**Researchers  
unveil database  
showing how  
trade licensing  
laws vary  
across nation**

An audiologist, a barber, an electrician or a massage therapist may do more or less the same job in any of the 50 states. But they'll have to jump through different hoops and pay different costs before they can start their job, and to keep doing it.

A team from WVU's Knee Regulatory Research Center recently unveiled a publicly available database that provides licensing information on 50 professions across all 50 states and D.C. They introduced the database in a paper for The Journal of Entrepreneurship and Public Policy.

Want to be an acupuncturist? In Pennsylvania, you'll need to pay a \$30 licensing application fee, earn a master's degree and have 1,098 hours of training. You'll need to pass the NCCAOM exam. To renew your license, you'll need two hours of continuing education and pay a \$40 renewal fee.

But next door, in West Virginia, you'll have to pay a \$500 licensing and application fee. You'll need the master's degree and 1,800 hours of training, but you'll have to pass the NCCAOM plus an oral exam by the state licensing board. To renew your license, you'll need 48 hours of

**Nearly 90K free trips on Mountain Line's Don Knotts route in 2023**

Without an agreement in place by the June 30 end of the fiscal year, free rides on Mountain Line's Don Knotts route will end and the normal 75-cent fare will be reinstated.

The service has been provided without charge since September 2021 to provide better access for individuals needing to use the social services within Hazel's House of Hope, on Scott Avenue.

The route travels from Mountain Line's Westover hub to downtown Morgantown, then

out to Scott Avenue, then Hornbeck Road Walmart and back.

Rides are being provided without charge thanks to an agreement between Mountain Line and Morgantown Community Resources, the nonprofit board that serves as facilitator and landlord for the Hazel's

House of Hope property.

Mountain Line General Manager Maria Smith explained everybody on that route rides free, regardless of destination.

"The challenge [MCR] had was getting the fare to the people.

**Pence 'cannot in good conscience' back Trump — but Capito can**

Donald Trump's own former vice president, Mike Pence, says there's no way he could endorse him.

Sen. Shelley Moore Capito, who endorsed Trump's re-election bid weeks ago, suggests Pence doesn't have it right.

"I think that West Virginians, amazingly in large, large numbers support President Trump — so I support the policies of President Trump and I support him," Capito, R-W.Va., said during a media briefing this past week in response to a MetroNews question.

Much of West Virginia's Republican-dominated political environment has become a matter of who supports Trump the most. In the 2020 election, Trump dominated West Virginia's vote by 38.9 points. That was down slightly from the 2016 margin in West Virginia, 42.1 points.

Trump is now cruising toward a rematch with current President Joe Biden, a Democrat, in the 2024 General Election.

Several key members of Trump's own administration, though, are not supporting his re-election. Those include former Attorney General William Barr, former Defense Secretary James Mattis, another Defense Secretary Mark Esper, Joint Chiefs Secretary Mark Milley, Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, U.N. Ambassador Nikki Haley, former national security advisers HR McMaster and John Bolton, chiefs of staff John Kelly and Mick Mulvaney and more.

The most prominent is Pence, who served at Trump's side as vice president for four years. Pence, on Jan. 6, 2021, determined that the constitution called for the vice president to certify the presidential election results. Supporters of Trump chanted "hang Mike Pence," constructed a gallows outside, rushed into the Capitol and caused the evacuations of the vice president and Congress.

At 2:24 p.m. that day, Trump

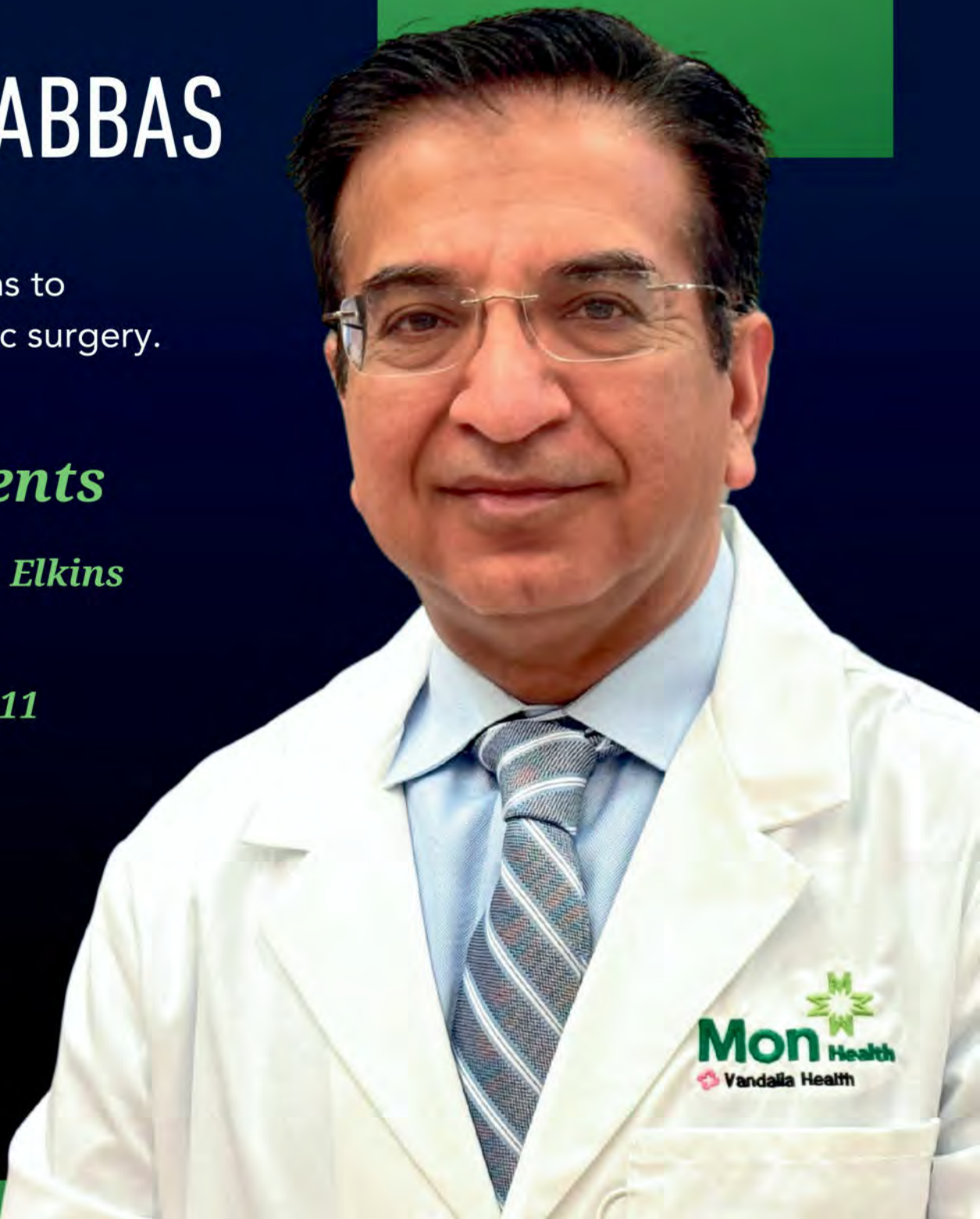

Dr. Sandy L. Burkart, PT, PhD, renowned physical therapist and educator, passed away March 13, 2024, at the age of 80.

He was born Sept. 23, 1943, in Reading, Pa., to Elenore and Paul Burkart.

Sandy was born as part of a surprise set of twins with his sister, Sandra. From the start, he and his sister kept his parents and older brother, Richard, on their toes. Always up for adventure, he lived a life marked by accomplishment and service, leaving a lasting mark on the hearts of those who knew him. After years of living in Florida, Sandy returned to the place he always loved and considered home, to spend his last days surrounded by beloved friends and family in Morgantown.

Sandy's journey was one of dedication and excel-

lence in all aspects of his life, from clinical work to humanitarian projects. His academic pursuits led him to obtain an undergraduate degree from East Stroudsburg University and a physical therapy degree from the University of Pennsylvania. These academic pursuits laid a strong foundation for his career. This was also a time that he formed many friendships that lasted for decades — the most important being with his best friend, John Petronis, and his wife, Barbara. Sandy dreamed of achieving a PhD in anatomy, which brought his young family to West Virginia University (WVU). Sandy joined as founding faculty for the division of Physical Therapy, while Barbara became one of the first female pediatric physical therapists in the state.

As a faculty member, and eventually the chair of the division of Physical Therapy, Sandy was not only a mentor, but also a trailblazer. He contributed to his field with unwavering commitment. His work

at WVU resulted in him being awarded the American Physical Therapy Association's Excellence in Clinical Teaching Award and allowed him to travel around the nation and internationally as a speaker and educator on Orthopedic Physical Therapy. His work extended beyond the classroom, as he engaged on the local level to bring equitability for people with disabilities and to increase access to physical therapy care to the people of West Virginia. He was also a proud leader on both the state and national level for various healthcare organizations.

Sandy's passion, clinically and in teaching, was in orthopedics, and he was integral in the creation of the Orthopedic Section of the American Physical Therapy Association and certification of advanced clinical competency and specialization. He was the second president of the Orthopedic Section and held a leadership position for six years. He held great pride in the fact that the

Orthopedic Section and the Orthopedic Specialization are both the largest in the APTA.

Those who worked with Sandy will remember him as a man whose intellect was matched only by his creative spirit. He approached challenges with a unique blend of innovation and practicality, which inspired him to begin working on the international level to improve human conditions in Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Sierra Leone and Guatemala. Working through Rotary International, he helped to equip medical clinics, increase access to healthy food and clean water, to improve care for children with HIV and to build digital classrooms. His passion for this work was infectious, and he had the rare ability to quickly incite the same excitement and hope in others.

Sandy's life was rich not only in academic and professional achievements, but also in love and family. He is survived by his devoted wife, Barbara A. Burkart,

who was his partner in all aspects of life. Together, they built a family that includes their daughter Jennifer L. Burkart, her husband Joerg Pohlmann, and their son Quinn; their daughter Megan A. Burkart; and Jermaine M. Brantley, his wife Talia, and their sons Lucca and Russo. He held great pride in the achievements of his family and each member carries a piece of Sandy's spirit, from his intellectual curiosity to his creative passions. He is also survived by countless friends, exchange students and Rotarians that the family welcomed into their home and hearts.

Sandy's legacy is one that will be felt for generations. He was a man who lived his life with purpose and who sought to empower others to reach their full potential. His absence will be felt deeply by those who knew him, but the impact of his work and the memories he created will continue to resonate.

The family will hold a celebration of his life in late

July 2024, honoring the man who was not only an esteemed professional, but also a loving husband, father, grandfather and friend.

The family is grateful for the wonderful care that he received from Dr. Andrea Labus and other caregivers at WVU Medicine. They especially want to thank Dr. Laura Davisson and countless other friends who provided him with so much love and support during his last days.

Heavy rains kill at least 7 in Rio de Janeiro state

PETROPOLIS, Brazil — Heavy rains in Rio de Janeiro state have killed at least seven people, authorities said Saturday, while a 4-year-old girl was rescued after more than 16 hours under mud.

The girl was pulled out alive in the city of Petropolis, 43 miles north of Rio. Rescue teams had to stop their work Friday night because of risks of new landslides in the region.

The girl's father died as a house was knocked to the ground. She survived because he protected her with his body, members of rescue teams said. Three more people died in the same place.

"My son was a warrior; he spent all that time there and saved his little daughter," Roberto Napoleão, the grandfather of the girl, told journalists. "You can't imagine what it is like to lose a son. It hurts so much."

Mayors in the state and Gov. Claudio Castro had alarmed residents of potential problems for the weekend since Thursday.

Museum, historical group launch search for wreckage of ace pilot Richard Bong's crashed plane

SUPERIOR, Wis. — A Wisconsin museum is partnering with a historical preservation group in a search for the wreckage of World War II ace Richard Bong's plane in the South Pacific.

The Richard I. Bong Veterans Historical Center in Superior and the nonprofit World War II historical preservation group Pacific Wrecks announced the search on Friday, Minnesota Public Radio reported.

Bong, who grew up in Poplar, is credited with shooting down 40 Japanese aircraft during World War II. He flew a Lockheed P-38 Lightning fighter plane nicknamed "Marge" in honor of his girlfriend, Marjorie Vattendahl. Bong

plastered a blow-up of Vattendahl's portrait on the nose of the plane, according to a Pacific Wrecks' summary of the plane's service.

Bong said at the time that Vattendahl "looks swell, and a hell of a lot better than these naked women painted on most of the airplanes," the Los

Angeles Times reported in Vattendahl's 2003 obituary.

Another pilot, Thomas Malone, was flying the plane in March 1944 over what is now known as Papua New Guinea when engine failure sent it into a spin. Malone bailed out before the plane crashed in the jungle.

