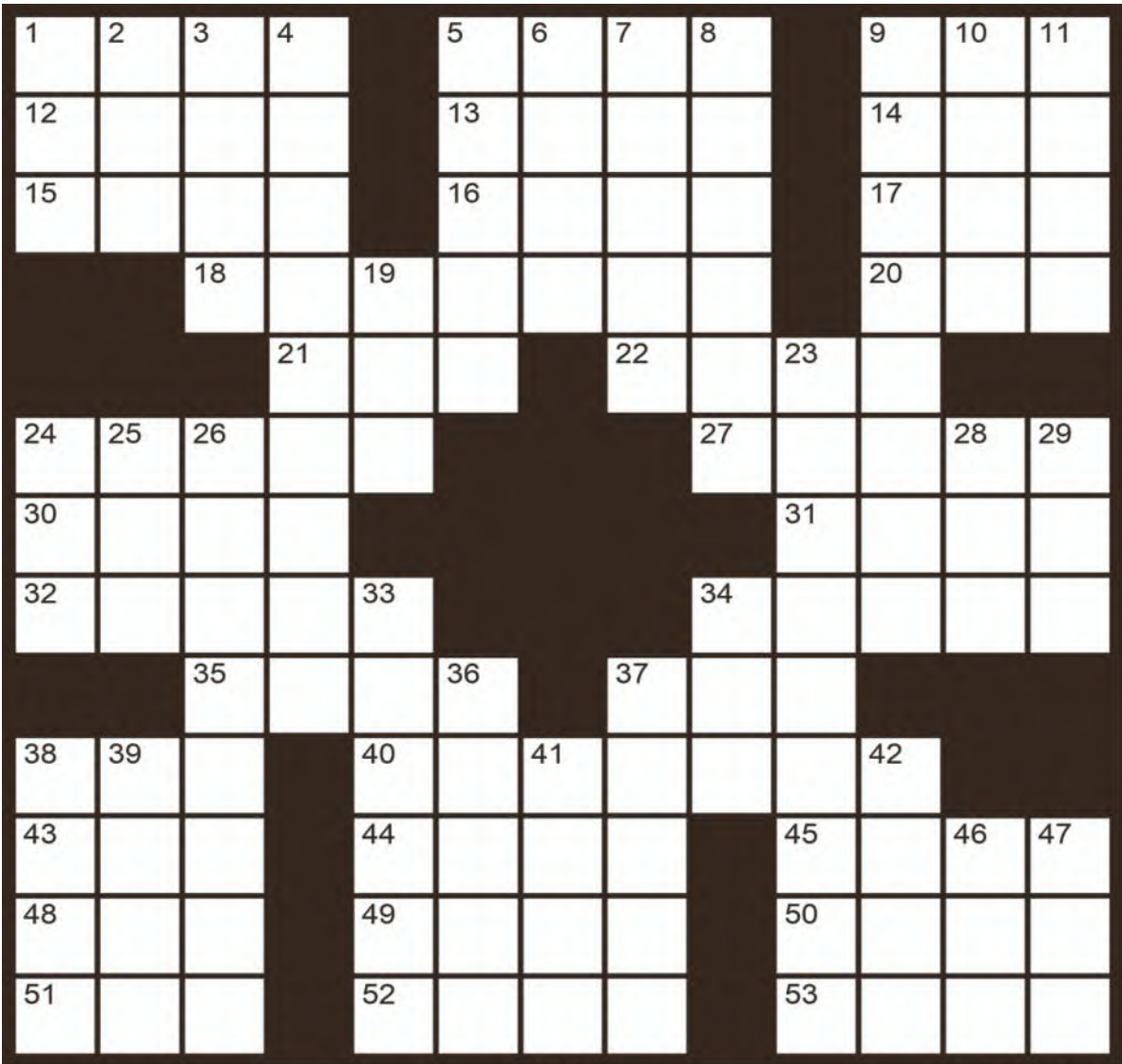

Hollywood Q&A

Q: I saw President Biden featured in an old episode of "Law & Order: SVU." Has he been on any other TV series?

A: U.S. President Joe Biden is, of course, a familiar face on news and documentary programs. But he's also dabbled in scripted shows — albeit always playing himself, and years before he was president. The "Law & Order: Special Victims Unit" episode you mention is in fact his most recent gig, airing in 2016, back when he was vice president. He did a cameo as himself, praising the show's team for their success in powering through a backlog of untested rape kits. Working to support victims of sexual abuse had long been a political focus for Biden, and so this was him bringing his real-world politics into fictional TV.

The same can be said of his previous scripted role, which was a recurring gig in the political sitcom "Parks and Recreation." He appeared in two episodes — one in 2012 to offer some words of civic optimism to the show's main character, Leslie Knope (Amy Poehler, "Saturday Night Live"), and again in the series finale three years later.

In 2004, he appeared in an episode of "Tanner on Tanner," the SundanceTV mockumentary series created by legendary film director Robert Altman ("Gosford Park," 2001) and "Doonesbury" comic strip creator Garry Trudeau. The series was a followup to the groundbreaking 1988 series "Tanner '88."

But, Biden's first scripted gig came way back in the '90s, when he was Sen. Biden, in a couple of episodes of the beloved children's game series "Where in the World is Carmen Sandiego?"

He appeared in a 1992 episode to deliver a clue to the kids about Wyoming and its history of women's rights. And he turned up again in 1993, doing a bit with

the show's host, Greg Lee, saying he had proposed a Congressional resolution naming Lee best detective of the year.

Q: I haven't seen the actor who played Phil on "Modern Family" since the show ended. Where did he go?

A: After "Modern Family" ended in 2020, Ty Burrell immediately went into the sound booth. That is to say that his next project was a voice gig, as the dad in the NBC animated sitcom "Duncanville" (hence why you haven't "seen" him).

That show ended in 2022, though, and Burrell hasn't been seen or heard since.

That could change soon, though. He's reportedly working on another sitcom,

called "Forgive and Forget," that's been optioned by ABC.

There are a lot of "mights" here, though. It was only announced (on Deadline.com) that ABC might buy the show — there was no actual filming being done. And that announcement happened a year ago, so it might be dead in the water at this point.

And if it is still being made, Burrell only might appear on the show — when the announcement was made, Burrell was listed as an executive producer.