Pacific Wrecks founder Justin Taylan will lead the search for the plane. He plans to leave for Papua New Guinea in May. He believes the search could take almost a month and cost about \$63,000 generated through donations.

Taylan told Minnesota Public Radio that he's confident he'll find the wreckage since historical records provide an approximate location of the crash site. But he's not sure there will be enough left to conclu-

sively identify it as Marge.

"Hopefully we'll be able to find the ultimate proof, which will be a serial number from the airplane that says this airplane is Marge," Taylan said.

Bong shot down more planes than any other American pilot, earning celebrity status. Gen. Douglas MacArthur awarded him the Medal of Honor, the U.S. military's highest decoration, in 1944.

Bong married Vattendahl in 1945. He was assigned to duty as a test pilot in Burbank, California, after three combat tours in the South Pacific. He was killed on Aug. 6, 1945, when a P-80 jet fighter he was testing crashed.

He died on the same day the United States dropped an atomic bomb on Hiroshima.

Vattendahl was 21 when Bong died. She went on to become a model and a magazine publisher in Los Angeles.

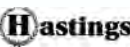

Di enjoyed dancing the night away at local venues. Myrtle Beach was her favorite get away, where she spent many summer days with her husband and her close group of friends.

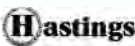

Advocacy center hosts ‘Child Safety 101’ session on April 14

It can be a tough world out there for kids.

And that’s not counting the threats of gun violence in schools or the angst that comes from just simply being that age.

If you’re a parent, or someone else who has been entrusted with the care of a child, you already know that.

Last year, at least 1-in-7 children suffered some form of abuse or neglect, according to numbers culled by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. “At least,” the CDC qualifies, because many such cases

go unreported.

One statistic, though, the agency noted, couldn’t be more grimly definitive, or more grimly telling.

In 2020, that high-stress year of the pandemic, a total of 1,750 children across the U.S. died.

Victims.

Beaten — and beaten down.

They were killed outright by the hands of their abusers.

Or, they wrenchingly succumbed from the ravages of neglect.

Either way, they were taken away.

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, and in

Morgantown, the Monongalia County Child Advocacy Center is helping lead off the annual awareness campaign with a session it calls, “Child Safety 101.”

The gathering will be from 4-6 p.m. April 14 at the Mon County Center in Mylan Park.

Look for a bevy of educational materials and a talk by Diane Tarantini, a survivor of child abuse who grew up to become a child safety expert and acclaimed author.

Her book, “The Brave Knight,” tells its young readers how to spot and avoid sexual predators.

There’s no pre-registration for the session, which is free, said

Taylor Shulz, the child advocacy center’s director of awareness and development.

“It’s about advocacy and it’s about awareness,” she said. “We want to see as many parents and caregivers as we can on April 14.”

Questions, the kind that have to be voiced during investigations, are in part why the Monongalia County Child Advocacy Center was created nearly 20 years ago.

Call it a matter of compassionate protocol.

That’s because the center is ground zero in its pursuit of bringing abusers of children to justice.

Instead of being shuttled from one agency after the other to recount painful events over and over, young victims are interviewed in one fixed location at the advocacy center.

The interviews are monitored and shared with the appropriate authorities who are also there for the sessions.

From its home on Green Bag Road, the center last year conducted 1,195 such sessions for children.

WVU to offer self-defense training to students, faculty, staff

If danger presented itself, would you be able to recognize a threat and have the confidence to defend yourself?

The West Virginia University Police Department is hoping to provide a little extra confidence for those lacking — or hoping to refine — their self-defense skills.

WVUPD is hosting a P.R.O.T.E.C.T. training class from 5-9 p.m. March 25, that will provide the opportunity to learn valuable self-defense techniques from officers.

P.R.O.T.E.C.T. is an in-person, immersive training that uses hands-on

demonstrations to teach self-defense techniques, said April Kaull, executive director of communications at WVU.

Participants will learn about the skills needed to recognize a threat, escape an attack and get to a safe place to call for help. Specifically, the training will go over striking techniques, takedowns and escape holds, and will provide information on developing situational awareness.

“When you’re in danger and help is not nearby, it is vital you know how to defend yourself,” Kaull said. “It is also important to have the skills needed to

World TB Day: MCHD is here to help.

BACK BEFORE DR. ROBERT KOCH ANNOUNCED THE DISCOVERY of the bacteria that causes tuberculosis, the disease killed 1 out of every 7 people living in the United States and Europe, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

That announcement took place on March 24, 1862, and the date since has been memorialized as World Tuberculosis Day.

The potentially fatal disease that affects the lungs can be transmitted via coughing, sneezing and spitting, hence the move historically to outlaw the latter to prevent the spread of TB.

Throughout the years, “consumption” took the lives of many well-known people, including poet John Keats (at age 25), writer

George Orwell and actress Vivien Leigh. In 1969, musician Cat Stevens’ long convalescence from TB changed the course of the songs he wrote as well as his path in life.

Now, more than 160 years after the discovery of Mycobacterium tuberculosis, the statistics in the United States are less grim when it comes to TB.

In 2023, West Virginia had a reported 15 total

What is Palm Sunday? And how is it celebrated?

Palm Sunday will be celebrated by Christians worldwide this Sunday. It commemorates the Christian belief in the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, when palm branches were strewn before him. It marks the start of Holy Week. The church's most solemn week also includes the Good Friday and Easter. The Palm Sunday liturgy traditionally starts with a blessing of the palms by the clergy. It is followed by a reading of the Passion of Jesus Christ. Christian pilgrims in the Holy Land mark Palm Sunday by retracing Jesus' triumphant return. Worshipers carry palm fronds and olive branches and march from the top of the Mount of Olives to Jerusalem's historic Old City. Palm Sunday commemorates the Christian belief in the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, when he was greeted by cheering crowds waving palm branches that they set out on the ground along his path, according to the Bible.

This year, Palm Sunday falls on March 24. Also known as Passion Sunday, it marks the start of Holy Week. The most sacred week of the Christian year includes the Good Friday re-enactment of Jesus' crucifixion story and death, and their belief in his resurrection on Easter. Here is a quick look at Palm Sunday's significance.

HOW IS PALM SUNDAY CELEBRATED?

The ritual or liturgy typically starts with a blessing of the palms by clergy. It's followed by a reading of the Passion of Christ, meaning an account of the final events of Jesus' life. Some ceremonies in German-speaking countries used to include a figure of Jesus riding a donkey, Encyclopedia Britannica says. The figure is called a "Palmesel," or German for "palm donkey," according to New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art, which on its site recounts how worshippers would lay palms on the

ground before the Palmesel during lively processions. Christian pilgrims in the Holy Land mark Palm Sunday by holding Masses and processions retracing Jesus' triumphal entry. Worshipers carry palm fronds and olive branches and march from the top of the neighboring Mount of Olives to Jerusalem's historic Old City, home to holy sites of the three Abrahamic monotheistic faiths.

Mega Millions jackpot rises to \$1.1 billion

DES MOINES, Iowa — The Mega Millions jackpot climbed to an estimated \$1.1 billion after no one matched the game's six numbers Friday night, continuing a stretch of more than three months without a big winner. The numbers drawn were: 3, 8, 31, 35, 44, 16. The jackpot increased after a drawing for an estimated \$977 million failed to produce a jackpot winner. No one has won the game's jackpot since Dec. 8, a string of 30 consecutive drawings without anyone taking home the top prize. That has enabled the jack-

pot to slowly grow, week after week. The \$1.1 billion prize is for a sole winner who chooses to be paid through an annuity over 30 years. Winners almost always opt for a cash payment, which for the next drawing Tuesday night is an estimated \$525.8 million. A lucky player winning the \$1.1 billion jackpot would take home the eighth largest in U.S. lottery history. The other U.S. lottery game, Powerball, has grown to an annuity jackpot of \$750 million and a cash payout of \$357.3 million. The next Powerball drawing is scheduled to take place Saturday night.

What's next now that Speaker Mike Johnson is facing a motion to vacate from Marjorie Taylor Greene

WASHINGTON — Barely six months into the job, House Speaker Mike Johnson is already at risk of the same conservative revolt that took down his predecessor. The Louisiana Republican, who only took the gavel in October after weeks of GOP infighting, was put on "warning" by one of his harshest critics Friday after he helped push through a \$1.2 trillion spending package with majority Democratic votes despite heavy criticism from his right flank. During the vote, Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene, R-Ga., filed a resolution with the House clerk — called a motion to vacate — that would remove Johnson from office if approved by the House. And while Greene did not force the resolution to be taken up immediately, she told reporters she was laying the groundwork for consideration once the House returns from recess in two weeks. "It's more of a warning," Greene said. She would not commit to a timeline for calling a vote, but added, "We've started the clock to start the

process to elect a new speaker."

WHAT IS A MOTION TO VACATE?

The current rules of the House allow for any single lawmaker — Democrat or Republican — to make a "motion to vacate the chair," essentially a vote to oust the speaker through a privileged resolution. The motion has existed for most of congressional history. But it had never been deployed successfully until last October when a rebel band of Republicans joined with Democrats to oust Kevin McCarthy as speaker. McCarthy's stunning removal came, in part, as the result of the concessions he was forced to make to win the speaker's gavel in the first place. Among the concessions was agreeing that a motion to vacate could be triggered by a single member — the threshold that historically has been the norm. Proponents of allowing a single lawmaker to file the motion said it promotes accountability, noting its long history in the House. The tool was used memorably in 2015 against then-Speaker John Boehner when then-Rep.

Mark Meadows of North Carolina, a Republican who later became Donald Trump's White House chief of staff, introduced a resolution to declare the speaker's office vacant. Two months later, Boehner announced he would be stepping down.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

At any point in time, a member of the House can introduce a privileged resolution — a designation that gives it priority over other measures — to declare the office of the speaker of the House of Representatives vacant. Once the motion is introduced, the lawmaker can walk onto the House floor and request a vote. Such a request would force House leaders to schedule a vote on the resolution within two legislative days. But there are procedural motions that members of either party could introduce to slow down or stop the process altogether. If those tactics were to fail, and the resolution came to the floor for a vote, it would take a simple majority of the House — 218 votes, when no seats are vacant — to remove the speaker, as happened to McCarthy in a 216-210 vote.

WILDLIFE

Dolphins on course prevent racing at SailGP New Zealand

The presence of an endangered species of dolphins on the race course prevented sailing on the first day of the New Zealand leg of the SailGP series on Saturday. The race venue on Lyttelton Harbour near Christchurch on the South Island is home to around 1,000 of the remaining 10,000 Hector's dolphins, which are native to New Zealand. Under the conditions of the two-day event, racing cannot take place while dolphins are on or near the course. Observers have been assigned to spot dolphins and warn organizers if they stray too close to the race area. The SailGP website said: "Race Day 1 canceled due to prolonged mammal activity on racecourse for duration of scheduled race window." On Saturday, there were dolphins near the start line of the course throughout the period in which racing was due to take place. The 10 competing teams waited on the course for around 90 minutes before organizers determined there was not enough time left in the day for even one race to be completed. Three fleet races were scheduled Saturday and two more are scheduled Sunday before the top three teams compete in the final to decide the event champion.

In a further brief statement on the event website, organizers said: "SailGP is committed to minimizing risk to the marine environment and has comprehensive protocols developed in conjunction with local authorities and experts to avoid contact with wildlife." Sunday's racing is expected to go ahead as scheduled, dolphins permitting. Lyttelton became the venue for the New Zealand leg of the series after Auckland indicated it would not be able to host the event. SailGP chief executive, New Zealand-born Russell Coutts has indicated Lyttelton will not be considered as a venue again because of what he described as "activists." He was referring to conservationists who have condemned the decision to allow the event to take place in the dolphin's habitat. "Unfortunately we won't be here next year and possibly not ever because we need those dates to fit in with the international calendar," Coutts said. While there was some frustration among sailors while racing was delayed Saturday, most accepted the cause of the delay. "We don't want to be racing if there are mammals on the course," New Zealand wing trimmer Blair Tuke said in a television interview. "That is not good for anyone."

TRAVEL

With panels and tires falling off planes, is flying safe?

DALLAS — It has been 15 years since the last fatal crash of a U.S. airliner, but you would never know that by reading about a torrent of flight problems in the last three months. There was a time when things like cracked windshields and minor engine problems didn't turn up very often in the news. That changed in January, when a panel plugging the space reserved for an unused emergency door blew off an Alaska Airlines jetliner 16,000 feet above Oregon. Pilots landed the Boeing 737 Max safely, but in the United States, media coverage of the flight quickly overshadowed a deadly runway crash in Tokyo three days earlier. And concern about air safety — especially with Boeing planes — has not let up. **IS FLYING GETTING MORE DANGEROUS?** By the simplest measurement, the answer is no. The last deadly crash involving a U.S. airliner occurred in February 2009, an unprecedented streak of safety. There were 9.6 million flights last year. The lack of fatal crashes does not

fully capture the state of safety, however. In the past 15 months, a spate of close calls caught the attention of regulators and travelers. Another measure is the number of times pilots broadcast an emergency call to air traffic controllers. Flightradar24, a popular tracking site, just compiled the numbers. The site's data show such calls rising since mid-January but remaining below levels seen during much of 2023. Emergency calls also are an imperfect gauge: the plane might not have been in immediate danger, and sometimes planes in trouble never alert controllers.

SAFER THAN DRIVING

The National Safety Council estimates that Americans have a 1-in-93 chance of dying in a motor-vehicle crash, while deaths on airplanes are too rare to calculate the odds. Figures from the U.S. Department of Transportation tell a similar story. "This is the safest form of transportation ever created, whereas every day on the nation's roads about a 737 full of people dies," Richard Aboulafia, a longtime aerospace analyst and consultant, said. The safety council estimates that more than 44,000 people died in U.S. vehicle

crashes in 2023.

BUT A SHRINKING SAFETY MARGIN

A panel of experts reported in November that a shortage of air traffic controllers, outdated plane-tracking technology and other problems presented a growing threat to safety in the sky. "The current erosion in the margin of safety in the (national airspace system) caused by the confluence of these challenges is rendering the current level of safety unsustainable," the group said in a 52-page report.

SEPARATING SERIOUS FROM ROUTINE

Aviation-industry officials say the most concerning events involve issues with flight controls, engines and structural integrity. Other things such as cracked windshields and planes clipping each other at the airport rarely pose a safety threat. Warnings lights might indicate a serious problem or a false alarm. "We take every event seriously," former NTSB member John Goglia said, citing such vigilance as a contributor to the current crash-free streak. "The challenge we have in aviation is trying to keep it there."

J.J. Quinerly takes over to lead WVU past Princeton in first round of NCAA tournament

J.J. Quinerly was just as much a dominant pitcher than she was a star basketball player Saturday night inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

She got the win and the save in the same game.

West Virginia’s junior guard willed her team back from a nine-point deficit in the second quarter, before taking over in the second half to push the Mountaineers to a 63-53 victory against Princeton in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

“J.J. was special again,” West Virginia head coach Mark Kellogg said. “She has been all year, and I hope people around the country are starting to realize how talented she is.”

Up next for WVU: A date with destiny against top-seeded Iowa (30-4) and the nation’s top player in Caitlyn Clark, which is scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday and will be Clark’s final home game.

Clark had 27 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds in the Hawkeyes 91-65 first-round win against Holy Cross.

The odds will be heavily against WVU (25-7) as a No. 8 seed. In a No. 8-No. 1 matchup in the women’s tournament, the top seed is 48-1 all time.

That likely won’t bother the Mountaineers too much, just like the Tigers’ 23-14 lead early in the second quarter didn’t seem to faze them.

Quinerly, who played all 40 minutes for the third time this season, scored on a pull-up jumper to cut into that lead and Jordan Harrison nailed a 3-pointer at the buzzer, and

Iowa cruises past Holy Cross 91-65 as Caitlin Clark scores 27

IOWA CITY, Iowa — Caitlin Clark struggled to make shots early, but finished with 27 points and 10 assists as Iowa defeated Holy Cross 91-65 in a women’s NCAA tournament first-round game Saturday.

Kate Martin also had a double-double with 15 points and 14 rebounds for the Hawkeyes (30-4), the top seed in the Albany 2 Regional. Iowa advanced to Monday’s second round to face either eighth seed West Virginia or ninth seed Princeton.

Clark, a unanimous Associated Press All-American selection, was just 8 of 19 from the field, 3 of 9 in 3-pointers, showing her frustration with missed shots multiple times during the game.

Clark finished with her 65th career double-double, and added eight rebounds.

She got off to a slow start and didn’t make her first field goal until 22 seconds were left in the first quarter. She committed five turnovers in the first eight minutes.

Iowa had a similar start. The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run midway through the first quarter that didn’t bother the Crusaders, who were within 23-21 at the end of the quarter.

The Hawkeyes then outscored Holy Cross 25-9 in the second quarter, holding the Crusaders to just 1 of 12 shooting. Clark finally got her first 3-pointer with 3:26 left in the first half, shaking her head and rolling her eyes after making the shot.

Holy Cross (21-13) made 12 3-pointers in Thursday’s 72-45 First Four win over UT-Martin, but were just 7 of 34 in 3-pointers in this game, with only three in the second half. The Crusaders, who missed their first 10 shots of the fourth quarter, shot just 32.4% from the field.

Screech owls and ruffed grouse come in two colors

Screech owls and ruffed grouse come in red and gray phases. We know that there are red and gray foxes, but they are separate species. And we know that black bear cubs can be black and brown in the same litter, but the cause of that is the fact that the mother was bred by two males that were of different colors. But in the case of the screech owl and ruffed grouse, each species has two color phases, and for both species there are some intermediate color phases as well.

Consider some background on screech owl coloration. One reference stated that throughout the screech owl's range, 54 percent were gray, 38 percent red, and 8 percent intermediate. That study examined 833 owl specimens from all over and said that the different colors are not related to age or sex of the owls. Several references mention that the red phase birds are more common in high humidity deciduous forests while gray phase owls are more common in

dry or cold environments. For example, gray phase owls are the most common color in Ontario (81 %) and throughout the northern range.

Why are gray phase birds more common up north? The suggestion is that red phase owls have lower survival in very severe winters such as is found in Ontario. A 30-year study in northern Ohio found that gray phase owls made up 75 to 90 percent of the population there. They noted that during those 30 years there were some very hard winters that probably lowered the survival of red phase owls, thus, that region had more grays. They also noted that red phase owls spent more time in cavities during cold winter days, 80 percent versus 38 percent for gray birds. Their conclusion was that red phase owls had higher energy demands in cold winters.

Camouflage has been another factor suggested to explain owl colors. Red phase owls may find better security in the changing fall leaves in deciduous forests. A Tennessee study found 79 percent of its screech owls were red, and an Illinois survey found 78 percent red. Both states have predominant deciduous forests. If that is true, then why are red phase

owls more common in the south where pine trees are predominant and would not be the best camouflage for them compared to living in deciduous forests? My guess is that mixed in with these theories that would explain coloration in screech owls is genetics. But proving that would be difficult if not impossible.

What about West Virginia? Where do our birds fit in? We obviously have lots of deciduous forests so given the camouflage theory we'd expect to see lots more red phase birds. And our winters are relatively mild compared to further north, so again we'd expect to see more reds. There aren't any studies, so I asked Katie Fallon who runs the Avian Conservation Center of Appalachia here in Cheat Lake what phase color screech owls does she see. The center takes in over 600 birds a year including some screech owls. Over the years Katie has seen a fair number of screech owls and says that about half are reds and half grays with a few intermediate brownish colored birds as well. So much for the theories that have been proposed to explain screech owl colors.

Ruffed grouse are found in Canada and the northern United States, and south in the Appalachian

Mountains. The gray phase ruffed grouse are found in the north and in higher altitudes. Some intermediate colored birds are found throughout their range.

Camouflage is given as one reason for the different colors. Red birds are better camouflaged on the ground of deciduous forests, so one would expect that West Virginia has predominantly red phase grouse. The suggestion is that gray phase birds are less conspicuous on snow, hence they are found further north. I'd add that gray birds would also be less conspicuous when they are perched in pine forests. Other researchers believe that the color phase is tied to cold weather, as was suggested for screech owls. Again, it's all speculation.

All of these explanations are interesting, but it seems that lots of times bird color phases don't fit either the cold weather theory or the camouflage theory. Truth is, we just don't know why we get two color phases for screech owls or ruffed grouse. However, that doesn't change the fact that it is really neat to have screech owls and ruffed grouse around for us to see regardless of whether they are reddish or grayish in color.

Another year without a perfect NCAA men's bracket

It's another year without a perfect NCAA Tournament bracket.

Surprising wins by Yale, Oakland and Duquesne busted many of the more than 22 million brackets entered in the largest contest, ESPN's Tournament Challenge, and the last three fell on Friday night when James Madison beat Wisconsin 72-61.

With only 1,825 surviving the first day of action, the number was down to single digits after Friday's early games. Florida Atlantic's loss to Northwestern knocked out about half of the survivors Thursday, with the eighth-seeded Wildcats picked in about 45% of brackets.

It was down to 306 perfect brackets on the ESPN site before No. 10 seed Colorado beat seventh-seeded Florida, leaving 62. Yale's victory over Auburn left

just 10. And with just four games remaining on Friday night there were only three perfect brackets remaining on the ESPN site — and none in CBS' contest or the one on March Madness Live, the NCAA's official site.

Those three on ESPN were no longer perfect after James Madison's victory.

The quest for a winless bracket also ended Friday.

One person on the ESPN site made it through the first day and then some without picking a game correctly, meaning they took a flyer on No. 16 seed Wagner over top-seeded North Carolina but missed on the actual losses by third-seeded Kentucky and No. 6 seeds Texas Tech and Brigham Young. They dropped out of contention for the ignominious honor of a perfectly imperfect bracket when Colorado beat Florida 102-100 on a last-second shot.

The odds of picking a perfect bracket at random — not even counting the play-in games — is 1 chance out of 2 to the 63rd power, which is 1 in 9,223,372,036,854,775,808, or about 1 in 9.2 quintillion (give or take 20 quadrillion or so). According to University of Hawaii researchers, that is more brackets than the number of grains of sand on Earth.

A record 22 million brackets were filled out on ESPN's site, up 15% over last year, with some of the early results knocking out millions. Mississippi State's 69-51 loss to Michigan State and Brigham Young's 71-67 loss to Duquesne each took out more than 9 million brackets. The biggest upset of the first day, third-seeded Kentucky's 80-76 loss to Oakland, also did some damage: The third-seeded Wildcats were picked in 95% of

brackets in the ESPN Tournament Challenge to beat the 14th-seeded Golden Grizzlies.

CBS said its last perfect bracket was spoiled when Yale won on Friday afternoon.

Last year, when there were victories by No. 15 seed Princeton and No. 13 seed Furman on the first day, the last remaining perfect brackets fell on top-seeded Purdue's loss to Fairleigh Dickinson — just the second No. 16 seed to beat a No. 1 seed in tournament history.

In the women's tournament, which started on Friday, ESPN's bracket challenge had a record 3.25 million entries — 56% more than last year. Almost half, 1.5 million, went out on Middle Tennessee's victory over Louisville and 1.3 million others were taken out when Michigan State lost to North Carolina.

Princeton's lead was down to 26-24 at the break.

The second half was when West Virginia, which picked up its 25th win of the season for just the seventh time in school history, did its damage.

"We went in at halftime and coach said, 'That's not us. Our defense is way better than that,' " Quinerly said. "So we just picked it up."

Unable to create any havoc with its pressure defense in the first two quarters, the Mountaineers took it up another notch when the game was on the line.

Princeton had five turnovers in the first half, but that doubled midway through the third quarter, and then reached 13 by the end of the quarter.

"We had 20 minutes left to either give it our all or go home," Harrison said. "So we just went back to what we had been doing all season. Got some deflections, started slowing them down, and start playing in transition like we always do, and have been doing all year."

That all led to Quinerly putting on a show.

She scored 18 of her 29 points in the second half, all of it coming with either a tough drive to the basket, pull-up jumpers or from the foul line.

She made no 3-pointers in the second half, but didn't have to.

Kylee Blacksten did nail one, though, that gave WVU its first lead, 32-29, and was part of a 13-0 run that saw the Mountaineers take the lead for good.

And then it was all on Quinerly.

She scored 15 of WVU's

21 points in the fourth quarter with constant drives into the lane that simply would not allow Princeton (25-5) to get any closer than six points down the stretch.

For added measure, Quinerly added seven rebounds and three steals. It was the 16th time this season she's gone for 21 or more points and the 17th time she's had at least three steals in a game.

"She has a motor," Kellogg said of Quinerly. "She's a highly conditioned athlete and an elite scorer. She's done it before. She's conditioned enough to do it."

While Quinerly scored nearly half of the Mountaineers points, Harrison fought through foul trouble and added 15 and Blacksten finished with 10, her first time in double figures since Feb. 6.

Princeton, which had

advanced to the second round in each of the last two NCAA tournaments, finished with 21 turnovers in all, but did dominate on the glass with 17 offensive rebounds.

Ellie Mitchell finished with 15 rebounds for the Tigers before fouling out in the final seconds. Madison St. Rose led Princeton with 22 points.

Ford still winless in 2024 as NASCAR heads to first road race of the season at COTA

AUSTIN, Texas — Five races into NASCAR's 2024 season and Ford is in a funk. Make no mistake, the Ford cars have been fast, just not quite fast enough to produce any wins yet. At the race in Atlanta, the razor-thin margins at the finish meant 0.003 seconds was the difference between first and third. But winning is what counts the most and Ford drivers are searching for answers to break the drought as NASCAR holds its first road race of the season today at the Circuit of the Americas. "Been close to a couple of (wins)," said last season's Cup series champion Ryan Blaney, who just missed out on the victory in Atlanta and has three top-five finishes. "I don't really get into panic mode too easily. Just understand it is a long year." A Ford win in Austin would seem like a long shot in NASCAR's fourth run on a track built for Formula One. Road course specialists Tyler Reddick (Toyota), New Zealand's Shane van Gisbergen (Chevrolet) and

Chase Elliott (Chevrolet) rate among the race favorites. Chevrolet has three wins and Toyota has two this season, as Ford teams and drivers try to understand the nuances of the Mustang Dark Horse body style that was supposed to provide better handling and aerodynamics. No Ford driver qualified in the top 10 for today's race. And while it's still early, Ford drivers make up just three of the 16 available Cup playoff spots. Blaney tops that short list at fourth. Ford drivers point to some solid statistics, even if the major results are lacking. "I know it doesn't look good on paper when you say that we haven't had a Ford in Victory Lane yet," said RFK Racing driver Chris Buescher, who is currently 14th in the Cup standings. "Look at our year and how competitive we've been. We've been able to lead in four of the five races at some point. And when we didn't lead any laps, we finished second. So to me, we've been very good. We've certainly had a little bit of rough luck,"

Chase Briscoe of Stewart-Haas Racing said Fords have shown good "raw speed." "I feel like we've had the speed, we just haven't been able to put the races together as a manufacturer," Briscoe said. "This week will be probably, truthfully, another struggle for the Fords to win. We just don't have as many good road racers as the other manufacturers have." Briscoe noted how Ford ended last season with Blaney's championship. "If you would have looked at us last year, you would have never thought a Ford was going to win a championship and then it did," Briscoe said. "Hopefully when it matters, Ford is going to be strong."

**ON POLE** Daytona 500 winner William Bryon will start from pole position on today,

**NEW RESTART** After last season's multiple restarts and overtime finish at COTA, the restart zone has been moved from the start/finish line to the exit of the final turn heading into the front stretch. The change should help spread the field before it powers into the uphill switchback turn No. 1 that created so many crashes and restarts last year. "Restarts can be exciting for people to watch for sure, but they get to be kind of a crapshoot," Blaney said. "It will still be wild, but hopefully it would be under more control."

**GAMBLING** NASCAR has been leaning into sports betting in recent years. Reddick, last season's winner at COTA, said there's a new level of engagement with fans. "My favorite one is, 'Don't screw up today, I've got a lot riding on you,'" Reddick said. "Fans love to chime and let you know what they've got riding on it."

**ODDS & ENDS** Reddick is the betting favorite to win today, according to FanDuel Sportsbook ... The first five races this season produced five different winners. The longest streak of different winners in the "modern" era of NASCAR (1972-present) was 10 in 2000.

Mitchell holes out 7-iron on the 18th to take 2-shot lead heading into final round at Innisbrook

PALM HARBOR, Fla. — Keith Mitchell capped off a magnificent run through the "Snake Pit" at Innisbrook on Saturday with a shot he never saw go in. His 7-iron from the 18th fairway one-hopped into the hole for eagle and a 5 under and a two-shot lead in the Valspar Championship. Mitchell was among a dozen players on the fringe of contention at a tournament so tight that it began with all 77 players who made the cut separated by a mere six shots. That changed when he went 3-2-2 through the closing stretch of the Copperhead course, the first player to do that in tournament history. Mitchell holed a birdie putt just inside 15 feet on the 16th hole, hit 6-iron to inside 3 feet for birdie on the par-3 17th and then holed out on the 18th hole with a 7-iron from about 151 yards up a steep hill. That puts Mitchell at 10-under 203, two shots clear of Mackenzie Hughes (69), Seamus Power (68) and Peter Malnati (68). Mitchell knew the shot was good, but something flew into his eye as he followed the flight, causing him to look away and wipe away the speck. Then he heard a loud cheer, looked up and realized the ball had gone in for a most unlikely eagle. "When I looked up, something kind of flew in my eye, so I kind of looked

"But I knew ... when I hit it, I was pleased with the contact." The 18th green is elevated, and the pin was up front behind a deep bunker, so he wouldn't have been able to see it go in the hole, anyway. He could hear the crowd, and there was pleasant surprise on his face he couldn't hide. There were a few other unpleasant surprises by players who briefly had a share of the lead. One of them was 50-year-old Stewart Cink, who began the third round in a five-way tie for the lead. He had two early birdies and was leading through seven holes when he three-putted from 30 feet on the par-3 eighth. It only got worse from there. Cink shot 41 on the back nine for a 76, taking him

So was Cameron Young, the New Yorker still looking for his first win despite have chances in the majors each of the last three years. He hit a rough patch early in his round that was erased when he holed out with a gap wedge for eagle on the par-4 seventh hole. Young had four birdies over the next seven holes and was right back in the game. "It's a golf course that's difficult and you know that with the scoring so bunched, it just takes two good swings and you can move up a lot," Young said. "It's definitely about as bunched as I've ever seen one, but I think provides a lot of opportunities, as well."

Green scores 41, Rockets beat Jazz 147-119 for eighth straight victory

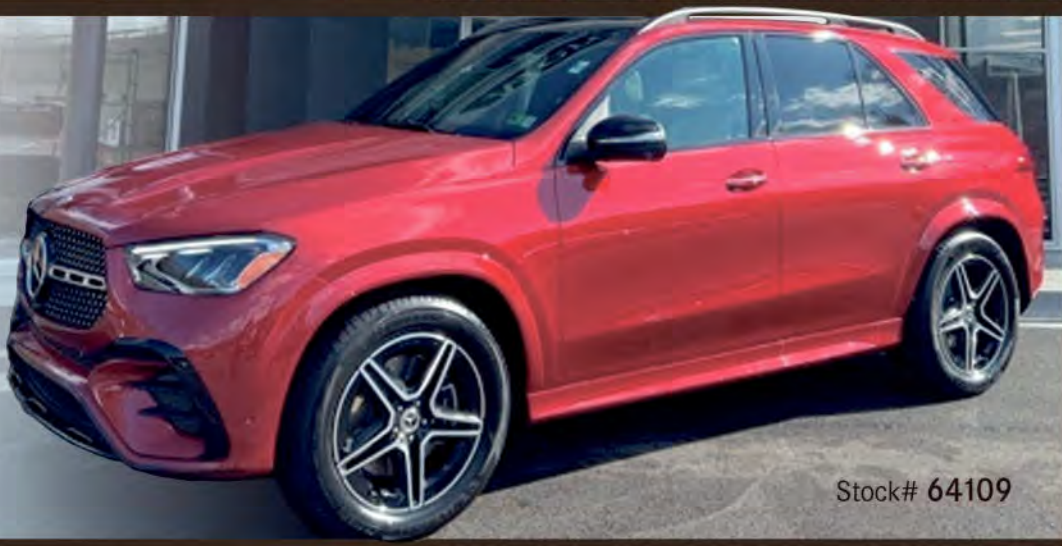

Indian Wells champ Alcaraz begins Miami Open with 6-2, 6-1 win over over Carballés Baena

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. — Indian Wells champion and second-ranked Carlos Alcaraz began his Miami Open campaign with an emphatic 6-2, 6-1 victory over fellow Spaniard Roberto Carballés Baena on Saturday night.

The 20-year-old Alcaraz, who is the reigning Wimbledon champion, dominated the match from start to finish with his impressive speed and agility. He saved all three break points he faced to pick up his seventh straight win.

Jannik Sinner advanced to the third round with a 6-3, 6-4 victory over fellow Italian Andrea Vavassori. The third-ranked Sinner, the Australian Open champion and last year's Miami Open runner-up, had to wait overnight to clinch the opening victory at Miami after rain forced a suspension of the match on Friday with Sinner leading 3-2.

"I think it's a lot of difference between here and anywhere else," Sinner said. "Here maybe the court suits me a little bit better because the ball is not that bouncy. But I feel just mentally quite free to play, and I think that's most important."

Andy Murray advanced to the third round with a 7-6, 6-3 victory over 29th-ranked Tomás Martín Etcheverry. That match was also suspended on Friday because of rain. Murray, who won the Miami title in 2009 and 2013, snapped a nine-match losing streak against top 50 players with the win and has now played 995 career tour-level matches.

"My body feels that," said Murray, who turns 37 in May. "It feels like I've

played a thousand. I've obviously been on the tour a long time. My first matches on tour were just as I turned 18 years old ... It's been a long career but an amazing career."

In women's play, top-ranked Iga witek, coming off an Indian Wells title last week, defeated Camila Giorgi 6-1, 6-1 in just over an hour. The victory gave witek 81 wins in the first 100 matches of her career at the WTA-1000 level. Only Serena Williams (87) had more wins in her first 100 matches at that level.

Naomi Osaka continued her comeback journey by defeating 17th-ranked Elina Svitolina 6-2, 7-6 (5). Osaka, who is coming off a third-round loss at Indian Wells, now has two wins over top 20 opponents in her last four matches.

"I definitely do think it was one of my best matches (of the year), if not the best match," Osaka said. "But I also want myself to play better and better every match."

A day after rain and

wind delayed the start of play and suspended several matches, downpours again pushed the start of Saturday's matches back by nearly three hours.

On a day with several upsets on the men's side, Brazil's Thiago Seyboth Wild stunned American Taylor Fritz 6-3, 6-4 to reach the third round. Numerous Brazilian fans were in attendance to watch their compatriot play, and they cheered so loudly that Fritz complained to the chair umpire.

Christopher O'Connell topped 22nd-ranked Francis Tiafoe 7-5, 7-6; 14th-ranked Tommy Paul appeared to roll his left ankle in the second set of his match against Martin Damm Jr. and was forced to retire; last year's Miami Open winner Daniil Medvedev advanced, beating Márton Fucsovics 6-4, 6-2.

In other action, fifth-ranked Jessica Pegula advanced to the second round after Zhu Lin retired with an illness while trailing 6-4, 4-1.

We need Bartlett House

Last week’s dip into freezing night-time temperatures was a stark reminder of how important shelter is for our unhoused population — and it happened to coincide with a series of disappointing announcements from Bartlett House.

As things currently stand, Bartlett House plans to close its triage shelter at Hazel’s House of Hope by June 30, because it did not receive the \$166,000 it expected.

At the same time it was announced Bartlett House would not get its funding for the year from the West Virginia Coalition to End Homelessness, news broke that the new Rainbow House would receive \$250,000 from WVCEH.

Unfortunately, many people in the community understood this to mean that Rainbow House had somehow stolen Bartlett’s funding. Sadly, this led to much finger-pointing and name-calling within the community.

To be clear: It was not an either/or situation where the WVCEH could choose to fund only one shelter in the area. The WVCEH recently implemented a competitive grant process in lieu of just funding the same handful of shelters year after year. This opened the opportunity to dozens of newer shelters and programs — like Rainbow House — to secure grant dollars that would not have otherwise been available to them. Rainbow House fairly earned every penny of that award, and we congratulate them.

Bartlett House, however, did not perform so well. It received the lowest rank under the new system, which meant that it would not receive its usual \$166,000, let alone the higher amount it had requested for 2024-25.

But, like the sun emerging after a storm, possibilities have surfaced for the shelter to regain its funding.

The WVCEH, which has provided that money to Bartlett House for the past 15 years, said if Bartlett can make some changes to meet certain criteria — the details of which have not been publicly shared — its backing can be restored. (This past week, Bartlett’s executive director was removed from her post. It is unclear if this was part of the criteria laid out by the WVCEH or for unrelated reasons.)

Right around the same time Bartlett announced it would have to close its emergency shelter, Sen. Michael Oliverio said, he was working behind the scenes with state lawmakers to rustle up the \$166,000 needed to keep the location at Hazel’s House going.

So there is hope that Bartlett’s shelter won’t have to close after all.

There is no reason that Bartlett House and Rainbow House cannot coexist. Monongalia County needs both a low-barrier emergency shelter for bitter cold nights and a place that is safe for unhoused LGBTQ+ individuals. (Rainbow House has made it clear that non-LGBTQ+ people can seek refuge in its facility, but they must be tolerant and respectful of the LGBTQ+ community.)

We truly hope that Bartlett receives the funding it needs, whether that be by making the changes required by the WVCEH to restore its grant dollars, or through state support negotiated in Charleston. Everyone deserves to have a safe, warm place to rest and Bartlett House helps make that a reality.

CONSTITUTION

The U.S. is at its best when it learns from its mistakes

**LEARNING FROM YOUR MISTAKES ISN’T JUST SOMETHING THAT APPLIES TO YOUR PERSONAL LIFE — IT’S A CORE LESSON OF POLITICAL SCIENCE.** Ten years before the Framers of our Constitution gathered in Philadelphia to draft a new governing document, they adopted the Articles of Confederation. Our Founding Fathers were so assured of its success that they intended it to last in perpetuity. Forever, in this case, was a decade.

The Framers realized their best effort to design a workable government clashed with the necessities of a changing nation. Here’s a short list of choices they quickly came to regret.

First, Congress operated like the United Nations — representatives were paid and selected by states; unsurprisingly, this led to representatives having little to no interest in supporting any legislation that negatively affected their respective states. Second, they vested all power in a single branch of government; their concern about a single executive (think King George) having too much power led them to avoid creating an executive branch and to instead place all power in the legislative branch. Third, even if the people realized a need to amend the Articles they could only do so upon all states agreeing to the change; as you may imagine, reaching consensus among 13 states is nearly impossible.

Fortunately for us, the Articles did not last for eternity. The Framers relatively quickly learned from their mistakes. They rallied to vastly improve upon their first go at creating a country. The second time around they incentivized our representatives to think nationally as well as locally; they created three branches of government and reduced their odds of concentrating power by developing a series of checks

and balances; and, they lowered the threshold to amend the Constitution.

That rapid pace of learning, though, has not carried into the 21st century. Consider that we’re currently in the third longest drought between constitutional amendments. Sixty-one years passed between the ratification of the 12th and 13th amendments; after the 15th Amendment, it took another 43 years before the ratification of the 16th; and it has been more than decades since we ratified the 27th Amendment in 1992. In the interim, nations around the world have taken meaningful steps to improve their democracies — their reforms, minimally, deserve close scrutiny from all those who want American democracy to remain as representative, deliberative and responsive as possible.

Thankfully, a group of scholars from across the political spectrum has already done a lot of our democratic homework for us. Convened by the National Constitution Center in 2022, this group closely studied ways America can improve our democracy by learning not only from our past but also from the democratic endeavors of other countries. Despite their ideological differences, these constitutional experts reached consensus on five potential amendments to the Constitution:

First, eliminating the natural-born citizen requirement for an individual to serve as president. In an age of globalization, why not allow the most qualified can-

didates to run for any office — regardless of whether they were born here or choose America to be their home?

Second, making it a bit easier to amendment the Constitution. At a time of novel and significant problems arising, it makes sense to increase the odds of responsive and responsible adjustments to the Constitution, right?

Third, providing Congress with the chance to veto agency rules prior to their enactment. Such a “legislative veto” was a popular means for Congress to check the administrative state prior to the Supreme Court declaring the practice unconstitutional.

Fourth, clarifying when and how officials may be impeached — a constitutional law question that has puzzled scholars for decades, if not centuries.

And, fifth, imposing an 18-year term limit on Supreme Court justices. Given the increasing importance of Supreme Court decisions on social, political and economic affairs, this change may help restore faith in this essential institution.

You may agree with all of these or none of these amendments — that’s fine. These suggestions — reached by an ideologically diverse set of really smart people — are not intended to open and close the conversation on how to make sure our Constitution has the checks and balances required by the 21st century. Let’s instead use this list of five to revive our willingness to closely study the health of our democracy, our Constitution and our political community. Though the Constitution itself is surely one of the greatest gifts left by its Framers, even more valuable is the gift of their example of democratic experimentation.

A world without suicide starts with our youths

**IF YOU THOUGHT YOU COULD SAVE YOUR TEENAGER OR YOUNG ADULT LOVED ONE FROM TAKING THEIR OWN LIFE, WOULDN’T YOU DO JUST ABOUT ANYTHING?** If we make it easier for the younger generation to share their feelings and feel validated, would the mental health crisis be a crisis at all?

Suicide is the fourth leading cause of death in adolescents aged 15-19, which is a staggering statistic. Youth and young adults are at a pivotal moment in their lives where they are developing their own identities and their own emotional behaviors. They are under extreme stress to be like their peers and keep the adults in their lives happy. Surrounding these individuals with a supportive, loving and protective environment is paramount.

June 16, 2022, was a day that forever impacted my family and made the fight to prevent suicide our family’s purpose.

A 17-year-old Matthew had been struggling with anxiety and depression for four years leading up to his death. He also had other ailments, such as Type I diabetes since the age of 7 and celiac disease since his early preteen years. Mattie was in and out of therapy and had taken different medications throughout his short life, but the battle became too much, and he lost his fight on that warm Thursday afternoon.

What if there were early screening tools for school systems or safe places within schools for the youth of this country to express their feelings and seek help? Just like the pain tools we use as health care providers to assess pain within our patients, what if there was a scalable tool to assess a person’s mental health status and their risk of making a life-changing choice?

Furthermore, what if schools had their own therapist or a mental health advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) who was a safe haven for students to talk to if they felt they don’t have anyone else? As a society, if we can start prevention early, then it may stop these mental health struggles from spilling over into adulthood.

Factors leading to mental health include: the stigma around talking about anxiety and depression and/or taking mental health medications, limited access to mental health services and lack of support at home or school. Younger individuals feel they can’t speak of their struggles with mental health for fear of being different or being made fun of by their peers. They need to understand that this will pass and that there can be better and brighter days in their future.

A major component to early identification and prevention is access to mental health services — of which there is a shortage in our society.

On Sept. 29, 2020, the Mental Health Services for Students Act of 2020 was passed by the House of Representatives. This act provides for comprehensive school-based mental health services through grants and other funding, if eli-

Thanking lawmakers for protecting libraries

I am writing to express my appreciation to Delegates Anitra Hamilton, Evan Hansen, John Williams and Joe Statler for their opposition to HB 4654: Removing bona fide schools, public libraries, and museums from the list of exemptions from criminal liability relating to distribution and display to minor of obscene matter. Delegate Statler was the only Republican to join Democrats Hamilton, Hansen, Williams and eight others in the House of Delegates in opposition. Fortunately the bill was never taken up in the Senate Judiciary Committee, and efforts to add it to another bill at the last minute failed.

If passed, it would have subjected these institutions to §61-8A-2 of the West Virginia Code:

“Distribution and display to minor of obscene matter; penalties; defenses,” which says that “Any adult, with knowledge of the character of the matter, who knowingly and intentionally distributes, offers to distribute, or displays to a minor any obscene matter, is guilty of a felony and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than \$25,000, or confined in a state correctional facility for not more than five years, or both.” §61-8A-1 attempts to define obscene matter with references to “contemporary adult community standards.” That sounds vague to me.

While I am part of the West Virginia Coalition for Truth in History (WVCTH) and a member of the West Virginia Association of Museums (WVAM), I am writing for myself, as a historian who has relied on librarians and worked with museum professionals around the state and country throughout my career. This bill would have had a chilling effect on their work, and I was glad to see the WVCTH, WVAM and West Virginia Library Association lobbying against it.

We all benefit from the resources they provide through books, exhibits, public programs, etc., and should trust them to work according to the standards of their professions.

Childcare advocates unite amid legislative failure

**THE WEST VIRGINIA LEGISLATURE’S RECENT FAILURE TO PASS ANY CHILD-CARE BILLS**, including the crucial House Bill 4797 aimed at reforming reimbursement for childcare providers, has dealt a significant blow to families statewide. The bill, focusing on enrollment-based reimbursement rather than daily attendance, was pivotal for ensuring stability and financial security for childcare facilities, which directly impacts workforce participation.

Access to affordable and reliable childcare is essential for parents’ ability to engage in the workforce. Currently, 42.6% of children in West Virginia who need child-

care cannot access it, forcing many parents, particularly mothers, to choose between their careers and childcare responsibilities. This dilemma hampers economic growth and perpetuates workforce disparities.

The economic ramifications of failing to address childcare issues extend beyond individual families, impacting the state’s overall prosperity. A well-supported childcare system facilitates increased workforce participation, driving productivity and economic growth. By neglecting childcare legislation, the Legislature impedes economic development and perpetuates systemic barriers to prosperity.

In response to the Legislature’s inaction, childcare advocates, including providers, families, businesses and organizations, are mobilizing like never before. Initiatives such as the “Day Without Childcare” on May 13 aim to underscore childcare’s essential role in supporting working families and the economy. Additional efforts, such as town halls and candidate forums, are being considered to highlight the critical need for legislative action.

Despite the associated costs, investing in high-quality early childhood education yields significant returns, as evidenced by research showing a 13% return

on investment. This holistic approach addresses various life outcomes and aligns with the Legislature’s purported goals for the state.

Gov. Jim Justice has expressed willingness to call a special session to address childcare legislation but has focused on tax credits rather than stabilization measures like enrollment-based reimbursements. Advocates emphasize the urgent need for such measures to prevent childcare providers from closing and to ensure the industry’s stability.

It is imperative that lawmakers prioritize the needs of working families and take meaningful action to reform and improve the

childcare system. Investing in childcare is not only a matter of social welfare but also an investment in the economic vitality and future success of West Virginia. During special session, advocates urge Gov. Justice and legislators to focus on enrollment-based reimbursements to stabilize the childcare industry and support working families across the state.

Aging comes with stigma. Let’s admire the defiant

WHO DO YOU WANT TO BE WHEN YOU GROW OLD?

Increasingly, senior citizens decide to keep working, including the two front-runners for the 2024 presidential election. Because many Americans consider the candidates too old for the job, age has become part of the national conversation.

Both Joe Biden, 81, and Donald Trump, 77, would be the oldest presidents at the end of their terms. Each has addressed his age quite differently this month.

In a new presidential campaign ad, Biden states, “Look, I’m not a young guy. That’s no secret. But here’s the deal. I understand how to get things done for the American people.”

In his Super Tuesday speech, Trump nodded to young people in the Palm Beach, Fla., audience who had “big futures” ahead. “I’d love to be your age,” he said. “I’d pay you a lot of money to be your age.”

Other octogenarians have long been leaders in Congress. Mitch McConnell, 82, will step down as Senate GOP leader in November; former House Speaker Nancy Pelosi, 83, plans to seek reelection.

Bernie Sanders, 82, is serving his third term in the Senate after 16 years in the House; Iowa’s Chuck Grassley, 90, is the oldest

sitting senator; and Illinois’ long-serving Sen. Dick Durbin turns 80 in November.

Beyond Washington, senior citizen role models keep distinguished vocations. Warren Buffett, 93, is considered one of the greatest investors ever. He continues to serve as chairman and CEO of Berkshire Hathaway.

Martha Stewart, who heads a media conglomerate, improbably became the oldest model to pose on the cover of Sports Illustrated. Stewart, 82, said, “I want other women to feel like they could also be on the cover of Sports Illustrated.”

Not an objective you’d seek? What about accomplishing a goal you failed earlier? Consider Diana Nyad, the subject of the Netflix film “Nyad.” At age 64, she became the first person to swim from Cuba to Florida, accomplishing the feat she first attempted at age 28.

Or do you want to take your art and point of view to a different generation? Activist-artist Faith Ringgold, 93, whose retrospective just ended at Chicago’s Museum of Contemporary Art, wrote more than 15 illustrated children’s books, including the bestselling “Tar Beach,” which was published in 1991 when she was 61. It won more than 30 awards, including the Caldecott Honor.

In the entertainment industry, examples abound of long careers.

At the Oscars, Rita Moreno, 92, wowed on the red carpet and nailed her address to best-supporting-actress nominee America Ferrera. Moreno’s 2023 film, “80 for Brady,” also starred two legends in their 80s, Jane Fonda, 86, and Lily Tomlin, 84.

At the Feb. 4 Grammy Awards, Joni Mitchell’s rendition of “Both Sides Now,” was greeted with tears and rapturous applause. Her performance of the song is markedly different at 80 than when she first recorded it in 1969 in her mid-20s. Back then, she sang it as if she frolicked in grassy fields; now, her voice scorches the earth.

Across the country, the Rolling Stones’ upcoming stadium tour this summer is selling out — they come to Chicago in June. Both Mick Jagger and Keith Richards, 80, still have the moves.

For those who do retire, many find it’s not enough to play pickleball, travel and spend time with the grandchildren. Because eventually, the sands of time feel like hail drops, and at some point, we’re all awaiting the final diagnosis. If you believe the final act is the last chance to leave a legacy, look to former President Jimmy Carter for a master class in aging with

purpose, dignity and humility.

Indeed, his post-presidential life was more successful than his presidency. After facing international challenges such as the Iran hostage crisis and domestic difficulties including inflation, he and Rosalynn left Washington in 1981 to return to their home in Plains, Ga.

Instead of accepting lucrative speaking gigs to enrich himself, he quietly championed the causes he cared about.

He won the Nobel Peace Prize in 2002, built homes with Habitat for Humanity and established the Carter Center to advance human rights. He wrote at least 30 books and taught Sunday school until 2020.

Now 99, he is in hospice, having ended medical intervention for cancer.

“I have one life and one chance to make it count for something. ... My faith requires that I do whatever I can, wherever I am, whenever I can, for as long as I can with whatever I have to try to make a difference,” Carter said. And that is exactly how he lived his life.

Faith, service, making a difference. A mantra to grow old by.

## Gardening blossomed during the pandemic: Garden centers hope people stay interested

**NEW YORK** — Garden centers enjoyed a pandemic boom, particularly with millennials, as people looked for outdoor activities during lockdowns. Now the question is will those wannabe green thumbs stick with the habit.

In 2022, 80% of U.S. households took part in lawn and gardening activities, a five-year high, according to the National Gardening Association's 2023 National Gardening Survey. Spending on lawn and gardening activities rose to an average of \$616 per household in 2022, an increase of \$74 from 2021.

Danny Summers, managing director of The Garden Center Group, which tracks sales of about 125 centers across the country, said sales are up by about 25% compared with 2019. But the sales totals flattened out between 2022 and 2023.

The spring season is crucial, because garden centers can make about 60% of sales during the 12 weeks of spring, according to Summers. That's particularly true for centers in the North since there are fewer months to plant.

To regain the sales momentum, garden centers must navigate a number of challenges as another spring season kicks in. Chief among them are volatile weather and higher costs for labor and plant materials, which in turn has forced the companies to raise prices for customers.

One positive development: Younger households, particularly the 18- to 34-year-old age group and 35- to 44-year old age group, have seen larger increases in spending than older households, a trend that Summers thinks has legs.

"Our garden centers are just serving a new need that we don't see going away anytime soon, because this new audience is very much grounded in nature and

plants and gardening," he said.

At Flowercraft Garden Center — a San Francisco garden center that is in its 50th year of operation — houseplants, vegetable starter plants and citrus trees are selling well, said general manager Lydia Patubo.

Since the spring season is so short, garden centers are at the mercy of the weather. Patubo said last year's unprecedented storms in the area put a dent in business. San Francisco saw record rainfall of nearly 34 inches during the 2023 "water year," which ended in September. That was good for an area suffering from a yearslong drought, but bad for garden center business.

"It was a rough year," Patubo said. "So, I'm hoping (this year)

for less rain, better business," she said.

As spring kicks into gear, Patubo said smaller items — such as four-inch plants or six plants in a pack — are selling better than 1-gallon to 15-gallon plants because customers are spending less due to higher prices and inflation.

"The smaller stuff sells remarkably well, it's the bigger stuff that I need to move a little faster," she said. That affects her ordering from dozens of growers in California. "So, my ordering is way down, but the ordering for smaller products is way up."

At the East Coast Garden Center in Millsboro, Del., co-owner Chris Cordrey said weather is also a concern, particularly because so much of the center's

business is compressed into a four-month period between March and June.

"We got a lot of rain last year, so that made it difficult," he said. "If you miss a Saturday during the busy time when it's raining or cold out, then that really hurts your sales overall."

While the National Oceanic and Atmosphere Administration said 2023 was overall the third-driest year on record, parts of the country saw above average rainfall. Meanwhile, there were a record 28 separate weather and climate disasters in 2023 that caused an estimated \$1 billion in damages, such as heat waves, drought, wildfires and floods, sur-

passing the record 22 the U.S. had in 2020. All of those can affect plants.

Higher costs are another issue.

"What we're used to paying labor has increased tremendously," Cordray said. He hasn't hired fewer workers, with a staff of 200, but he created a new recruitment position and added recruitment software to help retain staff.

"And our garden sup-

plies across the board have increased drastically. ... So we're definitely seeing a lot of increasing in our costs," he said.

To offset higher costs, he had to raise prices; for example, a flower in a 1-gallon pot, a standard size, had sold between \$5 and \$5.50 but he had to raise that to between \$6 and \$6.50.

So far, customers are taking the price increases in stride. Container gardening — putting plants in containers in areas where ground space is limited —

newer "dwarf" size plants and fruit trees and bushes like blueberries and raspberries are popular.

"People are enjoying growing their own food and then harvesting their food," he said. Even though his sales have plateaued since the pandemic, he feels the 34-year-old garden center is in a good spot.

At Ooltewah Nursery and Landscape Co. in Chattanooga, Tenn., which has been in business for 35 years, sales boomed during the pandemic and haven't slowed down since.

Vegetable and fruit plants are big sellers, including tomatoes and eggplants, said general manager Kat McGraw. Because of the garden center's location — two hours from both Atlanta and Nashville — a lot of retirees have relocated there, and they have time to spend on their gardens.

Still, weather has been a challenge there, too, including last year's drought and deep freeze, not normal for the area. A lot of plants were damaged.

Like elsewhere, costs have risen across the board, including costs for delivery and trucking, potting soil and even the wind chimes found in the gift shop.

"Everything has increased over the last two years," McGraw said. "I don't know of anything that hasn't."

Solar eclipse: How to prevent eye damage when viewing

**Q: I am excited to see our next solar eclipse on April 8, but I hear you can permanently damage your eyesight if not careful. What is the safest way?**

A: This will be a great opportunity for us here in West Virginia, as the path of total eclipse coverage will pass just north of us in Pennsylvania. You are right, in that if you look at the sun directly anytime or even while it is partially covered, you can permanently damage your vision. So while we are close to the total eclipse here, we are *not* in the path of complete coverage of the sun by the moon. This means our eclipse here is only partial, and even looking directly at a



small sliver of the sun can damage your retina. Technically, if you are geographically where the entire sun is blocked 100% by the moon, during those moments you could safely look directly at the darkened sun. But, there are a couple good and safe ways to see an eclipse right here in West Virginia. The best way is to buy “eclipse glasses.” Online, these cardboard “throw

away” glasses are made with incredibly dark plastic “lenses.” To be sure, there is a government standard for eclipse lenses — ISO #12312-2. You should find that safety assurance on any pair you would buy. They are not expensive, about \$2 a pair online. They are so dark that they block out almost 100% of ultraviolet radiation and 97% of infrared radiation, the part of our

sunlight that burns our skin and eyes. Solar retinopathy is the name of the permanent damage when sunlight burns and destroys that critical central retina. You do not want that. Plan B is to make an “eclipse viewer.” This idea can be accomplished a number of ways. Simply punch a pinhole through an index card and the image of the sun will be

projected through that pinhole onto another surface — another card or sheet of paper, for instance. Do not look through the pinhole toward the sun! Even using your hands with interlocked fingers, with your back to the sun, will project images of the eclipse onto the ground. You could also use a telescope or binoculars to focus the image onto a second surface, but again, do

not look through the scope toward the sun. People often ask if their very dark sunglasses are safe to use. They are not! In fact, if you inadvertently look at the sun, you may not realize the vision damage for a few hours or days. If you think you have any symptoms like loss of your central vision, distorted vision or altered color vision, see your eye doctor right away. So, enjoy this rare occurrence but please be very, very careful. Be especially diligent to keep children from looking at the sun, on April 8 or any day. **DR. Understanding the difference in types of brain aneurysms

Each year, nearly half a million people worldwide die from brain aneurysms. In the U.S., an estimated 6.7 million people have an unruptured brain aneurysm, which means about 1 in 50 people might have one.

A brain aneurysm, also called a cerebral aneurysm, is a bulge or ballooning in a blood vessel in the brain. Dr. Chris Fox, a Mayo Clinic neurosurgeon, says there are two broad categories of aneurysms: ruptured aneurysms, which are neurosurgical emergencies,

and unruptured aneurysms, where there is time to establish a treatment plan that may involve multiple options. “For unruptured aneurysms, we have the ability to plan and make a decision on the best treatment upfront in a none-emergent situation,” said

Dr. Fox. But when a brain aneurysm ruptures, prompt medical attention is required. “Typically, when we see a patient with a ruptured aneurysm, we treat it as quickly as possible. That’s usually within a matter of hours because there’s a

risk that the aneurysm can rerupture,” he says. **Symptoms** Symptoms of a ruptured aneurysm can include severe head pain, nausea, vomiting, confusion and loss of consciousness. “The classic presentation for a ruptured

aneurysm is a patient has the worst headache of their life,” Dr. Fox says. Brain aneurysms are more common in women, and there may be a genetic component because aneurysms can run in families. “But smoking and hypertension are two of the biggest risk factors for causing an aneurysm or having an aneurysm form,” said Dr. Fox.

## Ask Angi: What should a new homeowner do?

There's no excitement quite like the adventure of your first home purchase. Signing on the dotted lines brings a whole new spectrum of challenges, but it also gives you a great chance to put your stamp on the new place. Here are eight great steps to make your home your own, whether you're buying for the first time or the 10th.

First, you want to familiarize yourself with your house. The home inspector who checks out your home during the buying process can be a big help here, by pointing out crucial components. You always want to know where the main water and gas valves are located, so you can shut either down in the event of an emergency. Learn the location of your air filter and change it in accordance with your manufacturer's instructions. Leaving your filter in place all year is like driving your car without an oil change. Sooner or later, you'll regret it.

Next up, consider performing an energy audit. This service costs \$425 on average, but more than pays for itself in the long run with increased efficiency and lower energy bills. An energy audit will identify areas of energy loss, poor insulation and opportunities to reduce water, gas and electrical usage.

Go over your homeowner's insurance with an insurance agent. A lot of things can change when you switch homes. The more information you can give

your agent, the better coverage they can give you. And the more you learn from your agent, the more you'll understand the protection that insurance offers. Don't skimp on the planning portion now. You'll thank yourself later if you need to rely on that coverage.

Fourthly, create a yearlong plan for all the regular professional maintenance in your home. For instance, chimneys need to be swept once per year; HVAC should be inspected every fall and winter, and pest control pros should come in during the correct season for whatever pests you have. Roofers and plumbers should take a look at your system every so often as well.

Create a wish list for all your upgrades, but hold off on the big

projects for now. You've just moved into the home, so give yourself time to get a feel for it, figure out what works for you and what doesn't, and then prioritize your projects and start saving money for the work. Don't forget to think about the potential return on investment when selecting your improvements.

Next, make a note of the age of all the major appliances in your home. Most appliance warranties don't transfer to new homeowners, so you'll be on your own if anything breaks down. Different appliances have varying lifespans. For instance, your average dishwasher, microwave and refrigerator last around nine years. Plan ahead for potential breakdowns and keep a budget set aside for

them.

Seventh, create a homeowner's binder to store all your important documents. Mortgage and insurance paperwork, appliance warranties and receipts for home improvement expenses all need to go in there. Keep a tally of your home improvements for potential tax benefits and resale purposes.

Finally, create an emergency house fund to prepare for unexpected repair costs. Costly issues could develop at any time, and having a plan and a budget for them will reduce the stress of worrying about the unknown. And when household disaster does strike, you'll be ready.

# ‘Stiegel-type’ glass could be made by any glass manufacturer

**GLASS CAN BE NOTORIOUSLY DIFFICULT TO IDENTIFY.** Signatures, if there are any, can be faked, molds can be reused, and glassmakers often imitated one another's decorations. Stiegel-type glass is an excellent example.

We know that Henry William Stiegel came to Philadelphia from Germany in 1750. We know he had a glasshouse in Manheim, Pennsylvania, from 1763 to 1774. Confirming that a piece of glass came from his glasshouse is nearly impossible. To begin with, the glass he made was similar to what was made in Germany at the time: thin-walled, mold-blown glass decorated with enamel or engraving. The same type of glass was made by other American glassmakers and imported from Europe.

In the 20th century, copies were made as giftware. To further complicate matters, some collectors doubt that Stiegel actually made any multicolored enamel glass, like this cologne bottle that sold at the Conestoga Auction Company Division of Hess Auction Group for \$312. The auction described it as "Stiegel-type" instead of attributing it to Stiegel or any other glassmaker.

**Q: I have a very old microscope that is beautiful, and it still works. It has been in my family for at least 100 years. I would like to sell it and I am not sure how to proceed. It has a French inscription reading "C. Verick, eleve special de E. Hartnack, rue de la Pax cheminerie 2 Paris."**

A: Your microscope was made by Constant Verick, who lived from 1829 to 1892. He worked for Edmund Hartnack before starting his own business in 1866. Both Verick and Hartnack were highly regarded microscope makers in the 1860s and '70s. Antique microscopes with a known maker can sell for about \$250 to \$500 at general antiques auctions. Usually, the more information

(maker, date, etc.), the higher the value. The original box, slides and other "extras" also increase the value. If there are any antique shops or auction houses in your area, check to see if they sell microscopes or related antiques like binoculars, scientific instruments or medical equipment. You can search online or check ads in antiques publications for collectors or clubs specializing in antique microscopes or scientific or optical tools. You can also check medical supply companies; some of them also deal in antique equipment.

**Q: What is the value of a Lionel train set with accessories from the 1930s?**

A: The Lionel Manufacturing Company started in New York in 1900 and quickly earned its place as one of the best-known makers of model trains. They introduced the Standard Gauge train, which has 2 1/8 inches between the rails, in 1907. They were made until the 1930s. "O" gauge train sets, measuring 1 1/4 inches between the rails, were made by the 1930s. The 1930s Lionel train sets, usually called "pre-war" by collectors, often sell for about \$100-\$500 at auctions. Large sets in excellent condition with original boxes can sell for over \$1,000. Individual accessories can sell for about \$10 to over \$100. Condition is usually the most important factor. Trains with chipped paint and signs of wear will sell for lower prices, even if they are in working condition. There are many publications and price guides that specialize in collecting toy trains. "Lionel Trains Pocket Price Guide, 1901-2024" (Kalmbach Media) is

a handy reference. You should be able to find it at your local library. The Train Collectors Association is another great resource. Check it out online at [www.tca-trains.org](http://www.tca-trains.org).

**TIP:** Shallow nicks and rough edges on glass can sometimes be smoothed off with fine emery paper.

# Compass agrees to pay \$57.5 million, make policy changes to settle real estate commission lawsuits

Real estate brokerage company Compass Inc. will pay \$57.5 million as part of a proposed settlement to resolve lawsuits over real estate commissions, the company said in a regulatory filing Friday.

The New York-based company also agreed to change its business practices to ensure clients can more easily understand how brokers and agents are compensated for their services, according to the filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Among the policy changes Compass agreed to make, the company will require that its brokerages and their agents clearly disclose to clients that commissions are negotiable and not set by law, and that the services of agents who represent homebuyers are not free. It also agreed to require that its agents who represent homebuyers disclose right away any offer of compensation by the broker representing a seller.

The terms of the settlement must be approved by the court.

Compass follows several big real estate brokerages and the National Association of Realtors in agreeing to settle federal lawsuits brought on behalf of home sellers across the U.S.

Keller Williams and Anywhere Real Estate, which owns brokerage brands such as Century 21 and Coldwell Banker, have reached separate settlement agreements that also include provisions for more transparency about agent commissions for homebuyers and sellers.

The central claim put forth in the lawsuits is that the country's biggest real estate brokerages have been engaging in business practices that unfairly force homeowners to pay artificially inflated agent commissions when they sell their home.

The plaintiffs argued that home sellers listing a property for sale on real estate industry databases were required to include a compensation offer for an agent representing a buyer. And that not including such "cooperative compensation" offers might lead a buyer's agent to steer their client away from any seller's listing that didn't include such an offer.

Last week, the NAR agreed to pay \$418 million and make policy changes in order to resolve multiple lawsuits, including one where in late October a jury in Missouri found the trade group and several real estate brokerages conspired to require that home sellers pay homebuyers'

agent commissions. The jury in that case ordered the defendants to pay almost \$1.8 billion in damages — and potentially more than \$5 billion if the court ended up awarding the plaintiffs treble damages.

NAR also agreed to several policy changes, including prohibiting brokers who list a home for sale on any of the databases affiliated with the NAR from including offers of compensation for a buyer's agent.

The rule changes, which are set to go into effect in mid-July, represent a major change to the way real estate agents have operated going back to the 1990s. While many housing market watchers say it's too soon to tell how the policy changes will affect home sales, they could lead to home sellers paying lower commissions for their agent's services. Buyers, in turn, may have to shoulder more upfront costs when they hire an agent.

# February home sales hit strongest pace in a year as mortgage rates ease and more houses hit market

LOS ANGELES — Sales of previously occupied U.S. homes rose in February from the previous month to the strongest pace in a year with homebuyers encouraged by a modest pullback in mortgage rates and more properties on the market.

Existing home sales climbed 9.5% last month from January to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.38 million, the National Association of Realtors said Thursday. That's the strongest sales pace since

February last year and topped the 3.93 million sales pace economists were expecting, according to FactSet.

Sales rose on a monthly basis in February for the second month in a row, but fell 3.3% from a year earlier.

The pickup in sales helped push up home prices compared with a year earlier for the eighth month in a row. The national median sales price climbed 5.7% from a year earlier to \$384,500. That's the highest median sales price for February on records going back to 1999.

Average long-term U.S. mortgage rate hits almost 7% after two-week slide

LOS ANGELES — The average long-term U.S. mortgage rate climbed back to nearly 7% this week, pushing up borrowing costs for home shoppers with the spring homebuying season underway.

The average rate on a 30-year mortgage rose to 6.87% from 6.74% last week, mortgage buyer Freddie Mac said Thursday. A year ago, the rate averaged 6.42%. The average rate is now just below where it was two weeks ago.

Borrowing costs on 15-year fixed-rate mortgages, popular with homeowners refinancing their home loans, also rose this week, pushing the average rate to 6.21% from 6.16% last week. A year ago it averaged

5.68%, Freddie Mac said.

When mortgage rates rise, they can add hundreds of dollars a month in costs for borrowers, limiting how much they can afford in a market already out of reach for many Americans.

"After decreasing for a couple of weeks, mortgage rates are once again on the upswing," said Sam Khater, Freddie Mac's chief economist.

Investors' expectations for future inflation, global demand for U.S. Treasuries and what the Federal Reserve does with its short-term interest rate can influence rates on home loans.

After climbing to a 23-year high of 7.79% in October, the average rate on a 30-year mortgage has remained below 7% since

early December. Rates eased amid expectations that inflation was cooling enough for the Fed to begin lowering its short-term interest rate by this spring. But a spate of stronger-than-expected reports on inflation, the job market and the economy in recent weeks dimmed that outlook, sending mortgage rates higher through most of February.

Many economists expect that mortgage rates will ultimately ease moderately this year, but that's not likely to happen before the Federal Reserve begins cutting its benchmark interest rate. On Wednesday, the central bank kept its rate unchanged and signaled again that it expects to make three rate cuts this

year, but not before it sees more evidence that inflation is slowing.

"The Fed's announcement that it is holding interest rates steady for now was not unexpected, but it does mean that mortgage rates are going to remain higher for longer," said Lisa Sturtevant, chief economist at Bright MLS.

The U.S. housing market is coming off a deep, 2-year sales slump triggered by a sharp rise in mortgage rates and a dearth of homes on the market. The overall decline in rates since their peak last fall has helped lower monthly mortgage payments, providing more financial breathing room for homebuyers facing rising prices and a shortage of homes for sale this year.

Sales of previously occupied U.S. homes rose in February from the previous month to the strongest pace in a year. That followed a month-to-month home sales increase in January.

Still, the average rate on a 30-year mortgage remains

well above where it was just two years ago at 4.42%. That large gap between rates now and then has helped limit the number of previously occupied homes on the market by discouraging homeowners who locked in rock-bottom rates from selling.

# New downtown Oakland tower offers "full stack" of live, work and play

OAKLAND, Calif. — A new tower in downtown Oakland is offering what its developer calls a "full stack" of lifestyle amenities and choices in a new approach to the realities of the post-coronavirus era.

The 39-story mixed-use tower that has sprouted atop the 19th Street BART Station was built with the concept that the highrise could offer its residents an array of live, work, play and go options, according to the project's developer and principal owner, Behring Cos.

1900 Broadway features 452 luxury apartments on Broadway between 19th Street and Thomas L. Berkley Way.

Yet this highrise, located in Oakland's hip and lively Uptown district, goes well beyond a conventional residential tower, in the view of Colin Behring, president of Behring Cos.

"1900 Broadway's fully integrated 'Live-Work-Play-Go' model provides a 'full-stack' lifestyle experience that combines tech-enhanced luxury apartments, headquarters-quality flex-office and cowork-

ing space," Behring Cos. states in comments about the project.

The tower's prime office spaces are located on two floors and are flexible enough to appeal to both larger companies and smaller entrepreneurs.

"1900 Broadway is the flagship for Behring Cos.' StakSite concept, where the integration of luxury apartments, office, amenities and transportation come together," Behring said. Colin Behring is the grandson of Kenneth Behring, the legendary developer behind the Blackhawk res-

idential enclave, Blackhawk Plaza and Blackhawk Museum in Danville.

In 2020, an affiliate led by Behring Cos. paid \$27.5 million for the development site, landing a \$175 million loan at the time of the property purchase.

The tower has become an eye-catching addition to the Oakland skyline while it was under construction and now is slated to sign up its first residents.

The 1900 Broadway tower will also offer 53,700 square feet of office space in the building.

The workplaces make it

possible for residents to experience a "zero-commute lifestyle that caters to the needs of all employees, whether hybrid, remote or full-time in-office," the company stated.

The developers also listed several amenities that could make the building quite different from other more conventional residential towers.

Among the amenities: — a 6,700-square-foot fitness center.

— a fourth-floor lounge overlooking the historic Fox Theater. The space offers a social lounge, bil-


liards and table games, a poker and card room, media lounge and a taproom.

— a fourth-floor deck with a cocktail pool flanked by day beds and chaise lounges, barbecue areas and firepits.

— outdoor coworking spaces.

— a 3,000-square-foot sporting turf lawn and a dog park.

— a 39th-floor penthouse lounge with panoramic views, gathering spaces, cocktail bar, 16-seat boardroom, kitchen, media wall, an outdoor lanai and terrace seating.

## Just like magic

Original fantasy-adventure series 'Renegade Nell' premieres

One exceptional young woman drives polite society mad on her journey to fulfill an unexpected destiny in "Renegade Nell," an original historical adventure series premiering Friday, March 29, on Disney+. All eight episodes of the family-friendly fantasy series drop on the streamer on premiere day.

Nell Jackson, portrayed by "Derry Girls" star Louisa Harland, is a clever, brave woman who makes a name for herself as a highwaywoman in 18th-century England after she is framed for murder. Petty theft on the road keeps Nell afloat until she discovers she is destined for something beyond her wildest imagination. When powers enchant Nell, they make her even more of a force than she was on her own.

A magical spirit appears to Nell in the form of Billy Blind (Nick Mohammed, "Ted Lasso") to help her on her adventures — a sort of Tinker Bell-type fairy sidekick. Nell's abilities to evade capture and survive on her own get her into as much trouble as they keep her out of. With seemingly everyone after her for one reason or another, Nell thrives as an outlaw possessed by magical powers that make her stronger, faster and more capable than she ever was before.

Also starring in "Renegade Nell" are Frank Dillane ("Fear the Walking Dead") as Nell's difficult, fair-weather

friend, Charles Devereux; Adrian Lester ("The Undeclared War") as the well-connected Earl of Poynton; Alice Kremenberg ("The Sinner") as power-hungry Sofia Wilmot; and Joely Richardson ("The Sandman") as oddball newspaper magnate Lady Eularia Moggerhanger.

Rounding out the cast are Pip Torrens ("The Crown") as Lord Blancheford, Jake Dunn ("Big Boys") as Thomas Blancheford, Enyi Okoronkwo ("The Lazarus Project") as Rasselas and Craig Parkinson ("Line of Duty") as Nell's father, Sam. Newcomers Bo Bragason and Florence Keen star as Nell's younger sisters, Roxy and George.

Known for crafting satisfyingly complex adult dramas such as "Last Tango in Halifax" and "Gentleman Jack," "Renegade Nell" is a bit of a departure for series creator Sally Wainwright, who is also the BAFTA Award-winning series creator of small-town British crime drama "Happy Valley." In an appearance on "The Graham Norton Show" this February, Lester shared that the new series "is really good fun. It's very different for Sally Wainwright. She's put political intrigue, sprites, magic, lots of fighting, highway robbery and Regency England in a big pot, gave it a stir, and out came an amazing idea." In further praise, Lester said, "It is really good writing and I have a really good time being bad."

Sofia, a widow motivated by a need for power and independence, is the architect of a scheme to bring down Nell.

Aiding Sofia in her plot is the Earl, an influential political figure with the connections she needs to get the job done. Unfortunately for the pair of strategists, Nell more than lives up to the talk going around town.

In an official trailer for the series, excited gossips speak of Nell, saying, "she's unnatural," and "she is formidable," before Nell herself warns a foe, "you don't want to mess with me." Nell literally has the fighting spirit, as Sofia points out in the trailer, saying, "she fights as though she's possessed." Something comes over the titular renegade in these battles; whether it's a fire-fight or hand-to-hand combat, a dark glow reaches her eyes and Nell cannot be bested.

Nell is joined on her adventure by her two sisters, as well as Rasselas. Inspired by the chance to chase his own freedom, Rasselas leaves his life as a stable boy behind to help Nell, Roxy and George

on their journeys. The troupe, with Billy Blind in tow, earns quite a reputation all across the country while on the run. As Lady Eularia claims in the series trailer, "if you haven't heard of Nell Jackson, then you're the only person in England who hasn't."

While Wainwright having executive produced the series and wrote the first five episodes of the show, Emme Hoy ("Totally Completely Fine") and Georgia Christou ("On the Edge") share writing credits for the remaining three episodes.

Ben Taylor, director of hit British sitcoms such as "Sex Education," "Year of the Rabbit" and "Catastrophe," directed the first two episodes of the series.

Amanda Brotchie ("Gentleman Jack") and M.J. Delaney ("Frank of Ireland") each directed three episodes.

If you happen to be missing the sadly short-lived run of the spinoff series "Willow," based on the 1988 film of the same name, "Renegade Nell" is likely right up your street. Lost in last spring's streamer purge, the Warwick Davis-led adventure series was removed in its entirety from Disney+ after only a few months of availability, despite positive reactions from both viewers and critics.

Thankfully, "Renegade Nell" is here now to fill the "Willow"-shaped hole in fantasy lovers' hearts.

Don't miss the premiere of the brand-new original adventure series "Renegade Nell" when it premieres on Disney+ Friday, March 29. All eight episodes of the fantasy series will be available to stream on premiere day.

Sabres host Maple Leafs in final regular season matchup

The National Hockey League returns with more action in the East as the Toronto Maple Leafs head to Buffalo, New York, to take on the Buffalo Sabres in their final regular season matchup. The game airs Saturday, March 30, at the KeyBank Center, with the coverage broadcasting live on ESPN.

This season has been less than ideal for the Sabres, with the team sitting in the bottom half of the Eastern Conference standings going into April and their 13-year play-off drought potentially growing another year older. Additionally, expectations going into this season were much higher for the team, having just signed franchise all-star defenseman Rasmus Dahlin to a massive eight-year, \$88-million contract extension.

While the Sabres sit outside of a playoff spot, the Swedish blueliner continues to prove his worth, as Dahlin finished ninth in goals amongst all defensemen — including a 73-point campaign in 78 games last season — and ended up eighth in the James Norris Memorial Trophy race. He also recorded the best defensive season of his career so far, with 45 takeaways, 102 hits and 132 blocked shots.

The offensively talented Maple Leafs, meanwhile, could use some improvement on their own blue line. This season, the Maple Leafs are firing on all cylinders with Auston Matthews, William Nylander and Morgan Reilly leading the way offensively, with Matthews entering the month of March with 53 goals. However, while the Maple Leafs can score with ease, keeping the puck out of the net has been a struggle as they hold a 3.16 goals-against average, with injuries to Mark Giordano not helping the cause.

As both teams are seemingly on opposite sides of the standings, look for the Sabres to come out swinging as Dahlin will surely be looking to shut down Matthews and the Maple Leafs’ offensive prowess.

Bakers bend reality in new season of 'Is It Cake?'

Following rave reviews and nonstop attention online, the surreal hit baking competition "Is It Cake?" returns with a fresh batch of episodes, as its third season — affectionately dubbed "Is It Cak3?" — debuts Friday, March 29, on Netflix.

In a preview for the season, host Mikey Day ("Saturday Night Live") says: "Season 3 is stacked. There will be thrills, spills and mind-blowing cakes. ... And finally, I may get the answer to the most important question of our time: Is it cake?"

Viewers should prepare for "bigger cakes, higher stakes and even wilder bakes," according to Netflix, as "contestants attempt to fool a new lineup of guest judges with hyper-realistic cakes resembling everyday objects" while a massive prize of over \$100,000 hangs on the line.

The pressure is on for everyone — including Season 3 celebrity guests, such as Lauren Lapkus ("Good Girls"), Oscar Nunez ("The Office"), Danielle Pinnoch

("Ghosts"), Lana Condor ("To All the Boys I've Loved Before," 2018) and Chris Kattan ("A Night at the Roxbury," 1998), among others — as those who fail to trick the panel will face elimination from the game, losing their shot at winning this "dupe dessert" showdown.

From fictional monsters to real-life heroes to creatures of the sea, see what the bakers mimic next in all-new episodes of "Is It Cake?" available to stream Friday, March 29, on Netflix.

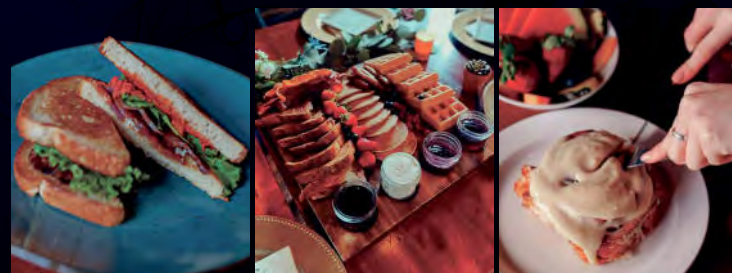

## "Madu" (2024)

Directed by Academy Award nominee Matt Ogens ("Home + Away," 2018) and Kachi Benson ("Daughters of Chibok," 2019), the feature-length documentary, "Madu," makes its streaming debut, Friday, March 29, on Disney+. 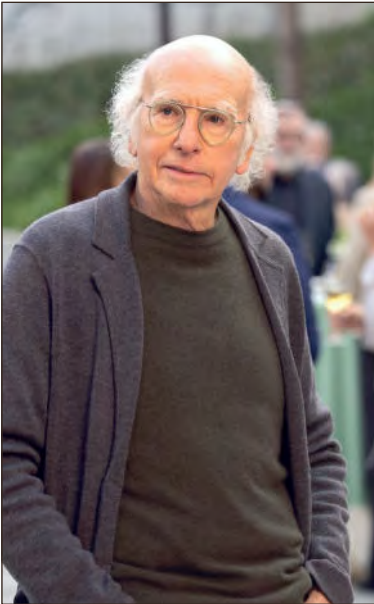

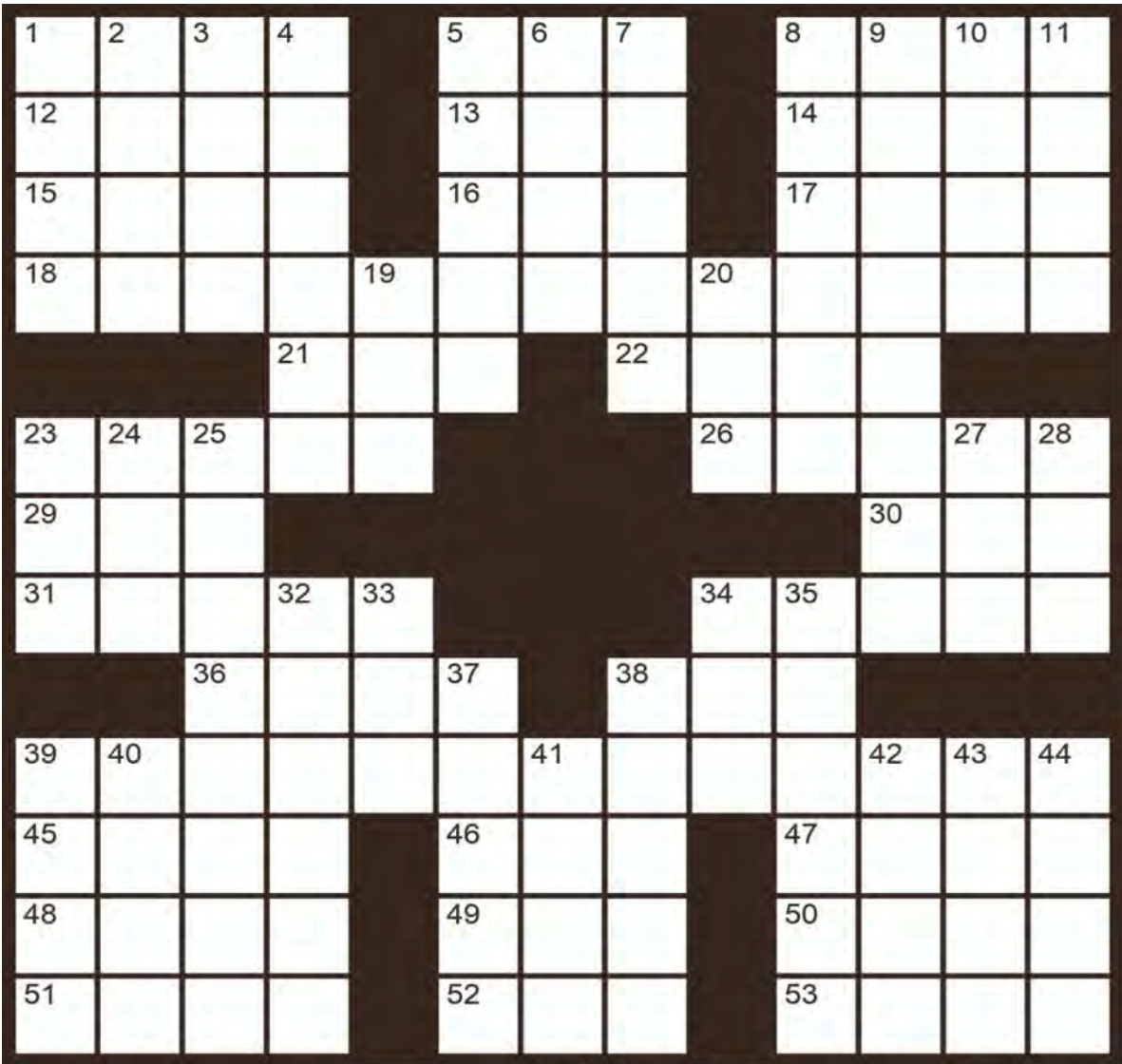

# Hollywood Q&A

**Q: What's going on with "The Winchesters"? Is it coming back?**

A: Unfortunately no. "The Winchesters" was canceled last year after just a single season on the air, and with it died the whole "Supernatural" universe — for now at least.

For those not fully up to date on this incredibly lore-heavy fictional universe, "The Winchesters" was a prequel series to The CW's long-running fantasy-action series "Supernatural." It told the story (or at least it started to) of John Winchester (Drake Rodger, "The In Between," 2022) and Mary Campbell (Meg Donnelly, "American Housewife," 2016), parents of the Winchester brothers, Sam (Jared Padalecki, "Gilmore Girls") and Dean (Jensen Ackles, "The Boys"), who were the central characters of "Supernatural."

When "Supernatural" came to an end in 2020, it broke the hearts of its famously devoted fans. That heartache was soothed by the debut of "The Winchesters" in 2022, but now hearts are breaking all over again.

And the news only gets worse. When "The Winchesters" was in the planning stages, it was discussed as just one of a number of "Supernatural" spinoffs. But, at the Television Critics Association press tour a few weeks ago, CW Entertainment president Brad Schwartz put a verbal bullet through the head of those hopes (sorry for the graphic metaphor, but it was a pretty violent show).

"We've had no discussion about any kind of spinoff," he said curtly when asked about the possibility. "But we're really excited about the new season of 'Walker' with Jared."

That was seemingly his attempt to throw a bone to fans — the Jared he refers to is Jared Padalecki, who's now leading CW's "Walker" (which is itself a prequel of "Walker: Texas Ranger").

**Q: Is Steve Austin still acting?**

A: He took a break from the acting game, but he's set to return with a movie about a different kind of game.

He reportedly just started work on the indie feature "The Walk-Ons," about a group of men laid off from a local factory who, with their newfound free time, join the local low-ranked college football team to help their sons have a championship season.

It was first announced back in July and is a labor of love by writer-producer-director (and former pro football player) Jim Fitzpatrick ("Soulmates," 2023).

Austin seemed poised for screen stardom back in the early 2000s, with leading roles in action films such as "The Condemned" (2007) and "The Expendables" (2010). This seemed like a

natural next step from his illustrious career in professional wrestling, where he was known by the nickname "Stone Cold."

He's joined in "The Walk-Ons" by a couple of other former wrestling stars making their returns to the screen: Chris Jericho ("MacGruber," 2010) and Tyrus ("Stand On It," 2020).

Given that it just started pre-production, and it's a small-scale indie that still needs to work out distribution, there's no word yet on a release date.
